**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Phillies, 7-6, yesterday...New York is coming off a seven-day, six-game road trip (2-4) to Houston (1-2) and Philadelphia (1-2)...Tonight, the Mets start of a seven-game homestand against the Brewers (four games) and Giants (three games).

**BLACK LEGACY GAME:** Today, in celebration of Juneteenth, the Mets will host their first Black Legacy Game...The game honors former Black Mets players, while also paying tribute to significant Black historical figures...The first 15,000 fans in attendance will receive a Starling Marte Bobblehead, inspired by the blockbuster film Black Panther...Singer/songwriter Tarrey Torae will sing the National Anthem...Mookie Wilson will be throw out the ceremonial first pitch.

**PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Congrats to RHP Luis Moreno who was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Week...He appeared in two games last week, going 1-0 and did not allow a run in 9.0 innings...He surrendered two hits, walked twice and struck out 11...The Dominican Republic native has appeared in 14 games (12 starts) with Double-A Binghamton and is 5-2 with a 4.77 ERA (35 ER/66.0 IP) with 36 walks and 61 strikeouts.

**BACK IN THE CITI:** The Mets return home for their final homestand before the All-Star break...The Mets are 17-15 at home this year and have posted a 4.14 ERA...The Mets went 28-15 at home before the All-Star break last season.

**J. CREW:** Justin Verlander is set to make his 10th start of the season tonight against the Brewers...He is 2-4 with a 4.50 ERA (26 ER/52.0 IP) with 13 walks and 44 punchouts...In four starts at home, Verlander is 1-2 with a 3.24 ERA (9 ER/25.0 IP) with five walks and 22 strikeouts...Verlander has made three career starts against the Brewers, going 2-0 with a 1.90 ERA (5 ER/23.2 IP) with seven walks and 35 strikeouts.

**BEER ME:** Brandon Nimmo has hit .330 (30-91) with 16 runs, six doubles, five triples, two home runs, two RBI, 10 walks with a .408 OBP and a .571 SLG in 27 career games against Milwaukee...Starling Marte has appeared in 118 career games against the Crew and is a .291/.331/.477 hitter with 25 doubles, five triples, 16 home runs and 58 RBI...Daniel Vogelbach, who played for the Crew, is a .299/.413/.493 hitter with seven extra-base hits and 12 RBI in 20 games against the Brewers.

**GIRL DAD POWER:** Over the last eight games, Francisco Lindor is batting .333 (8-24) with seven runs, two doubles, three home runs, eight RBI, six walks, three steals with a .469 OBP and a .792 SLG...Over the last 18 games, Lindor has posted a .970 OPS, batting .259 (15-58) with 12 runs, four doubles, five home runs, 12 RBI, 12 walks, five steals with a .384 OBP and a .586 SLG...He has posted a 2.3 fWAR this year, which ranks 17th in the National League...His 34 extra-base hits are tied for the 10th most in the National League.

**MILESTONES:** Francisco Lindor hit his 199th career home run yesterday, putting him one away from 200 for his career...According to Elias, 13 players have hit their 200th career home runs in a Mets uniform, the last was Todd Frazier on June 20, 2019...Six Mets players did it in a home game: Todd Zeile (8/17/00), Jeremy Burnitz (8/30/02), Cliff Floyd (9/18/05), Carlos Beltran (8/26/06), Jason Bay (8/8/11), and David Wright 8/24/12).

**NIFTY FIFTY:** Pete Alonso has recorded 55 RBI, while and Francisco Lindor has recorded 52 RBI this year...Alonso ranks tied for third in the NL, while Lindor is fifth...The Mets are one of four teams in the majors with two players who have each recorded at least 50 RBI...They join the Braves (Ozzie Albies - 55 and Matt Olson - 60) as the only other team in the National League.

**FIRST IS THE WORST:** The Mets have been outscored 56-23 in the first inning this year...New York has posted a 6.08 ERA (52 ER/77.0 IP) in the first inning this season...That is the fifth-highest first inning ERA in the majors...Last year, the Mets posted a 4.39 ERA (79 ER/162.0 IP) in the first frame.

**BREWERS-METS NOTES:** The Mets earned a series win over the Brewers from September 19-21, 2022, clinching a spot in the playoff.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Despite missing 10 games, Pete Alonso's 24 home runs this year, are the second-most in the National League and rank third in the majors to Shohei Ohtani and Matt Olson who have each his 25... Alonso has homered twice over his last five games.

**STEAL THIS BASE:** The Mets have stole a franchise-record 31 consecutive bases without being caught...The last time a Mets player was thrown out attempting a stolen base was on May 10 (Francisco Lindor at second)... The Mets are first in the major leagues with a 90.5% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 20 bags this year, tied for sixth in the majors and tied for third in the National League...His 334 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

**RISPY BUSINESS:** In 16 games since June 7, the Mets are batting .297 (43-145) with 65 RBI with RISP...That is the fifth-highest mark in the majors in that span...Overall, the Mets are batting .253/.343/.391 with RISP this year.

**KEEP THE CAR RUNNING:** The Mets are 5-10 when both teams score six or more runs this year...They are 3-6 when both score seven or more runs and 2-3 when they both score 8 or more runs.

**IF YOU START ME OFF:** New York is 21-2 when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings...The Mets are 8-1 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

**FIRST IS THE BEST:** The Mets are 22-8 (.733) when scoring first this season...On the other hand, the Mets are 13-34 (.277) when their opponent scores first.

**DR. ROBERTSON:** David Robertson has posted a 2-1 record with 11 saves, and a 1.64 ERA (6 ER/33.0 IP) in 29 appearances this season...He has walked eight, while striking out 40...He ranks fifth in the NL in ERA among relievers and tied for 18th with 40 punchouts...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .172 (11-64) average this year.

**PHAM-TASTIC:** Tommy Pham has safely hit in 14 of his last 16 games... Over the last 16 games, Pham is batting .302 (19-563) with nine runs, six doubles, two home runs, 13 RBI, five walks, three steals with an .840 OPS... Since May 17, Pham is batting .315 (28-89) with 13 runs, eight doubles, one triple, four home runs, 20 RBI, nine walks, six steals with a .936 OPS in 27 games.

**WHEN YOU'RE IN SCORING POSITION, YOU'RE PHAMILY:** Tommy Pham leads the Mets with a .342 (13-38) average with runners in scoring position...Since May 18, has 10 hits in 21 at-bats with RISP...He leads the NL in average (.476), slugging percentage (1.000) and OPS (1.538) with RISP over that timeframe.

**ABSENCE OF PROOF:** The New York Mets are teaming up with the national non-alcoholic pop-up Absence of Proof to bring a fun non-alcoholic experience to Citi Field...Fans ages 21 and up can enjoy a ballgame at Citi Field while sipping on refreshing craft mocktails and other non-alcoholic beverages during this special experience...The event, presented by Cadillac and Dunkin', will run in the Piazza Club on the Excelsior level for four home games: Thursday, June 29 vs. the Milwaukee Brewers and June 30-July 2 vs. the San Francisco Giants.

### VERLANDER NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Took the mound at Minute Maid Park on June 20 and faced the Astros for the first time since signing with the Mets this offseason...Suffered the loss and allowed four runs over 7.0 innings...Surrendered four hits, struck out five batters and did not issue a walk.

**HOME IMPROVEMENT:** After allowing six runs over 5.0 innings in his Mets Citi Field debut on May 16 vs. Tampa Bay, Verlander has pitched to a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP) over his last three home starts...During that span, Verlander has a 0.70 WHIP, has held opposing batters to a .159 average and a .470 OPS.

**3K AND COUNTING:** Entering the 2023 season, Verlander was 12th on the all-time strikeout list with 3,198 strikeouts, five ahead of teammate Max Scherzer...Scherzer has since passed Verlander, but the pair remain close, with just 27 separating the two...Entering last season, Verlander ranked 19th on the all-time with 3,013 career strikeouts, seven behind Scherzer...During the 2022 season, Verlander passed all-time greats John Smoltz, C.C. Sabathia, Curt Schilling, Bob Gibson, Pedro Martinez and Fergie Jenkins...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

**A TRUE COMEBACK STORY:** In 2022, Verlander returned to the mound for the first time since July 24, 2020 and had a tremendous season after fully recovering from Tommy John Surgery...Verlander went 18-4 with a 1.75 ERA (34 ER/175.0 IP) in 28 starts with the Astros last season in route to his third career Cy Young Award and American League Comeback Player of the Year...His ERA was the lowest by an American League pitcher in a full season since Pedro Martinez had a 1.74 ERA (42 ER/217.0 IP) in 2000...It was the third-lowest ERA by an AL pitcher and the ninth-lowest in the majors in a single season in the Divisional ERA (1969)...Verlander led the AL in ERA, wins, WHIP (.083), opponent OPS (.497), opponent average (.186), opponent slugging percentage (.297) and hits per nine innings (5.97)...At 39 years and 227 days, Verlander became the fourth oldest Cy Young Award winner in major league history behind Roger Clemens (2004, 42 years, 60 days), Gaylord Perry (1978, 40 years, 17 days) and Early Wynn (1959, 39 years, 267 days).

**30 FOR 30:** With a win on May 10th against the Reds, Verlander became the 21st pitcher in major league history to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams...He joined Gerrit Cole, Zack Greinke and teammate Max Scherzer as the only active pitchers to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams...Courtesy of Elias.

**LIKE A FINE WINE:** Verlander's ERA last season was the second-best in major league history by a pitcher age 39 or older behind Cy Young's 1.26 ERA in 1908 during his age 41 season (Min. 20 starts)...His 0.83 WHIP last season was the highest mark by a pitcher age 39 or above in major league history (Min. 20 starts)...Verlander's 185 strikeouts last season were the most by a pitcher in a season age 39 or older since John Smoltz struck out 197 batters in his age 40 season in 2007...His 18 wins at 39 were the most at the age since Mike Mussina won 20 games in his age 39 season in 2008.

**THE RÉSUMÉ SPEAKS FOR ITSELF:** Verlander is one of 11 pitchers with at least three Cy Young Awards...In 2011, Verlander took both the AL Cy Young and the AL MVP after winning the AL pitching triple crown after leading the league in after leading the league in wins (24), strikeouts (250) and ERA (2.40)...He is one of 11 pitchers to win both a Cy Young and MVP in the same season...Verlander and Don Newcombe are the only pitchers in major league history to have won Rookie of the Year, Cy Young and MVP...A nine-time All-Star, Verlander is tied with Clayton Kershaw for the most All-Star game appearances by an active pitcher...Verlander has started two Mid-Summer classics (2012 and 2019) and is one of 12 pitchers in major league history to start the All-Star game with two different clubs.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP DAVID PETERSON (1-6, 8.08)

**LAST TIME OUT IN THE MAJORS:** Allowed six runs over 5.0 innings and suffered the loss on May 15 against the Nationals at Nationals Park...Surrendered, nine hits, issued two walks and recorded five strikeouts.

**INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Peterson took home International League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of May 15-21 after throwing 8.0 scoreless innings and striking out nine batters in a win over the Norfolk Tides on May 21.

- Has 11 long balls and 23 RBI in his last 27 appearances...13 of his last 27 hits have been home runs and 17 of his last 27 have gone for extra bases.
- Hit a solo homer on June 4 vs. Toronto to set a Citi Field record with his 72nd career blast at the venue.
- Belted an opposite-field, game-tying grand slam on May 19 vs. Cleveland...Was his third career grand slam and the third game-tying slam in Mets history.
- Tied a Mets record with his fourth career walk-off blast on May 17 vs. Tampa Bay, a three-run shot to ice an 8-7, extra-inning victory...Five other hitters have hit four walk-off home runs with the Mets: Chris Jones, Kevin McReynolds, Cleon Jones, Mike Piazza and Wilmer Flores.
- His walk-off home run on May 17 was his fourth career extra-inning long ball...He is a .417 (10-24) hitter in extra innings with a 1.442 OPS in his career.
- Ranks fifth on the Mets all-time home run list with 170 homers...Howard Johnson (192) is next.
- Ranks 12th in franchise history with 435 career RBI...Up next: Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468).
