METSCELLANEOUS: Today, the Mets are set to play their first game at Citi Field when they take on Marlins...The Mets are coming off their first road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Miami (3-1) and Milwaukee (0-2)...Following this series, New York heads to New York...In this homestand, the Mets will host the Marlins (three games) and Padres (three games).

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets are on a season-long three-game losing streak...The streak matches their longest of the 2022 season (6-26-29, 7/17-23, 9/3-6, 9/12-14 and 9/30-10/2)...The last time the team lost four or more games was when they lost five straight from 9/21-26, 2022).

TAKE ME HOME, CITI ROADS: The Mets are 40-21 (.656) in Home Openers, including 10-4 at Citi Field...The Mets won their home opener, 10-3, against Arizona last season...The have won it in each of the last three seasons and in seven of their last eight years (2022, 2021, 2020, 2018, 2017, 2016, 2015).

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets won 54 games at home last year...That their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...The last time the team won more than 50 games in New York was in 2000 when they went 55-26...Overall, the Mets went 54-27 at Citi Field...The team's .667 winning percentage was the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage.

IT'S BEEN ONE WEEK: The Mets have yet to commit an error this season... This ties a franchise recorded for the longest the team has gone without committing an error...The 1985 Mets also did not commit an error in their first seven games...Last year, the San Diego Padres did not commit an error in their first 17 games to start the season, which was the longest time since 1900.

INJURY UPDATE: Yesterday, Omar Narváez underwent imaging this morning that revealed a medium to high-grade strain of his left calf...He will be placed on the Injured List...A typical return to play for this type of injury is 8-9 weeks.

WAIVER CLAIM: Yesterday, the Mets claimed RHP Edwin Uceta from Pittsburgh and optioned him to Triple-A Syracuse...Uceta, 25, has appeared in 24 major league games with the Dodgers and Diamondbacks and has 38 strikeouts in 37.1 innings...In addition, the Mets transferred RHP Sam Coonrod to the 60-Day IL.

HOME, SWEET HOME: Today, the Mets will play their first game at Citi Field this year when they take on the Miami Marlins at 1:10 p.m... Citi Field parking lots will open at 9:40 a.m. and gates open at 10:40 a.m... Ahead of the game, the Empire State Building will be lit blue and orange beginning at sunset on April 5 and continue through April 6 for the home opener...The Mets encourage fans to take Mass Transit for the Mets home opener...Mass Transit is the fastest and greenest way to Citi Field...Fans can purchase tickets to all 2023 Mets home games at the Citi Field box office or by visiting mets.com/tickets or calling 718-507-TIXX.

DOCTOR ROBERT-SON: David Robertson tossed 1.0 perfect inning on Wednesday in Milwaukee...In three games this season, Robertson has allowed only one hit, struck out three and notched a save...Robertson has recorded 158 career saves, which is the seventh-most by an active player.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 76-53 against the Marlins since Citi Field opened in 2009.

LET'S GO FISHING: The Mets are 3-1 against the Marlins this season... Tommy Pham is a .305/.378/.500 hitter with 29 runs, eight doubles, a triple, 21 RBI and 13 walks in 26 career games against the Marlins... Starling Marte has hit .289/.339/.413 with 32 runs, 12 doubles, two triple, three homers and 14 RBI in 51 career games against the Fish...Francisco Lindor and Brandon Nimmo have both socked nine home runs against the club.

MIAMI VICE: Megill will make his second consecutive start against the Marlins to begin the 2023 season...In three career games (two starts) against Miami, Megill is 1-1 with a 4.91 ERA (6 ER/11.0 IP) and 13 strikeouts...In his lone outing against Miami at Citi Field, Megill threw a scoreless inning in relief on September 27, 2023.

OPENOR: Tylor Megill will start the home opener this season...Last year, Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

MULTIPLICITY: Pete Alonso logged his 15th career multi-homer game on Wednesday at Milwaukee, slugging a pair of two-run shots...He ranks sixth in Mets history in multi-homer games...Lucas Duda and Dave Kingman are tied for fifth with 16 each...Mike Piazza and Carlos Beltrán each had 17...His 15 multi-homer games are the third-most since he entered the league in 2019...Only Aaron Judge (20) and Kyle Schwarber (26) have hit more.

PETE ALON150: Alonso ranks tied for sixth on the Mets all-time home run list with 149 homers...Carlos Beltrán also hit 149 with the Mets... Alonso has 149 home runs in 537 career games...With one more long ball in his next 14 games, he will become the second-fastest player in major league history to reach 150 career home runs...Ryan Howard got there in 495 games and Aaron Judge is currently second-fastest (552 games).

STRIKE THAT: Alonso has a 14.4 percent strikeout rate over his last 50 games, the lowest in any 50-game stretch in his career...He's struck out just four times in 30 PA this season (13.3 percent)...Each year he's spent in the majors, his strikeout rate has decreased...He punched out at a 26.4 percent clip as a rookie in 2019...Last year, he posted a career-best 18.7 percent strikeout rate.

DAY MANI: The Mets are 3-2 in day games this year...In 2022, the Mets went 39-19 in day games...The team's .672 winning percentage in the sunlight was the second-best in the National League and third-best in the majors...The Mets posted a 3.16 ERA with 150 walks and 564 strikeouts in the daytime last year...Their 3.16 ERA in the daytime was third in the majors and second in the NL.

MR. .305: Tommy Pham has a .305 (39-128) average against Miami in his career...He went 4-9 (.444) with a double, a home run, three RBI and a run scored at loanDepot Park in the Mets season-opening series win over the Marlins.

MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win in his first start of the season on April 1 at Miami...Allowed two runs over 5.0 innings on six hits with two walks and seven strikeouts...Was his first career victory against the Marlins.

AMAZIN APRIL: In six April starts since 2022, Megill is 5-0 with a 2.18 ERA (8 ER/33.0 IP) and 34 strikeouts...Megill's five wins in April since last season are tied for the most in the majors and his 33.0 innings in the month since 2022 are tied for eighth...Among qualifiers in April dating back to 2022, Megill is ninth in ERA and 11th in WHIP (0.97).

RIGHT/LEFT SPLITS: For his career, Megill has held right-handed batters to a .196 (54-276) batting average, the 10th-best mark in the NL since his major league debut on June 23, 2021 (Min. 200 RHB faced)...During the same time frame, Megill's .316 (86-272) opponent's average against left-handed batters is the fourth-worst in the NL (Min. 200 RHB faced).

MIAMI VICE: Will make his second consecutive start against the Marlins to begin the 2023 season...In three career games (two starts) against Miami, Megill is 1-1 with a 4.91 ERA (6 ER/11.0 IP) and 13 strikeouts...In his lone outing against Miami at Citi Field, Megill threw a scoreless inning in relief on September 27, 2023.

RELIEVOR: After starting the first 27 games of his major league career, Megill transitioned to the bullpen after returning from the 60-Day IL on September 19, 2022...Megill pitched to a 6.00 ERA (4 ER/6.0 IP) out of the bullpen...In his final appearance of the 2022 season, Megill threw 2.0 scoreless innings on October 4 vs. Washington.

COMBINED NO-NO: Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season on April 29 at Citi Field...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...The Mets combine no-hitter against the Phillies marked the 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodríguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bullpen. 17.1.

2022 RECAP: Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

OPENOR: Last year, Tylor Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY: His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021...According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP KODAI SENGA (1-0, 1.69)

MLB DEBUT: In his major league debut, Senga earned the win on April 2 against the Marlins at loanDepot park...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts...His eight strikeouts were tied for the third-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

NOW YOU SEE IT, NOW YOU DON'T: Included in Senga's pitching repertoire is a unique pitch called the 'ghost fork'...The pitch is so named because its break gives the appearance that it disappears out of the strike zone...All eight of Senga's strikeouts on April 2 came via the 'ghost fork.'
