TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners host the Detroit Tigers for the last of 3 games (0-2) to close out the first homestand of the season...the Mariners opened their season with a 4-game split against the Athletics... following an off-day tomorrow, the Mariners will travel to San Francisco to face the San Francisco Giants (3 G, 4/4-6) before returning home for a 6-game homestand where they will host the Houston Astros (3 G, 4/7-9) and the Texas Rangers (3 G, 4/11-13)...today's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Aaron Goldsmith and Ryan Rowland-Smith on the call and Jen Mueller serving as sideline reporter... the game will be broadcast live on Seattle Sports (710 AM) and Mariners.com with Rick Rizzs and Gary Hill Jr. on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped yesterday's game to the Tigers by a 4-1 final...despite dropping the series, the Mariners are 7-3-3 in series since **Dan Wilson** was named Manager on Aug. 22, 2024.

- Take a Walk Seattle's offense has drawn 26 walks through 6 games, the most walks in the American League...Seattle ranks 3rd in MLB, trailing the Cubs (36 BB in 7 games) and Dodgers (27 BB in 6 games).
- Winner, Winner The Mariners have put together 4 consecutive winning seasons (2021-c), tied for the most consecutive winning seasons in franchise history (also: 2000-03).
- Runners The Mariners are 5-for-6 (83.3%) in stolen base attempts this season, with Ryan Bliss (2 SB), Julio Rodríguez (2 SB) and Cal Raleigh (1 SB) each swiping at least 1 bag so far...the Mariners set a franchise record with a 83.3% (140-for-168) success rate on stolen bases last season.
- What a Relief Gregory Santos has spun scoreless innings in each of his first 3 appearances this season...Gabe Speier has not allowed a run while striking out 3 over 1.2 IP in his first 2 appearances.

"ROCK"STAR...Luis Castillo is set to make his second start of the season...Castillo has had a sub-4.00 ERA in each of the last 6 seasons (2019-c) including 5 qualified seasons during that span (2019-21, 2023-24), one of just 3 pitchers in the Majors during that span to have 5 qualified seasons with a sub-4.00 ERA, joining Gerrit Cole-HOU/NYY and Zack Wheeler-PHI...Castillo also has 4 seasons (2019, 2021, 2023-24) of at least 175 strikeouts since 2019, trailing only Aaron Nola-PHI (5 seasons).

YESTERDAY'S ROSTER MOVES...yesterday the Mariners made their first roster moves of the season, selecting LHP Jhonathan Díaz from Triple-A Tacoma and recalling INF Leo Rivas...in corresponding moves, RHP Emerson Hancock was optioned to Tacoma and INF Jorge Polanco was placed on the Paternity List.

THE J-ROD SHOW...Julio Rodríguez is batting .331 (49x148) with 31 runs, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 31 RBI and 8 stolen bases, getting on base at a .388 clip and slugging .581 with a .969 OPS in 35 games since Aug. 28, 2024...among qualified AL hitters with 100 PA during that span, his .974 OPS ranks 4th, trailing Aaron Judge-NYY (1.091 OPS), Yordan Alvarez-HOU (970 OPS) and Nathaniel Lowe-TEX (.970).

HE RALEY LOVES HITTING AT HOME...in 77 career games at T-Mobile Park, Luke Raley is batting .263 (59x224) with 40 runs, 14 doubles, 1 triple, 17 home runs, 48 RBI and 10 stolen bases, getting on base at a .352 clip and slugging .563 with a .914 OPS...his .914 OPS ranks T-4th among active players with at least 100 PA at T-Moblie Park, trailing only Aaron Judge-NYY (1.195), Mike Trout-LAA (1.143), David Fletcher-LAA (.929) and Yordan Alvarez-HOU (.922).

RANDY'S LASER SHOW...over his first 6 games this season, Arozarena has 4 runs, 1 double, 2 home runs, 2 RBI and 5 walks with a .333 on-base percentage, a .526 slugging percentage and a .859 OPS...he leads Mariners hitters with 8 hard-hit balls (95 MPH+) and 6 balls in play of at least 100 MPH.

CAL IS ON THE BOARD...Cal Raleigh hit his 1st home run of the season in Monday's game...he is 1 home run shy of tying Mike Zunino (94 HR) for the franchise record among catchers...Cal already has the 7th-most home runs among catchers in their first 5 Major League season, after leading all catchers with 93 home runs through his first 4 seasons...Mike Piazza (128 HR) holds the record for most HR through a catchers first five MLB seasons.

MUÑY, MUÑY, MUÑY...Andrés Muñoz has recorded saves in each of his first 2 appearances this season... Muñoz set a career-highs with 22 saves and a 2.12 ERA (14 ER, 59.1 IP) last season, earning his first career All-Star nod...on Opening Day, he joined Edwin Díaz, Josh Hader, Craig Kimbrel, Kenley Jansen, Dellin Betances, Ken Giles and Greg Holland as the only pitchers since 2000 to post a 2.64 ERA, 12.4 SO/9 and a 3.53 SO/BB or better over his first 200 career games.

<u>HOT START FOR JORGE</u>...third baseman **Jorge Polanco** has hit safely in each of his first 4 games to begin the season (3/27-c), batting .400 (6x15) with 1 home run, 4 RBI and a sacrifice bunt...on Thursday night, "Polo" supplied the go-ahead and eventual game-winning 2-run homer in the bottom of the eighth, his first career Opening Day home run in his seventh Opening Day game.

TERRIFIC AT T-MOBILE...in 2024, Seattle's pitching staff went 49-32 with 21 saves and a 2.85 ERA (234 ER, 739.0 IP) with 168 walks and 795 strikeouts in 81 home games...the 2.85 home ERA led MLB and was the best home ERA in franchise history, surpassing the 2.93 ERA during the 2014 season...the Mariners limited opponents to a .205 batting average at T-Mobile Park, tied for the 6th-lowest in MLB history... Seattle's .256 opponent on-base percentage at home was 4th-lowest in MLB history.

MARINERS EXTEND CAL RALEIGH TO 6-YEAR CONTRACT...the Mariners announced on Wednesday they extended catcher Cal Raleigh to a 6-year contract through the 2030 season, with a vesting player option for 2031...the 28-year-old backstop has led MLB catchers in home runs in 3 consecutive seasons and catcher caught stealing in 2 consecutive seasons...Cal led the Mariners in games played (153), plate appearances (628), home runs (34), RBI (100), extra-base hits (50) and total bases (238) last season... Raleigh won a *Rawlings* AL Gold Glove Award in 2024, also named the AL Platinum Glove Award winner and becoming the first Seattle player to go Platinum.

<u>UPCOMING HOMESTAND</u>...following a brief trip to the Bay Area for 3 games against the San Francisco Giants, the Mariners return for a 6-game homestand against Houston and Texas...the homestand is highlighted by Cal Raleigh "Platinum Glove" Bobblehead nights from April 7-9, Mariners Corduroy Hat Night on April 11, Mariners Salute to Armed Forces Night on April 12 and Mariners Little League Day on April 13.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...since joining the Mariners, Luis Castillo is 29-24 with a 3.44 ERA (169 ER, 442.2 IP), 122 walks, 475 strikeouts and a 1.13 WHIP in 75 starts, but...<u>DID YOU KNOW?</u>...that Castillo's 475 strikeouts through his first 75 starts are the most through a pitcher's first 75 starts in franchise history?... he ranks ahead of Randy Johnson (439) and Félix Hernández (427), while current Mariners teammates George Kirby (5th, 414 SO) and Logan Gilbert (6th, 413 SO) rank among the top 6 in team history.

ABOUT CASTILLO ...

- The 32-year-old right-hander is set to make his 2nd start of the season and his 1st against Detroit...he is also making his 213th Major League start and 6th career start against the Tigers.
- Has been named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA)
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on 12/23/11.
- Made MLB debut on 6/23/17 vs. Washington (w/ Cincinnati).
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.
- **LAST TIME OUT...**L#1 on 3/28/25 vs. ATH, Castillo recorded 5.0 innings pitched, allowed 3 hits (1 HR), giving up 2 runs with 2 earned runs, 2 walks and collecting 4 strikeouts.
- TOP OF CLASS...recorded his 6th consecutive season with a sub-4.00 ERA in 2024, including 5 qualified seasons (2019-21, 2023-24)...his 5 qualified seasons since 2019 with a sub-4.00 ERA are tied for the most in the Majors during that span (also: Gerrit Cole-HOU/NYY and Zack Wheeler-PHI).
- 2024 ROCKED...was 11-12 with a 3.64 ERA (71 ER, 175.1 IP), 47 walks, 175 strikeouts and a 1.17 WHIP in 30 starts last season...finished the season on the 15-day Injured List with a left hamstring strain suffered on Sept. 8 at STL.
- LUIS, LUIS...since making his Mariners debut (8/3/22 at NYY), Castillo is 29-24 with a 3.89 ERA (169 ER, 442.2 IP), 122 walks, 475 strikeouts, and a 1.125 WHIP while holding opponents to a .225 AVG against...among AL pitchers (min. 300.0 IP) during that span, he ranks 2nd in strikeouts (1st: Kevin Gausman, 472), 5th in ERA, 7th in Opp. AVG and 8th in WHIP.
- HOME COOKIN!...in 40 starts at T-Mobile Park, Castillo is 17-11 with a 2.90 ERA (77 ER, 238.2 IP) with 56 walks, 283 strikeouts and a 1.01 WHIP.
- WHIFF ARTIST...among AL pitchers in 2024, ranked 14th in strikeouts (175) and in swings-and-misses (375)...since he made his Mariners debut on 8/3/22, Castillo is 2nd the Major Leagues, and 1st in the AL, with 1,056 swings-and-misses and 2nd in the AL in strikeouts (475)...during that same stretch, Logan Gilbert (3rd, 473) and George Kirby (10th, 411) rank in the top 10 in the AL for strikeouts.
- FOR CLUB & COUNTRY...ranks among the Dominican Republic-born All-Time leaders (min. 1,100.0 IP) in SO/9 (2nd, 9.73), SO/BB (2nd, 3.26) ,WHIP (3rd, 1.18), H/9 (4th, 7.60), Opp. AVG (4th, .227), ERA (7th, 3.56)...trails only Hall of Famer Pedro Martinez in SO/9 (10.04) and SO/BB (4.15)...Castillo was born in Bani, Dominican Republic.)
- STEERING THE SHIP...since his Mariners debut (8/3/22 at NYY), Castillo has led the team in SO/9, (10.6 in 2022, and 10.0 in 2023), ERA (3.17 in 2022), innings pitched (197.0 in 2023), and games started (33 in 2023)... amongst the league, he also ranks in the top 10 in games started (4th, 75), innings pitched (5th, 442.2), quality starts (5th, 43), hits per 9 IP (8th, 7.601), and ERA (10th, 3.56) among active pitchers.
- TOP CHARTS...since his MLB debut (6/23/17 vs. WSH), Castillo ranks 5th in innings pitched (1235.0), strikeouts (1335), and quality starts (117), and 6th in games started (212) among all pitchers.
- <u>FIELDING HIS POSITION</u>...Castillo has only committed 3 errors in 212 games, and is tied for the 2nd best fielding percentage (.986) among active pitchers around the league.
- CAREER...has pitched in parts of 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2017-22) and Seattle (2022-c)...has been named an All-Star 3 times (2019, 2022 w/CIN and 2023 w/SEA)...finished 5th in 2023 AL Cy Young Award voting...has made 4 Opening Day starts in his career: 2019 and 2021 with Cincinnati and 2023-24 with Seattle.
- POSTSEASON PEDIGREE...has made 3 career postseason starts, going 1-2 with a 1.83 ERA (4 ER, 19.2 IP), 19 strikeouts and 1 walk (intentional)...earned the win in Game 1 of the 2022 AL Wild Card Series at Toronto...tossed 7.1 scoreless innings with 5 strikeouts, setting a franchise record for most innings pitched in a scoreless postseason start...was tagged with the loss on 10/13/22 at HOU in G2 of the ALDS...allowed 3 runs on 5 hits (2 HR) with 7 strikeouts.
- THE STONE WAS ROLLING...began his start on 9/7/22 vs. Chicago-AL by striking out the first 7 batters he faced, setting a franchise record for most strikeouts to begin a start, passing Michael Pineda (5 on 7/9/11 at LAA)...the 7 strikeouts also tied the AL record for most strikeouts to begin a game (done 4x, last: Blake Snell-TB, 6/3/18 vs. SEA).
