9/11 REMEMBRANCE CEREMONY DETAILS: The New York Mets will hold a ceremony prior to Saturday's game surrounding the 20th anniversary remembrance of 9/11...The ceremony will begin at 7:00 p.m....The club will wear first responder caps during batting practice and the game on September 11 vs. the Yankees...Caps from the FDNY, NYPD, Port Authority Police Department, Department of Sanitation and Department of Correction will all be represented to commemorate their bravery and sacrifice...Organizations represented on the field during the 20th Anniversary of 9/11 will be Tuesday's Children, The Visionary Network from the 9/11 Museum, Answer the Call - New York Police and Fire Widows' & Children Benefit Fund, which was created by Rusty Staub, The Feel Good Foundation, helping those suffering from 9/11 related illnesses and Mets employees who lost loved ones on 9/11 and those who worked tirelessly at Shea Stadium to aid the support effort.

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: With big crowds expected for the Subway Series at Citi Field and the conclusion of the US Open, the Mets urge fans to take mass transit to Citi Field...It's faster, easier, and the greener way to go...Tickets remain for Friday's and Sunday's games...For more info, visit Mets.com/Tickets now.

METSELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Marlins, 3-2, last night...The team has lost back-to-back games...The Mets are 22-31 (does not include the resumption of the April 11 suspended game on August 28) since the All-Star break...Tonight, the Mets begin their penultimate homestand of the season, a nine-game, 10-day stand against the Yankees (three games), the Cardinals (three games) and Phillies (three games).

ONE IS THE LONELIEST NUMBER: Each of the last seven Mets losses have been by one run...That is the longest streak in franchise history, surpassing the previous high of six straight losses by one run from June 9-19, 1998...14 of the team's last 16 losses have been by one run...Overall, the Mets are 27-29 in one run games this season...The team's .482 winning percentage in one run games ranks 15th in the majors... Courtesy of Elias.

BOTH BOROUGHS, BOTH TEAMS: There have been 147 players who have played for both the Mets and Yankees.

SUBWAY SERIES: The Mets and Yankees begin the Subway Series today...The Mets are 2-1 against the Yankees this season...The two teams will face each other a total of six times this year, three games from July 3-4 and this weekend at Citi Field...The two teams went 3-3 against each other last season...The Mets and Yankees have gone .500 against one another in each of the last three seasons.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets are 7-8 in Interleague play this year and went 9-11 against the American League last year...The team's .513 winning percentage (224-213) is the second-best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

STARTING OFF: The Mets rotation has posted a 2.01 ERA (five earned runs/22.1 innings) with three walks and 22 strikeouts over the last four games...The staff has gone at least 5.0 innings and allowed no more than two earned runs in any of those games...Over the last 15 games, the starting rotation has posted a 3.39 ERA (31 earned runs/82.1 innings) with 18 walks and 77 punchouts...Overall this season, the starting rotation has posted a 3.66 ERA (279 earned runs/686.2 innings) with 189 walks and 699 strikeouts...Their 3.66 ERA ranks sixth in the majors and fourth in the National League.

REVOLUTION NO. 9: Pete Alonso is on a nine-game hitting streak...It is tied for the second-longest streak of his career...Alonso recorded a career-high 11-game hitting streak from August 15-26 this year...He is batting .389 (14-36) with six runs, five doubles, a triple, three home runs, eight RBI, three walks, a .425 OBP and an .889 SLG in that span...In 53 games following the All-Star break, Alonso is batting .296/.373/.597 with 11 doubles, three triples, 15 home runs and 35 RBI...This compares to a .249/.326/.477 slashline with 12 doubles, 17 home runs and 49 RBI in the first-half.

OUCH: The Mets have been hit by 85 pitches this season...That is the third-most in the majors and in the National League...Since 2019, the Mets have been plunked by 225 pitches...That is the most in the majors in that span.

METS-YANKEES NOTES: The Mets and Yankees have split the season series for the three consecutive years.

A CENTURY: Pete Alonso become just the eighth player in major league history to hit 100 or more homers within their first three major league seasons...He became the second-fastest player in major league history to hit 100 home runs, hitting 101 in 347 games...Only Ryan Howard, 100 home runs in 325 games, was faster...He collected his 10th career multi-home run game last night...His 10 multi-homer games are tied with Kevin McReynolds and Bobby Bonilla for the ninth-most in franchise history...Darryl Strawberry is the franchise's record holder with 22 multi-home run games.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets own a 41-27 record with a 3.23 ERA (210 earned runs/586.0 innings) with 212 walks and 636 strikeouts at home...The Mets guaranteed at least a .500 season at home...The team's 3.23 ERA at home is the fourth-best in the majors...This compares to a 29-44 record with a 4.23 ERA (287 earned runs/611.1 innings) with 192 walks and 624 strikeouts on the road this year.

THE MAGIC MAN: Javier Báez has reached base safely in each of his last seven starts...He is batting .429 (12-28) with nine runs, three doubles, three home runs, five RBI, a walk, a .500 OBP and an .857 SLG in that span...Since returning from the injured list on August 22, Javier Báez is batting .317 (20-63) with 15 runs, six doubles, five home runs, nine RBI, a .377 OBP, a .651 SLG and a 1.028 OPS.

MOVIN' ON UP: Michael Conforto has hit 130 home runs, which is seventh on the team's all-time list...Carlos Beltrán is next with 149 home runs as a Met...Pete Alonso is now 15th on the team's all-time home runs list with 101 home runs...Carlos Delgado is 14th with 104 home runs...15 players, including Alonso have hit 100 or more home runs with the franchise...Alonso's 101 home runs are the most in the majors since he entered the league in 2019.

DINGERS! The Mets have hit 13 home runs in their last seven games...The Mets have homered in 14 of their last 15 games, including the make up of the April 11 game...The Mets have hit 24 home runs in that span...The Mets are 52-43 when hitting at least one home run this season and 25-12 when hitting two or more.

VILLAR THE WORLD: Jonathan Villar has reached base safely in each of his last 15 starts...He is batting .383 (23-60) with 11 runs, four doubles, a triple, three home runs, eight RBI, eight walks and a 1.089 OPS in that span...In 52 games following the All-Star break, Villar is batting .295/.361/.480 with 23 runs, six doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 17 walks, 21 RBI and an .841 OPS...This compares to a .236/.318/.438 slashline with 21 extra-base hits and 19 RBI in 69 games before the break.

FIRST CLASS: In 42 games batting first this season, Jonathan Villar is hitting .299/.386/.513 with 30 runs, 10 doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 14 RBI and 21 walks...The Mets are 26-16 in games Villar leads off...His .299 average when batting first is ninth in the majors.

WE LIKE MIKE: Michael Conforto is batting .250 (10-40) with nine runs, a double, four home runs, 14 RBI, a .362 OBP and a .575 SLG over his last 12 games...He is batting .237/.338/.456 with 26 runs, 10 doubles, nine home runs and 25 RBI in 53 games following the All-Star Game...This compares to a .202/.341/.298 slashline with 10 extra-base hits and 20 RBI in 53 games in the first half.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: The Mets swept a twinbill against the Expos and moved a game ahead of the Cubs in the NL East standings...New York won its six straight games...The Mets won game one, 3-2, via walk-off fashion in the 12th inning...Jim McAndrew hurled 11.0 innings, allowing only two runs and striking out seven...Ken Boswell hit an RBI single in the 12th to win it...The Mets put up a six-spot in the third frame to down the Expos, 7-1, in game two...Nolan Ryan hurled a complete game gem, allowing a run on three hits with four walks and struck out 11...For cool photos and interactive history information on the Mets, please visit the Mets Virtual Vault at metsheritage.com.

MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

PRO-NUN-SEE-AY-SHUN: Tylor's first name is pronounced TIE-lore.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed four runs, earned, on seven hits over 6.0 innings on September 4 against Washington at Nationals Park...Walked one and struck out a career-high-tying eight batters...Suffered his fourth loss of the season in the Mets' 4-3 setback.

IT'S ALL ABOUT MEGILL: Among pitchers to make their first 14 career starts with the Mets, Megill ranks tied for seventh in franchise history in strikeouts (78) to begin his career... He has allowed one or no runs in six of his first 14 career starts...Dwight Gooden (nine), Matt Harvey (nine) and Noah Syndergaard (eight) are only Mets pitchers to record more such games in their first 13 career starts...Megill is one of seven Mets pitchers to allow no more than two runs in at least eight of his first 14 career starts...He is the ninth Mets pitcher to collect five or more hits in his first 13 career games...His .238 average puts him fourth in team history for a pitcher who has had at least 15 at-bats through 13 games.

THE RIGHT STUFF: Megill has held right-handed batters to a .199 batting average, striking out 46 of the 150 hitters he has faced...Megill's .538 opponent OPS vs. RHB ranks seventh in the NL among pitchers who have faced 150 or more righties.

HOT LIKE THE JULY SUN: Megill's 1.04 ERA in July was the best in the major leagues (min. 25.0 IP)...Jameson Taillon (1.16 ERA) is the only other pitcher who had an ERA in July south of 1.20...Only two other pitchers in Mets history have had a better ERA in the month of July: Jon Matlack had 0.86 ERA in July 1972 and Rick Aguilera had a 0.89 ERA in July 1985...Megill received votes for both NL Pitcher of the Month and NL Rookie of the Month.

ALLOW TO ME TO INTRODUCE MYSELF: Megill ranks 10th in ERA among major league rookie starters who have started at least tossed 70.0 innings...His 26.2 strikeout percentage puts him sixth among rookies and 6.4 walk percentage ranks third (min. 70 innings pitched)...Among rookies to pitch at least 70 innings, Megill ranks seventh in strikeouts per nine (9.93). Among NL Rookie Pitchers, Megill ranks second in average (.238) and first in hits (5). who have had a minimum of 15 at-bats.

KEEP ON SLIDING: Megill uses his slider 17.9 percent of the time...The pitch has generated a .238 BAA, with batters totaling just 15 hits (15-65) with 22 strikeouts on at-bats ending with that pitch...His foes have a 32.1% whiff percentage on the slider... Righties have batted just .170 (8-48) batting average and struck out 18 time versus the pitch.

2021: Megill made eight starts between Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) this season...He is 2-1 with a 3.35 ERA (15 earned runs/40.1 innings) and has walked 12 and struck out 59...He is averaging 13.16 strikeouts per 9.0 innings and is walking just 2.68 per 9.0 IP in the minors.

MINOR LEAGUE REVIEW: Megill has pitched in three seasons in the Mets organization...In his first professional season, he appeared in 10 games (two starts) for Brooklyn (A), going 1-2 with a 3.21 ERA...In 2019, he began the year with Columbia (A), making 14 appearances (three starts) before being promoted to St. Lucie (A), where he started seven times...He was then promoted to Binghamton (AA) for his final outing of the year...All told, in 2019, the right-hander went 6-7 with a 3.52 ERA in 22 games (11 starts)...Megill did not pitch in 2020 as the MiLB season was canceled... He started this season at Binghamton, making five starts there (2-1, 3.12 ERA) before earning a promotion to Triple-A Syracuse...In his minor league career, he is 9-10 with a 3.41 ERA and has 51 walks and 187 strikeouts in 140.0 innings.

TOMORROWS STARTER: RHP TAIJUAN WALKER (7-9, 4.15 ERA)

LAST TIME OUT: , Walked pitched at home against division rival the Washington Nationals...Walker pitched four and one-thirds innings, surrendered six runs, earned, on six hits allowed...He had six punch outs, while only letting up three base on balls... The Amazins won this affair 13-6, Walker did not factor into the decision.

VS. YANKEES: In five career starts against the Yankees, Walker owns a lifetime 3.24 ERA (9 earned runs/25.0 innings)...His last appearance came this season at Yankee stadium...He allowed two earned runs in five and two-thirds innings of work...He had five punch outs and two walks, and threw his season high 106 pitches...The Mets won this affair 8-3, with Walker earning the win.

- Is tied for second in the majors with 21 homers since June 28...Ranks third in the NL with 32 homers this season...Is 11th in the league with a .528 SLG.
- Batting .339 (39-115) with a 1.072 OPS since August 10 (29 games)...Had a career-high 11-game hitting streak from August 15-26.
- Homers every 9.53 at-bats vs. LHP, first in the NL and third in MLB...Would be the best HR rate against LHP in Mets history (Dave Kingman, 10.55 AB/HR).
- Has eight homers and 18 RBI in his last 29 home games...Had one homer and nine in his first 33 home games this year.
- Is posting the lowest strikeout rate (20.1 percent) of his career...After striking out in 31 percent of his PA in April, has since whiffed in just 18 percent.
