BOSTON RED SOX (1-2)

TIED FOR FOURTH PLACE, AL EAST, -1.0 GB

ROSTER MOVES: Following last night's game, the Mets optioned RHP Corey Oswalt to the team's Alternate Training Site...RHP Tyler Bashlor has been recalled from the team's Alternate Training Site.

METSELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 14-1, last night...The Mets dropped their first series of the season...The team has dropped two straight games...The team hits the road for the first time this season for a two game series before returning to NY for another two against the Red Sox.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets went 21-12 on the road in the second half of the 2019 season...The Mets finished winning 13 of their last 20 and four of their last five games on the road...Overall, the team went 38-43 on the road last year after finishing 40-41 on the road in 2018.

SHIPPING UP TO BOSTON: The Mets head north to take on the Red Sox for the first time since 2018...The team dropped two of the three games against Boston...Overall, this marks the sixth time in team history that the Mets will play at Fenway during regular season play...New York is 6-9 at Fenway during the regular season.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets own the best Interleague winning percentage in NL history...Their .517 winning percentage (208-194) is the best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

SHAKE IT OFF: The Mets allowed 14 runs last night, their highest total since April 14, 2019 (14-3 loss at Philadelphia), which was also their highest a season-high...New York has scored a total of five runs in its first three games of the season, its fewest through three team games since 1981 (also five runs).

ROADSARIO: Amed Rosario ranked eighth in the majors and fourth in the NL with a .323 road batting average last year...He placed second in the majors with 104 hits on the road and tied for first with six triples in away games...He batted .382 (52-136) with 24 runs, nine doubles, two triples, four home runs, 17 RBI, five walks, six steals, a .408 OBP, a .566 SLG and a .975 OPS in 32 games on the road in the second-half...Overall, he finished with a .323/.352/.484 slash line with 32 extra-base hits and 41 RBI in 79 road games in 2019.

CONFORTOBLY NUMB: Michael Conforto has safely reached base in all three games of the season...He is 4-8 with a run, a double, a walk and was hit by a pitch...His .500 batting average is second in the National League and is tied for sixth in the majors.

I LIKE MIKE: Conforto has hit 109 home runs in his career which is 12th on the Mets all-time list...Conforto belted 33 homers last season, setting a career-high...Conforto previously set it with 28 in 2018...Conforto is one of five players in team history with 30 or more home runs, 90 or more RBI and 80 or more walks in a single season...Also David Wright (2008, 2007), Carlos Beltrán (2006), Darryl Strawberry (1988, 1987) and Howard Johnson (1987).

OH MR. WILSON: Justin Wilson has not allowed a run in both appearances this season...He has tossed 1.1 innings and allowed two hits, while striking out three while earning two holds...The lefty posted a 4-2 record with a 2.54 ERA (11 earned runs/39.0 innings) last year with 19 walks and 44 strikeouts...After coming back from injury, Wilson posted a 1.82 ERA (six earned runs/29.2 innings) with a .220 opponent's batting average in his final 35 games.

METS-RED SOX NOTES: The Mets and Red Sox face each other in a four game home-and-home series...This marks the first time the two teams have played each other since 2018...The Mets defeated the Red Sox in the 1986 World Series in seven games.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base in all three games this season...He is 3-10 with a double, an RBI, a walk and a .817 OPS...He has reached base safely in each of his last 18 games dating back to last season...In his final 26 games of the 2019 season, Nimmo hit .261/.430/.565 with 14 runs, a triple, five home runs, 20 walks and two steals.

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: The Mets had three All-Stars last season: Pete Alonso, Jacob deGrom and Jeff McNeil...Overall in the Mets' player pool, there are 16 players who have previously been selected as All-Stars.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Andrés Giménez entered the season as the third-best Mets prospect and the No. 84 overall prospect in the majors, per *MLB Pipeline*...After spending the 2019 season with Binghamton (AA), the Venezuelan shortstop led the Arizona Fall League with a .371 (26-70) average and .999 OPS.

SIXTY-GAME SPRINT: Over the final 60 games of the 2019 season, the Mets' 39-21 mark tied for the second-best in the majors and co- led the NL...Only one team, the Astros (42-18), had a better record in the season's last 60 games...The Rays, Twins, Dodgers and A's all also ended last year on a 39-21 run...See the chart below for the Mets' best 60-game starts to a season:

MEET THE NEW BOSS: Luis Rojas became the 11th manager in team history to win his first game as the Mets skipper...Rojas enters his first campaign as a major league manager after spending 2019 as the Mets' quality control coach...He spent the previous eight seasons managing at various levels of the Mets' minor league system...He was named the 23rd manager in club history on January 24, 2020.

BASEBALL'S IN HIS BLOOD: Rojas is the sixth Dominican-born manager in major league history...His father, Felipe Alou, became the first when he helmed the Montreal Expos from 1992-2001...Luis and Felipe are the fifth father-son duo to both serve as major league managers, joining Buddy and David Bell, Aaron and Bob Boone, George and Dick Sisler and Bob and Joel Skinner.

DON'T YA KNOW: Robinson Canó entered the 2020 season ranked third among active players in hits (2,570), RBI (1,272), total bases (4,170) and extra-base hits (919) and fourth in runs scored (1,234).

LAST TIME OUT: Wacha last appeared in a regular season game on September 25, 2019 at Arizona, making what would be his final appearance for the Cardinals...He allowed two runs, earned, on four hits with a pair of walks and three strikeouts in 1.2 innings pitched.

2019 RECAP: Wacha went 6-7 with a 4.76 ERA across 29 games (24 starts) in his last season with the Cardinals...In 126.2 innings, he walked 55 batters and fanned 104.

FINISHED STRONG: In his last nine starts of the 2019 season, he posted a 2.89 ERA (12 earned runs/37.1 innings)...That 2.89 ERA ranked 14th in the NL from August 15 through the end of the season (min. 35.0 innings).

INTERLEAGUE: Wacha tonight will make his 22nd career Interleague appearance (21st start)...In those 21 games against AL club, Wacha has gone 6-7 with a 4.02 ERA (53 earned runs/118.2 innings)...After tonight's start, Baltimore will be the only AL East club Wacha has yet to face...In five starts against the Yankees, Tampa Bay and Toronto combined, he is 0-3 with a 5.60 ERA (17 earned runs/27.1 innings).

RETURN TO FENWAY: Wacha has never faced Boston in the regular season, but he has made two starts against Boston in his career, both of which came in the 2013 World Series...He won Game 2 of that Fall Classic, tossing a quality start (6.0 IP, 3 H, 2 ER)...He was the losing pitcher in the series' decisive Game 6 (3.2 IP, 5 H, 6 ER).

WINNING AT A HIGH RATE: Wacha's career record sits at 59-39, 20 games above the .500 mark, good for a winning percentage of .602...He is one of just 12 NL pitchers with a winning percentage above .600 since 2013 (min. 70 decisions).

NO FLY ZONE: Wacha was one of just two starting pitchers with to post a HR/9 ratio under 1.00 every season from 2013-2018, joined by Gio González... However, Wacha suffered from an abnormally high home run rate of 1.85 HR/9 last season, nearly double his career rate of 1.01 HR/9.

ATHLETIC GENES: Wacha comes from a family of athletes...His brother, Lucas, played linebacker at the University of Wyoming...His sister, Brette, played basketball at Southern Arkansas University...His uncle, Dusty Rogers, played professional baseball in the Cincinnati Reds organization from 1984-1988.

- He homered in three consecutive games (Opening Day, July 20, 2018 at the Yankees and May 13, 2018 at Philadelphia)...It's the fifth time in his career he has gone deep in three-straight games...ESPN Stats & Info notes his streak spans 804 days, the longest duration of a three-game homer streak since Calvin Pickering had a 1,053-day three-game streak from 2001-2004.
- Had surgeries on both heels and suffered a fractured right ankle that kept him out for the entire 2019 season.
