## 2ND HALF

Since the All-Star break the Redlegs are 14-13 and lead the National League in hitting (.287), slugging (.485) and OPS (.835) while ranking second in runs scored ( $150,5.56 \mathrm{r} / \mathrm{g}$ ) and third in on-base percentage (.350)....Reds pitchers rank 12th in the NL in second-half ERA (5.03).

## FIRST WATCH

In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs scored (97), HR (34), RBI (94), batting average (.310) and slugging percentage (.594) while ranking second in the majors in on-base percentage (.370, NYM 371)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 97-61, and are 28-7 (.800) when leading after the first inning... 6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first...3B Eugenio Suárez leads the Major Leagues with 11 HR in the first frame while ranking T2nd in the majors with 21 RBI...SS José Iglesias leads the National League in first-inning batting average (.455) and ranks second in the NL in slugging (.864)...1B Joey Votto is among National League first-inning leaders in extra-base hits $(14,2 n d)$, doubles ( $8, \mathrm{~T} 2 \mathrm{nd}$ ), hits (31, T3rd), slugging percentage $(.589,14$ th $)$ and batting average (.326, 14th).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 3 (1-1) of a 4 -game series vs Brian Butterfield's first-place Cubs and Game 5 (3-1) of a 6-game homestand that included a 2-0 series sweep win vs the Angels...is Game 5 (3-1) of a strech in which the Reds are scheduled to play 13 of 16 games at Great American Ball Park ( $2-0$ vs LAA, $1-1$ vs Cubs, 3 g at Wsh, 4 g vs StL, 3 g vs SD).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds won the first 3 series of a season vs the Cubs for the first time since they won the first 5 series of 2013, then suffered a 2-1 series loss in their most recent meeting (7/15-7/17 at Wrigley Field). over the previous 4 seasons (2015-2018), the Cubs' .671 winning percentage vs the Reds ( $51-25$ ) was the best by any team against any division opponent....over the last 4 seasons the Cubs are 19-17 at Great American Ball Park, the fourth-best winning percentage (.528) of any team with at least 10 games here (Wsh .769, LAD .615, StL .576)...Joey Votto ranks third among all active players with 35 HR and 115 RBI against the Cubs, trailing in both categories only Albert Pujols (57-146) and Ryan Braun (39-136).

NATIONALS UP NEXT: Over the last 3 seasons, including 2019, the Redlegs have lost 14 of their last 17 games vs Wsh...the Redlegs haven't won a season series vs the Nationals since 2015 ( $5-1$ )...in 4 seasons since then the Reds are 6-18 vs Wsh, including 3-4 in 2016, 1-6 in 2017, 1-6 in 2018 and $\mathbf{1 - 2}$ this season...dating back to a $6-3$ Reds win on $6 / 4 / 16$, the Nationals have won 10 of the last $\mathbf{1 1}$ games at Great American Ball Park.

SUSPENDED: RHP Jared Hughes tonight is serving the third game of his 3 -game suspension... he cannot be replaced on the 25 -man roster... Hughes was 1 of 9 ejected in the 11-4 loss on $7 / 30$ vs Pit and, 2 days later, 1 of 8 suspended by Major League Baseball...also suspended were manager David Bell ( 6 g ), LHP Amir Garrett ( 8 g ) and RF Yasiel Puig ( 3 g ) of the Reds and manager Clint Hurdle (2g), RHP Keone Kela (10g), José Osuna ( 5 g ) and RHP Kyle Crick ( 3 g ) of the Pirates.

REHABBING: C Curt Casali, on the injured list since $7 / 18$ with a sprained medial collateral ligament in his right knee, last night began a rehabilitation

 assignment with Class AAA Louisville, started behind the plate and caught 5 innings of the $3-1$ win at Rochester ( $0-3$ ) tonight at Rochester, he is scheduled to serve as the Bats' designated hitter.

CATCH A BREAK: The Reds have used 5 catchers this season, including Tucker Barnhart, Curt Casali, Kyle Farmer, Juan Graterol and Ryan Lavarnway...the 3 catchers on the club's Opening Day roster - Barnhart (IL), Casali (IL) \& Farmer (concussion) - simultaneously were unable to play for 8 days (7/18-7/25) until Barnhart came off the injured list prior to the game on $\mathbf{7 / 2 6}$...Barnhart and Farmer have returned to the active roster...on $\mathbf{7 / 2 6}$, Barnhart filled the roster spot vacated by Graterol, who went on the 7 -day concussion list...Farmer was reinstated from the 7 -day concusion list on $7 / 28$...he replaced Lavarnway, who was designated for assignment....per @EliasSports, the Reds used 6 catchers in a season just 7 times in their history, most recently in 1992 (Troy Afenir, Scott Bradley, Joe Oliver, Jeff Reed, Dan Wilson, Rick Wrona)...also used 6 catchers in 1963, 1961, 1937, 1925 and 1895...the 1909 Reds used a club-record 8 catchers (Tommy Clarke, Tom Downey, Emil Haberer, Mike Konnick, Larry McLean, Si Pauxtis, Duck Pearce, Frank Roth).

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 71 of the Reds' 114 games so far this season, including 48 times solely as a pitcher, twice as a pinch hitter/pitcher, once as a pitcher/LF/RF (7/22 at Mil), once as a pitcher/LF (6/2 vs Wsh), twice as a P/RF, 3 times as a CF, 3 times as a LF, 7 times solely as a pinch runner, once as a pinch runner/CF (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a pinch runner/LF (5/9 at Oak) and once as a pinch runner/RF (5/24 at Chi) and once as a CF/P (7/17 at Chi)... 9 times in his career, including twice this season ( $4 / 9 \mathrm{vs} \mathrm{Mia}, 4 / 15$ at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch... 5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, $P, P R, P$ )...is the first Reds player with more than 380 career innings pitched (386.2) to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat ( 474.1 ip ) in 1958...Ron Mahay was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...Mahay played in 5 g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the 150th anniversary of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the 1869 Red Stockings...this season, the team will wear 15 uniforms from various periods throughout the team's history...tomorrow will wear replica uniforms from 1969...the Reds are 3-7 wearing throwback uniforms...already wore uniforms from 1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, $1935,1936,1939,1956,1961$ and $1967 \ldots$ as part of the seasonlong celebration, the Reds Hall of Fame and Museum underwent a comprehensive modification, while the 1869 Pavilion at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on May 4, the 150th anniversary of the Red Stockings' $45-9$ win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game.

AND THIS ONE BELONGS....: Hall of Fame broadcaster Marty Brennaman is in his 46th and final season calling Reds games for 700 WLW Radio...joined the Reds radio team in 1974 and for 31 seasons (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher Joe Nuxhall, tying LA's Vin Scully and Jerry Doggett for the longest running broadcast duo in baseball history.. is only the eighth Major League Baseball broadcaster to work for the same team for at least 46 seasons, joining Scully ( 67 seasons, 1950-2016), Ralph Kiner of the Mets (52, 1962-2013), KC's Denny Matthews (51, 1969-2019), Mil's Bob Uecker (49, 1971-2019), Jack Buck $(48,1954-2001)$ \& Mike Shannon $(48,1972-2019)$ of the Cardinals and LAD's Jaime Jarrín (47, 1973-2019).

## RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a 2019 National League All-Star...in his last 7 starts is $\mathbf{3 - 1} 1.97$ with 6 quality starts and 3 times was the victim of blown saves...in his $3-0$ win on $7 / 3$ vs Mil, threw 8.0 shutout innings and tied his career high with 12 strikeouts...the 8.0 innings are the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season, and his 12 strikeouts were the most by a Reds pitcher this season until Luis Castillo had a career-high 13 strikeouts on Mon vs LAA...has 6 wins and 4 times was the victim of blown saves...was added to the National League All-Star roster to replace Wsh's Max Scherzer...was Gray's second All-Star selection.

2nd Half: 25g, 25-82 (.305), 4 2b, 3hr, 10rbi, 2sb Leads the National League in hitting in the first inning (.455) and leads the Reds in hitting with RISP (.318, 28-88), 19th-best in the National League.
Has a 6 -game hitting streak ( $10-23, .435,2$ bb, $1 \mathrm{hr}, 3 \mathrm{rbi}$, 6 r ), tied with Aristides Aquino's for the longest active streak on the team and including 3 multi-hit games. With 103 hits is just 4 behind team leader Eugenio Suárez....is trying to become the second straight shortstop to lead the team in hits...SS José Peraza last year led the team with 182 hits.
With 8 HR has established a new single-season high (6hr, 2017)....has 2 grand slams in his career, both this season vs Pit ( $5 / 27 /$ night off Mitch Keller, $7 / 29$ off Montana DuRapau)....his career high for RBI in a season is 54 (2017).
After Scooter Gennett suffered a right groin injury in spring training became the team's starting SS, with José Peraza moving to 2B.
On 2/23/19 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract with an invitation to 2019 Major League spring training camp.
Was 1 of 2 non-roster invitees to make the Opening Day roster (IF/OF Derek Dietrich). Is the Reds' recipient of the 2019 Heart and Hustle Award, given to each team's player who best embodies the passion, values, spirit and traditions of the game.

Reds: 1 g in CF, 1 g as $\mathrm{PH}, 0-2$
Has made 2 apps since he was promoted from Louisville on Monday to replace injured IF/OF Derek Dietrich.
In the seventh inning of last night's $5-2$ win pinch hit and struck out.
In the eighth inning of Thu's 12-5 loss made his Major League debut as a defensive replacement in CF for Nick Senzel, who moved to 2B for Kyle Farmer, who went in to pitch...was Senzel's first Major League appearance at 2B and Farmer's first pitching appearance since high school.
Become the fourth Reds player this season to make his Major League debut (CF Nick Senzel, IF/OF Josh VanMeter, RHP Jimmy Herget).

Made 100 apps for the Bats (.277, 27 2b, 1 3b, 27hr, $70 r b i, 16 s b) \ldots$ when promoted was just 1 of just 3 players in professional baseball with at least 27 doubles and 27 HR (Pit's Josh Bell, 34 2b, 27hr \& Min's Max Kepler, 27 2b, 30 hr ).
For Louisville played 1B ( $62 \mathrm{~g}, 59 \mathrm{gs}$ ), 3B (3gs), LF (9gs) and CF (30g, 25gs). Was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month for May
Wore uniform \#82 in Major League spring training camp, his first.
9 JOSÉ PERAZA, inf 2nd Half: 24g, 13gs, 18-63 (.286), 3 2b, 1 3b, 1 hr , 12rbi Has a 4 -game hitting streak ( $4-16, .250,1$ 2b, 2rbi)...in 52 apps beginning $5 / 31$ is hitting 280 (37-132, 7 2b, $23 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}, 20 \mathrm{rbi}$, 1sb).
Leads the team with 42 starts at $2 B$ (last, Thu vs Cubs)...made 16 starts at SS (last, Fri vs Cubs), second-most on the team (José Iglesias, 98 gs ).
Made 10 starts in the outfield, including 8 starts in LF (last, $6 / 14$ vs Tex) and 2 starts in CF ( $6 / 9$ at Phi, $6 / 22$ at Mil).

Since the All-Star break is hitting .317, raising his season BA from . 263 .
His .285 batting average through the game of $8 / 2$ is a season high.
In the eighth inning of Thu's $12-5$ loss vs Cubs, as a part of a double switch made his first Major League appearance at 2B.
Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
Went hitless on $6 / 2$ vs Wsh, snapping a 9 -game hitting streak (14-41, .341, 5 2b, $1 \mathrm{hr}, 5 \mathrm{rbi}, .378 \mathrm{obp}$ ) and a 20 -game on-base streak ( $26-86, .302,62 \mathrm{~b}, 23 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$, $8 \mathrm{rbj}, 4 \mathrm{sb}, .358 \mathrm{obp}$ )...is the longest hitting streak by any Reds batter this season and ties Joey Votto's for the longest on-base streak by a Reds hitter.
Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on $3 / 25$ during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on $4 / 23$ and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his $5 / 3$ promotion hit 257 ( $12 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$, 2rbi).

EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf
2nd Half: 27-95 (.284), $11 \mathrm{hr}, 19 \mathrm{rbi}, 1.055 \mathrm{ops}$ First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
Since the All-Star break is tied for the National League lead in HR (11, Atl's Ronald Acuña Jr.) while ranking among the NL's second-half leaders in slugging percentage (.674, 2nd), RBI (19, T13th) and on-base percentage (.381, 14th).

In the first inning, leads the Major Leagues with 11 HR while ranking T2nd in the majors with 21 RBI... is hitting . 333 in the first frame, 12th-best in the National League. In his last 11 apps beginning $7 / 29$ is hitting .300 ( $12-40,12 \mathrm{~b}, 3 \mathrm{hr}, 4 \mathrm{rbi}, .967 \mathrm{ops}$ ). Beginning $6 / 30$, homered in 13 of his last 34 apps ( $15 \mathrm{hr}, 28$ rbi).

Is his fourth stint on the Reds' roster...from 5/5-5/16, in his first Major League apps, went 2 -for- 14 ( 1 rbi) in 8 apps and 2 starts...from 5/21-6/18 made 20 apps, including 5 starts (7-27, .259, 2 2b, 2rbi, . 375 obp)...in his third stint, from 7/4-7/7 went 1-for-4 with a 2 -run double in 2 apps ( $\mathrm{PH}, \mathrm{PH}$-LF-2B-1B-LF).
Has made 18 starts ( 12 gs in LF, 3gs at 2B, 2gs at 3B, 1gs at DH)....also made 2 apps at 1 B and 1 appearance in $\operatorname{RF}$ ( $7 / 22$ at Mil).

Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit . 348 (14 2b, 1 $3 \mathrm{~b}, 14 \mathrm{hr}, 43 \mathrm{rbi}, 8 \mathrm{sb}, 1.097 \mathrm{ops})$...started at $1 \mathrm{~B}(10 \mathrm{~g}), 2 \mathrm{~B}(20 \mathrm{~g}), 3 \mathrm{~B}(10 \mathrm{~g})$ and LF $(3 \mathrm{~g})$. In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month... in April hit . 358 and led the IL in games (26), hits (34), runs (24), HR (11), RBI (28), total bases (24), slugging percentage (.758) and OPS (1.204)... his 11 HR and 28 RBI are RiverBats/Bats records for April (since 2000). 2nd Half: 24-107 (.224), 5 2b, 4hr, 15rbi For the fifth straight season, per Baseball America was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League. From $5 / 8-6 / 4$ reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season...his current on-base streak is at 7 games (.344obp).
Beginning $5 / 8$ made his last 72 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, $5 / 7$ at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff ( $6 / 18 / 08$ vs LAD).
In his career has hit 64 HR on the first pitch, including last night's off Yu Darvish.
33 JESSE WINKER, of
2nd Half: 23-70 (.329), 3 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 11rbi Among National League leaders since the All-Star break ranks fourth in on-base percentage (.434) and eighth in batting average (.329).
Hit safely in 7 of his last 11 apps (11-28, $.393,1 \mathrm{hr}, 4 \mathrm{rbi}, .969 \mathrm{ops}$ ).
