METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Cubs, 4-2, on Wednesday night...The Mets have lost back-to-back games after winning five straight...New York continues a six-game road trip (0-2) to Chicago-NL (0-2) and Colorado (three games)...Following this road trip, the Mets enjoy Memorial Day off before beginning a sixgame homestand against Philadelphia (three games) and Toronto (three games).

HOMER HAPPY: After the Mets went five straight games without a home run, the Mets have homered in season-high eight straight contests, hitting 15 home runs in that span...The Mets are 20-11 when hitting a home run this season and 9-5 when hitting multiple homers...In 2022, the Mets longest home run streak was nine games (September 9-17)...The team hit 14 home runs in that span.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez has homered in three of his last four games... He is batting . 462 (6-13) in that span with four runs, three home runs, seven RBI, a walk with a . 533 OB, a 1.154 SLG and a 1.687 OPS...His six home runs are tied for the fifth-most by a rookie in the majors and tied for the third-most in the National League...The backstop is batting .290 (18-62) with four doubles, six home runs, five walks with a .353 OBP and a .645 SLG against right-handed pitching this year...In 17 games in May, Alvarez is batting . 294 (15-51) with eight runs, four doubles, five home runs, 11 RBI, six walks with a 1.046 OPS.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets rank fifth in the majors and second in the National League with a $84.2 \%$ stolen base rate this season... Starling Marte has swiped 13 bags this year, tied for 10th in the majors and fifth in the National League...His 327 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 340 steals.

18, I JUST DON'T KNOW WHAT I WANT: Pete Alonso has homered in five of his last eight games...Overall, he has hit 18 home runs this year, which leads the majors leagues...His 43 RBI are fourth in The Show and lead the National League...Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 423 career RBI... Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468)...Alonso has appeared in 49 games this year...See the chart below for the fastest Met to reach 20 home runs in a season and the fastest to 50 RBI...Courtesy of Elias.

I RALEY LIKE YOU: Since his return from the 15-Day IL, Brooks Raley has appeared in five games, allowing only one hits, three walks and striking out five in 5.0 innings... He has been unscored upon in 17 of his 19 appearances this season...Overall he is $1-0$ with a 3.31 ERA ( 6 ER/16.1 IP) with four walks and 16 strikeouts.

FOGO POWER: Eduardo Escobar is 12-32 (.375) with a triple, three home runs, six RBI, five runs scored and a 1.147 OPS over his last 14 games.

CUBS-METS NOTES: The Mets have not won a season series against the Cubs snce they went 5-2 against Chicago in 2016.

ROAD WARRIOR: Brandon Nimmo is batting .342 (39-114) with 13 runs, eight doubles, two home runs, 15 RBI, 11 walks with a . 400 OBP and . 465 SLG in 29 games on the road this season...His . 342 road average ranks sixth in the majors.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York has played 29 games on the road this year, the most in the majors...New York is $13-16$ with a 4.72 ERA away from Citi Field in 2023...The team's 248 strikeouts on the road is the most in the majors.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES: The Mets continue a three-game set at Wrigley Field tonight...New York took three of four in the Windy City in 2022...Franciso Lindor is a lifetime $.310(18-58)$ hitter with nine runs, four doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and 12 walks with a . 429 OBP and a . 483 SLG in 15 games at the ballpark...Brandon Nimmo has hit .304/.347/. 435 in 12 career games at the ballpark... In 68 career contests, Starling Marte has hit .267/.322/.451 with 44 runs, 12 doubles, four triples, 10 home runs, 34 RBI and 18 walks.

THREE NIGHTS IN CHICAGO: The Mets are set to play three consecutive night games in Chicago...The last did that from April 20-23, 2021...Prior to that, the team played three straight night games at Wrigley Field from September 12-14, 2017.

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets are 22-0 when leading after eight innings this season...The last time the Mets lost a game when they were ahead after eight innings was on September 6, 2021 at Washington...The Mets were up 3-2 and lost 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth...Since then the Mets have won their last 117 games when ahead after eight, the longest active streak in MLB...It's the tied for the longest streak in franchise history....From October 1 1990-September 2, 1992, the Mets also won 117 straight games when ahead after eight innings.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed 17 errors in 50 games this year...That gives the team a . 990 fielding percentage....Their . 990 fielding percentage ranks fourth in the majors and second in the NL...Their 17 errors are the second-fewest committed in the Senior Circuit...Only the Padres (15) have committed fewer.

FEELING A LITTLE DRAFTY: The Mets have a homegrown player on their roster from the 2019 (Brett Baty), 2018 (Tylor Megill), 2017 (Mark Vientos), 2016 (Pete Alonso), 2013 (Jeff McNeil) and 2011 (Brandon Nimmo) drafts.

COUNTDOWN TO THE HOF: Infielder Howard Johnson, LHP AI Leiter and broadcasters Gary Cohen and Howie Rose will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on Saturday, June 3 in a pregame ceremony prior to the 4:10 p.m. game vs. the Blue Jays at Citi Field...The four new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 34 ...Jay Horwitz will also be honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for his contributions to the organization.

## CARRASCO NEWS \& NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 5.0 innings in his first start back with the Mets since returning from his 15 -day IL stint due to right elbow inflammation...Allowed five earned runs on five hits and two walks while striking out three batters in a 10-9 Mets walk-off win in extra innings.

COOKIE VS. THE CUBBIES: Tonight, Carrasco will face Chicago-NL for the fourth time in his career...In his last start against the Cubs on July 14, 2022, Carrasco threw 6.0 scoreless innings at the Friendly Confines, during which he allowed five hits and two walks while fanning six batters...Throughout his career, Carrasco has made three starts against Chicago-NL, pitching to a 1-1 record with a 3.31 ERA ( $6 \mathrm{ER} / 16.1 \mathrm{IP}$ )...Carrasco has made two starts in his career at Wrigley Field, during which he has pitched to a 2.25 ERA ( 3 ER/12.0 IP) in two starts.

HE'S GOT THE MONTH OF MAY: In 39 appearances and 32 starts in the month of May, Carrasco has pitched to an 18-8 record with a 4.31 ERA (102 ER/213.0 IP)... His .692 winning percentage in May is the best mark of any month during the season...In those appearances, Carrasco has thrown three complete games, including one shutout, and has tallied 201 strikeouts compared to 48 walks.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Recorded a 3.97 ERA (67 ER/152.0 IP) in his first full season with the Mets...Ended the season ranked tied fifth in the National League in wins with 15 and 11th in win percentage with . 628 ...According to Baseball Savant, excelled in chase rate in the 94th percentile for MLB...Locked it down in July with a 0.90 ERA ( $3 \mathrm{ER} / 30.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in five starts that month, tallying three wins and 27 strikeouts...The slider and changeup were effective pitches for Carrasco in 2022, with a 35.5 and 31.6 whiff percentage and 26.2 and 21.8 put away percentage, respectively.
WINNER, WINNER: Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 last season at Miami after tossing 7.2 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and seven strikeouts...His 15 wins were tied for the eighth-most in the majors...He was the first Met to have a 15-win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joined Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more 15+ win seasons since 2017...Won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Was the first Mets starter to win at least six straight decisions in a single season since Zack Wheeler won seven from July 14-August 25, 2017.
MILESTONES \& MORE: At this point in the 2023 campaign, Carrasco is nearing 1500.0 career innings with 1466.2 ...Is also on the precipice of 300 games and 250 starts with 287 and 240 , respectively. Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts last year, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of $150+$ strikeouts since 2015.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelanborn pitcher...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...ls one of 16 active pitchers with 100 career victories...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,400.0 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego.
