RAYS REPORT —The Rays continue a 12-game, 14-day road trip against the Angels (2-1), Mariners (0-3), Athletics (1-1, one to play) and Giants (3G) tonight in West Sacramento...have lost five of six and 10 of their last 12 series, including seven of their last eight on the road...are 3-4 in their last seven games, but have dropped 10 of 14, 14 of 19, 20 of 28 and 28 of their last 40 games...are 5-13 so far on a stretch of 19 road games in a 22-game span (July 25–Aug. 17)...started the season 21-26, went an MLB-best 25-9 from May 20–June 26 and are an MLB-worst 12-28 since June 27...are fourth in the AL East for the 33rd consecutive day, a season-high 12.5 GB the division-leading Blue Jays and 6.5 GB the third-place Yankees for the AL's third and final Wild Card spot...including off days and the All-Star break, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 63 in fourth and four in fifth. ★ The Rays were blanked, 6-0, last night, their 11th shutout loss this season, tied with three other clubs (CLE, KC, TEX) for second most in the AL behind the Orioles (13G). ★ Tampa Bay starters have yielded four runs or more in four consecutive outings for the first time since June 14-18, 2024 (4GS)...the rotation's last longer streak was five straight starts from May 14-18, 2011. ★ Of the Rays last 21 runs, 15 have been scored via 12 HR...23 of their 37 runs allowed on the current road trip have come across on 11 HR by opponents. ★ Tampa Bay is 4-15 in its last 19 road games and 6-20 in its last 26 since June 29, worst in the majors over that span. ★ Since the All-Star break, the Rays have struck out 217 batters, tied for fifth most in MLB, and their 9.43 SO per 9.0 IP are third behind the Dodgers (9.71) and White Sox (9.63). ★ This marks the third time in the Rays last four series a rubber match has determined the winner...the club is 1-4 in its last five rubber games.	WHAT'S AT STAKE —With a win tonight, the Rays would: ★ Earn their second series win in their last three sets on the heels of dropping four straight series from July 25–Aug. 3. ★ Record their first road series win over the Athletics since May 2-4, 2022 at Oakland Coliseum and improve to 2-0-2 in their last four road series vs. the A's. ★ Secure a season series tie vs. the Athletics, moving to 3-0-1 since 2022 while avoiding their first season series loss since 2021 (4-3). ★ Avoid falling six games under .500 for the first time since entering play on June 22, 2018 (34-40).	DREW DAY —Drew Rasmussen carries a 15.1 scoreless inning streak into tonight's outing, the second-longest active streak in the AL behind ATH Jacob Lopez (24.0IP) and fifth longest in the majors...it marks Rasmussen's second-longest streak this season, trailing his 23.0-IP run from May 17–June 3, which was third longest by a starter in franchise history behind Alex Cobb (24.2IP, 2014) and Taj Bradley (24.0IP, 2024)...Rasmussen is 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA (22.1IP, 5ER) over his last five starts, yielding only two extra-base hits (2 2B) while holding opponents to a .244 slugging pct, second lowest in the AL over that span (since July 11, min. 20.0IP) behind BAL Trevor Rogers (.235)...he has not permitted an extra-base hit in his last three starts (16.1IP) since a double by CWS Mike Tauchman in the 4th inning on July 22 at Steinbrenner Field. ★ Rasmussen has recorded three straight starts of 5.0 IP with 0 XBH allowed, tied for the second-longest streak in club history behind his own four-start run earlier this season (March 31–April 18)...there have been six instances in Rays history of a pitcher going three consecutive starts of 5.0 IP or more with 0 XBH—three of them were recorded by Rasmussen this season (also: May 28–June 8, July 28–pres.). ★ He leads MLB with 11 starts of 5.0 IP or more with 0 XBH—no other pitcher has more than eight...the live-ball era record (since 1920) for a single season is 15 such starts, shared by OAK Vida Blue (1971), LAA Dean Chance (1964) and CLE Bob Feller (1946).	RISP BUT NO REWARD —The Rays went hitless (0-for-7) with runners in scoring position in yesterday's loss and are batting .193 (35-for-181) in scoring situations since the All-Star break, 29th in the majors, ahead of only the Mariners (.177)...they hit an AL-best .284 (224-for-788) with RISP before the break, third highest prior to the Midsummer Classic in team history behind 2023 (.289) and 2013 (.288)...the 91-point drop-off is the largest in the majors.	LA MÁXIMA —Junior Caminero has homered five times in his last six games, six times in his last 10 games and 10 times in 24 games since the All-Star break, tied for fourth most in the majors...Caminero's 33 HR, which rank third in the AL, are already tied for eighth most in a season in franchise history and are the most since Brandon Lowe (39HR) and Mike Zunino (33HR) in 2021...the 33 HR are the most through the Rays first 121 games of a season in team history, outpacing Carlos Peña (32HR) in 2009...it ties ATL Bob Horner (1979) for the second-most homers by a primary third baseman in an age-21-or-younger season in MLB history (age as of June 30), trailing the Milwaukee Braves Eddie Mathews (47HR, 1953)...with his next homer (34th), Caminero would tie Jose Canseco (1999) and Aubrey Huff (2003) for the sixth-most long balls in a season in club history. ★ Caminero has launched 6 HR or more in each of the last five months (April - 6, May - 7, June - 8, July - 6, Aug. - 6)...he is the second player in club history to record 6 HR or more in five consecutive months within a single season, joining Peña (May–Sept. 2007)...Caminero joined Mathews (1953) as the only players in MLB history to turn the trick in an age-21-or-younger-season (Stats Perform). ★ He is on pace for 44 HR, which would be the second-highest total in Rays history behind Peña (46HR) in 2007...he needs 7 HR in the next 41 games to join ATL Ronald Acuña Jr. (41HR, 2019), Mathews (47HR, 1953) and NYY Mel Ott (42HR, 1929) as the only players in MLB history to record 40 HR in an age-21-or-younger season.	DAWG DAYS —Brandon Lowe has 4 HR in his last seven games, bringing his season total to 23 HR, most among MLB primary second basemen (min. 50% of games at 2B), ahead of AZ Ketel Marte (22HR), and the second most of his career behind 2021 (39HR)...Lowe and Marte are the only second basemen in the majors to record 20 HR or more in each of the last three seasons (2023-25)...Lowe is 15-for-46 (.326) with 2 2B, 4 HR, 7 RBI and a .990 OPS over his last 12 games...he has hit safely in 19 of his last 21 road games, slashing .397/.448/.705 (31-for-78) with 10 XBH and 15 RBI, ranking among MLB's road leaders in that span (since June 11, min. 75PA) in average (T1st), slugging pct. (3rd) and OPS (3rd, 1.153). ★ Rays infielders lead the AL with 75 HR, third most in the majors behind the Diamondbacks (90HR) and Mets (76HR).	BULLISH ON THE PEN —Over the last 15 games since July 27, the Rays bullpen ranks among MLB leaders in WHIP (2nd, 0.96), strikeout rate (2nd, 29.5%), opp. on-base pct. (2nd, .254), opp. OPS (3rd, .557), opp. slugging pct. (3rd, .303) and opp. average (4th, .191)...their 2.36 ERA (53.1IP, 14ER) in that timeframe ranks third behind the Guardians (1.58) and Mariners (2.18)...their 3.72 ERA on the season is ninth best in the AL—they have finished within the majors' top 10 in ERA in each of the last six seasons (2019-24).	DOWN ON THE FARM —INF Bob Seymour recorded 3 HR in Triple-A Durham's 5-4 loss at Nashville last night, bringing his season total to 29 HR, the most in the International League and second most among all minor leaguers behind Yankees prospect Spencer Jones (30HR)...he became the second Rays farmhand this season with a three-homer game, joining Tres Barerra, who accomplished the feat with Durham on April 4 vs. Sugar Land...it was Seymour's second career three-homer game, joining Sept. 8, 2024 at Columbus. ★ MLB.com released its post-draft top prospects list Monday, with two Rays making the top 100: INF Carson Williams (No. 47) and OF Theo Gillen (No. 67)...five of the Rays 2025 draftees made the club's updated crop of top 30 prospects: INF Daniel Pierce (No. 4), OF Brendan Summerhill (No. 8), OF Dean Moss (No. 14), INF Cooper Flemming (No. 16) and C Taitn Gray (No. 27). ★ MLB.com also rated the Rays farm system as the 10th best in baseball in its midseason update earlier today. TONIGHT’S START—Drew Rasmussen takes the mound for his 24th start of the campaign and his second against the Athletics...marks his 123rd career appearance, 74th career start and fourth start against the Athletics (5G)...min. 100.0 IP, ranks among AL leaders in opp. SLG (4th, .318), opp. OPS (4th, .587), ERA (6th, 2.66), WHIP (7th, 1.00), opp. OBP (7th, .269) and opp. average (10th, .216/87-for-402)...the Rays are 11-4 in his last 15 starts... is two strikeouts shy of 400 for his career...signed a two-year contract extension through 2026 with a club option for 2027 on Jan. 7, 2025.

LAST TIME OUT—Rasmussen took a no-decision against the Mariners on Aug. 8 after throwing 6.0 scoreless innings with four hits allowed and four strikeouts...he retired 13 of the first 15 batters he faced and 17 of 21 batters overall...marked his sixth straight start with two runs or fewer allowed.

- ✦ Marked his first quality start since June 8 vs. MIA and his fifth outing of 6.0 innings or more this year (all quality starts).
- ✦ Was his ninth scoreless outing of 5.0 innings or more this season (last: June 25 at KC - 5.0IP), tied with DET **Tarik Skubal** for most such starts in the majors.
- ✦ Since May 17, Rasmussen is 8-1 with a 2.26 ERA (71.2IP, 18ER) and a 0.98 WHIP...the eight wins are tied for third most in the AL and tied for fifth most in the majors over that span...min. 65.0 IP, his 2.26 ERA over that stretch is second best in the AL.
- ✦ Rasmussen has allowed three runs or fewer in 20 of 23 starts this season and one or zero runs in 13 of 23.
- ✦ Rasmussen has made nine scoreless starts this season, tied for the most in a season by a traditional Rays starter for most in franchise history with **Blake Snell** (2019).

PITCHERS ARE ATHLETIC(S) TOO—Rasmussen will be making his fourth career start (5G) against the Athletics, most recently allowing four runs over 3.0 innings on five hits (1HR) and one walk with two strikeouts on June 30 at Steinbrenner Field...he is 2-0 with a 2.81 ERA (16.0IP, 5ER) and a .143 (8-for-56) opp. average in his previous four outings...min. 3 starts, his 0.69 WHIP against the Athletics is the best against any club he has faced.

- ✦ Against the AL West in 2025, he is 1-0 with a 2.37 ERA (19.0IP, 5ER) and a 0.79 WHIP...in his two road starts against the division this year, he has a 0.82 ERA (11.0IP, 1ER) and a .184 (7-for-38) opp. average...in 19 career outings (15GS) against the AL West he is 8-3 with a 2.68 ERA (80.2IP, 24ER), a .199 (59-for-296) opp. average and a 0.92 WHIP.

CATCHING FLIGHTS—The Rays are 6-3 when Rasmussen starts on the road this season, having won five straight from April 24–July 6...over that five-start span, he was 3-0 with a 3.52 ERA (23.0IP, 9ER) and 20 strikeouts to four walks...across his nine road starts this season, opposing hitters are slashing .232/.275/.344 (35-for-151) with five doubles and four home runs...he has allowed one or zero runs in six of the nine contests and spun two quality starts on May 17 at MIA and Aug. 8 at SEA...in 38 career road starts, he is 15-5 with a 2.84 ERA (171.0IP, 54ER), a .237 (151-for-638) opp. average and 139 strikeouts.

- ✦ He is 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA (20.0IP, 4ER) over his last five starts on the road dating back to June 25 at KC...the Rays are 3-2 in that span.

GOING STREAKING—Rasmussen’s 23.0 scoreless inning streak from May 17–June 3 was tied for the fifth-longest single-season run in club history, trailing runs by **J.P. Howell** (27.1IP, 2012), **Alex Cobb** (24.2IP, 2014), **Kevin Kelly** (24.1, 2024) and **Taj Bradley** (24.0IP, 2024)...only Cobb’s and Bradley’s streaks came as starting pitchers...Rasmussen tallied five scoreless innings or more in a franchise-record four consecutive starts during the streak.

GOING STREAKING 2: THE SEQUEL—Rasmussen is currently on a 15.1 scoreless inning streak that began in the 2nd inning on July 28 at NYY... it is the fifth longest active scoreless inning streak in the majors...he has thrown back-to-back starts with 5.0 scoreless innings, becoming the only pitcher in franchise history to have four or more separate streaks of consecutive starts with 5.0 scoreless innings or more (also: April 3-9, 2023; May 6-11, 2023; May 17-June 3, 2025)...a third such start tonight would mark only the ninth time in club history a pitcher has gone three straight starts of 5.0 scoreless innings or more and the first since his franchise-record four consecutive starts (May 17–June 3).

SLUG STOPPER—Rasmussen has allowed only two extra-base hits (2 2B) across his last five starts, holding opponents to a .244 slugging pct. ...his last outing on Aug. 8 at SEA marked Rasmussen’s MLB-leading 11th start of 5.0 IP or more with no extra-base hits allowed, most in a single season in franchise history, ahead of **David Price** in his 2012 Cy Young-winning campaign (9)...marks the most such starts by an AL pitcher over an entire season since HOU **Justin Verlander** (12GS) in 2022...Rasmussen has not allowed an extra-base hit in his last three starts spanning 16.1 IP...min. 100.0 IP, his .318 opp. slugging pct. on the season ranks fourth in the AL and seventh in the majors.

FROZE HIM—Rasmussen is tied with BOS **Garrett Crochet** others for fifth in the AL with 39 called strikeouts behind NYY **Will Warren** (48), CLE **Tanner Bibee** (44), ATH **Luis Severino** (40) and HOU **Hunter Brown** (40...20 of the 39 (51.3%) called strikeouts have come on his sinker...in his last 15 starts, 24 of his 62 strikeouts have been looking.

HEAT CHECK—Rasmussen throws fastballs (cutter, sinker, four-seamer) 89.3 pct. of the time, the highest rate among major league starters (min. 500 pitches thrown in starts)...among all hurlers with 500 pitches thrown or more this season, only NYY **Tim Hill** (95.4%) and LAA **Kenley Jansen** (91.0%) have a higher usage rate on heaters than Rasmussen.

- ✦ Opponents are hitting .219 (81-for-374) against his fastballs in 2025, including a .175 (21-for-120) clip against his cutter...min. 100 AB ending with cutters, it signals the second-lowest mark in the majors behind Jansen (.168).

FRIDAY’S PROBABLE STARTER @ SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS: RHP JOE BOYLE (1-2, 3.82)

LAST OUTING—Was tagged for six runs on four hits (3HR) and five walks in 3.1 innings on Aug. 9 at SEA...tied his season high in runs allowed (also: July 29 at NYY) and marked a season high in earned runs allowed.

vs. GIANTS—He has never faced the Giants in his career and has only faced the NL West on two occasions (Sept. 17, 2023 vs. SD and Aug. 3, 2025 vs. LAD)...in his previous starts against the NL West, he has a 0.00 ERA over 8.0 innings with four hits allowed, four walks allowed and six strikeouts.
