Advantage Memberships for the 2025 season, which include priority to purchase 2024 Postseason tickets as well as exclusive access to one-of-a-kind events, go on sale starting on Friday, July 26...to learn more, visit dbacks.com/membership or text/call 602.462.4600.

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

LAST GAME: The D-backs shut out the Cubs 3-0 last night.

- Zac Gallen earned his seventh win after tossing 5.0 shutout innings with just 3 hits allowed.
- The D-backs bullpen - Kevin Ginkel, Justin Martinez, Ryan Thompson and Paul Sewald (SV) - combined for 4.0 shutout, 1 -hit frames, facing 1 over the minimum.
- Alek Thomas (solo, 3rd of season) and Corbin Carroll (2-run, 6th of season) each homered in the third inning to combine for the D-backs 3 runs.

SERIES STRONG: The D-backs have won or split their last 6 series (5-0-1) and 12 of their last 14 series overall since May 30, going 9-2-3.

3 OVER: With last night's victory, the D-backs are 3 games above .500 for the first time in 2024.

- Arizona finished the first half over . 500 after sitting 7 games under entering June 1.

SECOND-HALF MOMENTUM: The D-backs have won 12 of their last 17 games, which are tied for the most wins in the span (also: Astros and Tigers).

- Since June 29, the D-backs lead the Majors with a . 361 OBP, . 828 OPS and 72 walks, and are second with 6.12 runs per game and a . 279 AVG.
