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PITTSBURGH PIRATES (73-73) vs. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (75-70)

September 10, 2026 - Rate Field - Chicago, IL - 6:40 CDT - Game #147/Road #75

RHP Jared Jones (3-6, 4.46 ERA) vs. LHP Hagen Smith (3-1, 0.56 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won the first two games of their penultimate road trip of the 2026 season at at Chicago-AL (2-0, Tuesday-Thursday) and Chicago-NL (Friday-Sunday), including a 4-2 win on Wednesday at Rate Field...Went 4-2 on their recent six-game homestand vs. San Francisco (2-1, September 1-3) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1, September 4-6)...Have hit 167 home runs (they hit 117 home runs in 2025)...Have the third-most hits (1273) in Major League Baseball, behind only Milwaukee (1280) and Tampa Bay (1274)...Have scored the fifth-most runs (707) in Major League Baseball (their most runs in a season since scoring 758 runs in 2019), behind only Chicago-NL (780), Washington (756), Milwaukee (742) and Los Angeles-NL (728)...Are looking to move over the .500 mark for the first time since they were 55-54 (.505) after a loss on July 29 vs. Arizona...Are looking to move over the .500 mark this late in a season for the first time since they finished 82-79 (.509) in 2018.

WHEN I'M BACK STILL IN CHICAGO: Pittsburgh will continue its six-game road trip to Chicago with a three-game series at Wrigley Field (Friday-Sunday)...The Bucs won two of three games at "The Friendly Confines" from April 10-12...The Pirates and Cubs have played 10 consecutive contests decided by two or fewer runs at Wrigley Field (since June 12, 2025)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, that is tied for Pittsburgh's sixth-longest such streak of games in any single venue in franchise history (since 1887).

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Pirates picked up their fifth straight series win after earning wins on Tuesday/Wednesday at Chicago (AL)...Pittsburgh also won two of three games from August 24-26 at San Diego, two of three games from August 28-30 at St. Louis, two of three games from September 1-3 vs. San Francisco and two of three games from September 4-6 vs. Los Angeles (AL)...It is the first time it has won five straight series since August 14-30, 2015, when it swept a three-game series from August 14-16 at New York (NL), won two of three games from August 17-19 vs. Arizona, won three of four games from August 20-23 vs. San Francisco, won three of four games from August 24-27 at Miami & won two of three games from August 28-30 vs. Colorado.

ROAD WARRIORS: Pittsburgh has won three straight road series (August 24-26 at San Diego, August 28-30 at St. Louis and Tuesday-Thursday at Chicago-AL) for the first time since April 16-25, 2021, when it won two of three games from April 16-18 at Milwaukee, two of three games from April 21-22 at Detroit and two of three games from April 23-25 at Minnesota...The Pirates have won four straight road games (since August 29 at St. Louis) for the second time this season (also March 31-April 11)...The last time they won five straight road games came from March 28-April 1, 2024 at Miami (four wins) and Washington (one win).

SWEEP DREAMS: The Pirates can complete their fifth series sweep with a win tonight at Rate Field...They also swept a three-game series from April 3-5 vs. Baltimore, a three-game series from May 1-3 vs. Cincinnati, a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota and a three-game series from July 11-12 vs. Milwaukee...Pittsburgh is looking to complete its first sweep on the road since a three-game sweep from July 28-30, 2025 at San Francisco and its first on the road vs. an American League team since a three-game sweep from July 12-14, 2024 at Chicago (AL)...It would mark the Pirates' third all-time three-game sweep vs. the White Sox (since interleague play began in 1997), along with June 30-July 2, 1997 (Three Rivers Stadium) and July 12-14, 2024.

CLEAN IT UP: The Bucs are looking to play 10 straight errorless games (since August 30 at St. Louis) for the first time since June 14-24, 2016 (11 contests).

LOWE OR NEVER: Brandon Lowe went 2-for-4 with a walk in Wednesday's 4-2 win at Chicago (AL) and has now recorded multiple hits in three straight games (since Sunday vs. Los Angeles-AL) for the second time this season (also July 26-28)...He is looking to post multiple hits in four straight games for the second time in his career (also August 12-15, 2020 with Tampa Bay).

COLD AS EIS: Brandon Eisert was one of six Pirates relievers in the Modern Era (since 1901) to strike out five batters without allowing a baserunner in an outing of at least 2.1 innings on Wednesday at Rate Field, joining Elroy Face (Aug. 31, 1960 at San Francisco), Bob Patterson (May 25, 1991 vs. Philadelphia), Chan Ho Park (Oct. 1, 2010 at Florida), Chris Stratton (July 4, 2019 vs. Chicago-NL) and Braxton Ashcraft (last year on Sept. 20 vs. the A's).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

September 10, 2014: Andrew McCutchen hit the first and only inside-the-park home run of his career with his one-out, solo shot in the fifth inning, while Russell Martin followed with a game-winning, solo home run two batters later, during Pittsburgh's 6-3 win over Philadelphia at Citizens Bank Park. Former Phillie Vance Worley improved to 7-4 after starting and allowing three runs over 5.0 innings.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2020 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Jones won a 1-0 decision after allowing just three hits and one walk while striking out a season-high-tying nine batters (also July 18 [G1] at Cleveland) over 6.0 innings of work on September 4 vs. Los Angeles (AL)...He became only the third Pirate since the start of 2025 to pitch at least 6.0 scoreless innings and allow four or fewer baserunners while striking out at least nine batters, along with Andrew Heaney (April 23, 2025 at Los Angeles-AL) and Paul Skenes (this year on May 12 vs. Colorado).

AMERICAN MAN: Jones will make his first career start against Chicago (AL)...He is 3-2 with a 3.68 ERA (29.1ip/12er) and 39 strikeouts in six interleague starts this year, including a 3.86 ERA (14.0ip/6er) and 17 strikeouts over three road interleague starts.

SKY-HIGH JULY: Jones’ 2.00 ERA (27.0ip/6er) during the month of July was tied with Atlanta’s Chris Sale and San Francisco’s Robbie Ray (he was traded to San Diego on August 3) for the seventh-lowest mark in the National League (minimum 27.0 innings pitched), behind Chicago’s Shota Imanaga (1.53), Chicago’s Matthew Boyd (1.67), Miami’s Eury Pérez (1.69), New York’s Nolan McLean (1.78), Arizona’s Brandon Pfaadt (1.88) and Arizona’s Merrill Kelly (1.95)...His .120 batting average against (11-for-92) during the month of July was first among Major League pitchers (minimum 90 at-bats).

DYNAMIC DUO: Jones had a no-decision after allowing one run on two hits and one walk in 6.0 innings in Pittsburgh’s 3-2, 10-inning loss on July 24 vs. Chicago (NL)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Bubba Chandler (July 22 [G2] at New York-AL) and him were the first pair of Pirates starters since at least 1893 to pitch at least 6.0 innings while allowing two or fewer hits, one or zero runs & one or zero walks in back-to-back games.

HISTORIC STRETCH: Jones became the only Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) with three or fewer hits allowed, one or zero runs allowed and at least six strikeouts in three consecutive outings when he accomplished that from July 2-18 (G1).

30 ROCK: Jones retired his final four batters on July 2 at Philadelphia, retired each of his 18 batters on July 8 vs. Atlanta and retired his first eight batters on July 18 (G1) at Cleveland (Steven Kwan snapped the streak with a two-out single in the third inning)... Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Jones became one of only three Pirates pitchers in the last 70 years (since 1957) to retire at least 30 consecutive batters, joining Harvey Haddix (38 straight batters, May 21-26, 1959) & Jim Bibby (32 straight batters, May 19-24, 1981).

YOU’RE PERFECT: Jones had a no-decision after striking out eight batters over 6.0 perfect innings in Pittsburgh’s 3-0 loss on July 8 vs. Atlanta...He was the first Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have an outing of at least 6.0 perfect innings.

2026 DEBUT: Jones had a no-decision after allowing five runs and striking out six batters over 4.1 innings of work in Pittsburgh’s 6-5, walkoff win on May 29 vs. Minnesota (Bryan Reynolds hit a game-ending, two-run blast in the ninth inning)...It marked his first Major League appearance since pitching 4.1 innings on September 27, 2024 at Yankee Stadium (he was reinstated from the 60-day injured list the same day).

MAKING A COMEBACK: Jones missed all of last year with a right elbow UCL sprain... He underwent right UCL surgery on May 21, 2025 (was performed by Dr. Keith Meister).

ON THE MEND: Jones had a 2.89 ERA (18.2ip/6er) and 24 strikeouts over five rehab starts split between Low-A Bradenton (one start, April 29 vs. Lakleand), Triple-A Indianapolis (two starts, May 6 [G1] vs. Omaha and May 23 at Toledo) and Double-A Altoona (two starts, May 12/17 vs. Harrisburg)...He had a 1.02 WHIP on the assignment.

TOMORROW'S STARTER

Pittsburgh has not named a starter for Friday's series opener against Chicago (NL) at Wrigley Field.
