**FLIGHT PATTERN:** The St. Louis Cardinals and visiting Athletics play the second game of a three-game series tonight at Busch Stadium ... After Thursday’s scheduled off day, the Cardinals continue their six-game Northern California homestand by welcoming the San Francisco Giants for three games over Cardinals Hall of Fame Weekend ... The Cardinals open play today in 4th place in the National League Central, 17.0 games behind first place Milwaukee and 6.5 games out of the final NL Wild Card position.

**WINNING FORMULA:** The Cardinals are needing a 14-9 run over their final 23 games to finish with a winning mark, above .500 ... St. Louis has had winning marks in 25 of their past 31 seasons since joining the NL Central Division in 1994 and in 23 of their 25 seasons played since 2000.

**ENDING ON A HIGH NOTE:** Since 2000, the Cardinals 406 combined regular season wins in September/October are 2nd-most in Major League Baseball behind only the Yankees (417) ... St. Louis ended last season by going 15-11 in Sept./Oct.

- According to *Elias*, the Cardinals play the toughest remaining strength of schedule, with combined .540 winning pct. against the Athletics (2g), Giants (6g), Mariners (3g), Brewers (6g), Reds (3g), and Cubs (3g).

**YUNGRY:** The Cardinals rank 4th in MLB this season with 446 combined games by players age 24 or younger, trailing the Rockies (534), Athletics (571), and Nationals (611) ... Cardinals age 24 or younger include **Jordan Walker** (age 23), **Masyn Winn** (23), **Jimmy Crooks** (23), **Thomas Saggese** (23), **Victor Scott II** (24), **Nathan Church** (24), and **Michael McGreevy** (24).

- According to *Baseball Reference* (Weighted by AB+Games), Cardinals position players rank as MLB’s 5th-youngest (age 26.8) behind the Orioles (26.8), Athletics (26.2), Nationals (25.9), and Marlins (25.8).

**DH DIGITS:** **Iván Herrera** plays his 67th game of the season at Designated Hitter tonight, 2nd-most single-season all-time among Cardinals behind **Albert Pujols** (69 games in 2022) ... At age 25, Herrera’s 67 games at designated hitter are the most by any Major League age 25 or younger since 25-year-old **Yordan Alvarez** appeared in 77 games at DH for Houston in 2022.

**FEED THE FAMILY:** **Iván Herrera**’s homer yesterday into Big Mac Land yesterday was the 3rd of his career (all this season), tying **Nolan Arenado** for 5th-most at Busch Stadium (2006-25) ... **Paul Goldschmidt** holds the unofficial stadium record with 8.

**INTERLEAGUE ACTION:** St. Louis is 286-282 all-time in Interleague play, with a .504 win pct. that ranks 15th-best MLB ... The Cardinals are 20-23 in Interleague games this season, but just 8-14 at home after dropping their last eight (June 5-present).

**TIME TO FLY:** When **Jimmy Crooks** and **César Prieto** recently made their Major League debuts on Aug. 29 at Cincinnati, it marked the first time two Cardinals position players made MLB debuts in the same game since pinch hitter **Greg Garcia** and defensive replacement **Randal Grichuk** on April 28, 2014 vs. Milwaukee.

**MERCY ME:** The Cardinals enter today without 3B **Nolan Arenado** (right shoulder), 2025 All-Star **Brendan Donovan** (groin), LHP **John King** (mid-back strain), 1B/OF **Alec Burleson** (right wrist) and C **Yohel Pozo** (concussion) currently on the Injured List, in addition to LHP **Zack Thompson** who has missed the entire season.

#### OAKLAND/SACRAMENTO/LAS VEGAS ATHLETICS CONNECTIONS

**Sonny Gray** was selected by Oakland in the 1st round (#18) of the 2011 MLB Draft...pitched parts of his first five seasons with the Athletics (2013-17) before traded to the Yankees with international bonus slot money for **Dustin Fowler**, **James Kaprielian**, and Jorge Mateo (July 31, 2017).

**Yohel Pozo** played two minor league seasons for Triple-A Las Vegas (2023-24) in the Athletics organization...made his MLB debut vs. Oakland while with Texas (Aug. 13, 2021) and singled off Cole Irvin for his first MLB hit.

**Jacob Wilson**’s father, **Jack Wilson**, was selected by the Cardinals in the 9th round of the 1998 MLB Draft and played parts of two minor league seasons in the Cardinals organization before being traded to the Pirates for LHP **Jason Christiansen** (July 29, 2000).

**Daniel Descalso** was born in Redwood City, Calif...graduated from Saint Francis High School in Mountain View in 2004...played college baseball at University of California, Davis (2005-07)...resides in Danville, Calif.

Former 1999 Athletics 2nd round draft pick **Ryan Ludwick** and **Jason Isringhausen**, who pitched for the Athletics (1999-2001), are both Cardinals Player Development Special Advisors.

Athletics Hitting Coach **Mike Aldrete** was the Cardinals Asst Hitting Coach (2008-11) and Bench Coach (2012-14)...member of the Cardinals 2011 World Championship team and 2013 NL pennant winner...his son, **Michael Aldrete**, was selected by St. Louis in the 39th round of the 2012 Draft.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Willie McGee** played 29 games for the Athletics in 1990 and was a member of their AL Championship squad...traded by St. Louis to Oakland for **Daryl Green**, **Félix José**, and **Stan Royer**...was born in San Francisco...graduated from Harry Ells High School in Richmond...played college baseball at Diablo Valley College in Pleasant Hill...worked as an assistant coach for Contra Costa College in San Pablo...resides in Hercules.

Cardinals Video Coordinator **Chad Blair** previously served in a similar role with the Athletics from (1988-95)...is a native of nearby Santa Rosa, Calif.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Matt Holliday** played 93 games for the 2009 Athletics before traded St. Louis for **Clayton Kershaw**, **Shane Peterson**, and **Brett Wallace** (July 24, 2009).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Mark McGwire** played parts of 12 seasons in Oakland (1986-97)...1987 AL Rookie of the Year...1989 World Series Champion & member of three AL pennant winners (1988-90)...eight-time AL All-Star (1987-92, ‘95-97)...won two Silver Sluggers (1992 & ‘96) and one Gold Glove (1990)...selected by Oakland in the 1st round (#10) in the 1984 MLB Draft...traded to St. Louis for **Eric Ludwick**, **T.J. Mathews** and **Blake Stein**.

Hall of Famer **Dennis Eckersley** pitched nine seasons with Oakland (1987-95) and two with St. Louis (1996-97)...converted 386 of his 390 career saves between the Athletics (320) and Cardinals (66).

Cardinals Manager of Player Development & Performance **Emily Wiebe** grew up in nearby San Francisco, Calif...attended University High School.

**Dean Kiekhefer** pitched in four games for the Athletics during the 2018 season.

**Brandon Allen** played in 44 games for the Athletics from 2011-12 & was the A’s Opening Day First Baseman in 2012.

Athletics Quality Control Coach **Marcus Jensen** played 16 games for St. Louis in 1999.

Cardinals Hall of Famer and broadcaster **Al Hrabosky** was born in Oakland, Calif.

Athletics Head Athletic Trainer **Jeff Collins** is a SIU-Edwardsville graduate.

Hall of Fame Manager **Tony La Russa** was a manager of the Athletics (1986-95) and Cardinals (1996-2011)...is only manager to win multiple pennants in both leagues and one of two (Sparky Anderson) to win a World Series in both...His 70 postseason victories (50 with St. Louis, 19 with Oakland, & 1 with Chicago) rank 2nd to Joe Torre (84)...La Russa piloted the A’s to four division titles, three AL pennants, and the 1989 World Championship...is A’s franchise wins leader (798)...also played parts of four seasons in Oakland (1968-71).

Cardinals broadcaster **Brad Thompson** was born in Las Vegas...graduated from Cimarron-Memorial High School in Las Vegas in 2000.

Cardinals broadcaster **Chip Caray**’s son, **Chris Caray**, is an Athletics broadcaster.

Athletic writer **Katie Woo** is a native of Vacaville, Calif...previously covered the Giants, 49ers, & Warriors for NBC Sports Bay Area & California.

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Makes his 27th start of the season and 209th career. 198 starts have been with the Cardinals (2018-present) and 10 with the Rangers in 2014.
- Has held his opposition to four hits or less in 13 starts this season, most of any Cardinals starter and T-7th most in the National League (Peralta, MIL, 18).
- Aiming to become the 12th Cardinals pitcher with 200 career starts, joining most recent Redbirds to accomplish the feat with Adam Wainwright and Matt Morris.
- At age 37 is the oldest player on the team’s active roster.
- Has not received more than three runs of support in any of his last 13 starts. His 21 runs total since June 15 rank tied for 3rd-fewest in MLB, trailing teammate Andre Pallante (16) in 1st.
- ***Receiving an average of 3.24 run support per game; lowest in the National League and 2nd-lowest behind former Cardinal Michael Wacha (KC, 3.17).***
- Has not earned a road win since May 17 at Kansas City (1-0).
- Has made 25+ starts in six seasons, all with the Cardinals.
- Has surrendered 7 HR in 70.2 innings at home, but 17 homers in 59.2 innings on the road.
- Has hurled 6.0+ innings in 8 of his 26 starts (7 quality starts).
- Mikolas is one of just 3 MLB pitchers to have made as many as 197 starts exclusively with one team since he joined the Cardinals in 2018; also Philadelphia's **Aaron Nola** (220) & Colorado's **Kyle Freeland** (197)
- Opened the season with 29.0 homerless IP (March 31-April 30), but averaging MLB-leading 2.02 HR/9 IP since May 1.
- Has entered his 8th season (was injured for all of 2020) with the Cardinals in 2025; Leads active Cardinals pitchers in wins (66), innings pitched (1,132.1), strikeouts (818) and games started (198).
- The Cardinals are 107-91 in his 198 career starts with St. Louis and Miles holds a 66-68 mark as a Cardinal.
- Since joining St. Louis in 2018, Mikolas leads MLB in first strike percentage (68.2) and lowest walk percentage (4.4%).

**LAST TIME OUT (Thursday, August 28 vs. Pittsburgh Pirates):** Received a no decision tossing 5.0 innings allowing one run, fewest runs allowed since July 25 vs. SD (1 run), as the Cardinals rallied late to win 4-1.

2025 NOTES:

- St. Louis is 12-14 in his starts this season. The Cardinals lost each of his first 5 starts to begin the season, then won 7-straight from April 30-June 5.
- Pitched three scoreless starts this season (22nd career since joining STL in 2018). Posted two scoreless starts in July (7/10 vs. WSH & 7/25 vs. SD).
- Surrendered a franchise record six home runs vs. CHI (7/4) at Wrigley Field en route to a franchise record eight total home runs (King - 2) allowed by the Cardinals. Five of the six home runs allowed were solo. Of pitchers who have allowed six home runs in MLB history, pitched the longest outing (6.0) since Tommy Thomas of the St. Louis Browns (6/27/1936) vs. NYY.
- Blanked the Reds over 5.1 IP (77 pitches) on April 30 in Game 1 of double header at Great American Ball Park. Was credited with his 1st win of the season as he and three relievers combined on the 6-0 shutout win. The Cardinals got back/back/back HR's from Scott II, Nootbaar and Winn to break the game open in the 9th inning.
- Fanned a season-high 7 batters in his 6/15 start at MIL over 6.0 IP.

MIKOLAS vs. ATHLETICS:

- Has made two starts vs. the Athletics, one as a member of the Rangers in 2014 and another with St. Louis at Busch Stadium in 2013.
- Is 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA in the two starts covering 11.0 innings with five strikeouts.
- Took the loss on July 27, 2014 at the Ballpark in Arlington allowing eight runs (7 ER) over 4.2 innings in a 9-3 loss opposing Scott Kazmir.
- Did not factor in the decision on Aug. 14, 2023 at Busch Stadium as the Cardinals won 7-5. Tossed 6.1 innings allowing four runs exiting with a 4-3 deficit. St. Louis rallied four runs in the 7th inning on a bases loaded walk followed by a 3-RBI triple by Jordan Walker.
