**METSCPELLANEOUS:** The Mets defeated the Nationals, 9-5, in Washington D.C. yesterday...The Mets have won eight of their last nine games and 12 of their last 16...The Mets are coming off a six-game trip (5-1) to Miami (3-0) and Washington D.C. (2-1)...This Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (5-1), a span that includes two doubleheaders (August 6 vs. Atlanta and August 20 at Philadelphia) and one scheduled off day (August 11)...The Mets are 50-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 24-6-3 in 33 series this year...Tonight, the Mets return home for an 11-game homestand, their longest of the year, against the Braves (five games), Reds (three games) and Phillies (three games).

**GIVE ME A BREAK:** The Mets are 8-3 in the second-half...The team is batting .296/.357/.494 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in average and are second in OBP and SLG following the All-Star Game...The team has posted a 3.12 ERA with 29 walks and 91 strikeouts in the second-half...The Mets are outscoring opponents 55-36 following the break.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** In 11 games since the All-Star break, Pete Alonso is batting .375 (15-40) with 10 runs, five doubles, for home runs, 10 RBI, seven walks with a .479 OBP and an .800 OPS...Alonso ranks second in the majors and tops the NL with 88 RBI...He is fifth in the majors and third in the NL with 28 home runs...Alonso is ninth in the majors and third in the NL with a .547 SLG.

**THE ROAD TO 100:** Pete Alonso is seeking to record 100 RBI in a season for the second time in his career...Alonso recorded a career-best 120 RBI in 2019, his rookie year...He is seeking to become the eighth player in franchise history with multiple seasons with 100 or more RBI...He would be first Met to do so since Carlos Beltrán and Carlos Delgado accomplished the feat in 2007 and 2008...In total, only 15 Mets, including Alonso, have recorded 100 or more RBI in a season.

**THE EAST IS A BEAST:** The Mets are in a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East and 19 of their next 22 games vs. their division...The Mets are 5-1 during the stretch...Overall, the Mets are 33-13 against the East this year...Their .717 division winning percentage is the best in baseball...They have not lost a series in the division all season long...According to ESPN Stats & Info, New York has either won or tied each of their 14 series this season against the East...That is the third-longest streak by a team to start a season since the MLB implemented divisions in 1969...It's the longest since the Braves went 16 straight to start the 1999 season...Since May 27, the team has gone 20-6 in the division...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.02 ERA against the East, while hitting .261/.338/.421...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents 234-146 this season.

**HECK OR HIGH-WATER MARK:** The Mets are once again a season-high 28 games over .500...Prior to this year, it's the most games over .500 since they were 32 games over with a record of 97-65 to end the 2006 season...New York has won 66 games this season, second-most in the National League...Their .635 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 66-38 record through the team's first 104 games...Only the 1986 (70-34) team posted a better record through the first 104 games of the season.

**SUMMERSLAM:** Daniel Vogelbach hit his first home run with the Mets yesterday, a grand slam in Washington D.C...He became the 11th player in franchise history to hit a grand slam as their first home run with the team...He joins Adrián González, Justin Ruggiano, Taylor Teagarden, Collin Cowgill, Ángel Pagán, Omir Santos, José Reyes, Dave Marshall, Jack Hamilton and Carl Willey.

**BACH IN A NEW YORK GROOVE:** The Mets acquired infielder Daniel Vogelbach from Pittsburgh on July 22...In nine games with New York, the lefty has hit .308 (8-26) with three runs, two doubles, a home run, seven walks, four RBI, with a .971 OPS...He has reached base safely in eight of those contests and in all of his starts...Vogelbach has posted a .270/.382/.536 slashline with 25 extra-base hits against right-handed hitters this year.

**C IS FOR COOKIE:** Carlos Carrasco has thrown 18.2 scoreless innings to finish out the month of July...His current streak is the third-longest of his career...His career-best is a 22.0 inning scoreless streak set in 2015 with Cleveland...Overall, he went 3-0 with a 0.90 ERA (three earned runs/30.0 innings) with nine walks and 27 strikeouts...That is his lowest ERA for any month in his career...His 0.90 ERA in July is the fourth-lowest ERA for any single month (min. 30 innings)...He trails only Mets pitchers with a sub-1.00 ERA in a single month since 1990 (min. 30 IP): Frank Viola (April 1991 - 0.86 ERA), Al Leiter (April 2002 - 0.92 ERA), R.A. Dickey (June 2012 - 0.93 ERA) and Jacob deGrom (April 2021 - 0.51 ERA).

**FOR STARTERS:** Since Max Scherzer returned from the Injured List on July 5, Mets starters have posted a 1.91 ERA (31 earned runs/146.1 innings) in the team's last 24 games with 151 strikeouts and 38 walks...That is over a full run better than the next-best club, the Dodgers (3.04)...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.53 in that span...The Mets rank fifth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.53 ERA from their starters.

**BRAVES-METS NOTES:** The Mets will play the Braves nine times over the next two weeks.

**HANG 10:** Francisco Lindor is on a 10-game hitting streak, batting .421 (16-38) with nine runs, four doubles, three home runs, eight RBI, six walks with a .500 OBP and a .763 SLG in that span...It's the second time this season he has recorded a hitting streak of at least 10 games...His season-high is 11 games with a hit from July 7-17...He has safely hit in 21 of his last 22 games, batting .337 (30-89) in that span with 15 runs, five doubles, a triple, six home runs, 17 RBI, 10 walks with a .404 OBP, a .618 SLG and a 1.022 OPS in that span.

**LINDOR CITY OVER HERE:** Over his last 52 games since June 1, Lindor is batting .263/.330/.473 with 26 runs, eight doubles, a triple, 11 home runs, 32 RBI, 18 walks with an .804 OPS...He is batting .315/.392/.568 in 28 games since the start of July...He ranks tied for second in the majors with 20 go-ahead RBI behind teammate Pete Alonso (25)... He ranks 11th in the majors and seventh in the National League with a 4.3 fWAR.

**20/20 VISION:** Francisco Lindor has recorded 74 RBI in 103 games this season (72 as a shortstop)...That is the second-most RBI by a shortstop in Mets history...José Reyes owns the record, recording 81 RBI in 153 games in 2006...He has hit 19 home runs this season (18 as a shortstop)...Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016...He is seeking to become the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in multiple seasons...Lindor blasted 20 home runs in 2021...Lindor has recorded 104 hits this season, matching his total from 2021...Francisco Lindor is sixth in the majors and fourth in the NL with 74 RBI...The Mets are the only team in the majors with two players with 70 or more RBI this season.

**REPEAT RELIEVER:** Edwin Díaz has been voted the National League Reliever of the Month for the second consecutive month...Díaz earned his seventh career Reliever of the Month Award and his second in a row...He is the first Major League reliever to win consecutive Reliever of the Month Awards since Josh Hader in May-June 2019...He made 11 scoreless appearances and converted each of his seven save opportunities, striking out 25 and issuing just one walk in 11.1 innings...Since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.43 ERA (one earned runs/21.0 innings) with 10 hits, two walks and 46 strikeouts...He has converted all 12 saves in that period.

**30 FOR 39:** 30 of Díaz last 39 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He has not allowed a run in his last 15 outings dating back to June 22, covering 14.1 innings...That places him 1.2 innings shy of his career-high scoreless streak of 16.0 innings...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 84 strikeouts That is 18 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has struck out 52.5% of batters faced (84/160), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 42 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 18.14 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rating over 16.00...Overall, he is 2-1 with 23 saves, a 1.51 ERA (seven earned runs/41.2 innings), allowing 26 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 37-5 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

**CITI SLICKERS:** The Mets have played 48 games at Citi Field this year, which is the third-fewest in the majors and the second-fewest in the National League...By comparison, the Braves have played 59 home games, the most in the majors...The Mets are 31-17 at home...They are fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a .646 winning percentage at home...The Mets have posted a 3.27 ERA with 145 walks and 461 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL.

**CONNECT FOUR:** The Mets have won 24 consecutive games in which they've scored at least four runs, and are 34-1 since May 27 when scoring at least four times...Their 24 wins scoring four or more runs is the second-longest such streak in franchise history and is the longest single-season streak...The franchise record is 25 games from August 25, 1971 - May 10, 1972...The 2021 Mets went 62-19 when scoring four or more...New York is 56-5 when scoring at least four runs in a game this year...The team's 56 wins when scoring at least four runs is tied for second in the majors...Their .919 winning percentage when scoring four or more runs is the best in the majors.

**RETURN OF THE MAC:** Jeff McNeil is on a six-game hitting streak, batting .462 (12-26) with four runs, five doubles, a home run, three RBI with a .481 OBP and a .769 SLG in that span...He has recorded four multi-hit games in that span...He tied a franchise record with three doubles yesterday...It was 31st time in team history and first since Dom Smith on September 6, 2020...McNeil has recorded 106 doubles in his career, which times him with Curtis Granderson for 28th in franchise history...Next up is Tommie Agee with 107 doubles.

**MARTE PARTY:** After batting .224/.290/.318 in 20 games in April...Marte is batting .323/.366/.517 with 47 runs, 17 doubles, four triples, nine home runs, 33 RBI with 14 walks...Over his last 22 games, he is batting .360 (32-89) with 11 runs, three doubles, four homers, 12 RBI, five walks with a .406 OBP and a .551 SLG...Marte leads the club and is tied for ninth in the NL with a .299 average.

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Brandon Nimmo has reached base safely in seven straight games, batting .364 (12-33) with five runs, two doubles, a home run, six RBI, a walk with a .400 OBP, a .515 SLG and a .915 OPS in that span.

**A HIT'S A HIT:** The Mets lead the major leagues with 134 infield hits this year...That is eight more than the second-place team, the Cleveland Guardians...Brandon Nimmo and Jeff McNeil are tied for sixth in the National League with 17 infield hits...Mark Canha has recorded 16 infield hits and Starling Marte has collected 15.

### CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

**THAT MAKES 100:** Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 at Miami...Tossed 7.2 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and seven strikeouts...The Mets have won each of his last five starts...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest Venezuelan-born hurler to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...Is one of 18 active pitchers with 100 career victories.

**JULY HEAT:** Carrasco went 3-0 with a 0.90 ERA (three earned runs/30.0 innings), nine walks and 27 strikeouts in five starts in the month of July...It is his lowest ERA for any month in his career and the third-lowest for any single month in Mets history since 1990 (min. 30.0 IP)...In that time frame, he joins Frank Viola (0.86 ERA, April 1991), Al Leiter (0.92 ERA, April 2002), R.A. Dickey (0.93 ERA, June 2012) and Jacob deGrom (0.51 ERA, April 2021) as the only Mets pitchers with a sub-1.00 ERA in a single month.

**CLUTCH COOKIE:** Carrasco has not allowed a run in 18.2 consecutive innings since July 14...He has thrown three consecutive scoreless starts for the first time in his career...Had four separate streaks of two straight scoreless starts between 2011-2019...His longest career scoreless streak is 21.1 innings from June 7-June 18, 2011...Has three scoreless innings streaks of at least 10.0 innings in a single season for the first time since 2018...His six scoreless starts on the season are tied for second-most in the majors behind Paul Blackburn's (OAK) seven such starts.

**THAT'S QUALITY STUFF:** Registered his seventh quality start of the season in his last outing on July 30...Notched just two such starts last year...Earned back-to-back quality starts on May 3 (G2) and May 10, his first time since finishing 2020 with six in a row...Carrasco's 11 wins on the season are tied for fifth in the majors...He has reached double-digit victories for the fifth time in his career (also, 2015-2018) and has earned 10 wins prior to the All-Star break for the fourth time in his career (also, 2015, 2017 & 2018).

**VS. ATLANTA:** Faced the Braves once this season, tossing 8.0 scoreless innings with six hits, two walks and five strikeouts on May 3 vs. Atlanta for his first career victory against the club...Will be his fourth career appearance (third start) against the Braves and second at home...Carrasco has gone 9-3 with a 2.97 ERA (34 earned runs/103.0 innings) in 22 career games (17 starts) against National League East foes...It is the only division in which he owns a sub-3.00 ERA for his career...This season, his six wins against the NL East are tied with Sandy Alcantara (MIA) for the most in the majors.

**SLIDING BY:** Among MLB qualifiers, Carrasco ranks second with a 35.6% chase rate with his slider...Only Kevin Gausman of the Blue Jays has a better rate (40.7%)...Carrasco has generated a 43.4% chase rate with his slider, his highest of any pitch...Only 24.7 percent of his sliders are hard-hit, meaning an exit velocity of 95 mph or higher, the eighth-lowest percentage in the majors.

**VENEZUELAN BORN:** Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Struck out the 1,400th batter of his career on May 27 vs. Philadelphia, the fourth-highest strikeout total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,400 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego.
