METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Pirates, 8-2, in Pittsburgh yesterday... New York is in stretch of 17-straight games before the All-Star break...They are 5-6 in that span...Tonight, the Mets return to Citi Field to close out the first-half with a six-game homestand against Nationals (three games) and Rockies (three games).

WE REMEMBER: Prior to today's game, the Mets will hold a moment of silence in memory of Team Photographer Marc Levine who sadly passed away...For more than three and half decades, Marc documented every move our team made from minor leaguers to Hall of Fame and number retirement ceremonies...He photographed over 2,000 Mets.

WAG THE TAIL: Billy Wagner will be available in the press conference room following Manager Carlos Mendoza's media availability...Wagner spent four seasons with the Mets, going 5-5 with 101 saves and a 2.37 ERA...He is sixth in team-history with 101 saves...All together, Wagner played 16 major league seasons, going 47-40 with 422 saves, a 2.31 ERA with 1,196 strikeouts...His 422 saves are the eighth-most in MLB history and the second-most by a left-handed pitcher.

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Congrats to Pete Alonso who was named to the 2024 NL All-Star team...The 94th All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, July 16 in Texas...Alonso, 29, was named to the All-Star team for the fourth time in his career, the most by any first baseman in team history – one more than Keith Hernandez...Alonso, who was also an All-Star in 2019, 2022 and 2023, becomes the 11th Met to be named to four or more All-Star teams.

DERBY DAY: Alonso also announced last night that he will participate in the 2024 Home Run Derby...A two-time Derby winner, Alonso will attempt to become the second player to win the event three times (also, Ken Griffey Jr.)...He will be the sixth player to compete in the HR Derby at least five times, joining Griffey Jr. (eight), Mark McGwire (seven), Barry Bonds (six), Sammy Sosa (six) and Albert Pujols (five).

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: RHP Brandon Sproat will represent the New York Mets at the 2024 All-Star Futures Game...Sproat, who was promoted to #98 on MLB Pipeline's Top 100 Prospects, has appeared in 13 games (12 starts) with the Cyclones and Rumble Ponies this season...He is a combined 6-1 with a 1.71 ERA (14 ER/73.2 IP) with 28 walks and 85 strikeouts...In eight starts at Double-A this year, Sproat is 4-0 with a 2.05 ERA (11 ER/48.1 IP) with 12 walks and 52 strikeouts...The right-handed pitcher was selected in the second round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida...The Futures Game will be played on Sunday, July 14 in Globe Life Field in Arlington.

HOMEGROWN: The Mets have a homegrown player on their roster from the 2021 (Christian Scott), 2020 (Eric Orze), 2017 (David Peterson, Mark Vientos), 2016 (Pete Alonso), 2013 (Jeff McNeil) and 2011 (Brandon Nimmo) drafts...In addition, the team features several players who signed via International Free Agency including Francisco Alvarez, Jose Quintana, José Buttó and Dedniel Núñez.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: In 46 games batting in the leadoff spot this year, Francisco Lindor is hitting .293/360/513 with 34 runs, 18 doubles, eight home runs, 25 RBI, 14 walks, 10 steals with an .873 OPS...Francisco Lindor has posted a 3.0 fWAR since May 1...That is third in the National League in that span, behind only Bryce Harper (3.3 fWAR) and Shohei Ohtani (3.2 fWAR)...It is seventh in the majors in that period...In 60 games since May 1, Lindor is batting .272/332/484 with 10 home runs and 32 RBI.

fWAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Francisco Lindor ranks ninth in the major leagues and fourth in the National League with a 3.6 fWAR...Brandon Nimmo is 18th in the majors and 10th in the NL with a 3.0 fWAR...His 3.0 fWAR is third among NL outfielders (min. 100 PA) behind only Jurickson Profar (3.3 fWAR) and Christian Yelich (3.1 fWAR).

INVADER NIMS: Entering June, Brandon Nimmo was batting .214/350/378 with 29 runs, nine doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 29 RBI and a .728 OPS...In 30 games since then, he is batting .316/403/581 with 27 runs, eight doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 26 RBI, 14 walks with a .984 OPS...He has safely reached base in 20 of his last 21 games, posting a .457 OBP in that span.

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets have gone 27-12 against the Nationals at Citi Field since the start of the 2019 season.

JULY! JULY! JULY!: The Mets are 4-4 this month, posting a 5.14 ERA, while batting .225/.270/.393...This compares to 16-8 record with a 4.17 ERA and a .280/.356/.504 slashline in June...The team's .225 average in July is 23rd in the majors, while their .270 OBP is 29th...The team's 5.14 ERA in July is 24th in the majors.

IN THE CITI: The Mets return home for seven straight games before the All-Star break...New York is 21-25 at home this year (20-25) at Citi Field...Their 3.65 ERA at home is eighth in the majors and fourth in the NL...The Mets went 43-48 at home in 2023.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 13-12 against the National League East this season...They have posted a 4.47 ERA, while batting .251/.313/.412...The Mets have won nine of their last 13 games against the division.

RECORD SCRATCH: The Mets are in the midst of 18 straight games against teams who currently have records below .500...The team is 4-4 in this stretch...The Mets are 26-20 this season when facing a team with a record below .500.

AM I SEEING DOUBLE?: Francisco Lindor has recorded 26th this season and 100 as a Met...That places him second in the majors...Lindor has recorded 25 or more doubles in three straight years...Since he entered the league in 2015, Lindor has collected 291 doubles...His 291 doubles are the 17th-most by a Puerto Rican born player...Next up is Jose Valentin (302).

QUINTANA NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 7.0 scoreless innings against Washington on July 4 in Nationals park...Allowed just four hits and three walks with one strikeouts.

CONNECT FOUR: Over his last four starts, Quintana is 2-0 with a 1.16 ERA (3 ER/23.1 IP) with nine walks and 22 strikeouts...The Mets are 3-1 in that span.

NINE IS FINE: Over his last nine starts, Quintana is 2-1 with a 3.17 ERA (17 ER/48.1 IP) with 14 walks and 38 strikeouts...He has made five quality starts and has not allowed more than three runs in any of those nine starts.

8.0 IS GREAT: Threw a season-high 8.0 innings on April 28 vs. St. Louis in the Mets' 4-2 walk-off victory...Was his longest start as a Met and his longest start since September 17, 2022 vs. Cincinnati with St. Louis (Also 8.0 IP)...Was the longest start by a Met since Justin Verlander threw 8.0 innings on July 19 vs. Chicago-AL.

OPENING UP: Quintana took the mound for Opening Day on March 29 vs. Milwaukee at Citi Field...He became the 30th Opening Day starter in franchise history...He was the first southpaw since Jon Neise (2013) to be named the Mets Opening Day starter...Quintana started the opener just once prior to today (2017, with Chicago-AL).

PROUD TO BE AN AMERICAN: In March of 2024, the Colombian-born Quintana passed his naturalization test in Miami to become an American citizen.

METS DEBUT SEASON: After starting his first season with the Mets in 2023 on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage, Quintana made his first start for the club on July 20, 2023, against his former team, the Chicago White Sox...The southpaw finished the last season 3-6 with a 3.57 ERA (30 ER/75.2 IP) in 13 starts.

300 CLUB: In his start on September 17, 2023, Quintana became the 11th active pitcher to reach 300 career starts and joined Clayton Kershaw, Madison Bumgarner and Wade Miley as the only active left-handed pitchers with 300 or more career starts.

HOT STREAK: Quintana's homerless inning streak came to an end at 97.1 innings in his start on August 12, 2023, at St. Louis after allowing a solo homer to Tyler O'Neill to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning...The last pitcher before Quintana to reach 90.0+ homerless innings was Tyson Ross (100.0 IP) in 2015...Courtesy of Elias.

LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS: Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022...Quintana currently ranks fourth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts (1,592) behind Clayton Kershaw (2,944), Chris Sale (2,189), Madison Bumgarner (2,070).

YOU GOTTA MAKE 'EM EARN IT: Quintana allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his 19 starts from July 23, 2022 to August 23, 2023...Is the longest such streak of his career and was the longest such active streak in the majors by a starting pitcher (excluding openers)...Quintana's streak of 16 straight starts allowing two earned runs or fewer came to an end in his start against Kansas City on August 1, 2023.

A PERFECT 10: The lefty pitcher struck out a season-high 10 batters on September 23, 2023 in Philadelphia...The fifth highest amount of strikeouts he has ever recorded in a game throughout his career...Was his first double-digit strikeout game since August 13, 2019 when he struck out a career-high 14 batters.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (5-2, 3.83)

NO WAY: Luis Severino carried a no-hitter into the eighth inning on April 29 against the Cubs...Threw 8.0 innings, allowing one run on one hit with two walks and five strikeouts...The outing was tied for the longest no-hit bid of his career...Threw 7.0 hitless innings on October 3, 2022 at Texas with the Yankees...Courtesy of Elias...Marked his longest start since June 16, 2018 vs. Tampa Bay (Also: 8.0 IP)...Became the first Mets pitcher to throw at least 8.0 innings and allow one or zero hits since Marcus Stroman accomplished the feat on July 21, 2021 at Cincinnati...Ranks fourth in the NL among qualifiers in ERA with a 2.31 (9 ER/35.0 IP) mark.

- Was named a National League All-Star for the fourth time on his career on July 7. Is the 11th player in franchise history to be selected to four or more All-Star Games and is the eighth position player in franchise to be selected to four or more All-Star Games.
- Has 27 home runs against the Nationals, the second-most in franchise history against Montreal/Washington (Most: Darryl Strawberry, 31). Are tied with Aaron Judge's 27 homers against Baltimore for the most against any single opponent since 2019.
- Went 2-3 with a double and a run on July 5 at Pittsburgh. Was his 21st double of the season, matching his total from 2023.
- Launched a two-run homer in the 10th on July 2 at Washington. Has five career home runs in extra-innings tied with Kevin McReynolds for second-most in Mets history. Only Howard Johnson (Nine) has more.
- Laced a game-winning double in the ninth on June 18 at Texas. Has 79 game-winning RBI, fifth-most in franchise history.
- Has 546 RBI, seventh-most in franchise history. Carlos Beltrán (559) is next.
- Picked up his second three-hit game of the season on June 17 vs. Texas (Also: 4/13 vs. Kansas City. Has 27 multi-hit games, tied for ninth-most in the NL and tied for 17th-most in the majors.
- Went 2-5 with a two-run homer and a two-run single on June 16 vs. San Diego. Was his ninth career five-RBI game, the second-most such games in franchise history behind David Wright (10). Are the second-most such games since 2019 behind only Nelson Cruz (10).
- Has 10 home runs and 17 doubles over his last 54 games dating to May 7. His 17 doubles during that span are tied for the second-most in the majors, while his 27 extra-base hits during that span are tied for the 11th-most in the majors.
- Is sixth in the NL and tied for 15th in the majors with 18 home runs. Also ranks tied for eighth in the NL in doubles (21), ninth in extra-base hits (39) and 16th in total bases (157).

- Hit safely in a career-best 10 straight games from June 15-28. Batted .515/.595/.939 with three home runs, five doubles, 10 RBI and seven runs during the stretch. Was the longest hitting streak by a Mets catcher since Wilson Ramos' 26-game hitting streak from August 3 - September 3, 2023.
- Went 2-5 with a go-ahead double in the sixth and an RBI triple in the 10th. Was his first career triple.
- Posted a 1.123 OPS in June. Is the highest OPS by a catcher younger than 23 in a month (Min. 50 Plate Appearances) since Johnny Bench in June 1970 (1.208). Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein.
- Went 3-3 with a home run, a double, a walk, three RBI and three runs on June 26 vs. Yankees. Was the third time in his career reaching base four times in a game.
- Has 30 home runs, the fourth-most by a catcher before turning 23. The only catchers with more homers prior to turning 23 are Johnny Bench (87), Iván Rodríguez (37) and Darrell Porter (31).
- Is batting .347/.422/.497 with 15 RBI and 11 extra-base hits in 24 games since returning from the IL on June 11. His 1.019 OPS during that span is the seventh-best in the NL and the 13th-best in the majors during that span (Min. 75 Plate Appearances).
- Recorded a game-tying two-run double in the eighth on June 18 at Texas as part of a three-hit night. Went 3-5 with two RBI on June 17 vs. Texas. Is the first Mets catcher with back-to-back three-hit games since Paul Lo Duca (4/4-4/6/07) and the first catcher age 22 or younger with back-to-back three-hit performances since Salvador Perez (9/17-9/20/11).
