### TIGERS TAKE 2-1 SERIES LEAD WITH SECOND STRAIGHT SHUTOUT:

The Tigers blanked the Guardians, 3-0, on Wednesday to record their second consecutive shutout and take a 2-1 lead in the best-of-five series. Six Detroit pitchers combined on the six-hit shutout, led by Brant Hurter, who threw 3.1 innings with five hits allowed, one walk and one strikeout to notch his first postseason win. Beau Brieske struck out three in 2.0 perfect innings of relief, while Will Vest retired all four batters he faced with one strikeout. Tyler Holton pitched a scoreless ninth for his first postseason save. Offensively, Riley Greene and Spencer Torkelson each had a hit and a RBI, and Jake Rogers went 1x2 with a double and a walk.

**IN THE POSTSEASON:** Detroit is in the postseason for the 17th time in franchise history and for the first time since 2014. The Tigers earned a Wild Card berth for the second time in franchise history (other, 2006) and are the No. 6 seed in the American League. Detroit is 61-63-1 all-time in the postseason, including a 31-28 record in Detroit. In the Division Series, the Tigers have an all-time record of 14-11, including a 7-3 mark at home.

**POSTSEASON SCORELESS INNINGS STREAK:** The Tigers posted their second straight shutout of the Guardians yesterday. It marks the Tigers 12th postseason shutout in franchise history and the first time that Detroit has recorded consecutive postseason shutouts since Game 5 of the 2013 ALDS at Oakland and Game 1 of the 2013 ALCS at Boston. Entering tonight's game, the Tigers have not allowed a run in 20.0 consecutive innings, which is tied for the second-longest streak in Tigers postseason history.

**BEAU KNOWS PITCHING:** Beau Brieske punched out three in 2.0 perfect innings out of the bullpen yesterday. In four appearances this postseason, Brieske has thrown 5.1 no-hit innings with two walks and six strikeouts. Dating back to August 28, Brieske has given up just two earned runs in 24.0 innings, allowing seven hits with 23 strikeouts in that span.

**FULLY VESTED:** Will Vest struck out one in 1.1 innings in relief yesterday. Vest has pitched in four games this postseason, retiring all 15 batters he's faced with seven strikeouts. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Vest's streak is tied with Jeremy Bonderman for the longest by a Tigers pitcher to start his postseason career and is the longest by a MLB pitcher to begin his playoff career since Trevor Stephan retired 16 straight from October 8-18, 2022.

**WALK IN THE PARKER:** Parker Meadows led off the bottom of the first yesterday with a single and came around to score on Riley Greene's RBI single. Meadows has recorded a hit in each of his first five postseason games and is one of four players to have an active hitting streak of five games-or-better in this year's playoffs (others, Fernando Tatis Jr., six games, Michael Massey and Salvador Perez, five games). Meadows is the first Tiger to hit safely in each of his first five postseason games since Al Kaline in 1968.

**ABOUT THE DIVISION SERIES ROSTER:** The Tigers 26-man roster for the American League Division Series includes 12 pitchers and 14 position players. Of the 26 players on the ALDS roster, 14 of them were on Detroit's Opening Day roster. Prior to the Wild Card series, Matt Vierling was the only player on the 26-man roster who had previous postseason experience. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last playoff team to have one-or-fewer players with previous playoff experience was the Angels in 2002.

**SECOND-HALF SURGE:** The Tigers posted a Major League best 31-13 record from August 11 until the end of the season. It was the team's best record over the final 44 games of a season since 2011, when Detroit went 32-12. The Tigers led the Majors with a 2.72 ERA (401.0IP/121ER) from August 11 until the end of the season, while also ranking first with a +62 run differential.

**TIGERS AND GUARDIANS:** After playing more than 2,300 regular season games, the Tigers and Guardians are meeting in the postseason for the first time. Detroit and Cleveland had split 16 meetings this season between the regular season and postseason. In the all-time series, the Tigers have a 1,161-1,156-12 advantage (includes regular season and postseason).

**AT COMERICA PARK:** The Tigers yesterday won their first postseason game at Comerica Park since Game 4 of the 2013 ALCS vs. Boston on October 16, 2013. Detroit went 42-38 at Comerica Park during the regular season, posting a winning record at home for the first time since 2021. The Tigers won 10 of their last 14 games at Comerica Park during the regular season.

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** A.J. Hinch is leading a team to the postseason for the fifth time in his managerial career. Hinch has posted a 32-23 (.582) record in the playoffs. In his four seasons as the Tigers manager, Hinch has a 307-341 (.474) record, while his all-time managerial record stands at 877-793 (.525). His 877 victories ranks fourth among active managers.

### Tonight's start vs. Cleveland

- Olson will make his second appearance overall and first postseason start of his career tonight vs. Cleveland...made his postseason debut in Game 1 of the series on Saturday, allowing a run on three hits with one walk and four strikeouts... became the first Tigers pitcher to throw 5.0-or-more innings in relief and allow one run-or-fewer in his first career playoff game since Ed Willett in Game 3 of the 1909 World Series vs. Pittsburgh.
- Made his first two career starts against the Guardians earlier this season, allowing five runs, four earned, on seven hits with three walks and seven strikeouts in 12.0 innings...in 22 appearances, including 20 starts, in his career at Comerica Park, Olson is 6-9 with a 3.95 ERA (118.1IP/52ER) and 120 strikeouts.

### 2024 Regular Season

- Started 22 games with the Tigers during the regular season, posting a 4-8 record with a 3.53 ERA (112.1IP/44ER) and 101 strikeouts...allowed two earned runs-or-less in 16 of his 22 starts.
- Allowed just seven home runs in 112.1 innings this season, ranking sixth among Major League pitchers (min. 100.0 innings) with 0.56 home runs allowed per 9.0 innings.
- Pitched 6.1 innings on May 25 vs. Toronto, giving up an unearned run on three hits with three walks and four strikeouts...allowed one earned run-or-fewer in six consecutive starts from April 26-May 25, over which he had a 0.77 ERA (35.0IP/3ER) with six hits allowed, 11 walks and 29 strikeouts...became the second Tiger in franchise history to post a sub-2.00 ERA while allowing 40-or-fewer hits through his first 10 starts of a season, joining Tom Timmermann in 1972.
- Allowed a home run to Michael Massey leading off the second inning on May 20 at Kansas City, snapping his streak of innings without allowing a homer to start the season at 48.1...in the Wild Card Era (since 1995), that was the third-longest streak by a Tigers starting pitcher to begin the season and sixth longest by any Tiger.
- Worked a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings on May 14 vs. Miami, allowing three hits with no walks and six strikeouts.
