TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 12, 1996: Trailing 8-0 after two innings, the Yankees respond with nine unanswered runs to pull out a Mother's Day win at Chicago's Comiskey Park. Joe Girardi hits a bases-clearing double in the sixth to give the Yankees the lead.

May 12, 1953: Whitey Ford throws a one-hit complete game shutout against Cleveland at Yankee Stadium, allowing his only hit to Cleveland pitcher Early Wynn (6th inning single) as the Yankees win 7-0.

May 12, 1925: Yogi Berra is born in St. Louis, Mo. A three-time American League MVP and 10-time World Series champion, Berra was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1972.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 13, 1955: Mickey Mantle goes 4-for-4 with 3HR (2LH, 1RH) and all 5RBI in a 5-2 victory vs. Detroit at the Stadium. It marks his only career three-homer game and his first of 10 career games with HRs from both sides of the plate.

May 13, 1929: The Yankees lose, 4-3 at Cleveland, marking the first Major League game between two clubs wearing numbered uniforms.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their six-game road trip tonight with the first game of a three-game set at Seattle (through Wed.)...are 2-1 on the road trip after winning two-of-three against the Athletics this weekend...following this road trip, will return home for a six-game homestand featuring three-game sets vs. the Mets (Fri.-Sun.) and Texas (5/20-22).
► Have won four of their last five games (since 5/6).
► Are a season-high-tying 6G over .500.
► Their +75 run differential this season is the best in the Majors.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Athletics, 12-2, on Sunday at Sutter Health Park...**LHP Ryan Yarbrough** (5.0IP, 6H, 2R/ER, 1BB, 2K, 1HR) started and earned his first win as a Yankee...**SS Anthony Volpe** (2-for-5, 2R, 1RBI) hit a go-ahead RBI single in the second inning...**3B Oswaldo Cabrera** (1-for-4, 2R, 1 double, 2RBI, 1BB) drew a bases-loaded walk in the second inning and hit an RBI double in the third inning...**RF Aaron Judge** (4-for-5, 1R, 1 double, 2RBI) recorded a career-high-tying 4H, including a two-run single in the second inning...**DH/C Ben Rice** (1-for-3, 2R, 1HR, 4RBI, 1BB, 2HP) reached base a career-high-tying four times and hit his first career grand slam in the fifth inning...**1B Paul Goldschmidt** (3-for-5, 1R, 3 doubles, 2RBI) recorded a career-high-tying 3 doubles, including RBI doubles in the fifth and seventh innings...**LF Jasson Domínguez** (2-for-5, 2R, 1BB) and **C Austin Wells** (1-for-3, 2R, 1BB, 1HP) each reached base three times...**RHP Yerry de los Santos** (3.0IP, 2BB, 1K) and **LHP Tyler Matzek** (1.0IP, 1H, 1K) combined to toss 4.0 scoreless innings of relief.

GOOD AS GOLD: INF **Paul Goldschmidt** drove in two runs and recorded a career-high-tying 3 doubles on Sunday at the Athletics...has hit safely in 27 of his last 34 games (since 4/4), batting .364/.406/.508 (48-for-132) with 19R, 10 doubles, 3HR, 18RBI, 10BB/11BB, 2SB and 1SF in that span.
► **Has hit safely in each of his 19 road games this year, batting .434/.466/.590 (36-for-83) with 13R, 7 doubles, 2HR, 10RBI, 5BB and 1SB...is one of only three Yankees in franchise history to hit safely in his first 19 road games of a season**, joining Derek Jeter (23G in 2007) and Jack Lelivelt (21G in 1912)...his 19-game road hitting streak is the longest by a Yankee since Derek Jeter's 44-game streak from 8/20/06-5/28/07.
► Has hit .447/.511/.632 (17-for-38) with 4 doubles, 1HR, 16RBI, 5BB/2IBB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year...with RISP this season, is tied for first in the Majors in hits (tied for first in AL), tied for seventh in BA (fifth in AL) and ranks 10th in OBP (fourth in AL).
► Has reached base safely in 31 of his 40 games this season, batting .349/.398/.500 (53-for-152) with 24R, 11 doubles, 4HR, 20RBI, 12BB/2IBB, 1HP, 1SF and 2SB.
► Ranks second in the Majors in multi-hit games (18, second in AL) and BA (second in AL), third in hits (third in AL) and 10th in OBP (fifth in AL).

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF **Ben Rice** reached base a career-high-tying four times and hit his first career grand slam in the fifth inning on Sunday at the Athletics...marked the fourth grand slam by a Yankee this season and the third in the club's last five games (since 5/6).
► 19 of his 32H this season have gone for extra bases (9 doubles, 1 triple, 9HR).
► Ranks seventh in the Majors in SLG (.569, second in AL) and eighth in OPS (.937, fourth in AL)...is also tied for fifth in the AL in XBH (19).

HIGH VOLTAGE: INF **Anthony Volpe** is hitting .302/.367/.472 (16-for-53) with 9R, 6 doubles, 1HR, 7RBI, 5BB, 1HP, 1SF and 3SB over his last 14 games (since 4/25).

OUT OF THIS WORLD: OF **Jasson Domínguez** reached base in 7-of-15 PA during the three-game set at the Athletics, batting .417/.467/1.167 (5-for-12) with 6R, 3HR, 7RBI, 2BB and 1SF.
► Is hitting .302/.404/.581 (13-for-43) with 12R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 8RBI, 8BB, 1SF and 1SB over his last 13 games (since 4/23).

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starting pitchers have posted a 2.87 ERA (135.0IP, 43ER) over their last 25 starts (since 4/14)**...over that span, lead the Majors in opponents' BA (.209), opponents' OBP (.275) and opponents' OPS (.612), rank second in opponents' SLG (.337, first in AL), third in WHIP (1.11, third in AL) and fourth in ERA (third in AL).
► Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 20 of their last 25 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 18 of those starts.

SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF **Cody Bellinger** has hit safely in each of his last seven games (since 5/3), batting .310/.375/.517 (9-for-29) with 5R, 2HR, 4RBI, 3BB and 1SB over that span.
► Is hitting .320/.386/.600 (16-for-50) with 11R, 2 doubles, 4HR, 11RBI, 6BB and 1SF in 13 career games vs. Seattle.

ALL RISE: OF **Aaron Judge** recorded a **career-high-tying 4H on Sunday at the Athletics**, including a two-run single in the second inning...reached base in 8-of-15 PA during the three-game set at the Athletics, batting .500/.533/1.071 (7-for-14) with 4R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 5RBI and 11BB.

► **Leads the Majors in BA by 60 points, OBP by 60 points, SLG by 138 points and OPS by 223 points.**

► **Has reached base in 38 of his 40 games this year**, batting .409/.494/.779 (63-for-154) with 38R, 11 doubles, 2 triples, 14HR, 39RBI, 24BB/6IBB, 2HP and 3SB.

► **Has reached base multiple times in 25 of his last 31 games (since 4/7), 28 of his last 35 games (since 4/3) and 30 of his 40 games this year**...his 30 games of reaching base multiple times this season are the most in the Majors.

► With 14HR and a .409 BA, is one of just four players in the Modern Era to record as many home runs and as high of a BA in their club's first 40 games of a season, joining the Yankees' Mickey Mantle (19HR and .430 BA in 1956), Philadelphia-AL's Jimmie Foxx (17HR and .425 BA in 1932) and Boston's Manny Ramirez (14HR and .412 BA in 2001).

► **Is one of three Yankees (sixth time) in franchise history to reach base multiple times in 30 of the club's first 40 games of a season**, joining Babe Ruth (4x: 32G in 1927, 31G in 1924 and 1928, and 30G in 1923) and Lou Gehrig (31G in 1936).

► **Has hit 6HR in his last 11 games (since 4/29) and 7HR in his last 13 games (since 4/27-G2).**

► Over his last 31 games (since 4/7), has hit .436/.518/.744 (51-for-117) with 24R, 8 doubles, 2 triples, 8HR, 22RBI, 19BB/4IBB, 1HP and 1SB.

► Has hit .484/.579/.839 (15-for-31) with 2 doubles, 3HR, 24RBI, 6BB/5IBB and 1HP with RISP this year.

► **Has hit 13HR in his last 26 games vs. the Mariners (since 6/21/18) and 15HR in his last 34 games against Seattle (since 7/21/17)**...has 10HR in his last 18 games at T-Mobile Park (since 7/21/17)...since 2017, has hit .348/.477/.870 (24-for-69) with 17R, 6 doubles, 10HR, 23RBI, 17BB/5IBB, 1HP, 3SB and 1SF in 19 games at T-Mobile Park.

SEA-ING CLEARLY: The Yankees have won or split 13 of their last 15 series vs. the Mariners (since 8/22/16) and 16 of their last 19 series (since 6/10/14)...overall, are 33-15 in the last 48 matchups vs. the Mariners (since 8/23/16).

► **The Yankees have won 12 of their last 13 series at T-Mobile Park (since 9/12/11) and 13 of their last 15 series (since 7/8/10)...their 28-10 (.737) record at T-Mobile Park since 2012 is the third-best by any team (min. 30G) at any stadium in that span**, trailing only Tampa Bay's 24-7 (.774) record at loanDepot park and Los Angeles-NL's 28-9 (.757) record at Citi Field.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters scored double-digit runs for the eighth time this season on Sunday at the Athletics...their eight games with at least 10R are tied with Chicago-NL for the most in the Majors...**have scored double-digit runs in three of their last five games (since 5/6), scoring 45R over that span.**

► **Have hit a Major League-leading 70HR this year, their most home runs through their first 40 games of a season in franchise history** (previous: 65HR in 2003)...**have homered in a season-high 11 straight games** (since 4/29), hitting 25HR over that span...marks their longest single-season home run streak since a 13-game streak from 5/21-6/4/24.

► Lead the Majors in HR (70), OBP (.348), SLG (.481), OPS (.829), runs scored (235), runs per game (5.88), total bases (655), times on base (544) and XBH (150), are tied for first in walks (162, first in AL) and rank third in BA (.263, first in AL).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CLARKE SCHMIDT (0-1, 4.79 ERA)

RHP Clarke Schmidt will make his fifth start of the season in tonight's series opener at Seattle...the 29-year-old will start on extended five days' rest due to Thursday's team off day...made his fourth start of the season on Tuesday vs. San Diego, allowing 2R/ER over a season-high 6.0IP without recording a decision (7H, 1BB, 4K, 0HR, 1BK)...missed the first 17 team games of the season on the 15-day injured list from 3/26 (retroactive to 3/24) to 4/16 with right rotator cuff tendonitis...made two rehab starts with Double-A Somerset, tossing 7.1 scoreless innings (4H, 1BB, 11K, 1BK)...in 16 starts with the Yankees in 2024, went 5-5 with a 2.85 ERA (85.1IP, 71H, 31R/27ER, 30BB, 93K, 8HR)...allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his first 15 starts of the season from 3/31-9/24...**was just the second pitcher in Yankees history to allow 3R-or-fewer in each of his first 15 starts of a season**, joining Ron Guidry (also first 15 starts in 1978)...**allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17 straight starts from 9/25/23-9/24/24, the third-longest such streak in franchise history**, trailing only Russ Ford (20GS from 8/9(G2)/1910-5/27(G2)/1911) and Nestor Cortes (19GS from 8/15/21-6/2(G1)/22)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 38 of his last 43 starts (since 5/19/23)...has pitched over parts of six Major League seasons with the Yankees (2020-25)...was selected by the Yankees in the first round (16th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Carolina.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his fourth start of the season on Tuesday vs. San Diego, allowing 2R/ER over a season-high 6.0IP without recording a decision (7H, 1BB, 4K, 0HR, 1BK)...marked his first quality start of the season.

- 2025:** Is 0-1 with a 4.79 ERA (20.2IP, 19H, 11R/ER, 10BB, 19K, 3HR) in four starts this season.
- Has limited right-handed batters to a .152/.200/.152 (5-for-33) slash line this season.
 - Missed the first 17 team games of the season on the 15-day injured list with right rotator cuff tendonitis...was originally placed on the 15-day injured list on 3/26 (retroactive to 3/24)...made two rehab starts with Double-A Somerset, tossing 7.1 scoreless innings (4H, 1BB, 11K, 1BK)...made his second rehab start on 4/10 vs. Reading, tossing 4.0 scoreless innings without recording a decision (3H, 4K)...in his first rehab start on 4/5 at Hartford, tossed 3.1 scoreless innings without recording a decision (1H, 1BB, 7K, 1BK).
 - Made his season debut on 4/16 vs. Kansas City, allowing 3R/ER over 5.2IP without recording a decision (4H, 2BB, 2K, 0HR)...was returned from rehab and reinstated from the 15-day injured list prior to the game.
 - Allowed just 1R/ER over 5.0IP without recording a decision in Game 2 on 4/27 vs. Toronto (1H, 4BB, 6K, 1HR)...allowed his only hit and run on a solo HR to Anthony Santander in the third inning...marked his fewest hits allowed in a start of at least 5.0IP in his career (previous: 3H, seven times).

VS. SEATTLE: Has made three career starts vs. Seattle, going 0-2 with a 1.72 ERA (15.2IP, 13H, 5R/3ER, 6BB, 20K, 1HR)...has tossed at least 5.0IP and allowed 2ER-or-fewer in all three starts.

- Made two starts vs. the Mariners in 2024 (5/21 at Yankee Stadium and 9/19 at T-Mobile Park), going 0-2 with a 2.70 ERA (10.0IP, 10H, 5R/3ER, 5BB, 13K, 1HR).
- In his two career starts at T-Mobile Park, has gone 0-1 with a 0.84 ERA (10.2IP, 9H, 3R/1ER, 4BB, 14K, 0HR)...has allowed one-or-zero earned runs in both starts.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Has made one road start this season on 4/21 at Cleveland (L, 4.0IP, 7H, 5R/ER, 3BB, 7K, 2HR).

- With his 5R/ER allowed in his start on 4/21 at Cleveland, **snapped his seven-start streak on the road of allowing one-or-zero earned runs (4/13-G1-19/24)...was tied for the second-longest streak in franchise history**, trailing only Whitey Ford's 10-start streak on the road from 8/10/63-6/3/64 (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...Luis Severino (7/15/17-3/29/18), Al Downing (5/14-9/14/68) and Ford (8/15/50-G2-5/5/53) also recorded one-or-zero earned runs in seven straight road starts.
- In eight road starts in 2024, went 3-3 with a 1.39 ERA (45.1IP, 34H, 11R/7ER, 17BB, 46K, 2HR)...allowed 1ER-or-fewer in each of his final seven road starts from 4/13(G1)-9/19, going 3-3 with a 0.90 ERA (40.0IP, 4ER) over that stretch...**his seven-start streak of 1ER-or-fewer on the road was tied with Downing's seven-start streak in 1968 for the longest single-season streak in franchise history** (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...at the time, was also tied for the third-longest single-season streak in the Majors in the last 19 years (since 2006), trailing only Dylan Cease's nine-start streak from 5/7-8/11/22 and Kevin Gausman's eight-start streak from 4/1-5/30/21.
- Over his last 13 road starts (since 8/26/23), has gone 3-5 with a 2.70 ERA (70.0IP, 21ER) and 71K over that span**...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 12 of his 13 starts and one-or-zero earned runs in eight of those starts.

ON A ROLL: Over his last 44 outings (43 starts) since 5/19/23, is 13-11 with a 3.68 ERA (225.0IP, 207H, 100R/92ER, 72BB, 213K, 27HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 38 of those 43 starts.

- Allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17 straight starts from 9/25/23-9/24/24, the third-longest such streak in franchise history**, trailing only Russ Ford (20GS from 8/9(G2)/1910-5/27(G2)/1911) and Nestor Cortes (19GS from 8/15/21-6/2(G1)/22).
- Has recorded at least 6K in 12 of his last 20 starts (since 2024) after recording just 12 such games in 37 starts from 2020-23.
- The Yankees are 25-11 in his last 36 starts (since 6/29/23) and 16-6 in his last 22 starts (since 9/25/23).

2024: In 16 starts with the Yankees, went 5-5 with a 2.85 ERA (85.1IP, 71H, 31R/27ER, 30BB, 93K, 8HR)...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 15 of his 16 starts, including 2R-or-fewer in 10 of those starts and one-or-zero runs in five of those starts.

- Allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his first 15 starts of the season from 3/31-9/24...**was just the second pitcher in Yankees history to allow 3R-or-fewer in each of his first 15 starts of a season**, joining Ron Guidry (also first 15 starts in 1978)...**allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17 straight starts from 9/25/23-9/24/24, the third-longest such streak in franchise history**, trailing only Russ Ford (20GS from 8/9(G2)/1910-5/27(G2)/1911) and Nestor Cortes (19GS from 8/15/21-6/2(G1)/22).
- The Yankees went 11-5 in his starts...the Yankees won each of his first five starts from 3/31-4/24 and eight of his first nine starts from 3/31-5/16.
