**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets earned their first road victory of the season defeating the Cardinals, 4-2, last night...The Mets continue their first trip of the year, a seven-game trip (1-0) against St. Louis (1-0) and San Francisco (four games).

**SERIES-LY SPEAKING:** The Mets are seeking their second series win of the season...The last time the Mets won each of their first two series of the season was in 2022...The team went 3-1 against the Nationals and 2-1 against the Phillies.

**TRIPLES IS BEST, TRIPLES MAKES IT SAFE:** The Mets lead the majors with three triples this season...Last night, Francisco Lindor recorded his second career leadoff triple (also: 9/17/17 at CWS)...He has hit a triple in consecutive games for the first time in his career and is the first Mets player to do so since Tyrone Taylor had two straight July 9-10, 2024 vs. Washington... Travis d'Arnaud is the only player in franchise history to record a triple in three straight games (9/20/14-5/6/15)...No Mets player has done so in three consecutive team games...Lindor has recorded two triples in four games this season...He recorded zero in 2025 and two in 2024...The only other Mets player with two triples through the team's first four games of a season was José Reyes in 2007.

**SOTO LUIS:** Juan Soto has reached base safely in all 39 career games played against St. Louis, the longest streak to begin a career vs. St. Louis, as well as the longest active streak and tied for the 10th longest streak by any player all-time against the Cardinals...He extended his hitting streak against St. Louis to seven games and his hitting streak at Busch Stadium to 10 games, passing Austin Riley for the longest active streak at the stadium.

**IN OUR CARDS:** The Mets have won 10 of their last 12 vs. St. Louis...They have tallied at least 10 hits for the fifth straight game against St. Louis, their longest such streak since a seven-game stretch from 7/1/08-4/21/09...The Mets have left 10+ runners on base in a franchise-record four straight games vs. the Cardinals...New York has won their first road game of a season against the Cardinals for the fifth straight season.

**SENGA GENESIS:** Kodai Senga is set to take the bump tonight...In three Major League seasons, Senga is 20-13 with a 3.00 ERA (95 ER/285.0 IP), 133 walks and 320 strikeouts...In 22 starts in 2025, Senga went 7-6 with a 3.02 ERA (38 ER/113.1 IP), 55 walks and 109 strikeouts...In his rookie season in 2023, Senga became just the 18th rookie in the Modern Era (Since 1900) and the sixth in the Wild Card Era (Since 1995) with 200 or more strikeouts in a season...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsuzaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookies with 200 or more strikeouts in a season.

**CARDS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 29-33 at Busch Stadium since the ballpark opened in 2006.

**WE REMEMBER:** The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship... From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

**40 YEARS:** This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at Mets.com/1986.

**SPRING TRAINING:** In three Spring outings (three starts), Senga recorded a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) with 11 strikeouts...Held Spring batters to a .176 (6-34) average...Last pitched on March 19 at Houston, tossing a spring-high 4.0 innings (2R, 6H, 1BB, 4K).

**VS. ST. LOUIS/NATIONAL LEAGUE:** Has recorded one run or fewer in two of his three career appearances vs. the Cardinals...He has recorded a 2.33 ERA (5 ER/19.1 IP) and a 7.91 SO/9.0 IP against St. Louis...Made 18 appearances vs. the National League last season, posting a 2.99 ERA (31 ER/93.1 IP)...The Mets were 11-7 last year when Senga started against a National League team.

**2025 SEASON RECAP:** Senga finished last season going 7-6 with a 3.02 ERA (38 ER/60.2 IP), 55 walks and 109 strikeouts in 22 starts...Started the season going 7-3 through June 12, with a 1.47 ERA (12 ER/73.2 IP)...He had thrown at least 5.0 innings in all 13 starts and allowed three earned runs or fewer in all of those starts...Following his return from the IL, posted a 5.90 ERA (26 ER/39.0 IP) in nine starts...Allowed three or more earned runs in three consecutive games before being sent to Triple-A.

**KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST:** Senga picked up 71 of his 109 strikeouts on the ghost fork last season...Held batters to a .130 average with his ghost fork this season, which was the second-lowest opponents' batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing a split-finger pitch and the seventh-lowest opponent batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing any pitch...His 41.8% whiff rate was the fourth highest...In his rookie year (2023), Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average.

**GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES:** Has allowed three or fewer runs in 44 of his first 52 career starts...His 44 such starts are tied with Dwight Gooden for the second most in franchise history through a starter's first 52 career games...He had allowed three earned runs or less in 31 consecutive starts from June 23, 2023 to July 11, 2025, which tied with deGrom (from 4/16/18-4/3/19) for the second-longest such streak in franchise history...At the time, it was the longest active such streak in the majors...He trailed only Jacob deGrom's 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22).

**SENGA GENESIS:** Through Senga's first 52 career starts he has posted 320 strikeouts...His 320 strikeouts through his first 52 Major League games are the fifth-most in Mets history behind Dwight Gooden (433), Matt Harvey (361), Noah Syndergaard (361) and Jacob deGrom (349)...His 320 strikeouts are also the fifth-most among Japanese-born pitchers through their first 52 starts, trailing only Yu Darvish (428), Hideo Nomo (409), Shohei Ohtani (367) and Masahiro Tanaka (326)...His career 3.00 ERA (95 ER/285.0 IP) is the 12th-best in franchise history through a player's first 52 starts with the club.

**CRUISING AT CITI:** In 29 career games at Citi Field, he has gone 12-5 with a 2.80 ERA (49 ER/157.1 IP), which is the 11th best in the history of the ballpark (min. 90.0 IP)...He has allowed just 15 home runs to 653 batters faced, recording a 0.86 HR/9.0IP ratio at home...His 11.27 K/9.0IP is the third-highest among pitchers at Citi Field behind Edwin Diaz's 15.10 K/9.0IP and Jacob deGrom's 11.52 K/9.0IP (min. 400 BF).

**2024 REWIND:** He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

**REMARKABLE ROOKIE:** During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsusaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967)...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

**HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

**METS-JAPAN CONNECTION:** Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

- Tossed 1.2 scoreless innings in relief on March 29 vs. Pittsburgh (1.2 IP)...Since the start of last year, he has gotten five or more outs in a relief appearance 13 times, which is tied for the seventh-most such appearances in the majors over that span.
- Entered in the sixth inning on March 28 vs. Pittsburgh (0.2 IP, K) and he struck out one while stranding two runners.
- Has made 38 appearances against NL Central opponents...In those contests, he is 6-0 with seven holds and a 1.82 ERA (8 ER/39.2 IP)...He is holding NL Central batters to a .181 (25-138) batting average over his career.
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Appeared in three Grapefruit League games and he threw 3.0 scoreless innings...He struck out five of the 11 batters he faced during the spring.

- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.

- Allowed two earned runs in the ninth inning on March 26 vs. Pittsburgh (1.0 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 2 K)...Marked his first appearance as a Met.
- Pitched in five Grapefruit League games and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings while recording three strikeouts.
- Last season he appeared in 58 games between Los Angeles-NL, Washington and Los Angeles-AL...He pitched to a 3.42 ERA (21 ER/55.1 IP) while recording 48 strikeouts.
- Was acquired by the Angels on July 30, 2025 and he posted a 2.00 ERA (4 ER/18.0 IP) while recording 17 strikeouts and two saves over 20 games with the club.
