TIGERS SHUT OUT IN GAME 1: The Tigers were blanked by the Guardians, 7-0, in Game 1 of the American League Division Series on Saturday. Reese Olson threw 5.0 innings in relief, giving up a run on three hits with a walk and four strikeouts. Keider Montero punched out three and allowed a hit in a scoreless 2.0 innings. Offensively, Kerry Carpenter, Riley Greene, Zach McKinstry and Parker Meadows each had a hit.

IN THE POSTSEASON: Detroit is in the postseason for the 17th time in franchise history and for the first time since 2014. The Tigers earned a Wild Card berth for the second time in franchise history (other, 2006) and are the No. 6 seed in the American League. Detroit is 59-63-1 all-time in the postseason, including a 29-35-1 record on the road. In the Division Series, the Tigers have an all-time record of 12-11, including a 6-8 mark on the road.

REESE'S PIECES: Reese Olson made his postseason debut on Saturday, pitching in relief and giving up a run on three hits with one walk and four strikeouts in 5.0 innings. He became the first pitcher to throw 5.0-or-more innings in relief in his first career playoff game since Ed Willett on October 11, 1909 vs. Pittsburgh.

TIGERS TIDBITS: Parker Meadows went 1x3 in Saturday's game and has recorded a hit in all three Tigers playoff games. He's the first Tiger to have a hit in each of his first three career postseason games since J.D. Martinez from October 2-5, 2014...While he's still looking for his first postseason hit, Colt Keith has still been productive at the plate, drawing a walk in each game so far this postseason and five walks in total. He's the first Tiger to draw a base on balls in each of his first three postseason games since Bill Freehan from October 2-5, 1968.

LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY: The Tigers will face Guardians LHP Matthew Boyd in today's game. Detroit went 21-12 against lefthanded starters during the regular season, including winning eight straight games against lefty starters to close the season. The Tigers offense averaged 4.76 runs/game against southpaw starters, which ranked third in the American League, compared to an average of 4.07 runs/game against righthanded starters.

ABOUT THE DIVISION SERIES ROSTER: The Tigers announced their 26-man roster for the American League Division Series on Saturday. The roster includes 12 pitchers and 14 position players. Of the 26 players on the ALDS roster, 14 of them were on Detroit's Opening Day roster. Prior to the Wild Card series, Matt Vierling was the only player on the 26-man roster who had previous postseason experience. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last playoff team to have one-or-fewer players with previous playoff experience was the Angels in 2002.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT: The Tigers and Guardians both featured young rosters throughout the season. Detroit was MLB's youngest team this season, while Cleveland ranked as the third youngest. According to MLB Network research, the combined average age of the Tigers and Guardians who appeared in Game One was only 26.4 years old, the youngest for any MLB postseason game since Game Four of the 1914 World Series.

SECOND-HALF SURGE: The Tigers posted a Major League best 31-13 record from August 11 until the end of the season. It was the team's best record over the final 44 games of a season since 2011, when Detroit went 32-12. The Tigers led the Majors with a 2.72 ERA (401.0IP/121ER) from August 11 until the end of the season, while also ranking first with a +62 run differential.

ON THE MOUND: The Tigers pitching staff ranked among the best in the Majors throughout the season. Detroit finished the season with a 3.61 team ERA (1447.0IP/581ER), which ranked third in the American League and fourth in the Majors. It marked Detroit's lowest season ERA since also having a 3.61 ERA in 2013. The Tigers finished second in the big leagues with a 1.16 WHIP, 3.72 FIP, .292 opponent on-base percentage, .372 opponent slugging percentage, .664 opponent OPS and 2.59 walks per 9.0 innings and fourth with a 3.25 strikeout-to-walk ratio and 0.99 home runs per 9.0 innings.

TIGERS AND GUARDIANS: After playing more than 2,300 regular season games, the Tigers and Guardians are meeting in the postseason for the first time. Detroit went 6-7 against Cleveland during the regular season, including a 3-4 record at Progressive Field.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers went 43-38 on the road during the regular season. Detroit's 43 road victories were their most in a season since winning 45 in 2014. The Tigers finished the season by winning eight of their last 10 games away from Comerica Park.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: A.J. Hinch is leading a team to the postseason for the fifth time in his managerial career. Hinch has posted a 30-23 (.566) record in the playoffs. In his four seasons as the Tigers manager, Hinch has a 307-341 (.474) record, while his all-time managerial record stands at 877-793 (.525). His 877 victories ranks fourth among active managers.

Today's start at Cleveland

- Skubal will make his second career postseason start this afternoon at Cleveland...made his playoff debut on Tuesday at Houston, throwing 6.0 shutout innings with four hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts...was the third pitcher in Tigers history to throw 6.0-or-more scoreless innings in his first career playoff game, joining Max Scherzer on October 2, 2011 at New York (AL) and Joe Coleman on October 10, 1972 vs. Oakland.
- Has faced the Guardians eight times in his career and has a 2-2 record with a 3.46 ERA (41.2IP/16ER) and 44 strikeouts...faced Cleveland just once this season, picking up the win on July 22 after giving up one run on 10 hits with one walk and six strikeouts in 7.0 innings...in five career starts at Progressive Field, Skubal is 2-1 with a 3.33 ERA (24.1IP/9ER) and 26 strikeouts.
- Has made 45 career appearances, including 43 starts, in his career against teams from the American League Central, compiling a 16-16 record with a 4.09 ERA (233.0IP/106ER) and 250 strikeouts...started 10 games against AL Central teams this season, posting a 7-2 record with a 3.03 ERA (59.1IP/20ER) and 67 punchouts.

2024 Regular Season

- Started 31 games during the regular season and went 18-4 with a 2.39 ERA (192.0IP/51ER) and 228 strikeouts...his 2.39 ERA was the lowest by a Tigers pitcher since Mark Fidrych's 2.34 ERA in 1976, while his 18 wins were the most since Max Scherzer also won 18 in 2014.
- Won the American League Pitching Triple Crown, finishing first in wins (18), ERA (2.39) and strikeouts (228)...became the third pitcher in franchise history to win the Triple Crown, joining Justin Verlander (2011) and Hal Newhouser (1945).
- In addition to leading the AL in the Triple Crown categories, he also ranked first in FIP (2.51), fWAR (5.9), bWAR (6.3), opponent slugging percentage (.311) and opponent OPS (.558), while ranking second in WHIP (0.92), opponent on-base percentage (.247), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (10.69) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.51) and fourth in opponent batting average (.201), walks per 9.0 innings (1.64) and home runs per 9.0 innings (0.70).
- Recorded his 200th strikeout of the season on August 31 vs. Boston...became just the fourth lefthanded pitcher in franchise history to reach 200 strikeouts in a season, joining Mickey Lolich (seven times), Hal Newhouser (twice) and Matthew Boyd (once)...Skubal finished the season with 228 strikeouts, which ranks as the seventh-most by a southpaw in franchise history.
- Earned a spot on the American League All-Star Team for the first time in his career this season after being voted on the team through the player balloting...was the first homegrown Detroit starting pitcher to be selected to the All-Star Game since Justin Verlander in 2013...threw a perfect second inning in the game, retiring Christian Yelich, Alec Bohm and Teoscar Hernández.
- Struck out a career-high 13 batters over 7.0 innings on July 7 at Cincinnati, allowing one run on three hits...became just the second pitcher in franchise history to have a game with 13-or-more strikeouts, zero walks and no more than one run allowed, joining Mickey Lolich on July 1, 1968 vs. California.
- Threw the fastest pitch of his career on June 9 against the Brewers, firing a 101.7 MPH fastball...ranked as the second-fastest pitch this season by any Major League starting pitcher (not counting openers), trailing only Pittsburgh's Paul Skenes, who reached 101.9 MPH on May 11 vs. Chicago (NL)...was also tied for the fastest pitch by any Tigers pitcher in the Statcast Era (since 2015), equaling Bruce Rondón, who threw a 101.7 MPH pitch on July 18, 2015 vs. Baltimore.

- Was selected as the Tigers nominee for the 2024 Roberto Clemente Award, baseball's most prestigious individual honor for Major Leaguers...Tarik and his wife, Jessica, generously donated in support of Alternatives for Girls, an organization that seeks to empower homeless and at-risk young women by providing critical interventions and support...in addition to his work with Alternatives for Girls, Tarik has made an unrestricted donation to the Tigers Foundation and has been involved in the Tigers Autographs for a Cause program.

- Inherited 49 runners during the season, which was tied for the third most in the Majors...was the most inherited runners for a Tigers reliever since Phil Coke inherited 52 in 2014.
- Had 19 multi-inning relief appearances during the season, posting a 2-1 record with a 2.10 ERA (30.0IP/7ER) and 20 strikeouts.
- Made the 200th appearance of his big league career on September 6 at Oakland, allowing two hits and striking out one in a scoreless two-thirds of an inning.
