

IETSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 7-0, on Thursday night...The Mets are coming off a seven-game road trip (4-3) to St. Louis (3-1) and Atlanta (1-2)... The Mets were off yesterday...Tonight, they return to New York to open a 10-day, nine-game homestand against the Angels (three games), Rangers (three games) and Mariners (three games).

KODAI SENGA GIVEAWAY: The first 15,000 fans in attendance tomorrow Friday, Aug. 25 will receive a voucher for Glow-in-the-Dark Ghost Fork Ball redeemable upon exit...This voucher can ONLY be redeemed upon exit from the ballpark at the Jackie Robinson Rotunda Gate on the date of distribution.

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: The Mets are encouraging all fans attending the games taking place August 25th - September 3rd to take the train to the game...With the capacity crowds expected at both Citi Field and the US Open, using mass transit and rideshare will be the most efficient ways to arrive to the ballpark...The LIRR and the 7 train have added additional trains for baseball and tennis fans...If you drive, please arrive early to avoid traffic delays.

LITTLE BLACK BACKPACK: Earlier today, Mr. and Mrs. Met visited the Queens Public Library at Elmhurst to help distribute backpacks filled with brand-new school supplies provided by the Amazin' Mets Foundation...This distribution was made possible through a \$175,000 grant to New York Cares that will provide 10,000 backpacks to local Title I schools and community organizations

150: Kodai Senga now has 154 strikeouts on the season...He became the seventh pitcher in franchise history to record at least 150 strikeouts in his rookie season... Senga is tied with Gary Gentry for sixth place among rookie pitchers in team history (Gentry had 154 in 1969)...His is the fifth pitcher of Japanese origin to post at least 150 strikeouts as a rookie, joining Hideo Nomo (236 in 1995), Yu Darvish (221 in 2012), Daisuke Matsuzaka (201 in 2007), and Kenta Maeda (179 in 2016)... Courtesy of sportsradar.

LIVIN' IN THE CITI: Tonight the Mets begin a nine-game, 10-day homestand...The Mets have played 59 games at home this year, tied for the fewest in the majors. New York is 31-28 at Citi Field this year, posting a 4.14 ERA.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: In 31 games this year, DJ Stewart is batting .261 (18-69) with nine runs, four doubles, six home runs, 12 RBI, eight walks, a. 342 OBP and a .580 SLG...Over the last eight games, Stewart is batting .393 (11-28) with two doubles, five home runs and nine RBI...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

LINSANITY: Lindor is on a 10-game hitting streak, batting .400 (16-40) in that span with 10 runs, four doubles, one home run, eight RBI, three walks and three steals...Over his last 56 games, he is batting .311 (65-209) with 44 runs, 11 doubles, two triples, 11 home runs, 34 RBI, 28 walks, 16 steals with a .399 OBP, a .545 SLG and a .945 OPS...Lindor has stolen 22 bases in 126 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.3 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.3 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (18.1) and Mookie Betts (17.3) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.3 fWAR since 2021 ranks fifth in the majors in that span.

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil has safely hit in 16 of his last 19 games, batting .347 (26-75) with 13 runs, three doubles, three home runs, 13 RBI, and four walks with a .507 SLG in that span...In 38 games following the All-Star break, McNeil is batting .293 (44-150) with 22 runs, six doubles, one triple, three home runs, 21 RBI, seven walks with a .344 OBP...He has struck out only 12 times in 163 plate appearances following the All-Star break.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is second in the majors and in the NL with 95 RBI. He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...He is seeking to become the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.

MONTHLY REPORT: Pete Alonso has recorded nine home runs in 23 games this month...His career-best for any single month is 11 home runs, which he recorded in 27 games in September of 2019...He has recorded five months with at least 10 home runs in his career...His next home run would mark the second time this year that Alonso has hit 10 homers in a single month...He hit 10 home runs in May...He also hit one home run in March and nine in April.

THIS IS ALMOST 40: Pete Alonso is third in the majors and second in the National League with 39 home runs...Alonso is one home run shy of recording his third season of 40 or more home runs...He socked 53 in 2019 and 40 last season... He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...Since he entered the league in 2019, only two other players have recorded multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs (Shohei Ohtani and Mike Trout)... Only one active player (Nelson Cruz, four) has more than three 40-HR seasons...Alonso's 185 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...With one more long ball, he'll become the fifth player in MLB history with three or more seasons with 40+ home runs in a player's first five years...He would join Ralph Kiner (4), Ryan Howard (3), Albert Pujols (3) and Eddie Matthews (3).

GIMME A BREAK: Alonso is hitting .248 (34-137) with 20 extra-base hits, 34 RBI, 23 runs, 17 walks and a .939 OPS in 38 games following the All-Star break...He batted .211 (64-304) with 50 runs, seven one triple, 26 home runs and 61 RBI in the 82 games before the break.

RETURN OF THE BACH: Daniel Vogelbach has recorded four home runs over his last 11 games...He is batting .290 (9-31) in that span with six runs, 11 RBI, eight walks with a .450 OBP and a .677 SLG...He has posted an .798 OPS in 27 games following the All-Star break.

INVADER NIM: Over the last 15 games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .345 (20-58) with eight runs, two doubles, three home runs, four RBI, nine walks, a .433 OBP and a .534 SLG...He is batting .297 (46-155) with 11 doubles, one triple, two home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks with a .366 OBP and a .419 SLG against left-handed pitchers this year...His .297 average is the eighth-best in the majors by a left-handed hitter against fellow lefties.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 36-11 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 15-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1985, Dwight Gooden turned in a quality start in a 9-3 win over the Padres to earn his 20th victory of the season... With the win, Gooden becames the youngest pitcher in MLB history to win 20 games in a season...Yesterday, the Mets announced the team will retire Darryl Strawberry's No. 18 and Dwight Gooden's No. 16 in separate pre-game ceremonies in 2024...In 1985, Doc became the youngest pitcher ever to win Cy Young honors when he captured the "Triple Crown" of pitching, leading the majors in wins (24), strikeouts (268) and ERA (1.53).

DOWN ON THE FARM: The Rumble Ponies scored four runs in the ninth inning to pull out a come-from-behind 7-6 win over the New Hampshire Fisher Cats...The team improved to 60-56 overall and 25-22 in the second-half...Binghamton got on the board first as Jeremiah Jackson launched a solo home run over the left center field wall in the fourth...It was his 20th home run on the season and his fifth in 19 games with the Ponies...The infield prospect has homered in three straight games and is riding a nine-game hitting streak.

SENGA NEWS & NOTES

METS ROOKIE MILESTONE WATCH: In his last start, August 19 at St. Louis, Senga became the seventh Mets rookie pitcher ever to reach the 150-strikeout mark...Senga finished his start reaching 154 strikeouts, tied with Gary Gentry for sixth all-time among Mets rookie hurlers...Senga is 12 strikeouts away from tying Noah Syndergaard for fifth all-time among Mets rookies...The right-hander also earned his 10th win of the season in his last start, becoming the 12th rookie in franchise history to reach double-digit wins in a season...Senga became the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee won 13 games as a rookie in 2011.

HARD TO HIT: This season, Senga has three starts of 7.0 or more innings and two or fewer hits allowed, tied with Shohei Ohtani and Reid Detmers of the Angels for the second-most such starts this season...That is tied with Dwight Gooden for the most such starts by a Mets rookie in a single season...Only Nolan Ryan (4, 1970) and Jacob deGrom (5, 2015) have had more such starts in a single season in franchise history.

I LOVE MY NEW HOME: Senga's 2.63 ERA (20 ER/68.1 IP) is the fourth-best mark in the NL and the seventh-best mark in the majors...Senga has held opposing batters to a .184 average at home, the lowest-mark in the NL and the third-lowest mark in the majors...His $11.06 \, \text{SO/9}$ rate at home is the fourth-highest in the NL and the 10th-highest in the majors (Min. 60.0 IP at home).

SENGA GENESIS: Senga has recorded 154 strikeouts through his first 23 career major league games, the fourth-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (185), Matt Harvey (165) and Noah Syndergaard (156) have recorded more during that span...His 154 strikeouts are the fourth-most by a Japanese born pitcher through 23 career games...He trails only Hideo Nomo (212), Yu Darvish (172) and Masahiro Tanaka (159)...Senga's 3.19 ERA is the eighth-lowest mark by a Mets pitcher through their first 23 career major league games (Min. 100.0 IP).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: Senga's 10 wins are the most among all major league rookies this season and his 154 strikeouts also lead all major league rookies...Among qualified National League pitchers, Senga is fourth in the in opponent's average (.211), fourth in SO/9 (10.69) and fifth in ERA (3.19)...Senga ranks third in the majors in opponent's average against left-handed batters with a .192 (43 - 224) clip (Min. 200 LHB faced).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On July 8, Major League Baseball announced that Kodai Senga was added to the National League All-Star team, which took place on July 11 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle...Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He is the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 81 of his 154 strikeouts through 23 starts...The pitch has a 58.6 percent whiff rate and a 27.3 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just 16 hits in 121 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .128 batting average.

MLB DEBUT NOTES: Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

NPB CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).
