ROSTER MOVE: Prior to today's game, the Mets placed LHP David Peterson on the Paternity List...RHP Colin Holderman has been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Texas Rangers, 7-3, yesterday...Despite the loss, the Mets are 37-9 when scoring first this season...Their .804 winning percentage ranks fifth in MLB...With a win today, the Mets would secure their 18th series victory of the season...New York is 17-5-2 in 24 series this year...The Mets are in a stretch of 17 games in 17 days (1-1) to finish out the first-half...The Mets continue a six-day, five-game homestand (1-3) against the Astros (0-2) and Rangers (1-1)...Following this series, the Mets head to Cincinnati for a quick three-game road trip against the Reds.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Tommy Hunter turns 36 today.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: With the victory Friday night, Mets Manager Buck Showalter earned his 1,599th career managerial win...The win tied him for 22nd on the all-time win list with Tommy Lasorda...After Lasorda, Fred Clarke is next with 1,602 wins...His 1,599 wins ranks fourth among active managers.

DAY MAN: New York is 21-13 in day games this season...The team's .618 winning percentage in the sunlight is the fourth-best in the majors and the second-best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 3.23 ERA with 87 walks and 322 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 3.23 ERA in the daytime is fourth in the majors and second in the NL.

HERE COMES THE SUN KING: Francisco Lindor is batting .292 (38-130) with 24 runs, eight doubles, seven home runs, 19 RBI, 18 walks with a .380 OBP and a .515 SLG in 34 day games this season...This compares to a .212/.287/.345 slashline with 22 runs, three doubles, five home runs, 37 RBI and 14 walks in 43 games under the lights in 2022.

JUNE BLOOM: Congrats to Edwin Diaz who was named the National League Reliever of the Month for June...Diaz earned his sixth career Reliever of the Month Award and his first in the NL, most recently in August 2018 with the Seattle Mariners...He is the first Mets reliever to take home monthly honors since his bullpen-mate Seth Lugo in July 2019...Diaz made 10 appearances for the Mets while converting each of his five save opportunities...He posted a 0.93 ERA (one earned run/9.2 innings) on eight hits with a K/9 rate over 15.00...He has struck out 61 of the 125 batters he faced, good for 48.8%...He is 2-1 with 17 saves, a 2.01 ERA (seven earned runs/31.1 innings), allowing 24 hits and 11 walks...The Mets are 29-3 when Diaz appears in a game this year.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz has posted a 1-0 record with seven saves, a 0.71 ERA (one earned run/12.2 innings) with nine hits, two walks and 27 strikeouts over his last 13 appearances since May 27...Overall, he has recorded 17 saves this season, tied for the fifth-most in the majors...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 61 strikeouts...His 17.52 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 15.00...He has struck out 61 of the 125 batters he faced, good for 48.8%...He is 2-1 with 17 saves, a 2.01 ERA (seven earned runs/31.1 innings), allowing 24 hits and 11 walks...The Mets are 29-3 when Diaz appears in a game this year.

MARTE PARTAY: Over the last six games, Starling Marte is 9-24 (.375) with three runs, three doubles, a home run, two RBI, a walk, a steal with a .400 OBP, a .625 SLG and a 1.025 OPS...He is one double away from 250 for his career...In 47 games since May 1, Starling Marte is batting .309 (58-188) with 37 runs, 14 doubles, three triples, six home runs, 23 RBI, nine walks, five steals with a .347 OBP, a .511 SLG and an .857 OPS.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets have struck out 10 or more in a game 38 times this year...That is the second-most in the majors...Only the White Sox (39) and Braves (39) have recorded more such games...Overall, the Mets rank third in the majors with 723 strikeouts this season...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 587 times this season...That is the fifth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit.

NEW YORK RANGERS: Starling Marte is a lifetime .388 (33-85) hitter against the Texas Rangers...He has accumulated 18 runs, four doubles, a triple, five home runs, 157 RBI and a walk, a .416 OBP and a .635 SLG in 22 career games...Ender Inciarte has hit 6-19 (.316) with one homer and three RBI in six games against the club...Francisco Lindor is a lifetime .282 (33-117) hitter with 17 runs, six doubles, a triple, four home runs, 15 RBI, 14 walks, a .361 OBP and a .453 SLG in 29 career games against Texas.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets have played the fifth-fewest home games in the National League and are tied for the third-most road games...By comparison, the Braves are tied for the most home games in the NL...The Mets have won 14 of their last 19 home games...Overall, the Mets are 25-13 at home this year...They are third in the majors and top the National League with a .658 winning percentage at home...The Mets have posted a 3.50 ERA with 123 walks and 372 strikeouts at Citi Field this year...The Mets own the third-best home ERA in the National League.

ONE-RUN GAMES: The Mets have won five straight one-run games at home...The club's last one-run loss at home came in the second game of a doubleheader vs. St. Louis on May 17...The Mets are 8-3 in one-run games at home and 11-8 overall.

OUCH: Brandon Nimmo has been hit by 49 pitches in his career...That is the second-most HBP in team history...Pete Alonso is fourth with 46 HBP...Michael Conforto is the franchise leader with 50 in his Mets career.

RANGERS-METS NOTES: The Mets take on the Texas Rangers for the first time since 2017...The two teams were slated to face each other in 2020.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 48 games this season, the second-most in the National League...Their .623 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 48-30 record through the team's first 78 games...Only the 1986 (55-23) and the 1988 (50-28) teams posted a better record through the first 78 games of the season.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets continue Interleague play against the Rangers today...The Mets are 4-8 this year against the American League...The Mets went 9-11 in Interleague play in 2021...The team's .507 winning percentage (230-224) is the second-best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 52 times this year...The Mets have been hit 286 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is first in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 63 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 46 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 44 HBP and Jeff McNeil is tied for ninth at 37 HBP.

ONE AWAY: Jeff McNeil is one double away from 100 in his career...He ranks ninth in the majors and fifth in the National League with a .318 batting average...His batting average has not dropped below .300 since it was .280 on April 22...He is batting .355 (39-110) with 11 doubles, a triple, two home runs, 31 RBI with a .405 OBP and a .527 SLG with runners on base this year...His .355 average ranks 12th in the majors and ninth in the National League.

MULTIPLICITY: Pete Alonso has recorded 23 multi-hit games this year, which is tied with teammates Jeff McNeil and Starling Marte for the ninth-most in the National League...He has recorded 114 multi-hit games in his career...That places him 51st on the team's all-time list...Next up is Cliff Floyd who recorded 114 multi-hit games in his career.

MV-PETE: Pete Alonso became the third Mets player in team history to record 60 or more RBI before the All-Star break in multiple seasons...He joins Carlos Beltran (2006 and 2008) and David Wright (2006, 2008 and 2010)...The Mets record for most RBI in the first half is 74, accomplished by David Wright in 2006.

LIN THE CITI: Francisco Lindor has reached base safely in 20 of his last 23 home games, recording a hit in 18 of those contests...He is batting .288 (23-80) with 18 runs, a triple, three home runs, 20 RBI, 14 walks, four steals with a .404 OBP and a .425 SLG in those 22 games since May 14...Overall, he is batting .272/.382/.434 with 28 runs, two doubles, a triple, six home runs, 29 RBI, 21 walks and six steals in 38 games at Citi Field this year.

LINSANE IN THE MEMBRANE: Francisco Lindor has recorded 56 RBI in 77 games this year...Lindor did not record his 56th RBI until his 118th game last year on September 26...Lindor recorded a total of 63 RBI in 2021...Francisco Lindor set a franchise record with the most RBI by a shortstop before the All-Star break...José Reyes was the previous record holder, collecting 43 RBI before the 2008 Midsummer Classic.

THE GAME OF RISP: The Mets are second in the majors with a .270 average with runners in scoring position...They rank seventh in MLB with a .343 OBP...Jeff McNeil - .377 (23-61), Tomás Nido - .343 (12-35) and Pete Alonso - .319 (23-72) are all hitting .300 or better with RISP...Alonso leads the major leagues with 51 RBI in RISP situations...He has 10 home runs with runner(s) in scoring position this year, three more than any other hitter in the majors...Jeff McNeil's .377 average with RISP is ninth in the majors.

SIX DAYS UNTIL NO. 17: On July 9, 2022, the Mets will retire Keith Hernandez's uniform #17 prior to the Saturday, July 9 game vs. Miami...In anticipation of the event, the Mets are counting down 17 moments of Hernandez career with the Mets at metsheritage.com...Hernandez was elected to the Mets Hall of Fame in 1997, ranks second in team history in batting average (.297) and earned six Rawlings Gold Gloves with the Mets, the most in franchise history.

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Faced the same opponent in consecutive games for the first time since September of 2019...Took the loss on June 28 vs. Houston after allowing six runs on six hits (one home run) and three walks with four strikeouts through 4.1 innings.

TOUGH COOKIE: Carrasco has lost consecutive contests for the first time since losing three straight games to end the 2021 season (September 18-October 2)... Has allowed five or more runs in three of his last four outings after doing so just twice in his first 11 starts of the year...His 19 runs allowed through the last four starts are his most in a four-game span since also allowing 19 runs from August 2-17, 2016.

HOMER HAPPY: Has given up seven home runs across his last four starts after allowing just three homers through his first 11 starts of the season...The seven longballs are his most in any four-game span of his career.

VS. TEXAS: Will be facing the Rangers for the first time since July 21, 2018 at Texas while with Cleveland...Allowed two runs on five hits with one walk and eight strikeouts through 6.2 innings of the victory...Is 19-14 with a 4.16 ERA (127 earned runs/275.0 innings) in 52 career games (41 starts) against the AL West... Has gone 3-3 in 10 career games (eight starts) against Texas, pitching to a 6.10 ERA (33 earned runs/48.2 innings).

HOME SWEET HOME: Carrasco won five straight decisions at Citi Field from April 21-June 16, the longest single-season home winning streak of his career and second-longest such streak overall (six games, August 27, 2017-April 11, 2018)... Is 5-1 in eight home games this season with a 3.88 ERA (20 earned runs/46.1 innings), compared to going 3-3 and posting a 6.11 ERA (24 earned runs/35.1 innings) in seven starts on the road.

SWING AND A MISS: Among MLB qualifiers, Carrasco ranks second with a 36.3% chase rate...Only Kevin Gausman of the Blue Jays has a better rate (42.0%)... Carrasco has generated a 47.2% chase rate with his changeup, his highest of any pitch...He ranks ninth the majors with both a 34.0% strikeout percentage and 25.0% putaway percentage with the pitch (min. 50 PA)...His 32 strikeouts on his changeup are tied for ninth-most in the majors.

WALK THIS WAY: Has issued multiple walks in three straight starts for the first time this season...Allowed just one free pass or fewer in eight of his previous 12 starts this year...Owns a 3.86 strikeout-to-walk ratio and 6.0 percent walk rate, the eight- and ninth-best marks in the National League, respectively...Has 2.31 walks per 9.0 innings, good for 11th-best in the NL.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco needs three wins to become the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone, while he ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Struck out the 1,400th batter of his career on May 27 vs. Philadelphia, the fourth-highest strikeout total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,300 career innings pitched on April 10 at Washington.

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision of the Mets' 2-0 loss to the Astros on June 29 vs. Houston...Threw 7.1 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and three strikeouts...Marked his longest scoreless start since throwing a complete game shutout on September 13, 2016 at Los Angeles-AL while with Seattle.

QUALITY BUSINESS: Earned his fourth straight quality start in his last outing...Is the fourth such streak of his career and the first since September 14, 2015-April 25, 2016...The other two single-season occurrences of four straight quality starts or more came during the 2015 season.

- Ranks eighth in Mets history with 128 homers...Up next on the Mets all-time HR list: Michael Conforto (132) and Carlos Beltran (149).
- Became the second-fastest player ever to reach 125 home runs, doing so in his 435th career game with his second career grand slam on June 17 vs. Miami... Only Ryan Howard (405) was faster...Is one of three players with multiple slams this season.
