YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Orioles fell to the Royals, 9-4, in the three-game series opener at Kauffman Stadium...**Adley Rutschman** went 3-for-5 and hit his first career grand slam in the seventh inning...Marked the first slam by an O's batter since **Cedric Mullins** on September 11, 2023 vs. St. Louis, and first by an O's catcher since **Pedro Severino** on August 26, 2021 vs. Los Angeles-AL...Rutschman is the 13th Oriole (29th occurrence) to hit a grand slam while in the game as a catcher (since 1954).

HOMER HAPPY: Entering today's games, the Orioles led MLB with 31 home runs, tied with the 1966 club for the most homers through the first 19 games in O's history; the most homers through the first 20 games is 31 by the 1966 and 1996 O's teams.

👉 Bird batters hit three home runs in five consecutive games from April 13-17, their first time doing so since August 6-10, 1996, and the longest such streak in MLB since the Braves also did so in five straight from June 11-15, 2022; the MLB record for consecutive games with at least three homers is six set by the 1987 Orioles.

STEADY CEDDY: **Cedric Mullins** has hit in an O's season-high 10 straight games since April 9, his longest since an 11-gamer from August 16-28, 2022; it is the longest streak by an O's batter since **Gunnar Henderson's** 11-game streak from August 14-26, 2023...Entering today's games, it was the second-longest active hitting streak in the AL and tied for the fourth-longest in MLB.

THEY'VE GOT POP: Entering today's games, the Orioles led the AL and ranked second in MLB with a 90.5 mph average exit velocity, per Statcast (see box at right)...**Gunnar Henderson** led all hitters with a 97.0 mph average exit velo (see box at right), while **Jordan Westburg** ranked sixth in the AL and 10th in MLB with a 94.1 mph mark.

COMEBACK KIDS: Eight of the Orioles' 12 wins this season, including five of their last seven, have been in comeback fashion, the most in MLB...Baltimore's 56 comeback wins since the start of last season are the most in MLB...Their 92 come-from-behind victories since the start of 2022 are also the most in MLB.

RUN IT UP: Entering today's games, the Orioles ranked second in the AL and seventh in MLB with 108 runs scored...Their +22 run differential was tied for third in the AL and sixth in MLB, while their 5.68 runs per game led the AL and ranked fourth in MLB.

DOWN BUT NOT OUT: The Orioles are slashing .182/.236/.348 (60-for-330) in two-strike counts...Entering today's games, they led MLB in slugging, OPS (.585), and extra-base hits (28) with two strikes, and were tied for the lead in home runs (13)...**Jordan Westburg** has hit .355/.394/.742 (11-for-31) in two-strike counts, with three doubles and three home runs... He led MLB in two-strike slugging percentage, ranked second in OPS (1.136), and third in average.

AL PLAYER OF THE WEEK: **Colton Cowser** was selected as the AL Player of the Week for the period of April 8-14 after slashing .435/.481/1.130 (10-for-23) with four doubles, four home runs, six runs scored, 12 RBI, three walks, and two stolen bases in six games...During that time, he led MLB in slugging, OPS (1.611), extra-base hits (8), total bases (26), and RBI... He led the AL in homers, ranked tied for the lead in doubles, and ranked among the leaders in hits (T-3rd), runs (T-3rd), and average (4th)...Marks the first career honor for Cowser, who is the first O's player to win the award since **Gunnar Henderson** for the week of June 5-11, 2023...Each of the last three Orioles to win Player of the Week have been rookies, including Cowser, Henderson and **Ryan Mountcastle** in 2021.

KIMBREL COUNT: **Craig Kimbrel** recorded the 421st save of his career Monday night against Minnesota, one behind Billy Wagner for seventh in MLB history; only Boston's Kenley Jansen (424) has more among active players...Kimbrel now has 1,206 strikeouts, the fourth-most all-time as a reliever; he trails Hoyt Wilhelm (1,363), Goose Gossage (1,340), and Lee Smith (1,225).

STRIKE A POSE: Baltimore pitchers have fanned 172 batters so far in 2024, the most strikeouts through 19 games in O's history...The most through the first 20 games is 178 by the 2023 Orioles.

O THE PLACES YOU'LL GO: The Birds are on a six-game road trip against the Royals (0-1) and Angels (3 G)...The Orioles have a scheduled off day after the trip on Thursday, April 25... The O's wrapped up their first road trip of the season with a 4-2 record against Pittsburgh (1-2) and Boston (3-0) from April 5-11.

AGAINST THE ROYALS: The O's and Royals are meeting for the second and final series of the regular season in Kansas City this weekend...The Birds took two out of three against the Royals in Baltimore from April 1-3, including two walk-off wins...The O's went 5-1 against the Royals last year; they took two out of three at Kauffman Stadium from May 2-4 before completing a three-game sweep in Baltimore from June 9-11.

SWEEPLESS IN BALTIMORE: The Orioles have gone 97 consecutive regular-season series of at least two decisions (no ties) without being swept...According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, that is the fourth-longest regular-season streak in MLB history, trailing the 1942-44 St. Louis Cardinals (124), 1906-09 Chicago Cubs (115), and 1903-05 New York Giants (105)... Baltimore's current streak is the longest in O's history, ahead of 46 such series from 1971-72...The Birds have not been swept in a regular-season series of at least two games since May 13-15, 2022 at Detroit (0-3), and not at home in a series of at least two games since August 27-29, 2021 vs. Tampa Bay (0-3).

👉 The 2023 Orioles (52 series) were the fourth MLB team since 2000 to go a full regular season without being swept in a series of at least two decisions, joining the Braves teams of 2022 (51 series), 2004 (52 series), and 2002 (52 series).

THE SKIPPER: Manager **Brandon Hyde** is in his sixth season in Baltimore...In 2023, he led the O's to an AL-best 101-61 record, their second straight winning campaign and the first time since 1997 that the Orioles claimed the top seed in the AL...He made his Postseason managerial debut in the ALDS, and was named the Baseball Writers' Association of America (BBWAA) AL Manager of the Year, becoming the fourth Orioles manager to win the award... He was also voted the Sporting News American League Manager of the Year by fellow AL managers for the second consecutive year...Hyde was named the 20th manager in Orioles history on December 14, 2018...His 327 wins rank fifth all-time among Orioles managers, trailing **Hank Bauer** (407), **Paul Richards** (517), **Buck Showalter** (669), and Orioles Legend and National Baseball Hall of Famer **Earl Weaver** (1,480).

QUICK HITS: Scheduled to make his fifth start and second of the season against Kansas City...A three-time All-Star and 2021 NL Cy Young Award winner, Burnes was acquired by the Orioles from the Brewers in exchange for LHP DL Hall, INF Joey Ortiz, and a 2024 Competitive Balance Round A pick on February 1, 2024...Entering the 2024 season, he was ranked as the No. 29 overall player in MLB Network's Top 100 Right Now...He was originally selected by the Brewers in the fourth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of Saint Mary's College (CA).

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor into the decision in his first career start vs. Milwaukee on April 14, completing 5.0 innings and allowing three runs (2 ER) on six hits (1 HR) and two walks with five strikeouts and a balk; marked his shortest start of the season; has now faced 27 of the 30 MLB teams (missing OAK, TB, & TEX)... Threw 98 pitches, 57 strikes.

AGAINST THE ROYALS: Did not factor into the decision in his start vs. Kansas City on April 3, 2024, allowing two runs on nine hits with three strikeouts across 5.2 innings; the nine hits surrendered tied the most allowed in a start in his career (5x, last: 7/30/21 at ATL w/MIL); the three strikeouts matched the fewest he has had in a start in his career (10x, last: 6/25/23 at CLE w/MIL)...Owns a 2-0 record with a 1.52 ERA (4 ER/23.2 IP) in his four prior starts against them.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: Owns an 8-1 record with a 2.77 ERA (32 ER/104.0 IP) in 19 lifetime appearances (16 GS) against the division.

LIFE ON THE ROAD: In Burnes' lone start away from Camden Yards this season, he allowed one run on two hits (1 HR) and two walks with six strikeouts on April 9 against the Red Sox.

NIGHT OWL: Scheduled to make his first night start of the season...In 2023, he went 8-7 with a 3.23 ERA (48 ER/133.2 IP) in 22 evening starts.

RING 'EM UP: Burnes is one of six pitchers with at least 200 strikeouts in each of the last three seasons (2021-23), along with Dylan Cease, Gerrit Cole, Kevin Gausman, Aaron Nola, and Spencer Strider...His 765 strikeouts from 2020-23 were the most in the NL and second-most in MLB behind Gerrit Cole (816)...He is 105 strikeouts away from 1,000.

INNINGS EATER: The 586.1 innings consumed by Burnes since the start of 2021 rank fourth in MLB (Sandy Alcántara – 619.0, Aaron Nola – 602.2, Gerrit Cole – 591.0)...Last season, he tossed 193.2 innings, which would have been the most by an Oriole since Chris Tillman threw 207.1 innings in 2014.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS: Burnes' 2023 campaign was highlighted by his third consecutive All-Star Game appearance...Burnes made his second straight Opening Day start for the Brewers...On July 25, he became the sixth pitcher in Brewers franchise history to notch 800 career strikeouts...He pitched to a 5-3 record with a 2.72 ERA (30 ER/99.1 IP) across his final 16 starts of the season.

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: Burnes' NL Wild Card Series start on October 3, 2023 against the Diamondbacks marked his eighth Postseason appearance (2 GS)...In those games, he has posted a 2.84 ERA (6 ER/19.0 IP) with 11 hits, six walks, and 22 strikeouts.

Scheduled to make his fourth start and second of the season against the Royals...Did not factor into the decision in his last start on Monday vs. Minnesota, allowing two runs on six hits (1 HR) with four strikeouts in 4.2 innings...Picked up the loss against Kansas City on April 2, 2024 in Baltimore, allowing four runs on seven hits and two walks with three strikeouts across 5.0 innings...Owns a career 2-3 record with a 2.83 ERA (11 ER/35.0 IP) in his six prior starts against the Royals...Appeared in 24 games (12 GS) across four separate stints with the O's in 2023, posting a 4.42 ERA (38 ER/77.1 IP), allowing 78 hits (11 HR) with 21 walks and 68 strikeouts...Did not appear on Baltimore's Postseason roster.
