## MILWAUKEE BREWERS (90-68) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (74-84)

SEPTEMBER 26, 2024 AT PNC PARK, PITTSBURGH, PA - 12:35 EDT - GAME #159/HOME #81

RHP AARON CIVALE (7-9, 4.53 ERA) vs. RHP MITCH KELLER (11-11, 4.21 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** beat the Brewers 2-1 last night to even their three-game series...Have won 15 games in their last at-bat (their most since having 16 last at-bat wins in 2021)...Have won eight games when trailing after seven innings (their most since winning nine times in 2019 when trailing after seven frames)...Have played in 51 one-run games, which are the second-most in the National League behind the Brewers (53); it's also the most one-run games for the team since also playing in 51 one-run contests in 2018...Have the best stolen base percentage (85.4 percent) in MLB...Have recorded 12 shutouts this year, which are tied for the sixth-most in the National League.

**UNTIL WE MEET AGAIN:** The Pirates will close out the home portion of their 2024 season this afternoon...The Pirates will return to PNC Park on Friday, April 4, when the team hosts the New York Yankees in the team's 2025 Home Opener.

**SPEAKING OF THE YANKEES:** The Pirates will depart for New York following today's game to face the Yankees this weekend to close out the 2024 campaign...It will be Pittsburgh's third visit to the new Yankee Stadium (also 2014 and 2022)...It will also be Pittsburgh's first series against the American League East since June 21-23 against the Rays here at PNC Park.

**55 BUCS:** Liover Peguero became the 55th player to appear in a game this season for the Pirates when he made his 2024 debut last night...A total of 58 players appeared in a game for the Pirates in 2023.

**ABOUT TODAY'S STARTER:** Mitch Keller gets the start this afternoon in the home finale of the 2024 campaign...With a win today, Keller would be the second Pirates pitcher since 2000 to win at least 12 games in back-to-back seasons...The other was Kevin Correia in 2011 and 2012...The last Pirates pitcher with at least 12 wins and 150 strikeouts in back-to-back seasons was Bert Blyleven(1978-79)...Special thanks to StatsPerform.

**DENNIS DEALING:** Dennis Santana needed a total of just five pitches to retire each of the three batters he faced in the eighth inning Wednesday night...Santana has allowed one unearned run in 23.1 innings while recording an .070 batting average against (5-for-71) dating back to his outing on August 8.

**WHAT'S AT STAKE:** A series win would give the Pirates the season series victory over the Brewers for the first time since 2018 (12-7)...After winning two-of-three in Milwaukee in July, it would also be the first time the Pirates have won two consecutive series against the Brewers since 2016/2017.

**HOW MAY I ASSIST YOU:** Bryan Reynolds threw out Willy Adames at second base to end last night's game for his 11th assist of the season...That's tied for the most assists in all of MLB among outfielders along with Ian Happ and Jarren Duran.

**PIRATING:** Oneil Cruz has been successful in each of his last 20 attempts since being caught for the only time on April 22...The last Pirate to steal at least 20 consecutive bases without being caught in a single season is Nate McLouth (21 straight) from May 2 to September 28, 2008...Pittsburgh's 85.4 percent stolen-base success rate leads MLB...Since 1951, the only seasons in which Pittsburgh led MLB in that category are 1979 and 1997.

**KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES:** Andrew McCutchen comes into today one run shy of tying Arky Vaughan (936) for 10th all time in Pirates history...McCutchen is also two extra base hits shy of 800 in his career (his 798 extra base hits are the third-most among active players behind Freddie Freeman's 881 and Paul Goldschmidt's 827).

**CALL TO THE PEN:** Aroldis Chapman comes into today first in the NL and tied for the MLB lead with seven saves this month...That's his most in a month since he also had seven in May of 2021 while pitching for the Yankees.

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

September 26, 2015: The Pirates won their eighth straight game on the road as Francisco Liriano tossed 7.2 scoreless innings in Pittsburgh's 4-0 win at Wrigley Field. The eight game road win streak was the longest since the club also won eight straight in 1987. Jordy Mercer led the way with a three-run homer as the Bucs improved to 95-60 on the season.

**HEIGHT/WEIGHT:** 6-2/205 **BATS/THROWS:** R/R  
**BORN:** April 4, 1996 **SIGNED:** Thru 2028  
**AGE:** 28 **HOW ACQUIRED:** Selected by the Pirates in the 2nd round of the 2014 Draft.

**STARTING OFF:** The 28-year-old righthander is in his sixth Major League season... Keller signed a five-year contract extension through the 2028 season on February 22, 2024...The 2023 All-Star has been Pittsburgh's Opening Day starter in each of the last two seasons, which made him the first Pirate to do so since Francisco Liriano started three straight season openers from 2014-16...He was selected by the Pirates in the second round of the 2014 First Year Player Draft.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Keller allowed a season-high tying eight runs in 3.1 innings and lost an 8-3 decision at Cincinnati Friday night.

**VS. MILWAUKEE:** Keller will be making his ninth career start today against the Brewers...Coming into today, he is 1-4 with a 5.44 ERA (41.1ip/25er) in his previous eight starts...This will be his third start against the Crew this season...He had a no-decision (5.0ip/4r) in a 7-5 loss at PNC Park on April 25...He also struck out seven batters in 6.0 scoreless innings while winning an 8-6 decision at Milwaukee on May 13.

**LEADING THE WAY FOR ANOTHER YEAR:** Keller leads the Pirates with 173.0 innings pitched this season...He led the Pirates with 194.1 innings pitched last season as well as 2022 when he logged a total of 159.0 innings...Prior to Keller, the last Pirate to lead the team in innings pitched in at least three straight seasons was Doug Drabek, who did so in five straight years from 1988-92.

**ON THE HOME FRONT:** Keller is 5-4 with a 2.94 ERA (85.2ip/28er) in 14 starts this season at PNC Park (the Bucs are 8-6 in his 14 starts)...He comes into today tied with Gerrit Cole for the fourth-most starts (65) at PNC Park...The only pitchers to make more starts since the ballpark opened are Paul Maholm (100), Zach Duke (82) and Charlie Morton (66)...Keller's 2.94 home ERA ranks ninth among all National League pitchers coming into today...Philadelphia's Cristopher Sanchez has the lowest home ERA (2.21) among National League pitchers.

**SEARCHING FOR A DOZEN WINS:** Keller comes into today looking for his 12th win of the season after winning a career-high 13 games in 2023...Since 1990, the only three Pirates to win at least 12 games in back-to-back seasons are Denny Neagle (1995-96), Doug Drabek (1990-92) and Kevin Correia (2011-12).

**AS A STARTER:** Keller has 130 starts as a member of the Pirates since making his big league debut in 2019...Keller's 130 starts rank 39th in team history (Pink Hawley and Heinie Meine are tied for the 37th-most with 132).

**AND THE WHIFF:** In 2023, Keller set the club record by a right-handed pitcher with 210 strikeouts, surpassing the previous mark of 209 held by A.J. Burnett in 2013.

- Since the beginning of last season, Keller's 370 strikeouts are the fifth-most among all right-handed pitchers in the National League...The only four National League right-handed pitchers to punch out more batters during that time are Zack Wheeler (425), Freddy Peralta (410), Aaron Nola (392) and Zac Gallen (376).
