**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets opened a three-game series against the Reds with a 5-1 victory...The Mets have won four straight, six of their last seven, 13 of their last 15 and 17 of their last 22 games...This Mets will be a celebration of 27 games in 26 days (10-2), a span that includes two doubleheaders (August 6 vs. Atlanta and August 20 at Philadelphia) and one scheduled off day (August 11)...The Mets are 55-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 25-6-3 in 34 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-game homestand (5-1), their longest of the year, against the Braves (4-1), Reds (1-0) and Phillies (three games).

**WOMEN'S DAY AT CITI FIELD:** Tomorrow, the New York Mets will host their first Women's Day at Citi Field...Led by the Mets female driven employee resource group, "She-Unit," Women's Day at Citi Field will be a celebration of women in sports with female focused pregame and in-game programming in honor of Women's Equality Day...Prior to the start of the game, there will be a panel with the women of the Mets front office, who will speak to other female industry contacts and female-driven community groups...A ceremonial first pitch will be thrown by Queens native Olivia Pichardo...Pichardo participated in the MLB's Girls Baseball Breakthrough Series last fall and was recently named to the 2022 Women's National Baseball Team...The Mets will also be remembering Shannon Forde with a tribute video on Citi Vision.

**PETE ALONSO ANAGRAMS TO PLATOON, SEE:** Pete Alonso has excelled in his recent opportunities with the platoon advantage, reaching base in 16 of his 17 plate appearances against southpaws since the All-Star break, good for a .941 OBP...He is 9-10 (.900) with two doubles, a home run, six walks and a hit-by-pitch (2.341 OPS) in those 17 matchups vs. lefties...He is batting .417 (15-36) with a 1.311 OPS against lefties since June 25...Prior to that date, Alonso was hitting .190 (11-58) with a .716 OPS vs. southpaws.

**HIGH FIVE:** The Mets have scored five or more runs in each of their last seven games...That is tied for the second-longest streak in the majors this year...The Padres went eight games with five or more runs scored from April 26-May 4...The Mets are hitting .299/.377/.480 in that span with 45 runs scored...It's their longest streak since they also went seven games with five or more runs scored from August 3-9, 2019...The last time the team had a longer streak was a nine-game streak from April 27-May 6, 2017...The franchise record is 12 games from August 11-24, 2007...Overall, the Mets are 52-5 this season when they score five or more runs...Their .912 winning percentage when scoring five or more runs ranks fourth in MLB and second in the NL behind the Dodgers (56-4, .933).

**FIRST THINGS FIRST:** The Mets are batting .274/.348/.419 in the first inning this season...They have recorded 17 doubles, a triple, 15 home runs and scored 69 runs...The team ranks third in the majors in first inning hits (121) and fifth in average (.274) and OBP (.348)...Starling Marte is batting .383/.419/.654 in the first inning this season...Six of his 12 home runs this season have come in the first inning, tied for third-most in the NL.

**STRIKE THAT:** The Mets lead the majors with 1,048 strikeouts this season...It's a franchise record for most strikeouts through 110 games in a season...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game eight times this year, which is the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 56 times this year, the most in MLB...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 833 times this season...That is the fourth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit.

**C IS FOR COOKIE:** Carlos Carrasco is 4-0 with a 1.50 ERA (six earned runs/36.0 innings) with 10 walks and 33 strikeouts over his last six starts...He is set to make his 13th start at home, where he is 7-1 with a 3.41 ERA (26 earned runs/68.2 innings) with 22 walks and 65 strikeouts.

**FOR STARTERS:** Since Max Scherzer returned from the Injured List on July 5, Mets starters have posted a 2.21 ERA (44 earned runs/1791 innings) in the team's last 30 games with 193 strikeouts and 44 walks...That Dodgers are second in that period with a 2.71 ERA, followed by the Phillies and Giants with a 3.17 ERA...New York's 193 strikeouts in that span also lead the majors...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.53 in that span...The Mets rank fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.53 ERA from their starters.

**NEWS AT 11:** Jeff McNeil is on an 11-game hitting streak, batting .404 (19-47) with eight runs, six doubles, two home runs, six RBI with a .429 OBP and a .660 SLG in that span...He has recorded six multi-hit games in that span...He has recorded 140 multi-hit games in his career...That places him 33rd in franchise history...Next up is John Milner at 141 multi-hit games.

**HECK OR HIGH-WATER MARK:** The Mets are a season-high 32 games over .500...Prior to this year, it's the most games over .500 since they were 32 games over with a record of 97-65 to end the 2006 season...The last time was more than 32 games over .500 was when they were 34 games above after they were 92-58 on September 19, 2006...New York has won 71 games this season, second-most in the National League...Their .645 winning percentage is tied for second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 71-39 record through the team's first 110 games...Only the 1986 (75-35) team posted a better record through the first 110 games of the season.

**GIVE ME A BREAK:** The Mets are 13-4 in the second-half...The team's 13 wins are the second-most in the majors, as is their .765 winning percentage...The team is batting .294/.362/.476 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in average and are second in OBP and third in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 91-59 following the break.

**BACH IN A NEW YORK GROOVE:** Daniel Vogelbach is the first Met to reach base in at least 12 straight starts to begin his Mets tenure since Norichika Aoki (15 starts) in 2017...Since he made his Mets debut on July 24, the Mets are first in MLB in each of the triple-slash categories (.307/.376/.508) and winning percentage (.867) and second in runs per game (5.93) and extra-base hits (62)...He is batting .333 (13-39) with five runs, three doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, 10 walks with a .480 OBP and a .564 SLG in 14 games with the Mets.

**REDS-METS NOTES:** Since the start of the 2014 season, the Mets have gone 17-7 against the Reds at Citi Field...The Mets have not lost a season series to the Reds since 2013.

**RUNNIN' DOWN A DREAM:** Francisco Lindor has scored at least one run in each of his last 11 games...It is the second-longest streak in the majors this year...Mookie Betts recorded a 12-game streak from May 13-24...He is the seventh Met in franchise history to accomplish that feat...It is the longest by a Mets shortstop in franchise history...It is tied for the third-longest streak in franchise history with Derek Bell who accomplished this feat from June 21-July 1, 2000...Only David Wright, who owns the franchise record with a 13-game streak (July 13-29, 2008) and Carlos Beltrán (12 games, August 17-30, 2006) have had longer streaks.

**LINDOR CITY OVER HERE:** Francisco Lindor is on a 16-game on-base streak...Since July 23, he is batting .407 (24-59) with 16 runs, five doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, 10 walks with a .486 OBP and a .644 SLG...In 34 games since the start of July, Lindor is batting .326/.404/.545 with 25 runs, six doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 21 RBI, 17 walks and a .949 OPS...He ranks tied for third in the majors with 20 go-ahead RBI behind teammate Pete Alonso (29)...He ranks eighth in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 4.7 fWAR.

**20/20 VISION:** Francisco Lindor has recorded 77 RBI in 109 games this season (75 as a shortstop)...That is the second-most RBI by a shortstop in Mets history...José Reyes owns the record, recording 81 RBI in 153 games in 2006...He has hit 19 home runs this season (18 as a shortstop)...Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016...He is seeking to become the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in multiple seasons...Lindor blasted 20 home runs in 2021...He is tied for fifth in the majors and tied for third in the NL with 77 RBI...The Mets are the only team in the majors with two players with at least 75 RBI this year.

**CITI SLICKERS:** The Mets have played 54 games at Citi Field this year...The Mets are 36-18 at home...They are tied for third in the majors and second in the National League with a .667 winning percentage at home...The team's .667 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 (55-26, .679) and 1986 (55-26, .679) teams had a better record at home...The Mets have posted a 3.32 ERA with 155 walks and 527 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL.

**LET'S GO STREAKING!:** Edwin Díaz has not allowed a run in his last 18 outings dating back to June 22, covering 18.0 innings, establishing a new career-high scoreless streak...37 of Díaz last 50 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards and since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.36 ERA (one earned runs/24.2 innings) with 11 hits, two walks and 53 strikeouts...He has converted all 15 saves in that period.

**BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS:** Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 91 strikeouts...That is 22 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has struck out 52.9% of batters faced (91/172), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 45 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 18.07 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 2-1 with 26 saves, a 1.39 ERA (seven earned runs/45.1 innings), allowing 27 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 40-5 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

**A CENTURY:** Díaz has struck out 91 batters in 45 games this season...He is seeking to become the seventh reliever in franchise history to strike out 100 batters in a season...The last player to do that was Seth Lugo in 2019...His career-high best is 124 strikeouts in 73 games in 2018...His record with the Mets is 99 strikeouts in 66 games in 2019.

**30 FOR 20:** Pete Alonso has hit 29 home runs this season...He is seeking to become the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons...Howard Johnson, Darryl Strawberry and Dave Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or more home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 135 home runs.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** In 17 games since the All-Star break, Pete Alonso is batting .365 (23-63) with 14 runs, six doubles, five home runs, 17 RBI, 10 walks with a .459 OBP and a .698 SLG...Alonso is second in the majors and leads the National League with 95 RBI...He is eighth in the majors and fourth in the NL with a .545 SLG.

**THE ROAD TO 100:** Pete Alonso is seeking to record 100 RBI in a season for the second time in his career...Alonso recorded 120 RBI in 2019, his rookie year...He is seeking to become the eighth player in franchise history with multiple seasons with 100 or more RBI...He would be first Met to do so since Carlos Beltrán and Carlos Delgado accomplished the feat in 2007 and 2008.

**HURTS DONUT:** The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 75 times this year...It's their third-highest total in franchise history...The 2019 Mets set the record with 95 HBP...Brandon Nimmo has been plunked 53 times in his career, which is a franchise record...Pete Alonso is third, having been hit 49 times in his career.

**WE'RE TALKING MILITARY SOFTBALL:** Earlier today the Mets hosted the annual Military Softball Tournament in partnership with Fiserv...Five teams made up of personnel from each branch of the U.S. Military (Army, Air Force, Navy, Marines, and Coast Guard) competed in round-robin tournament style play culminating in a championship game...The players enjoyed lunch in the Bullpen Plaza with Mr. Met and received a Mets military T-shirt, Mets challenge coins and tickets to a future game.

### CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

**LAST START:** Earned the win on August 4 vs. Atlanta, allowing three runs on four hits (one home run) and a walk with six strikeouts through 6.0 innings...The Mets have won each of his last six starts...Gave up an RBI single to Michael Harris II in the fifth frame to end his career-long scoreless innings streak.

**CLUTCH COOKIE:** Carrasco did not allow a run in 22.2 consecutive innings from July 14-August 4, surpassing his previous career-long scoreless streak of 22.0 innings from July 30-August 11, 2015...He threw three consecutive scoreless starts for the first time in his career from July 14-30...He has three scoreless innings streaks of at least 10.0 innings in a single season for the first time since 2018...His six scoreless starts on the season are tied for third-most in the majors behind Paul Blackburn (OAK) and Justin Verlander's (HOU) seven such starts.

**THAT MAKES 100:** Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 at Miami...He became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest Venezuelan-born hurler to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...Is one of 18 active pitchers with 100 career victories.

**JULY HEAT:** Carrasco went 3-0 with a 0.90 ERA (three earned runs/30.0 innings), nine walks and 27 strikeouts in five starts in the month of July...It is his lowest ERA for any month in his career and the third-lowest for any single month in Mets history since 1990 (min. 30.0 IP)...In that time frame, he joins Frank Viola (0.86 ERA, April 1991), Al Leiter (0.92 ERA, April 2002), R.A. Dickey (0.93 ERA, June 2012) and Jacob deGrom (0.51 ERA, April 2021) as the only Mets pitchers with a sub-1.00 ERA in a single month.

**THAT'S QUALITY STUFF:** Registered his eighth quality start of the season in his last outing on August 4...Notched just two such starts last year...Earned back-to-back quality starts on May 3 (G2) and May 10, his first time since finishing 2020 with six in a row...Carrasco's 12 wins on the season are tied for fifth in the majors...He has reached double-digit victories for the fifth time in his career (also, 2015-2018) and has earned 10 wins prior to the All-Star break for the fourth time in his career (also, 2015, 2017 & 2018).

**VS. CINCINNATI:** Last faced the Reds on July 30, 2021 where he tossed 4.0 innings of one-run ball with three hits, one walk and four strikeouts...Each of his last three starts against Cincinnati have come at his home ballpark, while just two of his eight career outings against the club were on the road...Has posted a 4-0 record with a 3.32 ERA (16 earned runs/43.1 innings) in those eight games (seven starts)...Is 8-4 and has pitched to a 3.72 ERA (49 earned runs/118.2 innings) in 21 games (20 starts) against the National League Central in his career.

**SLIDING BY:** Among MLB qualifiers, Carrasco ranks second with a 36.0% chase rate with his slider...Only Kevin Gausman of the Blue Jays has a better rate (40.7%)...Only 25.0 percent of his sliders are hard-hit, meaning an exit velocity of 95 mph or higher, the 10th-lowest percentage in the majors (min. 100 PA)...Carrasco has induced 90 swings and misses with his slider, tied for 15th-most in the NL.

**VENEZUELAN BORN:** Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Struck out the 1,400th batter of his career on May 27 vs. Philadelphia, the fourth-highest strikeout total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,400 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TAIJUAN WALKER [9-3, 3.45]

**LAST TIME OUT:** Suffered his first loss since June 7 after allowing eight runs on seven hits (two home runs) through 1.0 inning on August 5 vs. Atlanta...Did not record a strikeout in a start for the fifth time in his career.

**WENT STREAKING:** Snapped a streak of 15 starts allowing four runs or fewer dating back to May 12 in his last outing...Had not allowed more than three runs in nine consecutive starts, which was tied for the longest active streak in the majors entering that appearance.
