METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell 2-0 to the Yankees in The Bronx yesterday...Despite the loss, the Mets have won five of their last seven and nine of their last 14...The Mets are coming off a six-game road trip (4-2), against Miami (3-0) and the Yankees (1-2)...Tonight, the Mets return to Queens for their final homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against the Orioles (three games) and Phillies (four games).

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT AWARDS: Yesterday, the New York Mets announced their 2026 Player Development Awards (see below)...The recipients of the 2026 Player Development Awards will be honored during a pre-game, on-field ceremony at Citi Field prior to tonight's game against the Baltimore Orioles...In addition, Mitch Voit and Jonathan Santucci will be available in the Shannon Forde Press Conference Room following Andy Green.

ON DEADLINE: The Mets are 22-14 since the trade deadline...Their .611 winning percentage is the sixth-best mark in the majors during that span, and the fourth-best mark in the NL...They are batting .255/.324/.445 with a .768 OPS in that span...Their .445 SLG ranks second, as does their 57 home runs...They rank third in the Major Leagues with a .768 OPS in that span.

IN THE CITI: The Mets begin their final homestand of the 2026 season tonight...The team is 34-40 at home this year...They have posted a 4.06 ERA, while batting .231/.306/.382...They have struck out 697 at home this season, the 11th-most in franchise history...The 2019 team struck out a record 835 batters in 81 home games.

GIVE ME A BREAK: In 52 games following the All-Star break, Francisco Lindor is batting .244/.328/.498 with 34 runs, six doubles, one triple, 15 homers, 23 walks, 35 RBI and an .825 OPS...This compares to a .216/.298/.373 with 22 runs, three doubles, three triples, five homers, 12 RBI, 16 walks and a .671 OPS in 40 games in the first half of the season.

A.J. STYLES: A.J. Ewing had his on-base streak snapped at 11 games yesterday...He batted .400 (16-40) with nine runs, three doubles, two homers, nine RBI, five walks, two steals, a .457 OBP, a .625 SLG and a 1.082 OPS...He has posted a .998 OPS in 10 games this month.

HANG 10: The Mets are one of only three teams in the majors with 10 players who have hit 10 or more homers this year (Francisco Alvarez, Brett Baty, Carson Benge, Bo Bichette, Francisco Lindor, Luis Robert Jr., Marcus Semien, Juan Soto, Tyrone Taylor, Mark Vientos)...The Yankees and Nationals also feature 10 players...This ties a franchise record, also accomplished in 2019 and 2017.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga has appeared in 14 games since the trade deadline and is 0-1 with a 2.03 ERA (3 ER/13.1 IP), six walks and 15 strikeouts...He has converted all seven save opportunities.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Phillies completed a three-game sweep of the Mets, earning a 6-0 victory over New York...Kevin Gross tossed a six-hit shutout for the Phillies, while Sid Fernandez took his fifth loss of the season...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title.

NEW SKIPPER: Andy Green has been named Interim Manager for the remainder of the 2026 season...Green, who joined the Mets organization in 2023 and previously served as Senior Vice President, Baseball Development, managed the San Diego Padres from 2016-19, guiding the club to a 274-366 (.428) record...The 48-year-old played parts of four Major League seasons with the Diamondbacks (2004-06) and appeared in four games with the Mets in 2009...He will wear #70...The Mets are 35-33 since Green took the helm.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his second win of the season in his first start of 2026 on September 7 at Miami...Allowed four runs on four hits, issued one walk and recorded seven strikeouts...All four runs allowed came in the second inning...After the second inning, Tong retired nine of his last 11 batters faced...His seven strikeouts on the day were his second most in his career (most: 8 K, 9/18/25 vs. SD)...Marked his first Major League appearance since June 2 at Seattle...Was re-called from Triple-A Syracuse prior to the game.

SYRACUSE STATS: In his first 12 starts with Triple-A Syracuse this season, Tong went 1-5 with a 6.30 ERA (35 ER/50.0 IP) and 68 strikeouts...Over his last 11 starts in Syracuse, Tong went 4-1 with a 3.00 ERA (19 ER/57.0 IP) and 58 strikeouts...In his last outing with the S-Mets, August 29 at Lehigh Valley (G1), Tong tossed a 7.0-inning complete game shutout and allowed just one hit while striking eight...Tong's 126 strikeouts with Syracuse are the second-most in the International League and are the third-most among all Mets farmhands this season.

A YOUNG MAN'S GAME: Last season, he made five appearances with the Major League club, all starts, and he went 2-3 with a 7.71 ERA (16 ER/18.2 IP) and 22 strikeouts...At the time of his debut he was just 22 years old and 71 days old and he became the youngest pitcher to start for the Mets since Jenrry Mejia (20 years old and 339 days) on September 15, 2010...He is the youngest Mets starting pitcher to make his Major League debut since Jon Niese (21 years old and 311 days) debuted on September 2, 2008...He is one of 12 pitchers in franchise history to make his Major League debut as a starter at age 22 and 71 days or younger...Before being called up, in 22 starts between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse, he posted a 1.43 ERA (18 ER/113.2 IP) and recorded a Minor League-leading 179 strikeouts...His 1.43 ERA was the best among qualified full-season minor leaguers at the time of his call-up...He ranked first in batting average against (.148, 58-392) and third in WHIP (0.92) among qualified full-season minor leaguers...He had given up one or zero earned runs in 12 of his last 13 starts dating back to June 4, 2025 and he had a 0.90 ERA (7 ER/69.2 IP) with a 13.82 K/9 over that span...He finished the season as the Mets' 2025 Minor League Pitcher of the Year.

FIRST TIME SO GOOD: Allowed four runs, one earned over 5.0 innings and earned the win in his Major League debut on August 29, 2025 against Miami...Joined Jim McAndrew, Tyler Yates, Nino Espinosa and Jon Matlack as the only pitchers in franchise history to throw 5.0 or more innings and issue zero walks in their Major League debut...Tong's six strikeouts were the most among the group...Tong became the fifth-youngest Mets starter to earn the win in their Major League debut and the youngest since Julio Valera who earned the win in his Major League debut on September 1, 1990 at 21 years and 323 days...Joined Dwight Gooden as the only Mets pitchers age 22 or younger to throw at least 5.0 innings and allow one or zero earned runs in the Major League debut.

ROCKSTAR: His eight strikeouts on September 18, 2025 were the most by a Met who is 22 years old or younger since Noah Syndergaard struck out nine on August 25, 2015...On the same day, he became the second pitcher in franchise history to have a start of at least 5.0 innings, eight or more strikeouts, no walks, and no earned runs through their first four career starts (also: Dennis Ribant, 8/17/64).

TONG 'EH': He was born in Markham, ON and became the 12th player born in Canada to play a game for the Mets...He is the eighth Canadian to pitch for the team in franchise history...He became the third Canadian to start a game for the Mets and the first since 1962 (also: Ray Daviault, 1962 and Ken MacKenzie, 1962)...He is the youngest Canadian-born player to make their Major League debut since Josh Naylor debuted at 21 years old and 336 days on May 24, 2019.

CAREER NOTES: Tong was selected in the seventh round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Georgia Premier Academy in Statesboro, GA...Across four Minor League seasons, he has posted a 2.96 ERA (94 ER/285.2 IP) over 66 appearances (62 starts) and recorded 432 strikeouts...While with Double-A Binghamton last season, he was named EAS Pitcher of the Week twice (week of 5/11 and the week of 5/17) and EAS Pitcher of the Month twice (May and June).

- Recorded five outs and allowed one run on September 9 at Miami (1.2 IP, 2 H, ER, 2 K, BB).
- Fired a scoreless eighth inning on September 7 at Miami (1.0 IP)...18 of his 23 appearances have been scoreless.
- Picked up his second save of the season and the third of his career after tossing a scoreless ninth inning and striking out two on August 17 vs. San Diego (1.0 IP, 2 K).
- Has pitched 2.0 or more innings four times this season and during those 8.1 innings hasn't allowed a run and only two hits.
- Earned the win on August 10 at Atlanta (2.0 IP, BB) with 2.0 shutout innings.
- Notched his second career save and first as a Met on August 5 at Cleveland (1.0 IP, BB) when he tossed a scoreless 10th inning...His only other Major League save up until that point came on August 13, 2023, at Pittsburgh while with Cincinnati.
- Tossed 2.1 scoreless innings in his season and Mets debut on May 19 at Washington (2.1 IP, H, K)...Marked his longest Major League appearance.
- Was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse prior to their game on July 21...Marks his fourth stint with the team this season.
- In 24 appearances (seven starts) with Syracuse this season he is 3-2 and has pitched to 4.75 ERA (16 ER/30.1 IP) with 30 strikeouts...His last appearance came on July 17 vs. Buffalo where he tossed a scoreless inning and stuck out the side on 15 pitches.
- Pitched in the WBC for Mexico, and over two appearances, he allowed one run over 2.0 innings.
- Before this season, his last Major League appearance came on April 3rd, 2024, at Milwaukee while with Minnesota...He pitched in two games for the Twins that season.
- Made 31 appearances for the Reds in 2023 and pitched to a 3.69 ERA (13 ER/31.2 IP) with three wins and one save...Over 34 Major League appearances between Cincinnati and Minnesota from 2022-2024, he went 3-0 with one save, a 3.99 ERA (17 ER/38.1 IP) and 28 strikeouts.
- Pitched for Los Mochis in the Mexican Winter League in 2025-2026, and he didn't allow an earned run over 24.0 innings.

- Threw a scoreless seventh inning on September 13 at New York-AL (1.0 IP, K, BB)...15 of his 16 Major League appearances have been scoreless.
- Allowed the first run of his career in his 15th career appearance on September 9 at Miami (0.1 IP, 4 H, 3 ER) when he recorded one out and allowed three earned runs...His 14 consecutive scoreless appearances to begin his career is the second-longest streak in team history...Joe Smith holds the record with 17 straight scoreless outings.
- Fired a scoreless seventh inning and earned his 10th hold on September 8 at Miami (1.0 IP, 2 H, 2 K)...Has earned a hold in 10 of his first 16 appearances.
- Averages 13.6 pitches per inning, which is the sixth-fewest in the majors this season (min. 10.0 IP).
- Fired 2.0 scoreless innings in relief on August 25 vs. Milwaukee (2.0 IP, K)...Marked his first career outing of at least 2.0 innings.
- Stranded an inherited runner and threw a scoreless sixth inning on August 19 vs. San Diego (1.0 IP, 2 K) to earn his first Major League win.
- Has stranded nine of his 12 inherited runners this season.
- Made his Major League debut and threw 1.1. scoreless innings on August 4 at Cleveland (1.1 IP, K, BB)...Recorded his first career strikeout to end the seventh inning at the expense of Travis Bazzana.
- Was selected to the Major League roster and recalled on August 4.
- Has pitched in 34 games this season between Single-A St. Lucie (rehab appearances), High-A Brooklyn (rehab appearances) and Triple-A Syracuse and he is 2-3 with a 3.77 ERA (18 ER/43.0 IP)...25 of his appearances have been with Syracuse, where is 2-2 with a 3.27 ERA (12 ER/33.0 IP).
- Over five minor league seasons in the Mets system he is 12-9 with a 2.78 ERA (49 ER/158.2 IP) and 244 strikeouts.
- From 2022-2024 made nine appearances in Major League Spring Training with the Mets and didn't surrender a run over 7.2 innings.
