The Mariners and Cardinals have squared off 27 times, tied for the 2nd-fewest games against an opponent for Seattle (only its 26 G against Pittsburgh ranks fewer)...the Mariners have won 3 consecutive series against the Redbirds:

**TODAY'S TILT...**the Mariners take on the St. Louis Cardinals (2-0) today in the final game of a 3-game series...the Mariners will visit the Minnesota Twins (3 G, 4/27-4/29) on the road trip...today's game at the Redbirds will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call, with **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call.

**ODDS AND ENDS...**the Mariners beat the Cardinals 11-9 last night to earn their first series win on the road in 2026...Seattle is 4-2 over their last 6 series (4/10-c)...the Mariners will look to complete their second series sweep of the season (also: 4 G, 4/10-13 vs. HOU).

- **All is Ferrer in Love and War** - Mariners reliever **José A. Ferrer** has matched his career high with 2.0 innings pitched in back-to-back appearances (April 22 vs. ATH and April 25 at STL).
- **Leo Rivas What Have You Done (Again?)** - **Leo Rivas** yesterday recorded the 3rd game-tying or go-ahead hit in the 9th inning or later in his career and the first since he hit a walk-off home run against the Cardinals on Sept. 10, 2025.
- **Take a Bow** - **Dominic Canzone**, **Connor Joe** and **Leo Rivas** each came off the bench and recorded at least 1 RBI in yesterday's win...they are the first trio of Mariners to come off the bench to collect an RBI since Sept. 25, 2022 vs. KC (Luis Torrens, Dylan Moore and Sam Haggerty).
- **Quite an Introduction** - **Will Wilson** joined **Brendan Donovan**, who both homered in their first plate appearance with the Mariners.
- **Our Pal Cal** - **Cal Raleigh** went 2-for-5 in yesterday's win...over his last 12 games (4/13-c), Raleigh is batting .286 (14x49) with 7 runs, 2 doubles, 3 home runs, 4 RBI, 6 walks and an .874 OPS.
- **Quality** - Seattle is T-3rd in MLB and 2nd in the AL with 14 quality starts, trailing only the Dodgers (17) and Royals (15)...**George Kirby** and **Bryan Woo** are both tied for 3rd in MLB with 4 quality starts.

**AS EASY AS 2-3-4...**since the start of the Astros series on April 10, the Mariners offense has come alive, averaging 5.00 runs a game while batting .275 (138x501) with 26 doubles, 1 triple, 18 home runs, 73 RBI and 64 walks, getting on base at a .365 clip and slugging .439...since April 10, the Mariners rank 5th in MLB in OPS (.804) 2nd in OBP, 8th in slugging percentage, T-12th in runs per game and 3rd in wRC+ (132)...during the span, the heart of the Mariners order has been rolling, with **Cal Raleigh** (.816), **Julio Rodríguez** (.901) and **Josh Naylor** (.886) each holding an OPS above .800.

**NAYLZ HEATING UP...**first baseman **Josh Naylor** went 2-for-5 with 2 stolen bases in yesterday's game...over his last 7 games (4/17-c), Naylor is hitting .480 (12x25) with 2 doubles, 4 RBI, 4 SB and 4 walks, slugging .680 with a 1.213 OPS...Naylor is also batting .357 (15x42) with 2 doubles, 3 HR, 9 RBI and an 1.023 OPS over his past 11 games (4/13-c)...since Naylor made his Mariners debut on July 25, 2025, he is 23-for-23 in stolen base attempts, ranking 7th in the Majors and 4th in AL in stolen bases over that span.

**J-ROD TAKES FLIGHT TO BIG MAC LAND...****Julio Rodríguez** went 3-for-6 with 2 runs, 2 RBI, 1 SB and 1 HR in yesterday's game...his first inning home run landed in "Big Mac Land" in the upper deck in left field...in 14 games since April 11, Julio is batting .352 (19x54) with 7 runs, 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 8 RBI, 6 walks, 3 stolen bases, a .426 OBP and slugging .519 for a .945 OPS...Julio had his 19-game (4/3-c) on-base streak (via hit, walk or HBP), snapped in Friday's game.

**COLE BLOODED CRUSHER...****Cole Young** went 3-for-4 with 1 double, 1 home run, 1 RBI, 3 runs scored and 1 HBP, reaching base safely a career high-tying 4 times (also: 8/9/25 vs. TB and 8/15/25 at NYM)...over his last 9 games since April 16, Young is batting .333 (11x33) with 6 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 4 RBI and an .860 OPS...Young leads the Mariners with 1.5 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*)...he also has 8 defensive runs saved (*Sports Info Solutions*) this season, leading MLB second basemen and tied for the MLB lead among all defenders (also: Pete Crow-Armstrong-CHC).

**THE STARTING FIVE...**Mariners starting pitchers have been excellent to start the 2026 season, with the rotation of **Logan Gilbert**, **George Kirby**, **Bryan Woo**, **Emerson Hancock** and **Luis Castillo** combining to go 8-9 with a 3.73 ERA (66 ER, 159.1 IP), 35 walks and 142 strikeouts...among MLB rotations, the Mariners ranks 1st in IP, T-5th in fWAR (2.9), T-3rd in quality starts (14), 1st in fewest BB/9 (1.98), 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.06), T-5th in WHIP (1.16) and 7th in ERA.

**BRASHTY...**right-handed reliever **Matt Brash** is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 10.1 IP) with 6 strikeouts and 2 walks (1 intentional) in 12 appearances this season...he's posted a 0.48 WHIP and held opponents to a miniscule .100 batting average (3x30)...Brash is 1-of-3 players in Mariners history to have multiple season opening streaks of at least 10 games without an earned run (also: 19 G in 2025), joining teammates **Andrés Muñoz** (2023 and 2025) and **Gabe Speier** (2023 and 2025).

**MITCH GARVER STOPS BY "THE CAL RALEIGH SHOW"**...Mariners catcher **Mitch Garver** joined **Cal Raleigh** and Mariners insider **Shannon Drayer** on this week's episode of "The Cal Raleigh Show"...all episodes of the show air on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and **SeattleSports.com**.

**AS YOU MAY KNOW...**the Mariners tallied a season-high 19 hits in yesterday's game, tied for the most hits in a game since they notched 20 on May 30, 2012 at Texas, and...**AS YOU ALSO MAY KNOW...**all 9 players in the starting lineup recorded a hit, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...12 different Mariners players recorded a hit, tied for the most players hitting safely in a game in Mariners history?...it matched the record set on April 29, 1999 vs. DET and Sept. 17, 1988 vs. MIL.

### ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 26

- **1984** - Rookie Alvin Davis provides the fireworks in a 6-5, 10th inning win at Boston, as his two-run home run off Bob Stanley proved to be the game-winner.
- **1989** - Ken Griffey Jr. leads the Mariners to a come-from-behind win over the Toronto Blue Jays, 7-6, with his first career four-hit performance. Griffey goes 4x4 with three RBI including a game-winning home run with two out in the 7th inning.
- **1990** - On a drive by Jesse Barfield headed over the fence at Yankee Stadium, Ken Griffey Jr. made a leaping grab that still is shown in the highlights.
- **2016** - Robinson Canó recorded his 1000th career RBI in just his 1707th career game, the 5th-fastest to the feat as a 2nd baseman in MLB history.
- **2025** - **Julio Rodríguez** and Jorge Polanco record back-to-back home runs in the 1st inning, and is the 3rd time the Mariners have begun a game with back-to-back home runs

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 6th start of the season and the 37th start of his career...this will be his 43rd career appearance including the 6 relief appearances he made throughout the 2025 regular season...it will mark his 1st start against the Cardinals this season, 2nd career appearance and 1st career start against St. Louis.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

**LAST TIME OUT**...in his 3rd home start of the season, threw 5.0 frames, allowing 3 runs (3 ER) on 7 hits, 3 homers and no walks while striking out 3 batters...he threw 85 pitches and 58 strikes...is 1-of-8 pitchers in 2026 to have made 5 starts with 2-or-fewer walks over 5.0+ IP.

**HOT OFF THE BAT**...is the 6th time a Mariners pitcher has recorded 28+ strikeouts and 4-or-fewer walks through the first 5 games of the season (last: Bryce Miller, 2023)...is 1-of-2 pitchers this season to have done so (also: Cam Schlichter-NYY)...through his first 5 starts owns a 8.8 K/9 and a 26.7 K%, both marks outpacing his 6.4 K/9 and 16.6 K% recorded in 2025, both career-highs.

**KEEP OFF MY BASEPATH**...has allowed 26 base runners over his first 5 starts...is tied for the 7th fewest base runners allowed through a starting pitchers first 5 games of 2026...is also tied for the 6th fewest base runners allowed through a starting pitchers' first 5 games of the season in Mariners history (min. 10.0 IP).

**QUALITY CONTROL**...has recorded a quality start in 3 of his 5 starts this season...is 1-of-3 pitchers in 2026 to have 3 quality starts with 1-or-fewer walks and 5+ strikeouts (also: **Bryan Woo-SEA**, Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD)...the Mariners are 8-4 when Hancock logs a quality start since 2023 and are 6-2 since the start of 2025.

**NO FREE PASSES**...is 1-of-11 pitchers this season to have allowed 2-or-fewer walks over 5.0+ IP in 5+ starts...his 3.8 BB% ranks 3rd among pitchers in 2026 (min. 20.0 IP)...has contributed 4 starts with 5.0+ IP and 1-or-fewer walks to a Mariners pitching staff that leads the league in such games (14) in 2026.

**SOMETHING ABOUT THE SUNSHINE**...will be making his second day start of the season...in his last day start in his first outing of the season, Hancock threw 6.0 innings of shutout ball, allowing only 1 walk and striking out 9 batters...since 2025, has recorded quality starts in 3 of his 6 day starts and two 6.0+ inning shutouts... The Mariners are 4-2 when Hancock starts in day games since 2025.

**APRIL OUTINGS**...over 7 starts in April since 2025, he has gone 2-1, recording a 3.63 ERA (16 ER, 39.2 IP) with 34 strikeouts and 7 walks for a 4.85 K/BB...4 of 7 starts in April since 2025 have been quality starts with 2-or-fewer walks, while he has thrown 5.0+ innings with 3-or-fewer runs scored in all 7 April starts since 2025.

**GOOD TRAVELER**...in 2 away starts this season, Hancock owns a 2.13 ERA (3 ER, 12.2 IP) with a 11.00 K/BB ratio and a .234 opponent OBP...in both outings on the road he has recorded a quality start with 1-or-fewer walks...has allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in 8 of his 10 road starts since 2025.

**LENGTH ON THE MOUND**...has tossed 6.0+ innings in 13 of his 36 career starts, including 6 times during the 2025 season and already three times in the 2026 season (last: 4/15 at SD)...the Mariners are 8-5 when he tosses 6.0+ innings compared to 13-11 when he tosses less than 6.0 innings...has also tossed 5.0+ innings in 27 of 36 career starts, doing so in all five of his starts this season.

**NO HITS HERE**...in his first start of the 2026 season on March 29 vs Cleveland he threw a career high 9-strikeouts over 6.0 no-hit innings...he became the 2nd player in franchise history to toss 9+ SO without a hit allowed, joining Félix Hernández who threw 12 SO in his Perfect Game on Aug. 15, 2012 vs. Tampa Bay... is the first Mariners starter with 6.0+ IP and no hits allowed since James Paxton's threw a no-hitter (5/8/18 at TOR).

**EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT**...became the third pitcher in Mariners history and the second starter to record 7-or-more strikeouts with no walks in 4.0-or-less innings pitched on 9/25/25 against Colorado (also: Yusei Kikuchi as a starting pitcher, 6/5/21 at LAA, and Roy Thomas as a relief pitcher, 4/23/1983 at DET).

**LIGHTS OUT**...was one of 4 Mariners pitchers to toss 7.0+ shutout innings during the 2025 season after doing so in his July 15 start against the Guardians, joining **Luis Castillo** (done 2x, 5/19 at CWS and 7/5 vs. PIT), **Bryan Woo** (6/17 vs. BOS) and **George Kirby** (8/12 at BAL).

- **2025 Totals** - Went 5-0 with a 2.52 ERA (22 ER, 78.2 IP) with 27 walks, 82 strikeouts and a 1.017 WHIP in 73 appearances, limiting opponents to a .187 batting average in 2025.
- **El Campeón** - Won the 2026 World Baseball Classic with Team Venezuela, which included a pitching appearance in the Championship Game against Team USA on March 17.
