THE PIRATES:...had the day off yesterday...Went 3-3 on their homestand against San Francisco (1-2) and Atlanta (2-1)...Scored a season-high 11 runs Friday night...Have played in 13 games decided by one or two runs in their last 22 contests...Have played in 19 one-run games, which are the second-most in MLB behind the Cubs (21)...Are tied with the Phillies, Cubs, Guardians and Mariners for the most wins (10) in one-run games in all of MLB...Have gone 5-2 in extra innings; the third-most wins in MLB behind the Guardians and Marlins with six apiece...Have gone 15-0 this season when recording 10-plus hits; the only undefeated team in the Majors in such games and a club record for the longest such streak to start a season, surpassing the 1939 club that started 14-0 when recording 10-plus hits to start the season.

CLOSING IN ON ANOTHER MILESTONE: Andrew McCutchen comes
into today one hit shy of 1600 as a member of the Pirates, which ranks 12th all-time in team history.... Since May 11, McCutchen ranks seventh among all National League players in batting (.321), 11th in slugging (.554), tied for fourth in runs scored (12), tied for seventh in hits (18), sixth in OPS (.969) and eighth in OBP (.415).

ABOUT TONIGHT'S STARTER: Jared Jones has posted a 0.97 WHIP and a 10.37 strikeouts per 9.0 innings rate through 10 career starts in 59.0 innings...According to StatsPerform, he is the third pitcher to debut in the modern era with a sub-1.00 WHIP and a strikeouts per 9.0 innings higher than 10.0 through 10 career starts (minimum 20.0 innings pitched), joining Masahiro Tanaka of the New York Yankees and Jose DeLeon of the Pirates.

NICKY G: Nick Gonzales has eight games with at least one hit and one RBI since making his season debut on May 10 ( 16 total games)...According to StatsPerform, he is tied with Eddie Rosario for the second-most such games in the National League in that span and trails San Francisco's Heliot Ramos (nine) for the league lead.

HITTIN' THE ROAD: Tonight the Pirates begin a five-game road trip that gets underway here at Comerica Park...The trip will wrap up this weekend with three games against Toronto beginning Friday night...The Pirates split a two-game series against the Tigers at PNC Park from April 8-9...This weekend will be Pittsburgh's fourth trip to Toronto in interleague play (also 2003, 2011 and 2017).

DIALING LONG DISTANCE: The Pirates have hit 56.0 percent of their home runs this season after getting a first-pitch strike...According to StatsPerform, that's the highest percentage in MLB...In the pitch tracking era (since 1988), no team has hit higher than 51.1 percent after being in an 0-1 count ( 2018 San Francisco Giants).

LET'S GET IT STARTED: The Pirates have played in 54 games this season and have 27 quality starts, which are the fourth-most in MLB and second-most in the National League behind the Phillies (31)...Pittsburgh already has more than half the number of quality starts they had in 162 games in 2023 ( 53 QS).

AGAINST LEFTIES: The Pirates have hit 19 home runs against left-handed pitchers, which are tied for the sixth-most in all of MLB (the Orioles lead the way with 25)...The Pirates have gone 11-10 in games started by opposing lefthanders, which is tied with the Braves for the third-most wins among National League teams (Philadelphia and Los Angeles have 13 wins apiece)...Edward Olivares leads the team with four homers off southpaws.
