METSCOLLAGEOUS: The Mets were postponed yesterday...On Sunday night, the Mets fell to the Braves, 5-3, last night...New York is 35-11-4 in 50 series this year...Tonight, the Mets begin their final series of the regular season, a three-game set against the Nationals.

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets have lost three straight games...That matched their longest of the season...The only season in which the Mets never had more than a three-game losing streak was 1972...That season their longest losing streak was three games... The Dodgers (two games) and Athletics (three games) did not have losing streaks longer than three games in 2020...Prior to that, the last such team was the 2018 Red Sox (three games)...The last such National League team prior to 2020 was the 2014 Dodgers (three games)...Courtesy of Elias.

THESE METS!: Postseason games at Citi Field are now on sale...Fans can access the sale by visiting [Mets.com/Postseason](https://mets.com/postseason)...Fans should log on early, as a limited number of tickets for potential Mets home games in the Wild Card Series, National League Division Series and National League Championship Series will be available during this sale.

LET'S PLAY TWO: New York is set to play its 10th doubleheader of the season today...The Mets are 14-4 (.778) this season in doubleheaders, the most wins in baseball in twin-bill games...Entering today, only Cleveland with 10 has played more doubleheaders this year...It will be the club's 24th double dip since 2021, more than any other team in the majors...The Mets have earned at least a split in all 23 of their twinbills over the last two years...Elias notes the team's streak of 23 consecutive doubleheaders without being swept is the longest in Mets history...New York has swept six of their last 10 doubleheaders, including five DH sweeps this season...The last time the Mets were swept in a doubleheader was September 26, 2020 at Washington.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH: Eduardo Escobar was named the National League Player of the Month for September...Escobar earned his first career NL Player of the Month Award, and he is the first Mets player to win since David Wright in June 2010...The 2021 NL All-Star posted a .340/.393/.649 slash line with 16 runs, 33 hits, four doubles, one triple, eight home runs, 24 RBI and nine walks across 26 games...The Venezuela native posted a 10-game hitting streak from September 2nd-12th, batting .500 (18-36) with eight runs, a double, triple, five homers and nine RBI...Connected on his first career grand slam on September 23rd at Oakland, helping the Mets to a 9-2 victory...The 33-year-old recorded a walk-off RBI single and drove in all five runs for the Mets in 5-4, 10-inning victory over Miami on September 28...He homered in back-to-back contests on two occasions during the month: September 2-3 vs. Washington and September 10-11 at Miami.

JEFF MCHITS: Jeff McNeil leads the majors and the National League with a .326 batting average...He is right ahead of Freddie Freeman (.325) for the major league lead...José Reyes is the only player in Mets history to be crowned an NL batting champion after hitting .337 in 2011...McNeil would be the first Mets player to lead the majors in average.

MULTIPLICITY: McNeil has recorded multiple hits in five straight games and in seven of his last eight games...It is the second time in his career that he has recorded multiple hits in at least five consecutive games...His career-high is six straight games with multiple hits, accomplished from April 12-17, 2019...Over his eight game hitting streak, McNeil is batting .486 (17-35) with seven runs, a double, a home run, three RBI, two walks with a 1.114 OPS...He has collected 162 multi-hit games in his career, which places him for 24th on the Mets all-time list...Rey Ordóñez is 23rd with 168 such games.

BACH IN A NEW YORK GROOVE: Daniel Vogelbach has hit .364 (12-33) with four runs, two doubles, two home runs, nine RBI, nine walks with a .500 OBP, a .606 SLG and a 1.106 OPS over his last 13 games...In 27 games at Citi Field this year, Vogelbach is batting .258 with six extra-base hits, a 4.25 OBP and an .877 OPS...In 2022, he is batting .263/.384/.507 against right-handed pitching.

A CENTURY: Brandon Nimmo has recorded 100 runs this season...His 100 runs are a single-season career-high...It is the 21st time in Mets history that a player recorded at least 100 runs in a season...He became the 13th player in Mets history to record at least 100 runs in a season and the first since Pete Alonso scored 103 runs in 2019...Francisco Lindor is three runs away from 100...His career-best is 129 which he accomplished in 2018...The last time the Mets have multiple players with at least 100 runs scored in a season was 2008, when Carlos Beltrán, José Reyes and David Wright all accomplished that feat.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: Buck Showalter owns a 1,649-1,578 (.511) career record as a manager...His 1,649 wins place him 20th all-time in major league history...Mike Scioscia ranks 19th with 1,650 career wins...Showalter has now managed four teams to the Postseason...He is the fourth manager to accomplish that feat in major league history, joining Dusty Baker (five teams) and Billy Martin and Davey Johnson (four teams)...With three more victories, Showalter would be the first manager in Mets history to record 100 victories in his first season with the club...He also joins Yogi Berra as the only managers to guide the Mets and Yankees into the playoffs.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets have won 51 games at home this year...That their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...The last time the team won more than 50 games in New York was in 2000 when they went 55-26...Overall, the Mets are 51-27 at Citi Field...The team's .654 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage...The Mets have posted a 3.12 ERA with 218 walks and 797 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the third-best home ERA in the NL...The Mets have struck out 797 at home this year, which is the third-most in the NL...That is the second-most in franchise history...The franchise record is 835 strikeouts at home accomplished in 2019.

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets have clinched the season series against the Nats and have won it in four of the last five years.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,534 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...The team's 1,534 strikeouts is a single-season in franchise history...The previous record was 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.78 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (26.2 percent), the highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .606 winning percentage (40-26) following the All-Star break...The team's 40 wins are seventh-most in the majors since the break...The Mets are batting .266/.341/.426 with 72 home runs in 67 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets lead the majors in OBP, are second in average and are sixth in SLG following the break.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 47-26 against the East this year...They have lost only three series in the division all season long (against Atlanta, August 15-18, Washington, September 2-4 and this current series at Atlanta) and have clinched the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.46 ERA against the East, while hitting .260/.333/.418...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents, 358-268.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets have won 98 games...The team's 98 wins are tied for the fourth-most in franchise history...That is tied for the fourth-most in the major leagues...The last time the team recorded more than 98 wins was in 1988 when they won 100...The Mets have only recorded 100 wins in a season three times in franchise history: 1986 (108), 1988 (100) and 1969 (100)...The Mets are 98-61 through 159 games...That is the second-best mark in Mets history...Only the 1986 team (105-54) and 1988 team (98-61) posted a better record...The 1969 team also went 98-61 through 159 games.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor has hit 25 home runs this season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 home runs in 2018 for the most by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He is batting .304/.365/.469 with 43 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, nine home runs, 37 RBI, 23 walks with an .834 OPS in 66 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks sixth in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 6.8 fWAR this season.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 117 strikeouts...That is 21 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Díaz has posted a 0.68 ERA (three earned runs/40.0 innings) with 18 hits, eight walks and 79 strikeouts in 39 appearances since the start of June.

THIS IS 40: Pete Alonso has hit 40 home runs this season...He is the first player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs...Only two players this season have recorded 40 or more home runs - Aaron Judge and Kyle Schwarber...Alonso's 40 home runs are tied for fourth-most in a single season in Mets history...Alonso owns the franchise record with 53 in 2019...Carlos Beltrán (2006) and Todd Hundley (1996) each recorded 41 home runs.

CLEANUP ON AISLE 4: Alonso has hit all 40 of his home runs this season in the fourth spot in the batting order...127 of his 131 RBI have come as the Mets cleanup hitter...Alonso is one of only six players to tally 40 homers and 125 RBI as the No. 4 hitter in a single season since 2000, joining Alex Rodriguez (2007), Carlos Delgado (2000, 2003), Ryan Howard (2007-2009), Prince Fielder (2009) and Andruw Jones (2006).

ONLY A FEW CAN COM-PETE: Pete Alonso has set a franchise single-season RBI record with 131 this season...His 131 RBI tops the majors...Only once before in franchise history has a Met finished the season with the most RBI...Howard Johnson recorded a career-best 117 RBI in 1991 to lead the National League...He has 27 game-winning RBI this season, the most since the stat was first tracked in 1974...His 35 go-ahead RBI are tied for the second-most in a single season in Mets history...Keith Hernandez had 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985.

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Took the loss on September 27 vs. Miami after allowing four runs on six hits (one home run) and a walk with two strikeouts through 3.0 innings...Has lost three of his last six starts after winning five of his previous seven...Marked his first career loss against the Marlins after going 5-0 in his first nine starts against the club.

GOTTA EARN 'EM: Had his career-high streak of 12 starts with three earned runs or fewer (July 3-September 20) snapped in his last outing...Posted a 2.42 ERA (17 earned runs/63.1 innings) during the stretch, his best mark in a 12-start span since July 27-September 30, 2018 (2.30 ERA)...Has given up just two earned runs or fewer in 17 starts this season, tied with Max Scherzer for the second-most such starts on the club, behind 18 from Chris Bassitt.

START ME UP: Carrasco will be making his 29th start of the season tonight, his most in a single-season since making 30 starts in 2018...If he throws at least 2.0 innings tonight, he will have at least 150.0 innings pitched in a single season for the third time in his career and first since doing so in back-to-back seasons from 2017-18...With at least one punchout tonight, Carrasco will have 150+ strikeouts in a season for the fifth time in his career (2015-18)...His 65 earned runs allowed are his fewest through his first 28 starts to begin a season in his career.

VS. WASHINGTON: Will be facing the Nationals for the fifth time this season...Will be his third straight start at home against the club after facing them twice in D.C. to open the season...Took the loss against the Nats on September 4, allowing five runs (one earned) on six hits and two walks with two strikeouts through 2.2 innings...His 3.38 career ERA against the NL East is his lowest mark against any division in the majors (min. 15 games)...This season, his eight wins against the NL East are tied for the most in the majors with Sandy Alcantara (MIA) and Kyle Wright (ATL).

DOUBLE-DIGITS: Recorded 11 strikeouts on September 15 vs. Pittsburgh, the 28th such outing of his career and second of the season (10 Ks on June 6 at San Diego)...It was his most punchouts in a game since also striking out 11 on September 20, 2020 at Detroit while with Cleveland.

WINNER, WINNER: Carrasco won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Has earned 15 wins in a season for the third time in his career...Is tied for the eighth-most wins in the majors...He is the first Met to have a 15-win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joins Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more 15+ win seasons since 2017.

CLUTCH COOKIE: Did not allow a run in 22.2 straight innings from July 14-August 4, surpassing his previous career-long scoreless streak of 22.0 innings from July 30-August 11, 2015...He threw three straight scoreless starts for the first time in his career from July 14-30...He has three scoreless innings streaks of at least 10.0 innings in a single season for the first time since 2018.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Struck out the 1,500th batter of his career on September 20 at Milwaukee, the fourth-highest strikeout total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,400.0 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego...Is the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat when he did so in his 274th career game on July 30 at Miami.

GAME TWO'S STARTER: RHP TAIJUAN WALKER (12-5, 3.59)

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision of the Mets 5-4 win on September 28 vs. Miami...Allowed three runs on six hits (one home run) and two walks with eight strikeouts through 5.0 innings.

HOMER HAPPY: Walker has given up one home run in a season-high five straight starts since 9/6...It is tied with two separate occasions from last season for the third-longest such streak of his career...Had allowed at least one homer in six straight starts from 5/6-6/3/16 and seven straight starts from 7/8-8/16/17.

CITI SLICKER: In 12 starts at Citi Field this season, Walker is 5-1 with a 3.65 ERA (27 ER/66.2 IP)...Prior to allowing eight earned runs over 1.0+ inning at Citi Field on August 5 vs. ATL, Walker was tied with Justin Verlander for the eighth-lowest ERA at home this season among starting pitchers that have made at least seven home starts in the majors (1.93)...Since joining the Mets in 2021, Walker is 9-5 with a 3.54 ERA (62 earned runs/157.2 innings), a 1.08 WHIP and has held opposing batters to a .636 OPS in 28 games (27 starts).
