METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Rockies, 10-7, last night...New York has won seven of their last 10 games...The Mets are seeking their eighth series victory of the season and their fourth of the road...New York is 3-2 in rubber games this year...Today, the Mets finish a six-game road trip (2-3) to Chicago-NL (1-2) and Colorado (1-1)...Following this road trip, the Mets enjoy Memorial Day off before beginning a six-game homestand against Philadelphia (three games) and Toronto (three games).

GET WELL SOON: Elieser Hernández is set to begin a rehab assignment with the St. Lucie Mets today...The 28-year-old has been on the IL since March 30 with a right shoulder strain...He was acquired from the Miami Marlins along with Jeff Brigham for Franklin Sanchez and Jake Mangum... Catcher Omar Narváez has played two games with the Cyclones as part of a rehab assignment...He is 1-4 with two runs and two RBI...Narváez has been on the IL since April 7 with a left calf strain.

20/20 VISION: Pete Alonso hit his 20th home run of the season last night...He did so in his 53rd game of the season becoming the second-fastest player in team history to do so..See the chart below for the fastest Met to reach 20 home runs in a season and the fastest to 50 RBI...Courtesy of Elias.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso has homered in seven of his last 11 games... Overall, he has hit 20 home runs this year, which leads the majors leagues...His 46 RBI are tied for second in The Show and lead the National League...Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 426 career RBI...Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468)... Alonso has appeared in 52 games this year.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez is on a seven-game hitting streak, the longest of his young career...He is batting .440 (11-25) in that span with six runs, two doubles, four home runs, 10 RBI, one walk with a .500 OBP, a 1.000 SLG and a 1.500 OPS...His seven home runs are tied for the third-most by a rookie in the majors and tied for the second-most in the National League...The backstop is batting .311 (23-74) with six doubles, seven home runs, five walks with a .370 OBP and a .676 SLG against right-handed pitching this year...In 20 games in May, Alvarez is batting .317 (20-63) with 10 runs, six doubles, six home runs, 14 RBI, six walks with a 1.093 OPS.

TAP THE ROCKIES: Brandon Nimmo, who grew up around 100 miles from the ballpark, is a lifetime .371 (23-62) hitter with 15 runs, two triples, four home runs, 11 RBI, seven walks with a .429 OBP and a .629 SLG in 16 games at the ballpark...After going 0-1 with a run in his career game at Coors Field on August 2, 2017, Nimmo has hit in 15 straight games at the ballpark...He is 23-61 (.377) in that span with 14 runs, two triples, four home runs, 11 RBI, and seven walks with a 1.074 OPS.

ROAD WARRIOR: Brandon Nimmo is batting .346 (44-127) with 18 runs, eight doubles, three triples, two home runs, 17 RBI, 14 walks with a .411 OBP and .504 SLG in 32 games on the road this season...His .346 road average ranks third in the majors...Nimmo owns a career .398 OBP on the road...That is the fourth-highest mark in the majors since the Wyoming native entered the league in 2016.

ROCKIES-METS NOTES: The Mets have won each of the last three series at Coors Field going back to 2019...The team is 6-3 in that span.

IF YOU START ME OFF: The Mets are 13-0 this season when the starter goes at least 6.0 innings and 4-0 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

ROCKY ROAD: The Mets have won seven of their last 10 games at Coors Field...Overall, the Mets are 42-58 at the ballpark...Starling Marte has hit .402 (49-122) with 27 runs, four doubles, five home runs, 24 RBI, five walks with a .447 OBP and a .557 SLG in 28 games at Coors Field....Pete Alonso has hit .364 (16-44) with eight runs, two doubles, four home runs, eight RBI and one walk in 11 games in Denver.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 16-3 when scoring first this season... The team's .842 winning percentage when scoring first is tied for the second-best mark in the majors...On the other hand, the Mets are 11-23 (.324) when their opponent scores first...Since the start of 2022, the Mets are 97-19 when scoring first...Their .836 winning percentage is the best in the majors.

HOMER HAPPY: After the Mets went five straight games without a home run, the Mets have homered in season-high 11 straight contests, hitting 19 home runs in that span...The Mets are 22-12 when hitting a home run this season and 9-6 when hitting multiple homers...In 2022, the Mets longest home run streak was nine games (September 9-17)... The team hit 14 home runs in that span...The last time the Mets had a longer streak was in 2019...From June 20-July 5 the Mets homered in 14 straight games, socking 24 dingers in that span...The 14-game homer streak is tied for the second-longest in franchise history.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets are tied for second in the majors and are tied for the National League lead with a 85.4% stolen base rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 14 bags this year, tied for seventh in the majors and tied for third in the National League...His 328 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 340 steals.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York has played 32 games on the road this year, the most in the majors...New York is 15-17 with a 4.70 ERA away from Citi Field in 2023...The team's 268 strikeouts on the road are the most in the majors.

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets are 24-0 when leading after eight innings this season...The last time the Mets lost a game when they were ahead after eight innings was on September 6, 2021 at Washington...The Mets were up 3-2 and lost 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth...Since then the Mets have won their last 119 games when ahead after eight, the longest active streak in MLB...It's the longest streak in franchise history, surpassing the previous high of 117 consecutive games...From October 1, 1990- September 2, 1992, the Mets also won 117 straight games when ahead after eight innings.

COUNTDOWN TO THE HOF: Infielder Howard Johnson, LHP AI Leiter and broadcasters Gary Cohen and Howie Rose will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on Saturday, June 3 in a pre-game ceremony prior to the 4:10 p.m. game vs. the Blue Jays at Citi Field...The four new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 34...Jay Horwitz will also be honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for his contributions to the organization.

MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the loss in the Mets' 7-2 defeat by the Chicago Cubs on May 23...Threw 3.2 innings, allowed a season-high six runs and a season-high-tying four earned runs on six hits, with two walks and five strikeouts.

BIG DRIP VS THE ROCKIES: Today, Megill will make his second career start against the Rockies...Made his first career start against Colorado at Citi Field on May 6 and suffered the loss...Threw 4.2 innings and allowed three earned runs on six hits...Is 2-3 with a 5.67 ERA (29 ER/46.0 IP) in nine career starts against NL West opponents.

THE GAME OF RISP: This season, Megill is holding opposing batters to a .234 average (11-47) with runners in scoring position, the 20th-best mark in the NL among starting pitchers...Megill also ranks 10th in the NL and 23rd in the majors with a .570 opponent's OPS with runners in scoring position among starting pitchers (Min. 40 batters faced w/RISP).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: This season, Megill is 2-2 with a 5.56 ERA (14 ER/22.2 IP) in five road starts this season...In five home starts this season, Megill is 3-1 with a 3.29 ERA (10 ER/27.1 IP)...In 22 career road games (18 starts), Megill is 6-7 with a 5.06 ERA (50 ER/89.0 IP) and in 21 career home games (19 starts), Megill is 7-4 with a 4.22 ERA (46 ER/98.0 IP).

THE FRANCHISE HAS COMPANY: On April 7, the Mets home opener vs. Miami, Megill threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits...Megill joined Tom Seaver (April 5, 1983) as the only other pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0 shutout innings and allow three hits or fewer in a home opener...Courtesy of Elias.

COMBINED NO-NO: Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season on April 29 at Citi Field...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...The Mets combine no-hitter against the Phillies marked the 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodríguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bulloen.

2022 RECAP: Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those

OPENOR: Last year, Tylor Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY: His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021..According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).
