All games televised on ROOT SPORTS with home games featuring Span An three games at the Los Angeles Angels...began the road trip with four games at the Astros (1-3)...following this series, will return to T-Mobile Park for a 10-day, 10-game homestand against the Athletics (4 G), Angels (3 G) and Rockies (3 G)...tonight's game will be broadcast live on ROOT SPORTS NW, 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network...it will also be broadcast outside the Northwest on ESPN.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners begin their first series against the Angels...are playing their fifth (1-4) of 20 consecutive games to open the 2020 season... are next scheduled to have an off-day on Aug. 13.
-Running Against the Wind - the Mariners have allowed at least 6 runs in each of the first 5 games of the season...are the 20th team in baseball history to allow 6-or-more runs in each of their first 5 games of a season (last: 2019 Red Sox)...marks the second time in club history to allow 6+ runs in their first five games (also: 1998)...lead the Majors in runs allowed this season with 39, ahead of Chicago-AL (36) and Boston (31).

- Young \& Old - third baseman Kyle Seager (32 years, 269 days) is the oldest player on the Mariners active roster...left-handed pitcher Nick Margevicius ( 24 years, 41 days) is the youngest player on the Mariners active roster.
- Rule 5 Looking Good - RHP Yohan Ramirez (5th pick) is one of 5 players selected in the Major League phase of the 2019 Rule 5 Draft to break Summer Camp with the big league team...Ramirez pitched in 2 games at Houston, whom Seattle selected him from, throwing 3.0 scoreless innings and striking out 4 without allowing a hit.
- 2019 in Review - Completed the 2019 season 68-94 (.420), finishing 5th in the American League West (39.0 games behind division-winner Houston)...went 35-46 (.432) at home and 33-48 (.407) on the road...were 23-26 in one-run games and 9-4 when games went to extra-innings.
SIX PACK...with Justin Dunn's start tonight, it will mark the first time in club history that the Mariners have used six different starting pitchers in the club's first six games of a season
LEFTY POWER...since 2012, Kyle Seager leads all players in RBI against left-handed pitchers with 241 over that span, he ranks ahead of Carlos Santana (230), Anthony Rizzo (213), Robinson Cano (209) and Freddie Freeman (205)...since 2012, Seager ranks T3rd among all players in home runs against southpaws with 70 (also: Nolan Arenado); trails only Nelson Cruz (88) and Giancarlo Stanton (71)...Seager's 70 home runs off lefties since 2012 lead all left-handed batters.
NORTH LITTLE ROCK CONNECTION...seven players on the Mariners active roster, including last night's starting battery of Justus Sheffield and Joe Odom and tonight's starting pitcher, Justin Dunn, spent significant time with Double-A Arkansas last season...in addition to Dunn, Odom and Sheffield, Kyle Lewis, Evan White, Dan Altavilla and Zac Grotz helped the Travelers to a first-half Texas League North Division title and the best overall record in the Texas League ( $81-57 / .587$ )...Dunn and White were each named to the Texas League Midseason and Postseason All-Star teams, while Odom earned Midseason All-Star honors and Sheffield was named to the Postseason All-Star squad.
HOME SWEET HOME...the Mariners 2020 home opener, presented by T-Mobile, against the Oakland Athletics is Friday, July 31 at $6: 40$ pm at T-Mobile Park...the game will be broadcast on ROOT SPORTS NW, 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network...while there won't be fans at the ballpark, there will still be an Opening Day pregame ceremony featuring many of the elements that have become a Mariners tradition, whether they are previously videotaped or live at T-Mobile Park...the pregame ceremony will begin at 6:00 pm and will be carried live on ROOT SPORTS NW...the program begins with a special performance by Seattle-based singer-songwriter Ben Gibbard, lead vocalist for Death Cab for Cutie and the Postal Service...the National Anthem will be performed by Madisen Hallberg, a Portland State University senior, and Emmanuel Henreid, a Portland-based opera singer...6-year old Lily of Snohomish will complete the ceremonial First Run Around the Bases...delivery of the game ball will get an assist from health care workers who sent in video of themselves passing a ball on and off screen...Washington Governor Jay Inslee will be on the mound at T-Mobile Park to throw out the ceremonial first pitch live.
KYLE'S CLOSING IN...Kyle Seager is 1 run scored away from 600 in his career....he will become only the 6th player in franchise history to score at least 600 runs as a Mariner....he will join Edgar Martinez ( 1,219 ), Ichiro Suzuki $(1,181)$, Ken Griffey Jr. $(1,113)$, Jay Buhner ( 790 ) and Alex Rodriguez (627).
- Enters tonight's game with 199 career home runs...with his next homer, will become one of four

Mariners in club history to reach 200 career home runs (Griffey Jr., 417; Martinez, 309; Buhner, 307).
-Enters tonight's game with 1,223 career hits, 32 shy of tying Jay Buhner $(1,255)$ for 4th in club history. ALL HANDS ON DECK...in the first five games of the season, the Mariners have used 31 players, including 17 pitchers...the only active player yet to appear in a game for the Mariners this season is Justin Dunn...in 2019, the Mariners set the single-season Major League record for players used (67) and pitchers used (42). YOUTH MOVEMENT...the Mariners fielded the youngest Opening Day roster in the Majors with an average age of 27 years, 259 days (ages on 7/24)...ranked ahead of San Diego (27.349), Miami (28.017), Detroit (28.029) and Kansas City (28.047)...Seattle's roster includes just 5 players with at least 4 years of MLB service time and features 14 players with less than 1 year of MLB service.
IT'S A SPRINT...as part of its COVID-19 response, MLB has restructured the 2020 schedule to span 60 games, compared to the normal 162...the Mariners will face off against the AL West in 40 games and the NL West in 20 games...with the shorter season, each game in the 2020 season carries the equivalent weight of 2.7 regular season games in a typical MLB season...the trade deadline will take place on August 31 AS YOU KNOW...Joe Odom made his Major League debut last night at the Angels, batting 9th and starting at catcher...AND AS YOU MAY KNOW...Odom became the 5 th player to make his Major League debut with the Mariners this season, joining Evan White (7/24 at HOU), José Marmolejos (7/24 at HOU), Anthony Misiewicz (7/24 at HOU) and Yohan Ramirez (7/24 at HOU)...BUT DID YOU KNOW?...that this marks the first time in club history five players have debuted for the Mariners in the first five games of a season?...the Astros have had eight players debut in their first five games this season...prior to the 2020 season, the last team to have five or more players debut in their first five games of a season was the 2006 Marlins (Carlos Martinez, Eric Reed, Dan Uggla, Reggie Abercrombie, Ricky Nolasco)...via STATS Inc.

- Selected by Los Angeles-NL in the 37th round of the 2013 MLBFirst Year Player Draft but did not sign... played 3 seasons at Boston Colllege, where he was named third-team All-America (Baseball America) following his junior season... selected by New York-NL in the 1st round (19th overall) in the 2016 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Boston College.
- Has appeared in 4 minor league seasons with New York-NL (2016-18) and Seattle (2019), is 23-20 with a 3.76 ERA (164 ER, 392.1 IP) with 149 walks and 424 strikeouts in 80 career minor league games (73 starts).
