PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (23-23) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (24-22) May 17, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 1:35 EDT - Game #47/Home #26 RHP Zack Wheeler (2-0, 2.55 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (6-2, 1.98 ERA)



THE PIRATES: have gone 2-3 after the first five games of this six-game homestand vs. Colorado (2-1, Tuesday-Thursday) and Philadelphia (0-2, Friday-Sunday)...Are in the 22nd game of a stretch of 25 straight games vs. the National League (last interleague game was on April 23 at Texas)...Have the second-best stolen base percentage in MLB (88.0, 44-for-50), trailing only the Phillies (88.6, 31-for-35).

SKENES DAY: Paul Skenes gets the start this afternoon in the finale of this three-game series against the Phillies...Skenes brings a 16.0-inning scoreless streak into today's start, which is the fifth-longest active streak in MLB behind Philadelphia's Christopher Sánchez (29.2ip), Tampa Bay's Shane Bieber (21.2ip), Boston's RHP Suarez (19.0ip) and Milwaukee's Jacob deGrom (18.1ip)...Skenes also tossed 16.0 straight scoreless frames earlier this year from April 13-24.

A NEW ERA: Paul Skenes had a 67.50 ERA after allowing five earned runs in 0.2 inning on Opening Day (March 26) against the Mets at Citi Field...Beginning with his second start on April 1 at Cincinnati, Skenes has a Major-League best 1.09 ERA (49.1ip/6er)...Skenes' six wins since April 1 are also the second-most in all of MLB, trailing only Milwaukee's Aaron Ashby (seven).

HITTIN' THE ROAD: The Pirates will depart tomorrow for a six-game road trip that will take the team to St. Louis (Tuesday-Thursday) and Toronto (Friday-Sunday)...The Pirates went 2-2 in their last series at Busch Stadium from August 25-28 of last season...The Pirates dropped two of three games against the Blue Jays in their last road trip to Toronto from May 31-June 2 of 2024.

MAKE THAT A DOUBLE: Bryan Reynolds enters today one double shy of tying Johnny Ray for second place in Pirates history among switch hitters... Since the beginning of 2019 (his debut season), Reynolds' 201 doubles are the fourth-most in all of MLB among switch hitters, trailing only José Ramírez (243), Ketel Marte (204) and Francisco Lindor (203).

GOING THE EXTRA MILE: The Pirates have recorded an extra-base hit in a season-high 19 straight games (since April 26), which is the fourth-longest active streak in all of Major League Baseball behind the Tigers (44), Orioles (38) and Giants (21)...Pittsburgh has recorded 32 doubles, four triples and 20 home runs during the 19-game stretch.

IN THE NICK OF TIME: Nick Gonzales went 2-for-3 on Saturday for his 16th multi-hit game of the season...Gonzales' 16 multi-hit games are tied for the third-most among all National League players, trailing only Miami's Otto Lopez (18) and Atlanta's Drake Baldwin (17)...Gonzales enters today fourth in the National League and seventh in all of MLB with a .320 batting average.

INDISPENCEABLE: Spencer Horwitz went 2-for-4 with a run scored on Friday vs. Philadelphia (he also stole the first base of his Major League career and first since April 7, 2024 with Triple-A Buffalo at Worcester in the sixth inning)...He is 13-for-37 (.351) with five doubles, a triple, nine RBI, six walks, a steal, four runs and a .983 OPS in his last 11 games (since May 2 vs. Cincinnati).

KONNOR CONNECTING: Konnor Griffin is hitting at a .353 clip (6-for-17) during his current four-game hitting streak...Griffin's 17 hits this month are tied for the most among all rookies in MLB along with Carson Benge of the New York Mets...Griffin's 27 total bases this month are also tied for second among all rookies in MLB along with Munetaka Murakami of the White Sox... Toronto's Kazuma Okamoto leads the way with 32 total bases.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

May 17, 2024: Paul Skenes struck out 11 batters in 6.0-no-hit innings as the Pirates beat the Cubs 9-3 at Wrigley Field. Skenes, who earned his first career win, became the first pitcher in MLB history to have a start where he struck out the first seven batters or more and finished with zero hits allowed. His 11 punchouts also marked the 21st double-digit strikeout game by a rookie in Pirates history.

TODAY'S STARTER **RHP PAUL SKENES** **#30**

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes won a 3-1 decision after allowing just two hits (one hit by pitch) and striking out a season-high 10 batters over 8.0 innings on May 12 vs. Colorado...It marked his second straight start of at least 8.0 scoreless innings with two or fewer hits allowed and zero walks issued (also May 6 at Arizona)...He joined Bob Veale (September 16-22, 1963) and Steve Blass (September 15-20, 1968) as the only Pirates pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings and allow two or fewer hits in back-to-back starts...Skenes also became just the fourth Major League pitcher in the Modern Era to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings while allowing two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts, along with Boston (AL)'s Cy Young (1905), Chicago (AL)'s Billy Pierce (1958) and San Diego's Mat Latos (2010).

DON'T WALK HERE: Skenes has not issued a walk in 35.0 consecutive innings, a streak that began in the fourth inning on April 13 vs. Washington...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he and Bob Friend (46.1ip, May 28-June 22, 1963) are the only Pirates in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to have a streak of at least 35.0 innings w/o issuing a walk.

SWEET SIXTEEN: Skenes has not allowed a run in 16.0 consecutive innings, a streak that began in the first inning on May 6 at Arizona...It marks his second 16.0-inning scoreless streak this season (also April 13-24)...His career-best scoreless streak is 18.0 consecutive innings, which he set last season from July 11-August 2...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is one of six Pirates pitchers this century to have multiple scoreless streaks of at least 16.0 innings in a season, along with Mark Redman (2005), Tony Watson (2014), Edinson Volquez (2014), Watson (2015) & Trevor Williams (2018).

AGAINST THE PHILLIES: Skenes has a 0.57 ERA (15.2ip/1er) and 16 strikeouts in two career starts vs. Philadelphia...He lost a 1-0 decision after striking out nine batters in an 8.0-inning complete game on May 18, 2025 at Citizens Bank Park...He also allowed an unearned run & struck out seven batters in 7.2 innings last year on June 8 at PNC Park.

BEST OF THE BEST: Skenes' 1.97 ERA (370.2ip/81er) through his first 64 Major League starts is the third-best mark among all Major League pitchers since earned runs became an official stat in both leagues in 1913, trailing only Boston (AL)'s Rube Foster (1.92, 1913-15) and Boston (AL)'s Ernie Shore (1.95, 1914-16)...His 23 scoreless starts (last on May 12 vs. Colorado) in his first 64 career starts are the most by any pitcher since 1901.

HISTORIC PERFORMANCE: Skenes pitched 6.2 perfect innings before allowing a single to Jake Bauers on April 24 at Milwaukee (he went on to strike out seven batters and surrender just the one hit over his 7.0 innings)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he tied Nellie Briles (August 22, 1972 at San Francisco), Bert Blyleven (August 16, 1980 vs. Montréal) and Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) for the third-longest perfect game bid by a Pirates pitcher during the Expansion Era (since 1961), behind only Ken Brett (8.0ip, May 27, 1974 vs. San Diego) and Jeff Karstens (7.2ip, August 6, 2008 at Arizona)...Skenes was the sixth Pittsburgh pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have a start of at least 7.0 scoreless innings with one or zero hits allowed, zero walks issued and at least seven strikeouts...Skenes joined Bob Friend (September 7, 1955 at Chicago), Woodie Fryman (July 1, 1966 at New York), A.J. Burnett (April 17, 2013 vs. St. Louis), Kingham (April 29, 2018) & Jared Jones (May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado).

WHAT'S UP, DOC: Skenes won the National League Cy Young Award in 2025, one year after being named the National League Rookie of the Year...He became the second pitcher in Major League history to win the Rookie of the Year Award and the Cy Young Award in consecutive seasons, along with the Mets' Dwight Gooden (1984-85)...Skenes joined Vernon Law (1960) & Doug Drabek (1990) as the only Pirates to win the award.

Had his career-high-tying, three-game hitting streak snapped (also 9/27-29, 2024) while starting in center field in the 5-0 loss on 4/26 at Milwaukee. Has made two starts in center field, two starts in right field, one start at first base and one start in left field (last in right field on 5/8 at San Francisco).

His 10 home runs as a center fielder are tied with Los Angeles (NL)'s Andy Pages for the second-most in MLB, trailing Minnesota's Byron Buxton (15). Is 17-for-59 (.288) with four home runs, 11 RBI and an .848 OPS against left-handed pitchers this year (he went 11-for-108 vs. southpaws last year).

Has become the first Pittsburgh player to be successful in at least each of his first 10 career steal attempts since Chase d'Arnaud in 2011 (11-for-11). Is 26-for-80 (.325) with nine extra-base hits, 12 RBI, seven walks, six steals and 12 runs scored across his last 21 games (since 4/24 at Milwaukee).

His 30 RBI out of the No. 2 spot of the lineup are the third-most in all of Major League Baseball (Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber ranks first w/36 RBI).

Hit his 300th career home run (off Robbie Ray) on 5/8 at San Francisco (he became the 15th Dominican-born player to reach the 300-home run mark). Has recorded 14 of his 16 RBI at PNC Park so far this season...Is 8-for-25 (.320) w/a 1.033 OPS against left-handed pitchers since 4/16 vs. Washington.

His .392 OBP is the fifth-highest mark among all National League batters (his 34 walks are tied for the seventh-most in all of Major League Baseball). His 510 RBI rank first among all Pirates switch hitters (RBI official in 1920)...The Pirates are 14-3 when he has an RBI (last on Thursday vs. Colorado). His third-inning single off Diamondbacks starter Michael Soroka during the team's 1-0 victory on 5/6 was the 1000th hit of his Major League career.

Was recalled from Triple-A Indianapolis prior to Tuesday's game...Hit .221 (25-for-113) with six doubles, a homer and 16 RBI in his 34 games w/Indy. Hit .173 (9-for-52) with four doubles, two RBI, five walks & five runs in 18 games with Pittsburgh in 2025 (missed most of the season due to injuries).
