TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 6-game homestand (3-1) tonight with the 2nd of 3 games against the Tampa Bay Rays...Seattle is coming off a series win against the San Francisco Giants (2-1)... following an off day on Thursday after the current series vs. the Rays, the Mariners embark on a 10-game road trip against the Los Angeles Angels (3 G, 8/30-9/1), Oakland Athletics (4 G, 9/2-9/5) and St. Louis Cardinals (3 G, 9/6-9/8)...tonight's game against the Rays will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Mike Blowers** on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Dave Sims** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners defeated the Rays by a 5-1 score in last night's game and are now 3-1 to begin **Dan Wilson's** managerial career...the Mariners are 7-1 over their last 8 home games and 40-27 at T-Mobile Park this season.

- **Shutting It Down** - The Mariners are 55-1 when leading after 8 innings.
- **Hold Me Closer** - Seattle is 23-19 in 1-run games this season...the 23 one-run wins are tied for 3rd-most in MLB...the 42 one-run games are 4th-most in MLB.
- **vs. Left** - The Mariners are 19-17 when facing a left-handed starter this season.
- **Yard Cards** - The Mariners are 54-36 when they hit at least 1 home run this season, compared to 13-29 when they do not homer.

RANDY'S REVENGE GAME...outfielder **Randy Arozarena** went 1-for-3, with 1 run, 1 home run, 3 RBI and 1 hit-by-pitch in yesterday's game, his first time facing the Rays since being traded to Seattle on June 25...Randy has posted a .866 OPS in 13 games at T-Mobile Park since joining the Mariners, batting .267 (12x45) with 11 runs scored, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 7 RBI, 2 stolen bases and 8 walks, while reaching base at a .421 clip and slugging .444...he has reached base safely in 11 of 13 home games with Seattle during that span (8/25-c), while hitting safely in 9 of 13 games.

ON THE RUN...the Mariners have recorded a stolen base in each of the last 5 games dating back to Aug. 21, racking up 10 total steals during that span: **Dylan Moore** (4 SB), **Randy Arozarena** (3 SB), **Josh Rojas** (2 SB) and **Jorge Polanco** (1 SB)...the Mariners 5-game streak is tied for the longest active stolen base streak in MLB with Cincinnati (5 G, 8/21-c)...overall this season, the Mariners are 45-23 (.577) when stealing at least 1 base, compared to 22-42 (.344) when they don't record a steal...Seattle is 107-for-130 (82.3%) on stolen base attempts this season, highest success rate in the American League...defensively, the Mariners have held opponents to a 76.9% stolen base success rate, 3rd lowest in MLB.

POLO'S SECOND HALF...in 31 games since the All-Star Break, **Jorge Polanco** has an .883 OPS, batting .261 (29x111) with 19 runs, 6 doubles, 8 home runs, 19 RBI and 15 walks, with a .352 on-base percentage and .532 slugging percentage...the second baseman's .883 OPS in the second half **leads AL second basemen**, ranking 3rd in the Majors to Gavin Lux-LAD (1.022) and Jeff McNeil-NYM (.961).

OFF THE TOP RALE...first baseman/outfielder **Luke Raley** has a 1.051 OPS in 18 August games, hitting .280 (14x50) with 11 runs, 2 doubles, 5 home runs, 13 RBI and 11 walks, with a .431 on-base percentage and .620 slugging percentage during the month...Raley's 1.051 OPS during the month ranks 7th-best in the Majors (min. 50 PA), behind Aaron Judge-NYY (1.498), Vladimir Guerrero Jr.-TOR (1.192), Bobby Witt Jr.-KC (1.116), Yordan Alvarez-HOU (1.099), Joc Pederson-ARI (1.070) and Jake Burger-MIA (1.053).

IT'S LEO SEASON...over his last 21 games dating back to July 29, infielder **Leo Rivas** is batting .294 (15x51) with 6 runs, 1 double, 7 RBI and 5 walks, while reaching base at a .368 clip...during that span (7/29-c), his .294 batting average leads Mariners batters, ranking ahead of **Luke Raley** (.268) and **Jorge Polanco** (.250)...Rivas has hit safely in 7 of his last 8 games with an AB (8/17-c), batting .393 (11x28) with 2 runs scored, 1 double, 4 RBI and 4 walks during that span.

STRIVE FOR FIVE, FOUR AND SOAR...in 45 games this season when scoring 5+ runs, the Mariners are 42-4 (.913) which is the best such record in the Major Leagues...in 65 games when scoring 4+ runs, the Mariners are 54-11 (.831), which is the 2nd-best record in the Majors behind San Diego (.849/62-11).

MUÑOZ: ONE OF THE BEST...Andrés Muñoz recorded his 19th save of the season on Sunday...in 50 appearances this season, the 2024 All-Star has a 1.80 ERA (10 ER, 50.0 IP) with 24 walks and 63 strikeouts, sporting a 1.000 WHIP and 11.3 strikeouts-per-9 innings rate...he's also held opponents to a .154 batting average (26x169)...among pitchers with at least 50 IP this season, Muñoz's .154 opponent batting average ranks 5th-lowest in the Majors, while him and fellow All-Star Mason Miller-OAK are the only pitchers to hold their opponents to a .155 batting average with a strikeouts-per-9 rate of at least 10.

THE THRILL ON THE HILL...the Mariners pitching staff **leads the Major Leagues** in ERA (3.51), opponent batting average (.223), WHIP (1.09), fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.36), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.49), strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.72), opponent OPS (.654) and quality starts (80)...Seattle's pitching staff has 13 shutout wins, tied for most in the Majors with Atlanta.

QUALITY IN QUANTITY...the Mariners **lead the Majors** in quality starts (80) by a wide margin, with next-closest Philadelphia (67), Kansas City (65), Atlanta (58) and Pittsburgh (57) rounding out the top-5...Seattle has 4 pitchers with 14+ quality starts and 5 with 9+: **Logan Gilbert** (20 QS, T-1st in MLB), **Luis Castillo** (17, T-7th), **George Kirby** (16, 10th), **Bryce Miller** (14, T13th) and **Bryan Woo** (9), making them the only starting rotation in the Majors to meet both those criteria.

WILSON NAMED MANAGER, MARTINEZ NAMED HITTING COACH...on Thursday, **Dan Wilson** was named Mariners manager (21st manager, 18th full-time in franchise history) and on Friday, **Edgar Martinez** was named the team's hitting coach (through the 2024 season)...the pair of Mariners Hall of Famers were Seattle teammates for 12 seasons (1994-2005) and appeared together in each of Seattle's first 4 Postseason appearances (1995, '97, 2000-01) as a franchise.

AS YOU KNOW...**Logan Gilbert** ranks among American League pitching leaders in nearly every major category, including WHIP (1st, .091), quality starts (1st, 20), innings pitched (2nd, 165.2 IP), opp. average (2nd, .200), ERA (4th, 3.21) and strikeouts (6th, 162)...**AND AS YOU MAY KNOW**...Logan is also tied for the MLB lead with 5 starts of 7.0+ scoreless innings this season (also: Logan Webb-SF), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Logan's 5 starts of 7.0+ scoreless innings are already tied for the most in a season by a Mariners pitcher since Félix Hernández recorded 5 such starts during the 2015 season?...no Mariners pitcher has recorded 6+ starts of 7.0+ scoreless innings in a season since Hisashi Iwakuma's 7 starts in 2013...Logan is chasing the club record 8 such starts, shared by Hernández (2009) and Jamie Moyer (2002).

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 27th start of the season and 1st against Tampa Bay...he will also make the 115th start of his MLB career and 5th career start against the Rays. Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau. Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference. Was named the 2022 Mariners Most Valuable Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.

LAST TIME OUT...L#10 on 8/21 at Los Angeles-NL...he threw 4.2 innings and allowed 8 runs (6 earned) on 7 hits with 2 walks and 7 strikeouts.

ALL-STAR CALIBER...on July 7, was named to the 2024 American League All-Star team, his 1st All-Star selection...among qualified AL pitchers this season, Gilbert ranks 1st in WHIP (0.91), 1st in quality starts (20), 2nd in innings pitched (165.2), 2nd in Opp. AVG (.200), 6th in strikeouts (162) and 8th in ERA (3.21).

LUCKY 7...has the most starts of 7.0+ scoreless IP in MLB...has totaled 5 of those outings (38.0 IP) this season (8/10 vs. NYM, 7/14 at LAA, 6/22 at MIA, 6/16 vs. TEX and 5/4 at HOU).

25 OUTINGS...through his 26 starts of the season, opposing hitters are batting .200 (120x600) against Gilbert...Randy Johnson is the only pitcher in franchise history has ever finished a season with a sub-.200 opponent average against (1997, .194)...so far this season he has allowed 161 baserunners, 2nd-fewest in franchise history through 26 starts...trailing only Bryce Miller from this season with 150 baserunners allowed.

SPLIT SECOND DECISION...hitters this season are batting .107 (8x75) against Gilbert's splitter with 3 doubles and 1 home run...the .107 average is the 3rd-lowest in the Majors and the 2nd-lowest in the AL against a splitter (min. 60 PA).

WHIPPING IT UP...this season Gilbert has posted a 0.91 WHIP...it is the lowest qualified WHIP in franchise history, on pace to be 1 of 3 pitchers to post a sub-1.00 WHIP in a single season...since making his MLB debut, Gilbert has the 3rd-lowest WHIP in the American League (1.08) (min. 500 IP).

ALL I DO IS WIN...over his career has made 59 starts away from T-Mobile Park...in those starts he is 26-10 for a .722 win percentage, the 2nd-best in MLB history (min. 50 GS)...he is trailing Shane Bieber-CLE (37-14, .725).

FEELING SUPPORTED...Gilbert is 36-0 in his career when the Mariners score 3 or more runs while he is in the game...in those games the Mariners are 44-9.

QUALITY MIDSET...20 of his 26 starts have been quality starts...he has gone 6.0+ innings in 21 of his 26 starts...the Mariners are 12-9 when he pitches in 6.0+ innings.

SHUTDOWN STARTER...made back-to-back starts with 8.0 scoreless innings pitched from 6/16-6/22...since the beginning of the 2020 season, only Nathan Eovaldi-TEX (3 G, 4/29-5/11/21) has gone 8.0+ scoreless innings in consecutive starts...he became the first Seattle pitcher since Mike Montgomery (6/23-6/30/15) to do so.

MID-SEASON FORM...over 5 starts in June, he posted a 2-1 record with a 1.51 ERA (6 ER, 35.2 IP) and 31 strikeouts to 1 walk...his ERA marked the 2nd-lowest of his career during a single month (March/April 2022, 0.40 ERA)...Gilbert's 0.62 WHIP was the best mark in the Majors during June...his WHIP was also the lowest during a single month in his career.

GET AHEAD, STAY AHEAD...he is posting a 67.1% 1st pitch strike rate, the highest of his career...among pitchers with 100.0+ IP, this is the 5th-highest in the AL.

MARINERS MILESTONES...currently is 10th in franchise history with 653 strikeouts...he is 5 strikeouts away from tying Joel Piñeiro with 658 strikeouts...he moved into the top-10 after striking out 7 batters on 8/4 vs. Philadelphia.

100 AND COUNTING...made his 100th career start on 5/30 vs. HOU...he had the 4th-most strikeouts (562) in a players' first 100 games with the franchise...behind only James Paxton (603), Randy Johnson (593) and Félix Hernández (575)...only 14 pitchers in franchise history have had each of their first 100 appearances be starts.

STRONG BEGINNINGS...Gilbert was the 4th pitcher in Major League history to have recorded 500.0+ innings, 550+ strikeouts and 140-or-less walks in their first 100 career games...the list includes Noah Syndergaard-NYM, Masahiro Tanaka-NYY and Michael Pineda-NYY/SEA.
