The Reds are trying to become the third team ever to make the playoffs following a 100loss season (2017 Twins, 2020 Marlins) and the fourth Postseason team with a losing home record during the regular season (1981 Royals, 19-28; 2001 Braves, 40-41; 2020 Marlins, 11-15)...courtesy @EliasSports

ELIMINATED
Friday the Redlegs were eliminated from NL Central Division title contention...fell short in their bid to become the first team ever to win a division after losing at least 100 games the season before (62-100)...last season, the Reds were eliminated on 9/10.

## WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

The Reds finished 62-100 (.383) in 2022 and are 81-77 (.513) so far this season...among all Major League teams from 2022 to 2023, the Reds rank second to the Rangers (88-69, .561) for the largest increase in wins (+19, Tex +20) and largest increase in winning percentage (+.130, Tex +.141)...courtesy @EliasSports.

ROLLER COASTER
From 4/24-7/31 the Reds went 52-34 (.605), the second-best record in the Major Leagues behind the Braves (53-29, .646)...through games of July 31, the Reds led the NL Central by 1.5 games over the Brewers and by 5.0 games over the third-place Cubs...since then are 22-28, including 10-17 in August and 1211 in September...won their last 2 games.

## KOMEBACK KIDS

The Reds and Orioles lead the Major Leagues with 48 come-from-behind wins...the Reds won $\mathbf{2 4}$ games in their final plate appearance, including 10 walkoff wins...the single-season club record for comeback wins in a season will remain 54, held by the 1976 Big Red Machine.

The Reds won (5) or tied (9) 14 of the $\mathbf{2 5}$ Ohio Cup season series, including 5 straight wins or ties from 2006-2010, but lost 5 of the previous 8 series.

BIG ROAD MACHINE
The Reds are trying to become fourth Postseason team to post a losing home record during the regular season (1981 Royals, 19-28; 2001 Braves 40-41; 2020 Marlins, 11-15)...courtesy @EliasSports
Beginning 5/26 the Reds are 36-19 (.655) over their last 9 road trips covering 18 road series...is the best road record in the Major Leagues during that span (Tor, 33-19, . 635 \& Hou, 33-20, .623).
The Reds have won 12 of their last 17 completed road series, including a streak of 7 straight road series wins snapped by the Brewers in the last series before the All-Star Game break.

## ROTATION

Rookie pitchers have made 58 starts for the Reds, including 16 of the Reds' 23 games so far in September...rookie pitchers are projected to start 19 of the Reds' 27 games in September/October

- LHP Brandon Williamson (22gs), who began the season at Class AAA Louisville, is 0-1, 7.30 in 3 starts in September.
LHP Andrew Abbott (20gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, is 0-1, 5.40 in 4 starts in September
RHP Connor Phillips ( 4 gs ), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, is 1-0, 5.66 in 4 starts in September.
RHP Lyon Richardson (4gs), who began the season at Class A Daytona, went 0-1, 8.68 in 2 starts in September.
RHP Carson Spiers (2gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, went $0-1,9.00$ in 2 starts and 1 relief appearance in September.
RHP Fernando Cruz (2gs), who last year at age 33 made his Major League debut with 14 apps, started the $7-0$ loss on $9 / 19$ vs Min.

Reds rookies have produced $\mathbf{6 4}$ HR, 224 RBI, $\mathbf{5 0}$ go-ahead RBI and $\mathbf{7 5}$ stolen bases...are the most HR, RBI and goahead RBI totals by any Major League team's rookies and second-most stolen bases total by any team's rookies. Have established single-season club records for HR (64) and stolen bases (75) by rookies...have produced the Reds' second-most RBI (260 in 1935) in a season by rookies...courtesy @EliasSports.
With 64 HR the Reds have established a new franchise record for home runs in a season by rookies (Spencer Steer 22, Matt McLain 16, Elly De La Cruz 13, Christian Encarnacion-Strand 12, Noelvi Marte 1)...the 2008 team recorded 54 home runs by rookies (Joey Votto 24, Jay Bruce 21, Chris Dickerson 6, Ryan Hanigan 2, Paul Janish 1).
The Reds are the first team in Major League history with 3 rookies, in a single season, with at least 10 HR \& 10 stolen bases each (Elly De La Cruz, Matt McLain, Spencer Steer).

For the first time since 1890, when Cincinnati joined the National League, 4 Reds rookies have produced at least 10 HR...prior to this season, never had more than 2 rookies in the same season with 10 HR...courtesy @EliasSports. The Reds have 3 rookies with at least 89 apps (Spencer Steer 153, Elly De La Cruz 94, Matt McLain 89)...most recently produced in the same season 3 rookies with at least 89 apps in 2009 (Chris Dickerson 97g, Paul Janish 90g, Ryan Hanigan 90g).

## RED HOTS

- On June 1 turned 24 years old.
- Tonight is making his 21 st Major League appearance and start, his second career appearance vs the Guardians. - Luke Maile has caught 19 of his 20 starts, the only exception on $9 / 16$ at NYM...in that $3-2$ win was caught by Tyler Stephenson for the only time this season after Maile was hit by a pitch on the back of his left hand the night before. Didn't debut until $6 / 5$ but still ranks among the National League's rookie leaders in ERA (4th), wins (T3rd), strikeouts (2nd), starts (6th), innings pitched (6th), batting average against (4th, .232) and WHIP (6th, 1.27).
- In his 4-3 win on $7 / 2$ vs SD recorded a career-high 12 strikeouts, tied with Nick Lodolo (4/8 at Phi) for secondmost by a Reds pitcher this season...Hunter Greene recorded a team-high 14 strikeouts on $9 / 20$ vs Min.

Began his career with 17.2 scoreless innings, a new club record since 1893, until Col's Brenton Doyle hit a leadoff HR in Abbott's fourth start...the previous team record was held by Wayne Simpson, who in 1970 began his Major League career with 15.0 scoreless innings...@EliasSports.

- Since the mound was moved to its current distance in 1893, is the only Major League pitcher to begin his career with 3 consecutive scoreless starts of at least 5.0 innings...@EliasSports.
- Abbott's 16.0-inning scoreless streak was snapped in the second inning of the $6-5$ win on $7 / 31$ at Cubs....when snapped was tied for the longest active streak in the Major Leagues.
Since 1912, when earned runs became an official statistic in the National League, his 1.90 ERA was the third-lowest by a Reds pitcher after 10 career starts (LHP Tom Browning, 1.65, 1984-85 \& RHP Jim Konstanty, 1.89, 1944)...courtesy @EliasSports
- Is 1 of only 4 Reds pitchers since 1893 , when the mound was moved to its current distance, to begin his career with 4 or 5 wins without a loss in his first 5 career starts (Mel D. Queen, 4-0 in 1967; Pat Zachry, 4-0 in 1976; Santo Alcala, 5-0 in 1976)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- Joined the Reds' Taxi Squad on 6/4...the next night vs Mil made his Major League debut after just 41 minor league apps (39gs, 14-7, 3.45)...in 10 starts this season for Chattanooga and Louisville went 4-0, 2.50 ( $54 \mathrm{ip}, 33 \mathrm{~h}, 17 \mathrm{bb}, 90 \mathrm{k}, .171 \mathrm{baa}$ )...when promoted led minor league baseball in strikeouts ( 90 k , 54 ip ).
In his Major League debut, threw 6.0 scoreless innings to earn the 2-0 win vs Mil and snap the Reds' 4 -game losing streak....became the only Reds pitcher since 1893, when the mound was moved to its current distance, to produce in his Major League debut at least 6.0 scoreless innings while allowing fewer than 2 hits... didn't allow a hit until Joey Wiemer doubled with 1 out in the top of the fifth inning...first career strikeout was Christian Yelich.
Began the season at Class AA Chattanooga (3gs, 1-0, 1.15)...on $4 / 25$ was promoted to Class AAA Louisville (7gs, 3-0, 3.05).
- Was the Southern League's first Pitcher of the Week and the organization's Minor League Pitcher of the Month for April (4gs, 1-0, 1.74, 20.2ip, 9h, 6bb, 43k). - Was selected by the Reds in the second round (53rd overall) of the June 2021 first-year player draft...was signed by Jeff Brookens.
