# PITTSBURGH PIRATES (26-30) vs. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (26-29) <br> May 31, 2024 at Rogers Centre, Toronto, 0N - 7:07 EDT - GAME \#57/ROAD \#30 LHP BAILEY FALIER ( $3-2,3.55$ ERA) vs. RHP JOSÉ BERRÍOS (5-4, 2.94 ERA) 

THE PIRATES:...had the day off yesterday...Split their doubleheader against the Tigers on Wednesday after being rained out Tuesday night....Are making their fourth trip ever to Toronto during the regular season (also 2003, 2011 and 2017)...Have played in 13 games decided by one or two runs in their last 24 contests...Have played in 19 one-run games, which is tied with Oakland for the second-most in MLB (the Cubs have played 21 one-run contests)...Have gone 16-0 this season when recording 10-plus hits; the only undefeated team in the Majors in such games and a club record for the longest such streak to start a season, surpassing the 1939 club that started 14-0 when recording 10-plus hits to start the season...Have used 54 different lineups in their first 56 games...Only the White Sox (56), Athletics (56) and Tigers (55) have used more.

BAILEY ON THE BUMP: Lefthander Bailey Falter will make his 11th start of the season tonight in the opener of this weekend series against the Blue Jays...The 27 -year-old Falter had his scoreless streak of 19.2 i innings come to an end in his last start after surrendering a three-run home run to Ronald Acuña Jr. with one out in the eighth inning one week ago tonight at PNC Park...It was the longest streak by a Pirates lefthander since Francisco Liriano had a 20.0 -inning streak from August 31 to September 17, 2014....Falter comes into today with the fourth-lowest batting average against (.206) among all left-handed pitchers in the National League.

LET'S GET IT STARTED: Pittsburgh's starting rotation comes into today with the fifth-lowest ERA (3.69) among all National League teams...The only four National League starting rotations to produce a lower ERA are the Phillies (2.68), Dodgers (3.40), Cubs (3.49) and Braves (3.57)... The Pirates are also tied for the fourth-most quality starts in MLB along with the Tigers...The only three teams with more quality starts are the Mariners (34), Phillies (33) and Royals (29).

ON THE ROAD: The Pirates scored 10 runs in game two of their doubleheader Wednesday against the Tigers...Pittsburgh's $10-2$ win in game two Wednesday was the team's largest margin of victory for the season and the most runs scored on the road since the team's historic nine-run come-from-behind $13-12$ win at Cincinnati on September $23 .$. .The Pirates have been outscored by a total of three runs (124-121) while going 14-15 on the road this year.
KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES: Andrew MCCutchen comes into today one hit (1603) shy of tying Tommy Leach for 11th place all-time in Pirates history...The 37 -year-old McCutchen is also four RBI shy of tying Gus Suhr (790) for seventh place all-time in team history since RBI became an official statisticin 1920 .

CUTCH CLUTCH: Andrew MCCutchen is hitting. 328 (21-for-64) with two doubles, five home runs, 11 RBI, 14 runs scored, 419 OBP, 594 slugging percentage and 1.013 OPS in 16 games dating back to May 11 ...During that time, McCutchen ranks fourth in the National League in OPS, fifth in batting, OBP and slugging, tied for first in home runs, and tied for third in runs scored.

NICKY G: Nick Gonzales doubled, homered and had two RBI in game two of the team's doubleheader on Wednesday...Since making his season debut on May 10, Gonzales has recorded 16 RBI, which ranks second in the National League behind San Francisco's Luis Matos (19)...During that time, the 25 -year-old Gonzales also ranks ninth in the National League in slugging (.547), eighth in OPS (.922) and tied for 14th in batting (.313).

DIALING LONG DISTANCE: The Pirates have hit 28 home runs this month heading into the final day of May...That's tied for the third-most in the National League along with the Braves, Mets and Cardinals...The only two National League teams with more home runs this month are the Dodgers (39) and Brewers (30)...Individually, Andrew McCutchen leads the team with five home runs this month followed by Oneil Cruz with four.

37 BUCS: Grant Koch became the 37 th different Pirate to appear in a game this season after making his big league debut on Wednesday...He also became the fifth different catcher the Pirates have used this season...The Pirates and Giants are the only two teams in MLB to use five catchers so far this season.
