METSSELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 11-10, last night...New York has dropped three in a row after winning two straight...Tonight, the Mets continue their second road trip of the year, a six-game road trip against Atlanta (four games) and Washington (two games).

JUST THE HITS: The Mets lead the major leagues with 75 hits this season, are second with a .266 batting average and seventh with a .341 OBP...The Mets have recorded four games where they racked up 10 or more hits this season, which leads the majors...In 2019, the Mets recorded 69 such games, the fifth-most in the majors and the second-most in the National League...Colorado recorded 77 such games.

BE BRAVE: Michael Wacha has never earned a win against Atlanta...He has made four career starts (six games) and is 0-3 with a 3.65 ERA (10 earned runs/24.2 innings) with 11 walks and 20 strikeouts against the club...Atlanta is the only team he has faced in the National League that he has not earned a victory against (also has yet to defeat St. Louis, but has never appeared against his former club).

NEED THOSE GOOD LEADS: Last night, the Mets lost the game after leading by six runs (8-2 in the fifth)...The six-run lead that was lost is tied for the sixth-biggest blown lead in franchise history...The team's record was eight runs, set on April 19, 1980 at Chicago-NL...The last time the Mets lost a six run lead was September 3, 2019 at Washington.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: Over the last five games, the team is batting .293 (54-184) with five doubles, a triple, nine home runs, 18 walks and 32 runs...The Mets have scored three or fewer runs in four of their eight games this season...New York scored a total of five runs in its first three games of the season, its fewest through three team games since 1981 (also five runs).

BULLPEN NOTES: The Mets rank 28th in the majors with a 7.09 bullpen ERA after eight games...Last year, the Mets pen ranked 26th in the majors with a 4.99 ERA...The pen's 4.99 ERA was the highest in franchise history...Mets relievers are tied for first in the majors with three losses this season and are tied for second in the majors with three blown saves...The pen is tied for fourth in the majors allowing seven homers.

NINE IS NOT SO FINE: The Mets are 2-7 in their last nine games at Atlanta...The pitching staff has a 8.03 ERA (66 earned runs/74.0 innings) during those nine games.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 2-1 on the road this year...This compares to 1-4 at home...The team was an NL-best 21-12 on the road in the second half of the 2019 season...The Mets finished winning 13 of their last 20 and four of their last five games on the road...Overall, the team went 38-43 on the road last year after finishing 40-41 on the road in 2018.

ROADSARIO: Amed Rosario is 4-15 with two runs, a home run and three RBI in three road games this season...He ranked eighth in the majors and fourth in the NL with a .323 road batting average last year...He placed second in the majors with 104 hits on the road and tied for first with six triples in away games...He batted .382 (52-136) with 24 runs, nine doubles, two triples, four home runs, 17 RBI, five walks, six steals, a .408 OBP, a .566 SLG and a .975 OPS in 32 games on the road in the second-half...Overall, he finished with a .323/.352/.484 slash line with 32 extra-base hits and 41 RBI in 79 road games in 2019.

AMED IN THE ATL: Rosario has collected 30 hits at Truist Park, the most by any Met...He has hit .341 (30-88) with 16 runs, seven doubles, two triples, two home run, 15 RBI, five steals and an .875 OPS in 21 career games at Truist Park.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets head to Truist Park for the first time this year...The Mets own a 14-16 lifetime record at the new home of the Braves...Offensively, the team collectively owns a .274/.354/.443 slash line with 31 home runs at the ballpark.

OUCH: The Mets have been hit by 10 pitches this season, which ranks second in the majors...The Cubs have been hit by 12 pitches...Pete Alonso has been hit by three pitches, tied for second in the majors...The Mets were hit by a major league leading 95 pitches last season...That was a franchise record, surpassing their total of 73 in 2018...Pete Alonso and Jeff McNeil were plunked 21 times each last season, the second-highest total in franchise history...That also placed them tied for fifth in MLB.

NOBODY LIKES YOU WHEN YOU'RE 23: Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base in all eight games this season... Nimmo has reached base safely in each of his last 23 games dating back to last season...He is batting .310 (9-29) with six runs, two doubles, a home run, three RBI and three walks...He owns a .412 OBP and a .895 OPS...The 23-game on-base streak is the second-longest in his career...Nimmo safely reached base in 28 straight games from August 11-September 21, 2018.

THE NEW KID: Andrés Giménez made his second career start last night and went 2-4 in the contest...He is hitting .308 (4-13) with two runs, a triple, an RBI and a steal in eight games...Giménez entered the season as the third-best Mets prospect and the No. 84 overall prospect in the majors, per MLB Pipeline...After spending the 2019 season with Binghamton (AA), the Venezuelan shortstop led the Arizona Fall League with a .371 (26-70) average and .999 OPS.

DON'T YA KNOW: Robinson Canó reached base safely four times last night, going 3-4 with a run, a home run, two RBI and a walk...It was the 98th time in his career he reached base four or more times in a game...Canó is batting .615 (8-13) with three RBI over his last four games...He ranks third among active players in hits (2,579), RBI (1,275), total bases (4,183), extra-base hits (921) and in runs scored (1,238).

ESQUIRE DAVIS: J.D. Davis is batting .421 (8-19) with four runs, two home run, two walks and six RBI over his last six games...This comes after starting the season 0-3 in his first two games...J.D. Davis ranked 10th in the NL with a 136 wRC+ (weighted runs created plus) and was 17th in the NL with a .373 wOBA (weighted on-base average) last season.

SIXTY-GAME SPRINT: Over the final 60 games of the 2019 season, the Mets' 39-21 mark tied for the second-best in the majors and co- led the NL...Only one team, the Astros (42-18), had a better record in the season's last 60 games...The Rays, Twins, Dodgers and A's all also ended last year on a 39-21 run...See the chart below for the Mets' best 60-game starts to a season:

LAST START: Wacha made his Mets debut at Fenway Park and defeated the Red Sox, tossing 5.0 innings of one-run ball, allowing five hits and a walk while striking out four...Earned the win in the Mets' 7-4 victory...He was the first player to throw at least 5.0 innings and allow one or no runs in his Mets debut since Jacob deGrom in 2014.

VS. ATLANTA: Wacha has never earned a win against Atlanta...He has made four career starts (six games) and is 0-3 with a 3.65 ERA (10 earned runs/24.2 innings) with 11 walks and 20 strikeouts against the club...Atlanta is the only team he has faced in the National League that he has not earned a victory against (also has yet to defeat St. Louis, but has never appeared against his former club).

FINISHED STRONG: In his last nine starts of the 2019 season, he posted a 2.89 ERA (12 earned runs/37.1 innings)...That 2.89 ERA ranked 14th in the NL from August 15 through the end of the season (min. 35.0 innings).

2019 RECAP: Wacha went 6-7 with a 4.76 ERA across 29 games (24 starts) in his last season with the Cardinals...In 126.2 innings, he walked 55 batters and fanned 104.

WINNING AT A HIGH RATE: Wacha's career record sits at 60-39, 21 games above the .500 mark, good for a winning percentage of .606...He is one of just 12 NL pitchers with a winning percentage above .600 since 2013 (min. 70 decisions).

NO FLY ZONE: Wacha was one of just two starting pitchers with to post a HR/9 ratio under 1.00 every season from 2013-2018, joined by Gio González... However, Wacha suffered from an abnormally high home run rate of 1.85 HR/9 last season, nearly double his career rate of 1.01 HR/9.

ATHLETIC GENES: Wacha comes from a family of athletes...His brother, Lucas, played linebacker at the University of Wyoming...His sister, Brette, played basketball at Southern Arkansas University...His uncle, Dusty Rogers, played professional baseball in the Cincinnati Reds organization from 1984-1988.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP DAVID PETERSON (1-0, 3.18 ERA)

LAST TIME OUT: David Peterson made his major league debut on 7/28 in Boston...The lefty hurled 5.2 innings and allowed two earned runs on seven hits with two walks and three strikeouts.

SWEET 16: David Peterson became the 16th starter in Mets history to earn the win in his major league debut...He is the first to do so since Steven Matz notched the victory on June 28, 2015 vs. Cincinnati...He was the first to do so on the road since Zack Wheeler got the win in game two of a doubleheader on June 18, 2013 at Atlanta.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Peterson has made 49 appearances (all starts) across four levels of the Mets' minor league system, spanning his three years in the organization...After being drafted in 2017, the lefty made three starts at Brooklyn (A), tossing a total of 3.2 innings and allowing just one earned run...The following year, he dominated the SAL with Columbia (A), posting a 1.82 ERA (12 earned runs/59.1 innings) before earning a mid-season promotion to St. Lucie, where he made 13 starts...Last year, he pitched at Binghamton (AA) and made a career-high 24 starts, averaging more than 9.00 K/9 (122 strikeouts/116.0 innings).

- Won the 2019 Jackie Robinson NL Rookie of the Year Award...Hit a rookie-record 53 home runs...Was the first Mets player and first rookie to lead MLB in homers.
- During the shutdown, honored those who went "above and beyond their call of duty" through his newly-launched Homers for Heroes foundation...The foundation will honor a hero after each of the Mets' 60 games this season...The hero will receive a care package, which will include game-used memorabilia from Alonso.
