METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off in Miami yesterday...On Wednesday, the team swept a twinbill against the Pirates, winning game one, 5-1 and game two by a score of 10-0...The Mets are 70-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 31-9-3 in 43 series this year...The Mets are on the road for a seven-day, six-game trip (2-1) to Pittsburgh (2-1) and Miami (three games)...Following this trip, the Mets return home for a seven game homestand against the Cubs (three games) and Pirates (four games).

METS ON WIRE: According to sportradar, the Mets have won 60 games this season in which they never trailed, the most in the National League...Only the Houston Astros with 61 have recorded more this year...The team's 60 "wire-to-wire" wins are the fourth-most in franchise history...Only the 1986 (69), 1985 (66) and 1969 (63) teams have recorded more.

WINNING!: The Mets are seeking their 42nd win on the road today...With a victory, the Mets would clinch a winning record both at home and on the road...It would be the first time the team record winning records at home and on the road since 2016, when they collected 44 wins and home and 43 on the road...The Mets are seeking their 88th win today...It would be their most wins since they recorded 90 in 2015.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets have won 87 games this season, the second-most in the NL and the third-most in the majors...Their .630 winning percentage is third in the majors and is second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 87-51 record through the team's first 138 games...Only the 1986 (92-46) team posted a better record through the first 138 games of the season.

deHISTORY: With a win in his last start, Jacob deGrom tied Jon Matlack for seventh in Mets history with 82 victories...He has posted a 2.47 ERA in 205 career games with the Mets...That places him as the all-time ERA leader (min. 1000 IP)...Tom Seaver is second with a 2.57 ERA.

TOTAL deGROMINATION: deGrom recorded his sixth consecutive starts with eight or more strikeouts and one or zero walks in a game...According to Elias, since 1893, when the mound moved to its current distance from home plate, including deGrom there have been six pitchers to accomplish that feat...Jacob deGrom is the only major league pitcher to record a streak of five such games three times in his career.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: David Peterson has not allowed more than three runs in any of his last nine starts, going 4-2 in that span with a 2.68 ERA (16 earned runs/53.2 innings) with 19 walks and 73 strikeouts...He has struck out at least five batters in each of those starts...He is the first lefty to record at least five strikeouts in 10 straight starts for the Mets since Johan Santana recorded 13 such games from September 18, 2008 - May 27, 2009...Only three players in franchise history have had a longer streak than Peterson, Jerry Koosman, Johan Santana and Sid Fernandez.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Peterson is slated to make his 22nd appearance and 18th start of the season tonight...He is 7-3 with a 3.32 ERA (35 earned runs/95.0 innings) with 41 walks and 110 strikeouts...In 10 games (eight starts) on the road, Peterson is 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA (15 earned runs/47.2 innings) with 22 walks and 59 strikeouts...He will make his third start against the Marlins this year...He is 1-0 with a 1.46 ERA (two earned runs/12.1 innings) with two walks and 15 strikeouts against the club.

WELCOME TO MIAMI: Starling Marte has appeared in 72 games in his career at the ballpark and has hit .300/.363/.443 with 49 runs, 11 doubles, two triples, eight home runs, 32 RBI and 19 walks...Pete Alonso has hit .261 (23-88) with 16 runs, four doubles, a triple, 10 home runs, 17 RBI, 17 walks with a .383 OBP and a .670 SLG in 25 career games at the home of the Marlins.

LETS GO FISHING: Francisco Lindor has six home runs, 17 RBI and a 1.116 OPS in 14 games against Miami this year...Only six players have more RBI against a single opponent this season and no other player in MLB has driven in more than 11 runs against the Fish...Going back to September 2 of last season, Lindor has eight homers and 27 RBI in his last 22 games against the Marlins...Lindor is a .321 (17-53) hitter with eight runs, five doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, nine walks with a .419 OBP and a .528 SLG in 14 career games at loanDepot Park.

BLANK STREET COFFEE: The Mets recorded their major league-leading 18th shutout of the season on Wednesday night...The Mets recorded a total of eight shutouts in 2021...The team's 18 shutouts are tied with the 1976 team for the sixth-most in history...The last time the Mets recorded more in a single season as in 2010, when the team recorded 19 shutouts.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha has safely reached base in four straight games...Over his last 20 games, Canha is batting .308 (20-65) with 11 runs, 10 doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI, four walks with a .384 OBP, a .646 SLG and a 1.030 OPS...He is batting .293 (72-246) with 15 doubles, six home runs and 25 walks against right-handed pitchers this season...He has recorded 18 extra-base hits in 40 games since the break compared to 15 he collected in 77 first-half games...Canha slugging .492 in the second half (.381 SLG in the first half).

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won five of their last six games in Miami...New York is 49-45 since loanDepot Park opened up in 2012.

RAKEQUIN: Tyler Naquin has hit .345 with five home runs in 16 career games against the Marlins, and his .818 slugging percentage is third highest all-time by any opposing hitter (min. 50 PA)...The only players with higher marks are Mark McGwire (.917) and David Ortiz (.886)...Naquin went 5-11 (.455) with a double, a home run, four RBI and two runs scored in the Mets' series victory at Pittsburgh.

FOGO POWER: Eduardo Escobar has safely hit in six straight games, batting .526 (10-19) with four runs, three home runs, six RBI, three walks and a 1.565 OPS in that span...Over his last 10 games, Escobar is batting .433 (13-30) with four runs, a doubles, three homers, six RBI, three walks with a 1.237 OPS.

AND I WOULD PLAY .500 TEAMS: The Mets will face the 56-80 Marlins today...Each of their next 10 games and 18 of their 24 remaining games are against teams who currently have records below .500...The Mets are 48-21 against teams with a record below .500 this year, giving them a .696 winning percentage...Their .696 winning percentage is the fourth-highest in MLB vs. sub-.500 opponents.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 41-28 on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their 2021 road wins total (30-51)...Their .594 road winning percentage is the fourth-best in MLB and third-best in the NL...New York is batting .261/.329/.417 away from Citi Field...Their .261 road average is the best in the NL and third in the majors and their .326 OBP on the road ranks second in the majors and in the NL.

TWO AWAY: Brandon Nimmo is two RBI away from 200 for his career...He is batting .302 with 53 runs, 13 doubles, two triples, 11 home runs, 36 RBI, 32 walks with a .395 OBP and a .489 SLG in 67 road games this season...This compares to a .222/.297/.342 slashline with 20 extra-base hits, 13 RBI and 21 walks in 61 games at Citi Field...He has safely reached base in 34 of his last 35 road games, batting .324 (47-145) with 30 runs, eight doubles, seven home runs, 21 RBI, 15 walks with a .404 OBP and a .524 in that span that started on June 12...Overall, his .302 average on the road ranks eighth in the National League.

ABOVE AVERAGE: Jeff McNeil ranks third in the majors with a .328 batting average...He is behind only Paul Goldschmidt (.328) and Freddie Freeman (.324)...José Reyes is the only player in Mets history to be crowned a batting champion after hitting .337 in 2011.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil leads the majors with .350 (77-220) batting average on the road...He has recorded 26 runs, 22 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 21 RBI, 13 walks with a .395 OBP and a .500 SLG in 58 games away from Citi Field...He is slashing .350/.377/.509 in 43 games following the All-Star break...His .350 average is fifth in the majors and fourth in the NL...Dating back to August 20, McNeil has just three strikeouts in his last 68 plate appearances...Overall this season, McNeil ranks eighth among qualified hitters and third in the NL with an 11.6 percent strikeout rate.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso has collected 26 game-winning RBI this year, setting a Mets single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985) with 24...That is the most by any player since the statistic was officially tracked in 1974...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) with 27 each are the only players with more in a season (data incomplete pre-1974)...Alonso has 10 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 12 of the Mets' 29 second-half wins.

PUTTING UP LUG-O'S: Seth Lugo has not allowed a run in 11 of his last 12 appearances...He has tossed 13.0 innings in that span, allowed 10 hits, four walks, struck out 16 and posted a 0.69 ERA (one earned run/13.0 innings)...In 18 games following the All-Star break, Lugo has posted a 1.40 ERA (three earned runs/19.1 innings) with seven walks and 21 strikeouts.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 101 strikeouts...That is 14 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Craig Kimbrel (53.1 IP in 2017, 54.0 IP in 2012) and Chapman (53.2 IP in 2012) round out the top five fastest to 100 K all-time...Armando Benítez owned the previous franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings...Courtesy of Elias...Díaz has posted a 0.83 ERA (three earned runs/32.2 innings) with 15 hits, seven walks and 63 strikeouts in 32 appearances since the start of June.

30 FOR 39: Díaz is seventh in the majors with 29 saves this year...He is seeking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with at least 30 saves...John Franco is the franchise leader with five such seasons.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Went 5.1 innings against the Nationals allowing three runs on a season-high tying eight hits...Peterson struck out six batters for the 12th time this season which is tied for 10th-most such games by a left-handed pitcher.

STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT: Peterson has struck out at least five batters in 10 straight starts since June 20...He has 73 strikeouts across 55.0 innings since then (12 G/10 GS) for a 12.27 K/9 ratio, a mark that ranks fifth in the majors in that span (min. 50.0 IP)...His 73 strikeouts over his last 10 starts are the most by a Mets left-handed starter over a nine-game span since Johan Santana punched out 71 batters in nine starts from April 18-June 9, 2009.

THE RUN DOWN: Peterson has four or fewer earned runs in each of his 17 starts this season...Currently, his 17-game streak is the fourth-longest active streak by a left-handed starter...The last left-handed Mets starter with a 17-game streak without allowing more than four earned runs was Jerry Koosman from June 29 - September 18, 1968...Only three other lefty starters have had a longer such streak across a single season in franchise history Mickey Lolich (20), Johan Santana (19), and Jerry Koosman (18)...Peterson has not allowed more than three earned runs in his last 10 straight starts owning a 2.68 ERA (16 earned runs/53.2 innings) in that span.

VS. MIAMI: This season, Peterson owns a 1.46 ERA (two earned runs/12.1 innings) through two starts against the Marlins...Across three career starts against his division rival, he owns a 2.08 ERA (four earned runs/17.1 innings)...Peterson is 3-2 with a 3.38 ERA (17 earned runs/46.2 innings) in eight games (seven starts) against the NL East this season.

ROAD TRIP: In 10 road games, eight starts, this season, Peterson is 2-2 with an ERA of 2.83 (15 earned runs/47.2 innings) with 59 strikeouts and 22 walks across 10 road games...His 2.83 road ERA ranks sixth in the NL and 10th in the majors among left-handed pitchers (min. 40.0 IP)...He is 5-8 with a 4.49 ERA (57 earned runs/114.1 innings) in his career away from Citi Field.

LETHAL LEFTY: This season, Peterson has limited lefties to a .197 (15-76) average...Among left-handed hurlers, it is eighth-best opponents' average in the National League (min. 75 LHB faced).

SLIP 'N' SLIDE: Peterson has held batters to a .178 (23-129) average with his slider this season and 72 of his 110 strikeouts have come on the pitch...His 50.7 slider-strikeout percentage is the second-highest in MLB (min. 100 PA) behind only teammate Edwin Diaz (53.1).

FOUR-HIT WONDER: Has allowed four hits or fewer in 11 of his 17 starts this season and in 15 of his 21 total games...In his career, he has allowed four or fewer hits in 33 of 46 career games (183 career hits)...Among Mets hurlers, only Nolan Ryan (156 hits) allowed less hits in their first 46 major league games (min. 200.0 IP).

200 KLUB: Struck out the 200th batter of his career on August 6 vs. Atlanta when he punched out Matt Olson swinging in the sixth frame...Is the 10th pitcher in Mets history to reach 200 strikeouts in their first 43 career games...He was the first to accomplish the feat since Steven Matz recorded his 200th strikeout in his 39th career game in 2017.

ON THE FARM AND IN THE ARM BARN: Peterson has made six starts with Triple-A Syracuse this season...He has gone 2-3 and has posted a 4.85 ERA (14 earned runs/26.0 innings) with 10 walks against 34 strikeouts...In four outings out of the bullpen this year, Peterson has gone 1-0, posting a 4.50 ERA (four earned runs/8.0 innings)...This compares to a 3.32 ERA (45 earned runs/95.0 innings) while going 7-3 in 17 starts.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (13-6, 3.91 ERA)

LAST TIME OUT: Made his return from the IL in front of the Citi Field crowd on September 4...Suffered the loss after allowing five total runs, with only one earned across his 2.2 innings of work...Carrasco struck out two batters and walked two.

YOU GOTTA EARN IT: His last start was Carrasco's ninth consecutive start allowing three or fewer earned runs, the second-longest active streak by a Mets starter this season...This streak ties a career-high from June 13-July 27, 2016...His nine-game streak is tied for the third-longest streak by a Mets starter this season.

- Lined a walk-off single on August 26 vs. Colorado...Was his second walk-off RBI of the year...He is tied for sixth in Mets history with six career walk-off RBI.
