TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 1, 2003: Behind 7.0 scoreless IP from starter Andy Pettitte (6H, 1BB, 7K), the Yankees defeat Toronto, 10-1, to move to 2-0 on the season. It marks the first time in franchise history that the Yankees won on April Fools' Day.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 2, 2003: Todd Zelle homers in his first career Yankees at-bat in a 9-7 win at Toronto, setting an all-time mark by homering with his 10th Major League team. Later in 2003, after being released by the Yankees, he adds to his total by homering with Montreal.

April 2, 1996: Derek Jeter bats ninth and hits a fifth-inning solo HR in the Yankees' 7-1 Opening Day win at Cleveland's Jacobs Field. He becomes the first Yankee rookie to start at SS on Opening Day since Tom Tresh in 1962.

FRIDAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 3, 2018: Didi Gregorius goes 4-for-4 with 1 double, 2HR, 1BB and 8RBI in Yankees' 11-4 home opener win vs. Tampa Bay, setting single-game franchise records for RBI by a shortstop and RBI by any Yankee in a home opener.

April 3, 2006: The Yankees win, 15-2, at Oakland on Opening Day. Alex Rodriguez goes 3-for-5 with a grand slam and 5RBI and Hideki Matsui goes 4-for-4 with a solo HR and 4RBI.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will play the final game of their three-game set at Seattle today (1-1 thus far)...are 4-1 on their season-opening six-game road trip after sweeping San Francisco in a three-game series and splitting their first two games at Seattle...following this series, will return home for their first homestand of the season, featuring three-game sets vs. Miami (Fri.-Sun.) and the Athletics (4/7-9).

- Have won at least four of their first five games of a season for the third time in the last 23 years since 2004 (also 5-0 in 2024 and 4-1 in '20)...with a win today, would mark just the third time in the last 23 years the Yankees have won five of their first six games (5-1 in 2020 and '24).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Mariners, 5-0, on Tuesday at T-Mobile Park...**LHP Max Fried** (7.0IP, 3H, OR, 1BB, 6K, 1HP) earned the win after tossing 7.0 scoreless innings...**1B Ben Rice** (2-for-2, 2R, 1 double, 1RBI, 2BB) reached base a career-high-tying four times, including an RBI double in the first inning...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-4, 1 double, 2RBI) recorded his fifth straight multi-hit game and drove in two of the club's five runs, hitting an RBI single in the first inning and an RBI double in the sixth inning...**2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (1-for-4, 1RBI, 1SB) hit an RBI single in the sixth inning...**LF Cody Bellinger** (2-for-3, 2R, 1BB, 1SB) reached base three times...**LHP Brent Headrick** (1.0IP, 1H, 1K) and **LHP Tim Hill** (1.0IP) were both scoreless in relief.

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers recorded their third shutout of the season on Tuesday at Seattle...**have allowed only 3R over their first five games, matching the 1943 St. Louis Cardinals for the fewest runs allowed by a team through their first five games of a season in Major League history.**

- Marks only the 11th time in franchise history and just the third time in the last 49 years (since 1978) that the Yankees have allowed only 3R-or-fewer in any five-game span of a season (also 3R in 5G from 5/31-6/4/22 and 4/3-7/02).
- Marks the second time in franchise history (also 2002) and ninth time in Major League history a team has recorded at least three shutouts through their first five games of a season (also three by the 2016 Los Angeles Dodgers, 2015 Oakland Athletics, 2013 Los Angeles Dodgers, 1980 Cincinnati Reds, 1963 St. Louis Cardinals, 1954 Philadelphia Phillies and 1913 Philadelphia Phillies)...did not record their third shutout in 2025 until their 32nd game of the season.
- Have held opponents to a .192/.192/.192 (5-for-26) slash line with RISP.
- Yankees pitchers have not surrendered a HR this year...are the only pitching staff to not allow a HR yet this season.

SEA-ING CLEARLY: The Yankees have won or split 15 of their last 17 completed series vs. the Mariners (since 8/22/16) and 18 of their last 21 completed series (since 6/10/14)...overall, are 39-17 in the last 56 matchups vs. the Mariners (since 8/23/16).

- The Yankees have won 13 of their last 14 completed series at T-Mobile Park (since 9/12/11) and 14 of their last 16 completed series (since 7/8/10)...their 31-12 (.721) record at T-Mobile Park since 2012 is the third-best by any team (min. 30G) at any stadium in that span, trailing only Tampa Bay's 25-9 (.735) record at loanDepot park and Los Angeles-NL's 29-11 (.725) record at Citi Field.
- Are 10-3 in their last 13 games vs. Seattle (since 5/22/24).

SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger reached base three times on Tuesday at Seattle...is batting .333/.429/.444 (6-for-18) with 4R, 1 triple, 3BB and 1SB in five games this season.

- Has batted .341/.396/.537 (28-for-82) with 20R, 4 doubles, 4HR, 13RBI, 8BB, 1SF and 1SB in 21 career games vs. Seattle...has hit .327/.397/.558 (17-for-52) with 10R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 9RBI and 6BB in 13 career games at T-Mobile Park.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have allowed only 2R total through the club's first five games, marking the fewest runs by any Major League team's starting rotation through their first five games of a season (since 1900).

- Yankees starters have allowed only 1R-or-fewer in each of the Yankees' five games...marks only the fifth time since 1900 that a team's starting rotation allowed 1R-or-fewer in each of their first five games of a season, joining the 2023 Minnesota Twins (first seven games), 2018 Boston Red Sox (first seven games), 1988 San Francisco Giants (first five games) and 1943 St. Louis Cardinals (first five games).

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice reached base a career-high-tying four times on Tuesday at Seattle and hit an RBI double in the first inning...has hit safely in each of his four games, batting .357/.471/.500 (5-for-14) with 4R, 2 doubles, 3RBI and 3BB.

STARTING OFF STRONG: Since 2017, the Yankees have gone a Major League-best 133-90 (.596) in March/April.

LAND OF THE FRIED: LHP Max Fried earned his second win of the season on Tuesday at Seattle after tossing 7.0 scoreless innings (3H, 1BB, 6K, 1HP)...is only the seventh pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his first two appearances of a season, joining Ray Caldwell (first 3G in 1914), Mel Stottlemyre (first 2G in 1967), Bob Turley (first 2G in 1958), Allie Reynolds (first 2G in 1947), Bob Shawkey (first 2G in 1922) and Slow Joe Doyle (first 2G in 1906)...is the 10th pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his first two starts of a season (also George Mogridge's first three starts in 1916, Freddy Garcia's first two starts in 2011 and Lew Brockett's first two starts in 1909).

- Has won a career-high eight straight starts since 8/27/25, posting a 1.34 ERA (53.2IP, 8ER) and 51K over that span.
- Also owns a career-high-tying nine-game winning streak (since 8/16/25), posting a 2.09 ERA (64.2IP, 15ER) and 64K during that stretch (also had nine-game winning streaks from 9/21/24-5/24/25 and 4/19-7/6/22)...is only the fourth Yankee in the last 11 years (since 2016) to record as long of a winning streak, joining James Paxton (10-game winning streak in 2019), Luis Gil (nine-game winning streak in 2024) and Jameson Taillon (nine-game winning streak in 2022).
- As a Yankee, has made 17 starts after a Yankees loss and has gone 12-1 with a 1.71 ERA (110.2IP, 21ER) in those starts...has tossed at least 6.0IP in 15 of those starts and has not allowed an ER in eight of them...the Yankees have gone 13-4 when Fried starts after a loss.
- His season-opening 13.1 scoreless inning streak is tied for the second-longest by a Yankees starter to begin the season in the last 15 years (since 2012), trailing only Luis Gil's 18.2 scoreless inning streak in 2021 (Nestor Cortes also had a 13.1 scoreless inning steak in 2022).

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton recorded two hits and drove in two runs on Tuesday at Seattle, hitting an RBI single in the first inning and an RBI double in the sixth inning...his RBI in the first inning marked his 500th RBI as a Yankee...has gone 4-for-6 with 1 double and 3RBI with RISP this year.

- Has recorded multiple hits in each of his first five games, batting .500/.500/.750 (10-for-20) with 2R, 2 doubles, 1HR and 4RBI...is only the fourth Yankee in franchise history to record multiple hits in each of the Yankees' first five games of a season, joining Alfonso Soriano (first 6G in 2003), Bill Skowron (first 6G in 1956) and Bob Meusel (first 6G in 1928).
- His five-game multi-hit streak matches the longest streak of his career (also 5G from 8/3-7/21)...is only the fourth Yankee in the last five years (since 2022) to record multiple hits in at least five straight games, joining Gleyber Torres (6G from 7/8-17/23), Aaron Judge (5G from 4/28-5/3/25) and Anthony Volpe (5G from 6/27-7/1(G2)/23).
- His 10H mark his most hits through his first five games of a season in his career (previous: 8H in 2020)...his 10H are also the most by a Yankee through the club's first five games of a season since Alfonso Soriano (11H) and Bernie Williams (10H) in 2003.
- Has hit safely in each of his last 10 games dating back to last season (since 9/24/25)...matches the fourth-longest hitting streak of his career, trailing only his 17-game streak from 4/29-5/15/14, and 12-game streaks from 4/23-5/6/21 and 9/23/10-4/11/11 (also had 10-game streaks from 7/25-8/4/25, 6/11-22/24 and 4/28-5/7/12).

WHAT A RELIEF: Yankees relievers have allowed only 1R in 17.0 innings this year, posting a 0.53 ERA...have held opponents to a .180/.242/.213 (11-for-61) slash line.

- Have not allowed an inherited runner to score (7IR).
- All Rise: OF Aaron Judge has hit .341/.459/.778 (46-for-135) with 32R, 14 doubles, 15HR, 34RBI, 31BB, 1HP, 35B and 35F over his last 37 games against the Mariners (since 8/27/17)...has hit 15HR in his last 34 games vs. the Mariners (since 6/21/18) and 17HR in his last 42 games against Seattle (since 7/21/17).
- Since 2017, has hit .345/.468/.805 (30-for-87) with 19R, 7 doubles, 11HR, 25RBI, 21BB, 1HP, 35B and 25F in 24 games at T-Mobile Park...has hit 11HR in his last 23 games at T-Mobile Park (since 7/21/17).

THE RIGHT CALL: The Yankees are 12-for-14 in ABS challenges through their first five games...have posted a Major League-best 85.7% success rate (the Major League average success rate is 54.2%)...their 14 challenges are tied with Chicago-AL for the most in the Majors.

SCHLITZ'S CREEK: RHP Cam Schlichter will make his second start of the season today...will make his second career start vs. the Mariners after facing Seattle in his Major League debut on 7/9/25 at Yankee Stadium (5.1IP, 4H, 3R/ER, 2BB, 7K, 2HR)...in 15 career starts, has gone 5-3 with a 2.76 ERA (78.1IP, 59H, 24R/ER, 31BB, 92K, 8HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 13-of-15 starts, 2R-or-fewer in 11 starts and 1R-or-fewer in eight starts.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CAM SCHLITTLER (1-0, 0.00 ERA)

RHP Cam Schlittler will make his second start of the season in today's series finale at Seattle...the 25-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...made his season debut on Friday at San Francisco, earning the win after allowing just 1H over 5.1 scoreless innings (0BB, 8K)...went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA (9.2IP, 6H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 11K, 0HR) in three spring training starts...made his first career Opening Day roster...saw his first Major League action in 2025 with the Yankees, going 4-3 with a 2.96 ERA (73.0IP, 58H, 24R/ER, 31BB, 84K, 8HR) in 14 starts...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12-of-14 starts, 2R-or-fewer in 10 starts and 1R-or-fewer in seven starts... **his 92K through his first 15 career games are the third-most in franchise history**, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (119K in first 15G) and Orlando Hernández (100K in first 15G)... **his 24R allowed are the fewest by a Yankees pitcher through their first 15 career starts**, the next fewest is Dave Righetti (25R in first 15GS from 1979-81)...the Weymouth, Mass., native was selected by the Yankees in the seventh round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Northeastern University (Mass.).

LAST TIME OUT: Made his season debut on Friday at San Francisco, earning the win after allowing just 1H over 5.1 scoreless innings (0BB, 8K)...allowed his only hit on a second inning double to Heliot Ramos before retiring his next 11 batters faced.

- ✦ **At 25 years, 50 days old, became the second Yankee age 25-or-younger to start one of the club's first two games of a season since 1999**, joining Luis Severino (24 years, 37 days on Opening Day at Toronto in 2018).
- ✦ **Became the first pitcher in franchise history to record at least 8K and allow 1H-or-fewer in their first game of the season.**
- ✦ Marked his fourth career scoreless start... **is just the sixth Yankees pitcher to record at least four scoreless starts in their first 15 career games**, joining Russ Ford (5), Luis Gil (5), Hippo Vaughn (4), Vito Tamulis (4) and Tiny Bonham (4).
- ✦ His 1H allowed matched his career low (also 1H in 6.2IP on 8/20/25 at Tampa Bay).

ROAD TRIP: Will make his second road start of the season today at Seattle...made six road starts in 2025, going 0-1 with a 2.76 ERA (32.2IP, 22H, 10R/ER, 14BB, 37K, 4HR)...allowed 2R-or-fewer in five of his six starts, including 1R-or-fewer in three of those starts.

- ✦ Recorded at least 6K in five of his six starts last season.
- ✦ The Yankees went 5-1 in his six road starts in 2025...received 2R-or-fewer of support in four of those starts.

VS. SEATTLE: Will make his second career start vs. the Mariners today.

- ✦ Made his Major League debut on 7/9 vs. Seattle and earned his first career win after allowing 3R/ER over 5.1IP (4H, 2BB, 7K, 2HR)...struck out Cal Raleigh in the first inning for his first career strikeout...became the 10th pitcher in franchise history to record at least 7K in his Major League debut...was the first Yankee to earn the win in his Major League debut since Jhony Brito on 4/2/23 vs. San Francisco.

2025: Saw his first Major League action in 2025 with the Yankees, going 4-3 with a 2.96 ERA (73.0IP, 58H, 24R/ER, 31BB, 84K, 8HR) in 14 starts...opponents batted .217/.309/.337 (58-for-267, 8HR); LH .222/.313/.310 (35-for-158, 4HR); RH .211/.304/.376 (23-for-109)...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12-of-14 starts, 2R-or-fewer in 10 starts and 1R-or-fewer in seven starts.

- ✦ The Yankees went 9-5 in his 14 starts, including 7-1 over his final eight starts from 8/20-9/27.
- ✦ Began the season in the minors, combining to go 6-6 with a 2.82 ERA (76.2IP, 67H, 30R/24ER, 26BB, 99K, 4HR) in 15 combined games (14 starts) with Double-A Somerset and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.
- ✦ **Allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his first nine career starts from 7/9-8/30, tying Dave Righetti (9GS from 9/16/79-8/16/81) and Herb Thormahlen (9GS from 9/29/1917(G2)-6/8/1918) for the second-longest streak to begin their career in franchise history**, trailing only Joba Chamberlain (11GS from 6/3-7/30/08).
- ✦ From when he made his Major League debut on 7/9 to the end of the season, ranked among AL pitchers (min. 60.0IP) in opponents' SLG (.337, fourth), strikeout rate (27.6%, sixth), K/9.0IP (10.36, seventh), strikeouts (84, eighth) and ERA (2.96, ninth).
- ✦ Made his Major League debut on 7/9 vs. Seattle and earned his first career win after allowing 3R/ER over 5.1IP (4H, 2BB, 7K, 2HR)...became the 10th pitcher in franchise history to record at least 7K in his Major League debut, joining Jordan Montgomery (7K on 4/12/17 vs. Tampa Bay), Luis Severino (7K on 8/5/15 vs. Boston), Masahiro Tanaka (8K on 4/4/14 at Toronto), Orlando Hernández (7K on 6/3/98 vs. Tampa Bay), Hideki Irabu (9K on 7/10/97 vs. Detroit), Al Leiter (8K on 9/15/87 vs. Milwaukee), Rich Beck (8K on 9/14/65 at Washington-AL), Vic Raschi (8K on 9/23/46 vs. Philadelphia-AL) and Bill Hogg (7K on 4/25/1905 vs. Washington-AL)...was the first Yankee to earn the win in his Major League debut since Jhony Brito on 4/2/23 vs. San Francisco.
- ✦ Went 1-1 with a 1.60 ERA (33.2IP, 6ER) and 39K in six starts in August...allowed 2R-or-fewer in all six starts...recorded at least 6K in five of his six starts... **his 1.60 ERA was the third-lowest by a Yankees rookie (min. 25.0IP) in a single calendar month over the last 52 years (since 1974)**, trailing only Luis Gil (0.70 ERA in May 2024) and José Contreras (1.51 ERA in September 2003)...during the month of August, ranked sixth among Major League pitchers in ERA (third in AL), tied for seventh in strikeouts (tied for third in AL), eighth in opponents' BA (.186, fourth in AL), ninth in opponents' SLG (.288, fourth in AL) and 10th in strikeout rate (29.8%, seventh in AL) and opponents' OPS (.555, fourth in AL).
- ✦ **Posted a career-high 17.2 scoreless inning streak from 8/13-8/30...was the third-longest scoreless streak by a Yankees rookie in the last 57 years (since 1969)**, trailing only Ron Marinaccio's 19.0 scoreless inning streak from 5/22-7/28/22 and Luis Gil's 18.2 scoreless inning streak from 8/3-9/8/21.
- ✦ Made his final regular season start and earned his fourth win of the year on 9/27 vs. Baltimore after tossing 7.0 scoreless innings (2H, 1BB, 9K, 2HP)...his 7.0IP and 9K were career highs... **was the first Yankees rookie to toss at least 7.0 scoreless innings in a game since Shane Greene on 8/7/14 vs. Detroit (0R in 8.0IP)**.
- ✦ In two postseason starts, went 1-1 with a 1.26 ERA (14.1IP, 13H, 4R/2ER, 0BB, 14K)...made his postseason debut in ALWCS Game 3 vs. Boston and earned the win after recording 12K over 8.0 scoreless innings... **became the first pitcher in Major League history to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings and record at least 12K without allowing a walk in a postseason game...his 12K were the most by a Yankees rookie in a postseason game** (previous: Dave Righetti (10K in 1981 ALDS Game 2 at Milwaukee)... **was the fourth rookie in Major League history to record at least 12K in a postseason game**, joining Florida's Liván Hernández (15K in 1997 NLCS Game 5 vs. Atlanta), Baltimore's Mike Boddicker (14K in 1983 ALCS Game 2 vs. Chicago-AL) and Pittsburgh's John Candelaria (14K in 1975 NLCS Game 3 vs. Cincinnati)... **became only the fourth pitcher in franchise history to record at least 12K in a postseason game**, joining Roger Clemens (15K in 2000 ALCS Game 4 at Seattle), Gerrit Cole (13K in 2020 ALWCS Game 1 at Cleveland) and Orlando Hernández (12K in 2000 World Series Game 3 at the Mets)...started in ALDS Game 4 vs. Toronto and took the loss after allowing 4R/2ER in 6.1IP (8H, 0BB, 2K, 0HR, 1WP).
- ✦ Following the season, was named to *Baseball America's* All-Rookie Team.
