**TODAY'S TILT**...the Mariners take on the St. Louis Cardinals (1-0) today in the 2nd game of a 3-game series...the Mariners will visit the Minnesota Twins (3 G, 4/27-4/29) on the road trip...today's game at the Redbirds will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call, with **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners beat the Cardinals 3-2 in the series opener last night...with a win today, Seattle would improve their series record to 4-2 over their last 6 series (4/10-c).

- **Small World - Randy Arozarena** and today's Cardinals starter Matthew Liberatore were traded for each other on Jan. 9, 2020, with Arozarena going to the Rays along with José Martinez in exchange for Liberatore and Edgardo Rodriguez going to St. Louis...the teams also swapped Competitive Balance picks in the trade.
- **Yesterday's Trade** - The Mariners yesterday acquired MiLB RHP Ty Cummings in exchange for RHP Casey Legumina, who was designated for assignment on April 21...Cummings was a 7th round pick in the 2023 MLB First-Year Player Draft by Seattle and was dealt to the Rays in the trade that brought **Randy Arozarena** to Seattle.
- **Big Tex - Bryce Miller** made the 2nd start of his rehab assignment last night with High-A Everett, tossing 3.0 scoreless innings with 6 strikeouts...he threw 47 pitches, 35 strikes.
- **Quality** - Seattle is tied for the AL lead with 14 quality starts (also: Kansas City), trailing only the Dodgers (17)...**George Kirby** and **Bryan Woo** are both tied for 3rd in MLB with 4 quality starts in 2026.
- **Ratio'd** - Since the start of 2024, 3 Mariners starters rank within the top 5 in MLB in SO/BB ratio (min. 200 IP): **Bryan Woo** (2nd, 5.91), **George Kirby** (4th, 5.72) and **Logan Gilbert** (5th, 5.71).
- **Young and Spry on Defense** - Mariners infielder **Cole Young** has 8 defensive runs saved (*FanGraphs*) this season, leading MLB second basemen and tied for the MLB lead among all defenders (also: Pete Crow-Armstrong-CHC).

**THE STARTING FIVE**...Mariners starting pitchers have been excellent to start the 2026 season, with the rotation of **Logan Gilbert**, **George Kirby**, **Bryan Woo**, **Emerson Hancock** and **Luis Castillo** combining to go 8-9 with a 3.40 ERA (59 ER, 156.1 IP), 35 walks and 141 strikeouts...among MLB rotations, the Mariners ranks 4th in fWAR (3.5), T-2nd in quality starts (13), 1st in fewest BB/9 (2.01), 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.03), 4th in WHIP (1.13) and 6th in ERA.

**CAN'T LIVE WITHOUT WOO**...**Bryan Woo** makes his 6th start of the season today, and is 1-2 with a 2.25 ERA (8 ER, 32.0 IP), 6 walks, 26 strikeouts and a 0.88 WHIP over his first 5 starts...dating back to the start of the 2024 season, Woo ranks 4th in the AL and 9th in MLB with a 2.86 ERA (min. 200 IP)...during that same span, he ranks among the AL leaders in BB% (2nd, 4.1%), SO/BB (2nd, 5.91), Opp. AVG (5th, .202) and WHIP (0.91).

**NAYLZ HEATING UP**...first baseman **Josh Naylor** provided the go-ahead home run in last night's game, going 1-for-3 with the HR, 1 BB, 2 runs and 1 SB...over his last 6 games (4/17-c), Naylor is hitting .500 (10x20) with 2 doubles, 4 RBI, 2 SB and 4 walks, slugging .750 with a 1.310 OPS...Naylor is also batting .292 (14x48) with 2 doubles, 3 HR, 9 RBI and an .896 OPS over his past 13 games (4/10-c).

**NEVER DONE WITH ONE RUN**...the Mariners have played 10 one-run games (4-6) this season, tied for the most in the Majors...Seattle has played the most one-run games (277, 154-123) since 2021, and the most (499, 276-223) since 2016...the Mariners own the best one-run record in the American League since both 2021 and 2016, ranking 2nd to the Brewers in both.

**ALL STREAKS MUST COME TO AN END**...**Julio Rodríguez** had his 19-game (4/3-c) on-base streak (via hit, walk or HBP), snapped in yesterday's game at the hands of two stellar defensive plays by the Cardinals...the streak was the 3rd-longest on-base streak of Julio's career, trailing streaks of 27 G (2023) and 22 G (2022) and is the 2nd-longest streak in the AL this season, trailing Nick Kurtz-ATH active 20-game streak...Julio hit .289 (22x76) with an .372 OBP during the streak.

**BRASH DECISION**...right-handed reliever **Matt Brash** is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 9.1 IP) with 5 strikeouts and 2 walks (1 intentional) in 11 appearances this season...he's posted a 0.54 WHIP and held opponents to a miniscule .107 batting average (3x28)...Brash is 1-of-3 players in Mariners history to have multiple season opening streaks of at least 10 games without an earned run (also: 19 G in 2025), joining teammates **Andrés Muñoz** (2023 and 2025) and **Gabe Speier** (2023 and 2025).

**SPLENDID STARTERS CEMENT PLACE IN SPECIAL CLUB**...only 11 pitchers in MLB history have recorded 400+ strikeouts while walking fewer than 100 batters through their first 75 career starts and the Mariners have 3 of them currently in their rotation: **Logan Gilbert**, **George Kirby**, and **Bryan Woo**.

**MITCH GARVER STOPS BY "THE CAL RALEIGH SHOW"**...Mariners catcher **Mitch Garver** joined **Cal Raleigh** and Mariners insider **Shannon Drayer** on this week's episode of "The Cal Raleigh Show"...all episodes of the show air on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and **SeattleSports.com**.

**AS YOU MAY KNOW**...**Josh Naylor** has notched the game-winning RBI in back-to-back games, hitting a 6th-inning go-ahead home run in last night's game after recording a walk-off single in Wednesday's win, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Naylor leads MLB since 2024 with 21 go-ahead or game-tying hits in the 6th inning or later?...he ranks ahead of **Cal Raleigh** (20) and **Brent Rooker-ATH** (20).

### ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 25

- **1990** - Edgar Martinez goes 4x4 with a homer and two RBI as the Mariners win 5-2 at New York.
- **1997** - In a 13-8 victory at Toronto, Ken Griffey Jr. belts three home runs in a game for just the second time in his career. He has 13 homers in April, a new Major League record. He hits career home run #250, making him the fourth-youngest player to reach the milestone.
- **1999** - Jay Buhner hits a game-winning home run at Tampa Bay in the 9th inning off Roberto Hernandez with two-outs and two-strikes.
- **2001** - Kazuhiro Sasaki records his 11th save in April, tying the Mariners record for the most saves in ANY month.
- **2016** - Kyle Seager hit his 100th career home against the Astros.
- **2022** - Ty France named Co-AL Player of the Week with Miguel Cabrera (3,000th hit)...France batted .500 (13x26) with 3 homers and 10 RBI during the week.

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 6th start of the season and his 75th career start...marks his 1st start of the year against St. Louis and 2nd career start against the Cardinals.

LAST TIME OUT...W#1 on April 19 vs. Texas, tossing 7.0 innings and allowing 2 runs on 4 hits with 6 strikeouts to 1 walk allowed...he threw 85 pitches (54 strikes) in his 5th start of the season.

NO HOMERS HERE...has yet to allow a home run this season...is 1 of 2 pitchers this season with 30+ IP and no home runs allowed (also: Seth Lugo-KC)...is the first Mariner to give up no HR through their first 5 starts of a season since Bryce Miller did so in 2023.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...making his 4th road start of the season...has tossed 6.0+ IP in 16 of his 19 road starts since 2025, including 12 quality starts...among qualified pitchers since 2025, his 117.0 IP on the road are 6th-most while his 12 QS are tied for 4th-most across that span.

AGAINST THE NL...is making his 2nd start against a National League team this season (also: 4/14 at SD)...is 7-5 with a 3.21 ERA (37 ER, 103.2 IP) across 17 career starts against National League teams...went 4-2 with a 3.16 ERA (15 ER, 42.2 IP) and 45 strikeouts across 7 starts against NL opponents last season.

APRIL SHOWERS...across 8 career starts in the month of April, he is 3-3 with a 2.77 ERA (16 ER, 52.0 IP) and 42 strikeouts to just 10 walks and 2 home runs allowed...has tossed 6.0+ IP in 7 of those starts, with 6 quality starts across his career in April.

WOOOOO...has tossed 7.0+ innings in 3 of his 5 starts this season...threw 7.0 shutout innings, allowing just 1 hit on April 3 at Los Angeles-AL, his 3rd career start tossing 7.0+ IP with 1-or-fewer hits...tied for the most such games in MLB since the start of last season (also: Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD).

WATCH ME WHIP.....owns a 0.88 WHIP across 5 starts this season, tied with Parker Messick-CLE for 8th-best in MLB to start the year, and trails rotationmate Emerson Hancock (0.87)...Woo's 0.973 career WHIP is the lowest in franchise history (min. 400 IP) and is the 3rd-best mark in MLB among qualified pitchers since 2023, trailing Tarik Skubal-DET (0.91) and Paul Skenes-PIT (0.95)... has thrown 6.0+ IP with 4-or-fewer hits in 16 games since 2025, tied for 3rd-most such games in MLB across that span.

QUALITY STUFF...has tossed a quality start in 4 of his 5 starts this season...threw a quality start in 21 of his 30 starts last season, tied for 4th-most in the Majors that season, trailing only Logan Webb-SF (22), Christopher Sánchez-PHI (22) and Garrett Crochet-BOS (22)...his 25 quality starts since 2025 are tied for 2nd-most in MLB.

THROUGH 75...made his 75th career start on April 19 vs. TEX...among Mariners through their first 75 starts with the club, his 330 hits allowed are the fewest, his 3.14 ERA ranks 2nd-best, trailing only Hisashi Iwakuma (2.93), his 86 walks allowed are 2nd-fewest, trailing only George Kirby (52 BB), and his 418 strikeouts are 4th-most...his 39 total quality starts are T-6th in franchise history across a starter's first 75 career starts, alongside Dave Fleming, Félix Hernández, and Hisashi Iwakuma.

GOING THE DISTANCE...across his career, the Mariners are 28-20 when Woo tosses 6.0+ IP and 9-4 when he tosses 7.0+ IP compared to 15-12 when he tosses fewer than 6.0 innings...Woo has tossed 6.0+ IP in 31 of his 35 starts since 2025 with the team going 17-14 in those games.

FIRST HALF WARRIOR...is 13-8 with a 2.76 ERA (69 ER, 225.1 IP), 207 strikeouts and a 0.936 WHIP across 39 career starts pre All-Star Break...his 0.936 WHIP in the first half ranks 3rd-best in MLB since 2023 (min. 200 IP), trailing Tarik Skubal-DET (0.860) and Paul Skenes (0.922...he threw 6.0+ innings in all 18 starts before last year's All-Star break, while posting a 2.75 ERA (35 ER, 114.2 IP) with 109 strikeouts and 21 walks...his 2.75 ERA last year was the 6th-best by a starting pitcher in the first half (min. 15 GS) in franchise history, while his 0.93 WHIP ranked 3rd-best (1st: Logan Gilbert, 0.87 in 2024).

400...recorded his 400th career strikeout on March 28 vs. Cleveland, becoming the 2nd fastest starter to reach 400 strikeouts in franchise history (71 GS), behind only Felix Hernández (70 GS, 405 K).

2025 TOTALS...went 15-7 with a 2.94 ERA (61 ER, 186.2 IP), 36 walks, 198 strikeouts and a 0.93 WHIP in 30 starts...held opponents to a .200/.243/.353 slashline last season...finished 5th in 2025 BBWAA Cy Young Award voting.

END OF THE ROAD...finished the 2025 regular season on Sept. 19, 2025 at Houston, throwing 5.0 scoreless innings and allowing 1 hit and 1 walk while striking out 7 batters before exiting with right pectoral inflammation...returned 27 days later to make Postseason debut in ALCS Game 5 vs. Toronto, allowing 1 run (1 ER) in 2.0 innings of relief.

THE STREAK...began the 2025 season with 25 consecutive starts of 6.0+ innings and 2-or-fewer walks, the 2nd-longest such streak in MLB history (Cy Young, 30 G, 1905)...his run of 6.0+ inning starts was also the longest to begin a season in Mariners history.

- **Steady Eddy** - Made 8-consecutive relief appearances (3/30-4/18) without allowing an earned run...tossed 7.2 innings over those appearances.
- **2025 Totals** - Went 5-0 with a 2.52 ERA (22 ER, 78.2 IP) with 27 walks, 82 strikeouts and a 1.017 WHIP in 73 appearances, limiting opponents to a .187 batting average in 2025.
- **El Campeón** - Won the 2026 World Baseball Classic with Team Venezuela, which included a pitching appearance in the Championship Game against Team USA on March 17.

- **Scoreless Streak** - Has begun his season with 9.1 scoreless innings over 11 appearances...last season set Mariners record after not allowing a run in his first 19 appearances of the season.
- **2025 Totals** - Went 1-3 with 4 saves, a 2.47 ERA (13 ER, 47.1 IP), 18 walks, 58 strikeouts and a 1.25 WHIP in 53 relief appearances...held opponents to a .236 average while recording 21 holds.
- **Postseason Stalwart** - Made 8 appearances during Mariners run to the American League Championship Series, going 1-0 with a 2.00 ERA (2 ER, 9.0 IP), 5 walks and 10 strikeouts.
