Reds Game Notes contributors include:

**TODAY'S GAME:** Is Game 2 (0-1) of a 3-game series vs **Adam Chodsko's Angels** and the second game (0-1) of a 7-day/6-game homestand that includes an upcoming 3-game set vs the **Giants** (Tue-Thu).

- The Reds are coming off their first road trip of the season in which they swept the **Rangers** (3-0) and split with the **Marlins** (2-2).
- Following Thu's game vs **SF**, the Reds will head back on the road for a 6-game trip at **Min** (3g, 4/17-4/19) and **TB** (3g, 4/20-4/22).

**REDS UNVEIL CITY CONNECT 2.0:** The Reds on Thu unveiled their newest **City Connect** uniform, which will debut on-field today vs **LAA**.

- The uniforms feature red jerseys and pants accented by dark red piping and sleeves, black numbers, white lettering and red socks...a red cap, which also features pinstripes, showcases the stylized "C" logo.
- The Reds will wear the new **City Connect** uniforms at Saturday home games...Due to its popularity amongst players and fans, the **City Connect** 1.0 black uniform will continue to be worn on Fridays at GABP.

**OUR PAL SAL:** **1b Sal Stewart** has hit safely in 10 of his 14 games this season and reached base in 13 of 14 (16-for-47, .340/.458/.681)...he's been on base 27 times, which ranks T2nd in the majors.

- Stewart** ranks among Major League leaders in OPS (1.139, 4th), OBP (.458, T5th), SLG (.681, 6th), and total bases (32, T6th).

**WINS/RUNS:** The Reds have won 8 of their first 14 games despite ranking last in the majors with 41 runs scored...this is the first Cin team in any 14 game span to score 41 or fewer runs and win 8 times since the 2012 club did it from 9/19-10/3 (14 games, 8 wins, 39 runs).

- The last Major League team to win 8 times in any 14-game span while scoring 41 runs or fewer was the 2025 **Orioles** (8w/41r, 9/6-9/20).
- 7 of Cin's 8 wins this season have come in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the most such wins in the majors this year.
- The 2025 Reds went 35-38 (.479) in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the ninth-worst record in the majors.
- The Reds have been *held* to 2 runs or fewer 7 times already this season, tied for third in the majors (**CWS** & **KC**, 8g each).
- Have been outscored 25-7 during this current 3-game losing skid.

**LEAVING RUNNERS ON:** Reds batters rank third in the majors with 109 runners left on base (**Hou** 116, **NYM** 111)...Cin is 1 of 3 teams in the majors to have stranded at least 10 runners on 4 different occasions (**Sea** 5, **LAA** 4).

- With runners in scoring position Cin is slashing .162/.264/.279...rank last w/RISP in average, hits (18), runs (27), and RBI (24), and second-to-last in OBP, SLG, & OPS (.543).

**NOELVI BOBBLEHEAD:** Fans in attendance today will receive a **Noelvi Marte "Wall Catch" Bobblehead**.

- On 9/25/25 vs **Pit** and the Reds battling for a Postseason spot, **Marte** made a leaping catch to rob a game-tying home run from **Bryan Reynolds** in the 9th inning...the catch earned MLB Play of the Week.

### SERIES NOTES:

- The Redlegs are 14-12 all-time vs the **Angels**, including 8-4 here at **Great American Ball Park** and 6-8 at **Angel Stadium of Anaheim**.
- The Reds' 10-game winning streak vs **LAA** dating back to 8/5/19, was snapped in the clubs' final meeting of 2025 (8/20, 2-1 at **Angel Stadium**)...it's Cin's longest winning streak ever vs an AL opponent.
- In 2013 the Reds and **Angels** played the first interleague **Opening Day** game in Major League history, a 3-1 **Angels** win in 13 innings in which the teams established the modern Major League record for strikeouts by both teams in a season-opener (Cin pitchers 17, **LAA** pitchers 13).
- OF Mike Trout** led off the 2015 All-Star Game at **GABP** with a home run off **RHP Zack Greinke** and became the first player ever to win the ASG's MVP award in consecutive years.

**EL CABALLO DE HIERRO:** **SS Elly De La Cruz** has appeared in each of Cin's last 232 games, beginning 7/30/24...it's the fifth-longest consecutive games played streak by a Red since 1970 (see box below).

**SWITCH BLADE:** **SS Elly De La Cruz** has homered 3 times in 20 at-bats this season vs left-handed pitchers...in 2025, he hit 5 HR in 199 at-bats vs LHP.

**NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM:** The Reds have avoided being swept in 33 consecutive home series (min. 1g) dating back to 2024...it's the longest such streak since 9/19/11-9/25/13 when the Reds avoided being swept at **Great American Ball Park** in a franchise-record 52 consecutive home series.

- The Reds avoided being swept in all 26 of their series last year at **GABP**...only the Cin teams of 1940, 1943, 1944, 1994, and 2012 ran the home schedule without being broomed.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the 2-0 win on Mon (4/6) at Mia (6.2ip, 3h, 0r, 1bb, 4k, 93TP).

- Was his first Major League victory and first quality start since 9/29/23 at StL, a span of 920 days.
- Tied his career high with 6.2 innings pitched (3x)...marked the first time in his Major League career that he ever pitched 6.2 shutout innings.
- Allowed 4 of his 24 batters to reach.
- Turned it over to Brock Burke in the 7th inning with 2 outs and a runner on first...Burke fanned Xavier Edwards.

**MARCH 31 vs PIT:** Suffered the 8-3 loss on 3/31 vs Pit (4.2ip, 6h, 6r/6er, 2bb, 3k, 3hr, 94 TP).

- The 3 home runs allowed were a career high...5 of the 6 runs allowed came via HR.
- 4 of the 6 runs allowed came with 2 outs, including back-to-back homers in Pit's 5-run 2nd inning (O'Hearn 3-run HR, Reynolds solo HR).
- Was his first Major League appearance since 9/17/24 at Atl, a span of 560 days...missed all of last season as he recovered from left elbow reconstruction surgery (10/9/24).

**28th BIRTHDAY:** Turned 28 on 4/2...shares a birthday with Hall of Famers Don Sutton, Luke Appling, and Hughie Jennings, and celebrities Pedro Pascal, Marvin Gaye, Emmylou Harris, and Sir Alec Guinness.

**SPRING RECAP:** Went 2-0 with a 1.65 ERA in 5 appearances (3 starts) during Spring Training (16.1ip, 12h, 3r/3er, 3bb, 15k, 2hr, 246 TP).

**ACQUIRED FROM THE MARINERS:** Was acquired from the Mariners with RHP Justin Dunn, OF Jake Fraley, and a player to be named (RHP Connor Phillips, 3/29/22), for 3B Eugenio Suárez and OF Jesse Winker on 3/14/22.

- When obtained by the Reds in March 2022, his curveball was rated by *Baseball America* as the best in the Mariners' organization.
- Was originally selected by the Mariners in the second round (59th overall) of the 2019 MLB Draft.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in the decision in the Reds' 10-inning, 6-3 win at Mia on 4/7 (5.1ip, 6h, 2er/2er, 2bb, 2k, 0hr, 91TP)...squared off against Sandy Alcantara.

- Gave up both his runs in the 4th inning (double, single, **2 ground outs**, single, flyout).
- Pitched into the 6th inning and was 2 outs from a quality start...turned it over to Pierce Johnson with the bases loaded and 1 out...Johnson produced a groundout and a strikeout to end the threat and keep the score at 2-0.

**APRIL 1 vs PIT:** Was outduelled by Paul Skenes in the 8-3 loss on 4/1 vs Pit (5.2ip, 5h, 4r/4er, 3bb, 5k, 1hr, 88 TP)...was his first loss of the 2026 season.

- After giving up a 1st-inning, 3-run homer to Oneil Cruz, went on to retire 14 of his next 17 batters.
- Had a chance for a quality start when he retired the first 2 batters he faced in the 6th inning, but was removed when the next 2 batters reached (single, walk).

**OPENING DAY, MARCH 26 vs BOS:** Did not factor in the decision in the 3-0 loss vs Bos on Opening Day (3/26)...threw 6.0 shutout innings (7h, 1bb, 4k, 83 TP)...battled Garrett Crochet.

**HE EARNED IT:** His 3.41 ERA through his first 78 career starts is the lowest by a Reds starting pitcher in that span since RHP Mario Soto (3.27, 1977-82).

**PERSONAL:** Graduated from Halifax County High School (South Boston, VA), the same school attended by All Elite Wrestling champion "Hangman" Adam Page and Major League pitcher Jeremy Jeffress...was named 2017 Gatorade Virginia Player of the Year...was a 4-year member of the Halifax swim team...at the University of Virginia became only the second pitcher in school history to record at least 300 strikeouts.
