BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals play the second of a three-game series with the San Francisco Giants at Oracle Park tonight. Last night, the Cardinals rallied from a 3-0 deficit to take a 4-3 lead in the 10th inning, but were walked-off in 11 innings, 5-4. Tomorrow afternoon, the Cardinals wrap up this series and a nine-game road trip through the National League West. They won the first two series against the Dodgers (2-1) and Rockies (2-1) and are looking to avoid losing a road series for the first time since being swept by the Phillies (Aug. 21-23)

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis enters play today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 17.0 games behind first place Milwaukee and 9.0 games behind 2nd place Chicago. The Cardinals are 5.0 games out of the 3rd Wild Card position held by Arizona with San Diego in their path. St. Louis has eight road games remaining and nine home games.

WINN ACTIVATED; PRIETO OPTIONED: Prior to tonight's game, the Cardinals activated Gold Glove-winning shortstop **Masyn Winn** from the 10-Day Injured List (fractured left thumb) and optioned INF **César Prieto** to Memphis (AAA). Winn last appeared in a game on Aug. 21 at Philadelphia.

BAY WATCH: **Alec Burleson** pulverized his 22nd home run of the season into the San Francisco Bay last night. The 22 home runs set his new single-season mark and gave him 104 RBI on the season, 2nd only to Reds' rookie **Sal Stewart** (107) in MLB. Burleson became the 3rd Cardinals player all-time to hit one into McCovey Cove joining **Larry Walker** and **Matt Carpenter**; was the 153rd instance all-time and 72nd by a visitor. Burleson has set his single-season marks in runs (81), hits (156), doubles (34), home runs (22), RBI (104), walks (48), extra base hits (57) and total bases (258).

NICE GAME, PRETTY BOY!: **Alec Burleson** recorded his 104th RBI of the season last night with 103 coming while playing first base. He tied **Keith Hernandez** for most RBI by a Cardinals left-hander while playing first base. Hernandez had 103 in his MVP season of 1979 (2 RBI as a pinch-hitter). Cardinals Hall of Famer **Bill White's** 109 RBI while playing first base in 1962 is the most recent season with more than Burleson and Hernandez. Burleson and **Jordan Walker** are the first Cardinals teammates with 100+ RBI since **Paul Goldschmidt** (115) and **Nolan Arenado** (103) in 2022.

SEPTEMBER HIT SQUAD: Cardinals INF **Thomas Saggese** and **C Iván Herrera** each banged out 12 hits to lead MLB this September. They are tied with **Javier Sanoja** (MIA) and **Elly De La Cruz** (CIN). Rookie OF **Joshua Baez's** 10 hits is tied for the most September hits among MLB rookies with **Hector Rodriguez** (CIN) and **TJ Rumfield** (COL). Baez extended his season-high hit streak to seven games last night and his 10 hits are more than the nine he recorded in 16 August games.

ROAD WORK: Cardinals **Jordan Walker** (68) and **Alec Burleson** (58) rank 1st and 2nd in MLB in road RBI. Walker's 68 are the most by a Cardinals player since **Albert Pujols** recorded 74 while barnstorming in 2009. **Jim Bottomley** holds the club record with 82 road RBI in 1928.

GRAY IS MY COLOR: Tonight's starting pitcher, **Quinn Mathews**, played his college baseball at nearby Stanford University in Palo Alto. The rookie southpaw is making his 6th start of the season and his 5th on the road. Mathews Joins **Stoney McGlynn** (1906), **Bill Steele** (1910) and **Joe Magrane** (1987) as the 4th Cardinal all-time to have made five road starts through their first six career. He became the first Cardinal (6th all-time) to make his first three career starts on the road since **Howie Pollet** (Aug. 20-28, 1941). - *Elias Sports Bureau*

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (September 8, 1998): Cardinals first baseman **Mark McGwire** hits his 62nd home run of the season off Cubs' Steve Trachsel at Busch Stadium breaking the previous home run record of 61 held by **Roger Maris**.

Bryan Torres was selected by the Giants from the Brewers in the Triple-A phase of the 2019 Rule 5 Draft & played in 43 games for Double-A Richmond in 2021.

Justin Bruihl was born in nearby Petaluma, Calif., and earned his first save on Sept. 18, 2022 at San Francisco while with the Dodgers.

Quinn Mathews pitched at nearby Stanford University from 2020-23, going 25-10 in 68 games (45 starts) and was the 2023 Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year.

Alec Burleson and **Carson Whisenhunt** were teammates at East Carolina University in 2020.

Daniel Descalso was born in Redwood City and resides in Danville, Calif...graduated from Saint Francis High School in Mountain View in 2004...played college baseball at UC-Davis (2005-07).

Giants Manager **Tony Vitello** is a St. Louis native...attended De Smet High School and the University

of Missouri, where he played baseball from 2000-02...was an asst. coach at Mizzou from 2003-10.

Hayden Birdsong was born in Mattoon, Ill...pitched at Eastern Illinois University in Charleston, Ill., where Sr. Dir., Player Dev. **Kyle Haines** graduated with a kinesiology and sports mgt. degree.

Andrew Knizner played parts of five seasons in St. Louis (2019-23)...selected in the 7th round of the 2016 MLB Draft by the Cardinals.

Giants Hitting Coach **Hunter Mense** played baseball at the Univ. of Missouri from 2004-06 and was an assistant coach from 2011-16...Bench Coach **Jayce Tingler** played at Mizzou from 2000-03.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Willie McGee** played four seasons (1991-95) with the Giants...was born in San Francisco...graduated from Harry Ells High School in Richmond...played college baseball at Diablo Valley College in Pleasant Hill...resides in Hercules...worked as an asst. coach for Contra Costa College in San Pablo, CA.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER:

- Southern California native and former Stanford Cardinal makes his 6th career Major League start tonight, including his 5th on the road.
- Joins **Stoney McGlynn** (1906), **Bill Steele** (1910), and **Joe Magrane** (1987) as the 4th Cardinal all-time to have made five road starts through their first six career appearances ... Became the first Cardinal (6th all-time) to make his first three career starts on the road since **Howie Pollet** (Aug. 20-28, 1941). - *Elias Sports Bureau*
- Currently ranked as the No. 11 prospect in the Cardinals organization by *Baseball America*.
- Made his only career start at Busch Stadium Friday, Aug. 28 vs. Pittsburgh and earned his first career win with a career high 5.2 innings.
- His 34.7% "Hard Hit" percentage is 3rd-lowest on the staff behind **Luis Gastelum** (33.3) and **Andre Pallante** (33.6).
- Limiting opposing MLB left-handed batters to 4-for-19 (.211/.250/.211) with four singles and one walk.
- Has received 3 runs of support or fewer in all five of his Major League starts.
- The Cardinals 4th round draft pick out of Stanford University in 2023. Originally selected by the Rays in the 19th round in the 2022 MLB Draft.
- 2024 Cardinals and Baseball America Minor League Pitcher of the Year.
- Led the 2026 International League in strikeouts (111) and opponent BA (.170); and ranked in the Top 10 in ERA (3.13, 2nd), games started (19, 2nd), innings pitched (92.0, 5th) and WHIP (1.14, 4th) when he was first called up (Aug. 1).
- Since the beginning of 2024, ranks 2nd in all of Minor League Baseball with 437 strikeouts, trailing only the Mets **Jonah Tong** (472). Ranks 4th in qualifying ERA (3.19).
- Led all of Minor League Baseball in 2024 with 202 strikeouts, T-7th most in a single-season by any Cardinals minor league pitcher (since 1962).

LAST TIME OUT (September 3 at Dodger Stadium): ND, L 3-2; 5.0 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 4 BB, 4 SO, 0 HR, 99 pitches

- Northern California native his first career start in the state of California, limiting the Dodgers to one run over 5.0 innings in a no-decision.
- Exited with a 2-1 lead after five innings before the Dodgers walked off the Cardinals on a two-run double by Teoscar Hernández.

2026 SEASON:

MEET ME IN ST. LOUIS: Made his first career start at Busch Stadium on Aug. 28 and earned his 1st career with career-high 5.2 innings, most innings by a Cardinals rookie left hander since **Matthew Liberatore** (8.0 IP on Aug. 10, 2023 at Tampa Bay) ... Quinn's 102 pitches were a professional high (2024-26) and most is most thrown since his 156-pitch complete game in the Stanford Super Regional win against Texas on June 11, 2023 (16 SO) ... Became the first Cardinal w/ 7+ strikeouts in his first career start at Busch Stadium since **Luke Weaver** (7K vs. OAK on 8/26/16).

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME: Became the first Cardinals pitcher (6th all-time) to make his first three starts of the road. Previous was **Howie Pollet** in 1941 (Aug. 20-28). - *Elias Sports Bureau*

OH, CANADA!: Was the first Cards starting pitcher to make his Major League debut in Canada since **Rick Ankiel** on August 23, 1999 at Montreal's Olympic Stadium vs. the Expos.

HATCHED: Is one 13 Cardinals (8 pitchers) to make their Major League debuts this season.

WALKING IN MEMPHIS: Began the season in the Memphis (AAA) rotation and held his opposition to three hits or fewer in 15-of-21 Triple-A starts.

BULL-YING DURHAM: Struck out a season-high 10 over 7.0 IP in a 7-3 Redbirds win vs. Durham (7/24) on the start before his MLB debut.

SUMMER LOVING: Over his final 12 starts with Memphis (AAA) from May 28-August 12, went 4-1 with a 1.99 ERA and 76 strikeouts over 63.1 innings pitched (10.8 K/9 IP) including a 1.01 WHIP.

SIX FOR THE FIX: Made four scoreless starts with three of them 6.0 innings or more with a season-high 7.0 IP, two-hitter at Gwinnett (Braves).

- Threw a 156-pitch complete game in the Stanford Super Regional win against Texas on June 11, 2023, striking out 16 batters.

- His older sister, Remy, played soccer at Rice University (2017-18).
