METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Padres, 4-2, last night... The Mets are seeking their third series victory of the season... The Mets finish their first homestand of the season, a six-game stand against the Marlins (2-1) and Padres (1-1)...New York is off on Thursday before they head to the West Coast for their second road trip of the season, a 11-day, 10-game trip against the Athletics (three games), Dodgers (three games) and Giants (four games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY!: Happy Birthday to Tomás Nido (29) and Dennis Santana (27)...Jeff McNeil is the last player to homer on his birthday...Overall, 16 players have homered on their birthday in franchise history...Mike Piazza owns the franchise record, having homered on his birthday three times in his career...The last Met to earn a win on his birthday was Justin Wilson (August 18, 2020)...Jeremy Barnes celebrates his birthday tomorrow.

AMAZIN APRIL: In seven April starts since 2022, Tylor Megill is 6-0 with a 1.85 ERA (8 ER/39.0 IP) and 37 strikeouts...Megill's six wins in April since last season are eighth...Among qualifiers in March/April dating back to 2022, Megill is fifth in ERA and ninth in WHIP with a 0.95 mark (Min. 30.0 IP).

ADDING TO THE LIST: Today, Megill will make his first career start against the San Diego Padres...The Padres will be the 15th team Megill has faced in his career...In five career starts against NL West foes, Megill is 1-1 with a 5.60 ERA (17/27.1 IP).

RUBBER BAND MAN: The Mets play their first rubber game of the season today...The Mets were 18-4 in rubber games last season.

THE LEFTOVERS: The Mets left seven men on base last night... The team has now left 90 on base this season...That is tied for the fourth-most in the majors and tied for the second-most in the National League.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed only two errors in 12 games this season...The team's .995 fielding percentage is the best in the majors.

A HIT'S A HIT: The Mets have collected 14 infield hits this season, which is tied for the second-most in the majors...Last year, the Mets collected 186 infield hits, which was the fifth-most in franchise history and the third-most in the majors in 2022.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: As a team, the Mets are batting .246/.332/.402 against left-handed pitchers this season...That compares to a .186/.309/.294 slashline against righties...The Mets are 2-4 when a left-hander starts a game in 2023.

THE LEFT OF US: Brandon Nimmo is batting .308 (4-13) with a double and three walks against left-handed pitchers this year... He hit .264/.358/.428 with 24 walks and a .786 OPS in 234 plate appearances against left-handed pitchers last season...Since 2022, his 21 extra-base hits as a lefty against left-handed pitchers is tied for the fourth-most in the majors.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets are now 3-2 at Citi Field this year...The team won 54 games at home last year...That their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...The last time the team won more than 50 games in New York was in 2000 when they went 55-26...Overall, the Mets went 54-27 at Citi Field...The team's .667 winning percentage was the fourth-highest in team history... Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage.

DOCTOR ROBERT-SON: David Robertson has appeared in five games this season and has allowed only one hit in 5.0 innings with six strikeouts...He has tossed 3.0 consecutive perfect innings.

CURTAINS FROM CURTISS: John Curtiss hasn't allowed a run in his last 4.1 innings with five strikeouts and has yielded one run overall in 5.1 innings (1.42 ERA) in five outings.

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets have stolen 11 bases this season, which is third in the National League...Starling Marte fourth in the NL with four steals...Brandon Nimmo, who is tied for fifth in the NL, has stolen three bases in 11 games this year...Nimmo stole a total of three bases in 151 games last season.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has hit 65 home runs at Citi Field... That is the third-most in the history of the yard...Only Michael Conforto (66) and Lucas Duda (71) have hit more...Overall, Alonso has hit .247/.343/.497 in 265 career games at Citi Field.

OPENING LIN-DOOR: Over the last six games, Francisco Lindor is batting 7-22 (.318) with six runs, three doubles, a home run, six RBI, three walks with a .423 OBP and a .591 SLG.

WALK THE WALK: The Mets rank fourth in the majors and third in the National League with 52 free passes this season...Brandon Nimmo is tied for first in the majors with 12 walks...The Mets have recorded two walks with the bases loaded this season, which is tied for the third-most in the majors...In 2022, the team drew 10.

KING OF QUEENS: In five games at home this year, Jeff McNeil is 4-15 with two runs, three doubles, three RBI and six walks...He has hit .311 with 128 runs, 56 doubles, four triples, 25 home runs, 118 RBI and 77 walks in 266 career games at the yard...His .311 batting average is the second-highest by a Met at the ballpark (min. 100 PA)...Only Luis Castillo, .313, has a higher batting average in the history of the ballpark.

DAY MAN!: The Mets are 5-3 in day games this year...In 2022, the Mets went 39-19 in day games...The team's .672 winning percentage in the sunlight was the second-best in the National League and third-best in the majors...The Mets posted a 3.16 ERA with 150 walks and 564 strikeouts in the daytime last year...Their 3.16 ERA in the daytime was third in the majors and second in the NL.

MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

THE FRANCHISE HAS COMPANY: In Megill's last start, the Mets home opener on April 7 vs. Miami, the right-hander threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits...Megill joined Tom Seaver (April 5, 1983) as the only other pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0 shutout innings and allow three hits or fewer in a home opener...Courtesy of Elias.

AMAZIN APRIL: In seven April starts since 2022, Megill is 6-0 with a 1.85 ERA (8 ER/39.0 IP) and 37 strikeouts...Megill's six wins in April since last season are eighth...Among qualifiers in March/April dating back to 2022, Megill is fifth in ERA and ninth in WHIP with a 0.95 mark (Min. 30.0 IP).

ADDING TO THE LIST: Today, Megill will make his first career start against the San Diego Padres...The Padres will be the 15th team Megill has faced in his career...In five career starts against NL West foes, Megill is 1-1 with a 5.60 ERA (17/27.1 IP).

RELIEVOR: After starting the first 27 games of his major league career, Megill transitioned to the bullpen after returning from the 60-Day IL on September 19, 2022...Megill pitched to a 6.00 ERA (4 ER/6.0 IP) out of the bullpen...In his final appearance of the 2022 season, Megill threw 2.0 scoreless innings on October 4 vs. Washington.

COMBINED NO-NO: Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season on April 29 at Citi Field...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...The Mets combine no-hitter against the Phillies marked the 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodriguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bullpen. 17.1.

2022 RECAP: Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

OPENOR: Last year, Tylor Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY: His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021...According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).

FRIDAY'S STARTER: RHP KODAI SENGA (2-0, 1.59)

MLB DEBUT: Earned the victory after allowing a one run over 6.0 innings in his Citi Field debut on April 8 vs. Miami...Became the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two starts of their career joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry.

NOW YOU SEE IT, NOW YOU DON'T: Included in Senga's pitching repertoire is a unique pitch called the 'ghost fork'...The pitch is so named because its break gives the appearance that it disappears out of the strike zone...All eight of Senga's strikeouts on April 2 came via the 'ghost fork.'
