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TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners finish the homestand with the last of 3 games against the Cincinnati Reds (1-1)...the Mariners are coming off a series win against the San Francisco Giants (2-1) to open the first homestand of the second half...following today's series finale against the Reds and an off day Thursday, Seattle will embark on a 7-game road trip at the Texas Rangers (4 G, 7/24-27) and Los Angeles Dodgers (3 G, 7/28-30)...tonight's game will be televised live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call with **Ryan Rowland-Smith** as field analyst...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners dropped yesterday's game against the Reds by an 4-2 final...Seattle is 43-25 (.632) when they homer, 36-14 (.720) when they score 4+ runs and 21-6 (.778) when they record 10+ hits.

- **Seeing Red** - Seattle is 22-7 (.759) all-time against the Reds, their best all-time record against any opponent they have faced...the Mariners have won 8 of 9 series played against the Reds since 2002...since 1900, the Mariners .786 winning percentage against the Reds is the highest of any team against any single opponent.
- **Rubber Soul** - The Mariners are 6-8 in rubber games this season.
- **Home Sweet T-Mobile Park** - The Mariners are 9-3 over their last 12 home games since June 21.
- **Rehab Update** - INF/OF **Brendan Donovan** has made 4 rehab appearances between Triple-A Tacoma (2 G), the ACL Mariners (1 G) and Everett AquaSox (1 G) as he works his way back from the Injured List...Donovan has been on the IL since May 16 with left groin muscle strain...OF **Rob Refsnyder** (right knee inflammation) has made 3 rehab appearances with Triple-A Tacoma

EMERSON'S AMAZING STUFF...Mariners starter **Emerson Hancock** is set to make his first start since the All-Star break in today's game...in the first "half" of the season, Hancock was excellent, going 6-4 with a 3.17 ERA (35 ER, 99.1 IP), 25 walks, 94 strikeouts and a 1.08 WHIP in 18 starts...among American League hurlers with at least 90.0 IP, Hancock ranks 5th in WHIP and 9th in ERA.

SECOND HALF J-ROD SHOW...**Julio Rodríguez** went 1-for-2 in yesterday's game, including his 15th home run of the season, which is tied with **Dominic Canzone** and **Luke Raley** for the team lead...J-Rod has been an excellent second-half hitter in his career, batting .296 (272x919) with 158 runs, 48 doubles, 3 triples, 60 homers, 158 RBI and 38 stolen bases, reaching base at a .349 clip and slugging .551 for an .900 OPS in 224 career games after the All-Star Break (2022-c)...his OPS is over 150 points higher in the second half than the first half (career .739 in first half).

MUÑ ON FIRE...closer **Andrés Muñoz** picked up his 95th career save and 17th of the season on Sunday...he has been flawless over his last 12 appearances (6/16-c), not allowing a run with 18 strikeouts and 4 walks, limiting opponents to a .125 batting average (5x40) with a 0.75 WHIP...during that span, Muñoz's 40.9% strikeout rate ranks 6th among MLB relievers and 2nd in the American League (min. 10.0 IP) behind only Ryan Zeferjahn-LAA (44.4%).

HOT STUFF...second baseman **Cole Young** has posted an impressive .809 OPS and is batting .256 (31x121) with 4 doubles, 9 home runs, 17 RBI, 5 walks and slugging .534 over his last 33 games (6/11-c)...Young leads AL second basemen and ranks 3rd among MLB second basemen (min. 50% G as 2B) with 3.4 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*) this season...he is on pace to join Ken Griffey Jr. (4x), Alex Rodriguez (3x), **Julio Rodríguez** (2x) and Ruppert Jones as Mariners to post a 3.0+ bWAR season at age-22 or younger.

PITCHING HAS BEEN OUTSTANDING...the Mariners pitching staff has excelled in 2026, ranking 1st in MLB in SO/BB (3.44), 1st in fewest BB/9 (2.53), 1st in fewest HR/9 (0.98), 4th in *FanGraphs* Wins Above Replacement (13.8), 3rd in WHIP (1.17) and 5th in ERA (3.58).

RANDY STILL SWINGING IT...in 94 games this season, left fielder **Randy Arozarena** is batting .282 (96x341) with 62 runs, 21 doubles, 1 triple, 11 home runs, 45 RBI, 40 walks and 19 stolen bases, getting on base at a .382 clip, slugging .446 with an .827 OPS this season...Randy is coming off his third All-Star selection (2023, '25-'26) and second with Seattle after being named an All-Star in back-to-back seasons.

NAYLOR'S BAKER'S DOZEN...**Josh Naylor** has reached base safely in each of his last 13 games (7/4-c), batting .306 (15x49) with 5 stolen bases during the streak...Naylor's 39 steals since he joined the Mariners on July 25, 2025 rank T-3rd in MLB, trailing only Jazz Chisholm Jr.-NYY (47) and Bobby Witt Jr. (41).

DOM CANCRUSH...over his last 38 games (5/30-c), **Dominic Canzone** is batting .282 (35x124) with 18 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 19 RBI and 14 walks, reaching base at a .360 clip and slugging .573 for an .932 OPS that ranks 8th in the AL during that span (min. 100 PA)...overall this season, Canzone is batting .257 (62x241) with 34 runs, 13 doubles, 1 triple, 15 home runs, 40 RBI, .335 OBP and slugging .506 for an .841 OPS in 87 games.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Josh Naylor** recorded his 20th stolen base of the season in last night's game, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that the most recent first baseman (min. 50% of games at first base) to record back-to-back 20+ stolen base seasons before Naylor was Wil Myers-SD (2016-17)?...when Naylor records his 30th steal of the season, he would become the first first baseman since George Sisler (1920-22) to record consecutive 30 stolen base seasons.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JULY 22

- **1990** - Alvin Davis collects his 1,000th career hit, the first Mariners player to record 1,000 hits for the franchise.
- **1994** - Mariners begin what turns out to be a 20-game, 22-day, 8-city, 10,425 mile road trip while the roof is being repaired at the Kingdome. Post an 11-9 record including a 9-3 mark in games originally scheduled for the Kingdome.
- **2000** - Mariners endure first home rain delay (54 minutes) in team history. Seattle's 13-5 win over Texas was interrupted for 54 minutes when a rainstorm drenched fans at Safeco Field and the ballpark's roof wouldn't close because of a computer problem. The roof finally began closing about 20 minutes later.
- **2010** - Mariners score 5 runs in the bottom of the ninth to tie the game at 6-6 against Boston, but Seattle ends up losing 6-8 in 13 innings.
- **2022** - Mariners open the second half of their season in front of a sold-out crowd of 45,290 at T-Mobile Park, riding an active 14-game winning streak. The Mariners and MLB unveiled the 2023 All-Star Game Logo prior to the game. Despite the festivities the Mariners winning streak is snapped in a 5-2 loss to Houston.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season and the 50th of his career...this will be his 56th career appearance, including the 6 relief appearances he made throughout the 2025 regular season... it will mark his 1st start of the season and 2nd career start against Cincinnati.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT...on July 12 at Tampa Bay, tossed 1.2 innings before exiting the game after being struck by a comebacker in the 2nd inning...allowed 1 walk and struck out 2 batters over his 1.2 innings of work.

SEMICENTENNIAL START...will make his 50th start in today's game...he will be the 25th pitcher that made their debut in 2023 to record their 50th start...will become 1-of-18 Mariners pitchers to make their first 50 career starts with the franchise.

WHERE WE LEFT OFF... prior to his 1.2 inning start entering into the all-star break, Hancock recorded back-to-back starts of 1-or-fewer runs allowed over 5.2+ IP (6/28-7/5), marking the 2nd time in his career that he has tossed back-to-back starts of 1-or-fewer runs allowed over 5.0 IP (last: 3/29-4/4)...owned a 0.71 ERA (1 ER, 12.2 IP) with 11 strikeouts, 5 walks and a 0.984 WHIP over those 2 starts...his 0.71 ERA matches his 2nd lowest ERA over a span of 2 starts in his career (also: 3/29-4/4) while his 11 strikeouts are tied for 6th most over 2-game span.

HOME TURE...across 9 home starts this season, owns a 2.92 ERA (17 ER, 52.1 IP), 10 walks and 64 strikeouts for a 5.36 K/BB and a .879 WHIP...ranks 3rd in WHIP in MLB (min. 50.0 IP) while his 30.3 K% in home games ranks 5th best and his K/BB ranks 8th best in MLB this season, just ahead of Logan Gilbert's 5.12 (min. 50.0 IP).

WFH TODAY...has recorded 4 home starts with 2-or-fewer runs and 6+ strikeouts over 6.0+ IP...is 1-of-9 pitchers in the AL with 4+ such games this season...the Mariners 20 such games this season are most in MLB...his 6 home starts with 6-or-fewer base runners allowed and 5+ strikeouts over 5.0+ IP are tied for 5th most in MLB with Jacob DeGrom-TEX, just trailing **Bryan Woo** (7 G) and **Logan Gilbert** (7 G)...allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in each of his first 7 home games of the season, becoming the 7th Mariners pitcher all-time to do so (last: J.A. Happ, 2015).

TOP MARKS...is 1-of-4 pitchers this season to have 94+ strikeouts, 25-or-fewer walks and 75-or-fewer hits, along with Zack Wheeler-PHI, Kyle Harrison-MIL, and Tarik Skubal-DET...among those 4 pitchers, has the most innings pitched (99.1)...is 1-of-2 pitchers in Mariners history to record such marks through the first 18 outings of the season, joining **Logan Gilbert** (2025).

NO FREE PASSES...has allowed 3-or-fewer walks over 5.0 IP in 16-of-18 appearances this season, tied for 9th most in the AL (6 others)...his 2.3 BB/9 is 11th best in the AL (min. 90.0 IP)...has contributed 9 starts with 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer walks (last: 7/5 vs. TOR) to a Mariners pitching staff that is tied for the most such games (53) in 2026.

TRAFFIC CONTROL...his 106 base runners allowed over 99.1 innings in his first 18 starts, are the 4th fewest among pitchers in 2026 through their first 18 games (min. 95.0 IP)...is 1-of-3 Mariners pitchers to record 106-or-fewer base runners over 95.0+ IP through their first 18 starts of the season, along with **Bryce Miller** (2023) and **Bryan Woo** (2024)...owns a baserunners-per-9 of 9.42, tied for 7th lowest in MLB in 2026 (min. 95.0 IP), just behind **Logan Gilbert** (9.23)...is 1-of-11 pitchers, along with **Woo** (4 G), to log 4+ starts with 4-or-fewer base runners allowed over 6.0+ IP this season.

CAN'T TOUCH THIS...allowed only 2 hits over 7.0 innings of work in his last home start on July 5 vs. Blue Jays for his 4th start with 2-or-fewer hits allowed over 6.0+ IP this season...is 1-of-8 pitchers in 2026 with 4+ such starts...has thrown 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits in 2 starts this season (5/26 at ATH and 3/29 vs. CLE)...is 1 of 8 AL pitchers with multiple such starts this season, joining teammates **Bryan Woo** (5/6 vs. ATL and 4/3 at LAA) and **Logan Gilbert** (5/10 at CWS and 7/4 vs. TOR)...the Mariners have combined for 7 such starts this season, tied for the most in MLB.

CROSS FIRE...owns a 1.012 WHIP against left-handed batters, ranking 7th best in MLB (min. 40.0 IP) while ranking 10th in K/BB (3.56) among AL pitchers...has thrown his cutter the 2nd most against left-handers (154 times) behind his 4-seam, owning a .150 (3x20) opponent batting average on the pitch to rank 6th lowest among pitchers with at least 100 cutters thrown to lefty batters...his whiff rate (33.9) on his cutter to LHB ranks 4th and his K% (26.1) ranks 9th best (min. 100 cutters).

SWING BATTER BATTER SWING...earns a first pitch swing from the batter 37.6% of the time for 10th highest in the league (min. 95.0 IP)...in at-bats where the 1st pitch is swung at, Hancock has 35 strikeouts to 3 walks (11.67 K/BB) with a 0.814 WHIP...holds the season-high for swinging strikeouts in a single game with 12 recorded in his May 2 start vs. KC, tied with Jacob Misiorowski (6/12 vs. PHI).

UP TO BIG UNIT STANDARDS...on May 2, followed up Mariners legend Randy Johnson's Number Retirement Ceremony with a performance of his own, tossing a career-high 14 strikeouts, and becoming the 4th player with 14+ strikeouts and no walks allowed in Mariners franchise history, joining Randy Johnson (done 2x), **George Kirby** (done 2x) and Mark Langston.

QUALITY CONTROL...has recorded a quality start in 9 of his 18 starts this season...his 6 quality starts with 1-or-fewer walks and 5+ strikeouts this season are T-7th most in MLB...the Mariners are 12-6 when Hancock logs a quality start since 2023 and are 10-4 since the start of 2025...5 of his 9 road starts this season have been quality starts with 2-or-fewer walks and 5+ strikeouts.

SWITCHING UP THE MIX...over his first 17 starts of the season, Hancock has increased his 4-seam usage by 11.6 percentage points since 2025 and increased his sweeper usage by 15.1...his cutter usage increased 11.7 points from his 0.1% use last season...his 31.6 whiff rate is 2nd highest of any of his pitches...he owns a 36.6 whiff rate and a .137 (7x51) opponent batting, the lowest of any of his pitches thrown, on his sweeper...his whiff rate on the sweeper, now his 3rd most used pitch, ranks 9th highest in the AL (min. 200 sweepers thrown).
