Multidimensional

Atlanta collected a season-most 19 hits last night in a win, 13-1, over Cleveland. Last night marked the third time this season that the Braves posted double-digit runs.

Of Atlanta's 19 hits last night, just one was a home run. Dominic Smith drove the first pitch he saw in last night's fourth inning out to right field for a two-run shot.

The Braves this season rank third in the majors in runs scored (90) and second in home runs (21). However, just 33.3% of Atlanta's runs this season have come via the home run (30 of 90), a percentage that ranks 20th in the majors.

For context, during Atlanta's seven consecutive postseason appearances from 2018-2024, the club scored 46.4% of its runs via homer. That total led the National League and ranked second in baseball.

The Braves last night scored runs via five doubles, three singles, the one home run and a force out.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Marlins tonight open a three-game midweek series with what is the first of 13 games between the teams this season...The two are set to meet next for four games at loanDepot park in May, from the 18th through the 21st.

A Atlanta has won the season series against Miami for 11 consecutive years dating to 2015, and the Braves have won double-digit games over the Marlins in 17 of the last 22 full seasons...Since 2015, the Braves are 117-64 (.646) against the Marlins.

A Atlanta is 325-214 (.603) all-time against the Marlins franchise since it was founded in 1993... The Braves' 325 wins versus Miami since the start of 1993 are its most against any one team in baseball...Per Elias, since 1993, only two MLB teams have beaten another club more times than Atlanta has beaten Miami; the Dodgers have 328 wins over the Rockies, while the Yankees have 328 over the Orioles.

A Atlanta went 5-2 against Miami here at Truist Park last season, and is 53-22 (.707) here versus the Marlins since the facility opened in 2017...That record is by far the best by the Braves against any intradivision opponent since the stadium opened.

A RH Grant Holmes is set tonight to make the fourth start of his career against Miami, and has never lost to the club...The 6-foot-0, 226-pound native of Conway, SC, is 1-0 with a 3.14 ERA (5 ER/14.1 IP) versus the Marlins in his career, including 5.2 shut-out innings in his only such start last season...The right-hander is 1-1 with a 2.55 ERA (5 ER/17.2 IP) through three total starts this season, and Atlanta has won each of his last two.

A RH Eury Pérez has never beaten Atlanta in three career starts against the club, going 0-2 with a 12.19 ERA (14 ER/10.1 IP) and five homers allowed versus the Braves...Miami has lost all three of his starts...The 6-foot-8, 220-pound right-hander last faced the Braves on August 7 of last season here at Truist Park, and allowed seven hits and five runs over 5.1 innings in a no-decision.

BOTTOM OF THE ORDER: The 6-7-8-9 batters in Atlanta's lineup last night combined to go 12-for-17 with eight RBI and eight total runs scored...The six total batters who comprised these four spots in the order collected a homer and two doubles, and five of the six drove in a run.

A The 12 hits marked the most by these four spots in a Braves lineup since April 18, 1999, when six players with a plate appearance from those spots went 12-for-23 at Colorado...Current Braves manager Walt Weiss went 1-for-6 batting eighth that night, while current Braves coach Eddie Pérez was 5-for-6.

A Atlanta's 6-9 batters this season rank second in baseball in average (.275), slugging (.432) and OPS (.755)...They lead the National League in runs (42) and RBI (40) from these spots in the order.

MATT OLSON GAMES: Matt Olson is set tonight to play in his 799th consecutive game, which will give him sole possession of the 11th-longest streak of consecutive games played in major league history...His run dates to May 2, 2021 while with Oakland.

A When he takes the field tonight, Olson will have appeared in all 665 of Atlanta's games since the team acquired him prior to the 2022 season...That is 11 more games played than any other major leaguer.

A The 10th-longest consecutive games streak in history belongs to Gus Suhr, who played in 822 straight games for Pittsburgh from 1931-1937.

A Olson doubled again in last night's eighth inning, and leads Major League Baseball with 12 extra-base hits...Atlanta's first baseman has logged a multi-base hit in each of his last five games, the longest active streak in baseball.

A Dating to the 2022 season, his first with Atlanta, Olson's 313 extra-base hits are by far the most in the National League...Freddie Freeman, with 291, ranks second.

A Olson has compiled 1.3 bWAR through 16 games this season, fourth most in the majors...**Dating to that 2022 season, his 22.0 total bWAR are the most by a first baseman in the majors...**Freddie Freeman, with 21.5 bWAR, ranks second.

MICHAEL HARRIS II: The Braves today reinstated OF Michael Harris II from the paternity list and designated INF Luke Williams for assignment...Michael and his wife, Esther, welcomed their first child, Michael Harris III, on Saturday.

A Harris II drove his second home run of the season out to right-center on Friday night...He currently ranks in the 90th percentile or better among qualified batters in baseball in barrel percentage (91st, 17.1%), average exit velocity (91st, 93.3 mph), expected weighted on-base (91st, .401) and expected slugging percentage (97th, .620).

IGGY APPROACHING HISTORY: Raisel Iglesias converted his second save of the season on Tuesday night at Los Angeles, and his next save will be his 100th with Atlanta...He has converted 99 of 113 total save opportunities with the club.

A Since Major League Baseball first recognized saves as an official statistic in 1969, just four pitchers in franchise history have recorded at least 100 saves with the club...Craig Kimbrel (186), John Smoltz (154), Gene Garber (141) and Mark Wohlers (112) are the only others to do so.

A Iglesias' 255 career saves rank 39th in MLB history and fifth among all active pitchers.

A Since his Braves debut on August 5, 2022, Iglesias is 15-12 with a 2.29 ERA (57 ER/224.1 IP) over 227 total appearances...His ERA in that span is best in the National League among pitchers with at least 200 appearances, and his 87.6% save percentage ranks third.

Today's Game

- Makes his fourth start of the season and 32nd career start tonight against Miami, opening a three-game home series against the Marlins...Has faced Miami three times in his career, all starts, going 1-0 with a 3.14 ERA (5 ER/14.1 IP) with 14 strikeouts.
 - Earned the win in his most recent outing against the Marlins on June 21, 2025 at Miami, tossing 5.2 scoreless innings with five strikeouts, allowing five hits and five walks in a 7-0 Atlanta victory.
- Picked up his first win of 2026 in his last start on April 8 at Los Angeles (AL), working 6.2 innings with six strikeouts and yielding two earned runs on five hits and three walks on 99 pitches...The victory was his first since June 21, 2025 at Miami.
- Has posted two quality starts in three outings this season, going 1-1 with a 2.55 ERA (5 ER/17.2 IP)...The 6-foot-0, 226-pound right-hander has held opponents to a .175 batting average (11-for-63) through three turns.
- Carried a no-hit bid through 5.1 innings on April 3 at Arizona, allowing just one hit over 6.0 scoreless frames with three strikeouts and no walks in 85 pitches...The Braves won, 2-0, with both runs scoring in the ninth inning after Holmes exited.
- His 31 career starts for the Braves are the most in Atlanta-franchise history by a South Carolina-born player.
- Reached 200 career strikeouts on April 3 at Chase Field in Arizona, entering the game with 197 and fanning three...Enters tonight with 206 career punchouts.
- Made his second career Opening Day roster with Atlanta this season after also making the club's roster to open 2025...Went 1-0 with a 1.02 ERA in five spring appearances (four starts), striking out 20 over 17.2 innings with just one walk...Did not allow a run in his first four outings before surrendering two earned runs over 5.1 innings in his final spring start on March 24 against Tampa Bay.
- Missed the final 57 games of the 2025 season after being placed on the 60-day injured list on July 27 with right elbow inflammation.
- Is 3-7 with a 3.09 ERA (36 ER/105.0 IP) in career home appearances.

2026

- Picked up his first victory of the season on April 8 at Angel Stadium, allowing two earned runs over 6.2 innings with six strikeouts and three walks on 99 pitches against Los Angeles (AL)...The win was his first since June 21, 2025 at Miami.
- Carried a no-hit bid through 5.1 innings on April 3 at Arizona, allowing just one hit over 6.0 scoreless frames with three strikeouts and no walks in 85 pitches... The Braves won, 2-0.
- Took the loss in his season debut on March 29 against Kansas City, allowing three earned runs on five hits over 5.0 innings with four strikeouts and two walks... Surrendered a solo homer to Carter Jensen in the fourth inning.
- Reached 200 career strikeouts on April 3 at Chase Field in Arizona.
- His 31 career starts for the Braves are the most in Atlanta-franchise history by a South Carolina-born player.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.02 ERA in five spring appearances (four starts), striking out 20 over 17.2 innings with just one walk...Did not allow a run in his first four outings before surrendering two earned runs over 5.1 innings in his final spring start on March 24 against Tampa Bay.

2025

- Was placed on the 60-day injured list on July 27, 2025 with right elbow inflammation and missed the final 57 games of the season.
- In his second major league season, went 4-9 with a 3.99 ERA (51 ER/115.0 IP) in 22 games, 21 starts, for Atlanta.
- Became the fourth pitcher, sixth instance, in franchise history to record 15 or more strikeouts within a single game, joining Hall-of-Famer Warren Spahn, twice, Hall-of-Famer John Smoltz, twice, and teammate Spencer Strider.
 - Was the first National League pitcher to fan 15 in a losing decision since Cliff Lee with Philadelphia, May 6, 2011 against Atlanta.

- Awards: Midwest League Midseason All-Star (2015); Texas League Pitcher of the Week (July 30, 2017).
- In his MLB debut season in 2024, went 2-1 with a 3.27 ERA (11 ER/30.1 IP) in 26 relief appearances and one start...Was recalled by Atlanta from Triple-A Gwinnett on August 8, 2024.
- In 2022, pitched for three different minor league teams throughout the Oakland and Atlanta organizations...Separately, went 1-2 with Triple-A Las Vegas before joining the Braves system.
- Pitched the entire 2021 season for Triple-A Las Vegas and saw more relief appearances (29) than starts (7) for first time in career.
- Set career highs and led the team in games (50) and saves (13) in 2023 with Triple-A Gwinnett...Led all Stripers relievers in strikeouts (74).
- Named Gatorade Player of the Year in South Carolina following his senior year in 2014.
- Selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the first round (22nd overall) of the 2014 June draft (Conway High School, SC).

- Picked up the 41st multi-inning save of his career, his second as a Brave (also: 9/22/24 at MIA, 2.0 IP), on April 7 at Los Angeles-AL...Despite having just two since 2022, Iglesias' 41 saves of 1.1-plus innings are the most in MLB since he became a primary reliever in 2016.
- Is one save away from 100 with the Braves, which would make him the fourth Braves pitcher to reach the feat... He would become one of 19 pitchers since saves became an official stat in 1969 to record 100-plus saves with multiple teams (also: 106 with CIN) and the fourth active reliever to do so.
- Has not allowed a run in 47 of his last 50 appearances since June 9 of last season...He leads major league relievers with at least 45.0 innings pitched in ERA (1.10, 6 ER/49.0 IP), ranks second in WHIP (0.67) and batting average against (.139) and is tied for second in fWAR (1.8) in that span...Is the first Braves pitcher to allow six runs or less across 50 appearances since Craig Kimbrel from June 8, 2013-April 12, 2014.
- Among active pitchers with as many appearances since his Braves debut on August 5, 2022 (227 apps.), Iglesias owns the best ERA (2.29, 57 ER/224.1 IP), WHIP (0.93) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.98, 244 K/49 BB).
- Ranks second among Braves pitchers in franchise history (min. 100 G) in WHIP and ERA+ (183), third in strikeout-to-walk ratio, fourth in hits-per-nine-innings (6.4) and fifth in ERA and saves (99).

- Has thrown his slider 68.2% of the time this season, the most of any pitcher with at least 10 batters faced, and is tied for the fourth-best run value (3) on the pitch...Opponents are hitting .083 against it without an extra base hit and are whiffing 35.7% of the time.
- Since his Braves debut on July 31, 2025, Kinley ranks third among major league pitchers (min. 25.0 IP) in ERA (0.87, 3 ER/31.0 IP) and opponent's OPS (.364), and fifth in WHIP (0.71) and batting average against (.130).
- His three runs allowed with Atlanta are the fewest by a Braves pitcher in their first 31 appearances with the club in the Live-Ball era, surpassing Raisel Iglesias, Craig Kimbrel and Hall of Famer Billy Wagner (four RA each).
- Among Braves pitchers with at least 24 appearances in a season, Kinley holds the second-best ERA (0.72), WHIP (0.83), hits-per-nine-innings (4.0) and ERA+ (583) marks in a single campaign.
