J.P. Crawford (4 H, 5 BB) and **Kyle Lewis** (6 H, 3 BB) have each reached base 9 times this season, tied for 3rd-most in the American League (also: Michael Brantley-HOU, Ramón Laureano-OAK and Brandon Lowe-TB)...trail only Jackie Bradley Jr.-BOS (10) and David Fletcher-LAA (10).

Since making his Major League debut on Sept. 10, 2019, **Kyle Lewis** has homered 8 times in 22 games...during this stretch his 8 home runs are tied with Ian Happ, Eloy Jiménez, and Matt Olson for 2nd-most in the Major Leagues...he trails only Nelson Cruz, Jorge Soler and George Springer, who have 9 home runs dating back to Sept. 10, 2019.

With 199 career home runs, **Kyle Seager** is one homer away from becoming the 4th player in club history to hit 200 career home runs as a **Mariner**, joining **Ken Griffey Jr.** (417), **Edgar Martínez** (309) and **Jay Buhner** (307).

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin their first of three series (10 games total) against the Los Angeles Angeles tonight at Angel Stadium of Anaheim...following tonight's game, the Mariners will play two more in Anaheim on Wednesday and Thursday before heading to Seattle for the opening series against the Oakland A's: July 31-Aug. 3...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the **Mariners Radio Network**.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners begin their first series against the Angels...are playing their fourth (1-3) of 20 consecutive games to open the 2020 season...are next scheduled to have an off-day on Aug. 13.

• **Young & Old** - third baseman **Kyle Seager** (32 years, 268 days) is the oldest player on the Mariners active roster...left-handed pitcher **Nick Margevicius** (24 years, 40 days) is the youngest player on the Mariners active roster.

• **Rule 5 Looking Good** - RHP **Yohan Ramirez** (5th pick) is one of 5 players selected in the Major League phase of the 2019 Rule 5 Draft to break Summer Camp with the big league team...Ramirez pitched in 2 games at Houston, whom Seattle selected him from, throwing 3.0 scoreless innings and striking out 4 without allowing a hit.

• **International Game** - the Mariners active roster is represented by four countries: Cuba (**Nestor Cortes**), Dominican Republic (**Yohan Ramirez**), Japan (**Yusei Kikuchi**), United States (27 players).

• **2019 in Review** - Completed the 2019 season 68-94 (.420), finishing 5th in the American League West (39.0 games behind division-winner Houston)...went 35-46 (.432) at home and 33-48 (.407) on the road...were 23-26 in one-run games and 9-4 when games went to extra-innings.

J.P. OFF TO HOT START...**J.P. Crawford** has reached base safely in 9 of 17 plate appearances (4 H, 5 BB)...in 4 games, he is 4-for-12 (.333) with 3 runs, 1 double, 2 triples and 5 walks...his 5 walks are tied for 3rd-best in baseball, trailing only Atlanta's Freddie Freeman (6) and Philadelphia's Rhys Hoskins (7).

ALL ABOARD!...in yesterday's loss in Houston, the Mariners saw all 9 offensive players reach base safely (without including a player reaching via an error)...in Sunday's win, Seattle also had 9 players reach safely without the benefit of a defensive miscue, giving the Mariners back-to-back games with 9 players reaching base safely...in 2019, the Mariners had back-to-back games with such an offensive spread just twice: July 30-31 at TEX & June 23-25 vs. BAL/at MIL.

WHITE NOTCHES HOMER No. 1...in what was his 4th game above Double-A, **Evan White** blasted a change-up from Astros starter Josh James an estimated 418 ft., with an estimated exit velocity of 106.5 MPH off the bat, according to *Statcast*...with the home run, White becomes the first Mariner of 2020 to record his first big league home run...in 2019, two Mariners collected their first career homer within their first 4 career games: **Kyle Lewis** (debut) and **Tim Lopes** (3rd game).

KYLE'S CLOSING IN...**Kyle Seager** is 1 run scored away from 600 in his career...he will become only the 6th player in franchise history to score at least 600 runs as a Mariner...he will join Edgar Martínez (1,219), Ichiro Suzuki (1,181), Ken Griffey Jr. (1,113), Jay Buhner (790) and Alex Rodríguez (627) as the only Mariners players in club history with at least 600 runs scored.

• He also sits on 199 career home runs...with his next long-ball, he will become 1 of 4 Mariners in history to reach 200 career home runs (Hall of Famer Griffey Jr.-417, Hall of Famer Martínez-309, Buhner-307).

• He enters with 1,223 career hits...needs 32 hits to tie Jay Buhner (1,255) for 4th in Mariners history.

MARINER MILESTONES...with his RBI double in the first inning on Sunday, **Kyle Seager** surpassed **Alvin Davis** for the 4th-most RBI in club history with 668 career RBI...Hall of Famer Edgar Martínez (1,261) holds the all-time club record, followed by Hall of Famer Ken Griffey Jr. (1,216) and Jay Buhner (951)...since his debut season of 2011, Seager ranks 7th among left-handed batters in RBI (668), 8th in doubles (271) and 8th in home runs (199).

ALL HANDS ON DECK...in the first four games of the season, the Mariners have used 28 players, including 16 pitchers...the only active players yet to appear in a game for the Mariners this season are **Justin Dunn**, **Dylan Moore** and **Justus Sheffield**.

YOUTH MOVEMENT...the Mariners fielded the youngest Opening Day roster in the Majors with an average age of 27 years, 259 days (ages on 7/24)...ranked ahead of San Diego (27.349), Miami (28.017), Detroit (28.029) and Kansas City (28.047)...Seattle's roster includes just 5 players with at least 4 years of MLB service time and features 14 players with less than 1 year of MLB service.

WHO ARE THESE GUYS?...**Dee Gordon** and **Marco Gonzales** are the only players remaining on the Mariners active roster from the 2019 Opening Day lineup (**Mitch Haniger** is currently on the IL, and **Kyle Seager** was on the IL for Opening Day last season)...the Mariners did not return a position player from their Opening Day starting lineup in 2019 to 2020.

SUMMER CAMP RECAP...the Mariners played 12 intrasquad games at T-Mobile Park during Mariners Summer Camp...**Kyle Lewis** led the way on offense, batting .435 (10x23) with 4 home runs, 7 RBI and 5 walks in 9 games...**Justin Sheffield** was a standout for the pitching staff, tossing 9.0 innings and allowing just 1 run (1.00 ERA) with no walks and 13 strikeouts over 3 outings.

IT'S A SPRINT...as part of its COVID-19 response, Major League Baseball has restructured the 2020 schedule to span only 60 games compared to the normal 162...the Mariners will face off against the AL West in 40 games and the NL West in 20 games...with the shorter season, each game in the 2020 season carries the equivalent weight of 2.7 regular season games in a typical MLB season...the trade deadline will take place on August 31.

AS YOU KNOW...Mariners first baseman **Evan White** cranked his first career home run in the 3rd inning yesterday off Astros starter Josh James...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?...**that he became the 125th player in franchise history to record his first career home run with the club...in 2019 alone, Seattle saw 6 players (Lewis, Court, Lopes, Nola, Long Jr. & Moore) collect their first big league home runs, the most in a single season since 2011...the first Mariner to ever collect his first career home run with the club: Juan Bernhardt on April 10, 1977 vs. California, off left-handed pitcher Frank Tanana...only 2 teams in the American League have had more players record their first MLB homers since Seattle's inception in 1977: Houston-133 and Minnesota-130.

ABOUT SHEFFIELD...

- 24-year-old left-hander is making his 8th Major League start, his 1st appearance of the season, his 12th career appearance, and his 1st career appearance against the Angels, tonight at Angel Stadium.
- Justus ("justice") Kane Sheffield...resides in Tullahoma, TN.
- Acquired in trade from New York-AL along with Erik Swanson (rhp) and Dom Thompson-Williams (cf) in exchange for James Paxton (lhp) on Nov. 19, 2018.
- Has been a top-10 organizational prospect according to *Baseball America* since making his professional debut in 2014...entered the 2020 season as the Mariners No. 7 prospect (*Baseball America*).
- Made his Major League debut with the Yankees on Sept. 19, 2018 vs. Boston.
- Has spent 6 minor league seasons in the Indians (2014-16), Yankees (2016-18) and Mariners (2019-c) organizations...over his minor league career, has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 2.63 (640 K, 243 BB), while averaging 9.3 strikeouts-per-9.0-innings (640 K, 620.2 IP) and allowing only 0.70 home-runs-per-9.0-innings (48 HR, 620.2 IP).
- Native of Tullahoma, TN...selected by Cleveland in the 1st round (31st overall) of the 2014 MLB Draft out of Tullahoma (TN) High School...at Tullahoma HS, was the 2014 "Gatorade National Player of the Year" after going 10-0 with a 0.43 ERA (3 ER, 61.2 IP) and 131 strikeouts in his senior season...had his number "42" retired by THS on Jan. 21, 2020.
- Began his pro career with Cleveland after being selected by the Indians with the 31st overall pick in the 2014 MLB Draft...spent parts of 3 seasons with Cleveland before being acquired by the Yankees in a 4-player deal that sent Andrew Miller (lhp) to the Indians on July 31, 2016...joined the Mariners in a 4-player deal that sent James Paxton (lhp) to the Yankees on Nov. 19, 2018.

SPRING RECAP...the left-hander posted a 2.25 ERA (2 ER, 8.0 IP) and allowed just 5 hits with 12 strikeouts (team-best) and 0 walks...held opponents to a .179 batting average.

SUMMER CAMP RECAP...tied **Kendall Graveman** for the team-lead in Summer Camp with 13 strikeouts over 9.0 innings (3 G)...allowed just one run on four hits and did not walk a batter.

GIVING US A CHANCE...despite not receiving a winning decision over his 8 appearances with the Mariners this season, left the game with the lead or tied in 5 of 7 starts... overall the Mariners are 6-2 in games when Sheffield takes the mound.

DOMINATING DOUBLE-A...in 12 starts with Double-A Arkansas, went 5-3 with a 2.19 ERA (19 ER, 78.0 IP) with 85 strikeouts and 18 walks...had 9 starts of at least 6.0 innings and 2 or fewer earned runs allowed...worked at least 6.0 innings in 10 of his 12 starts, including 6 outings of at least 7.0 innings...allowed 3 or fewer earned runs in 11 of 12 starts...issued 2 or fewer walks in 11 of 12 starts...recorded at least 7 strikeouts in 7 of 12 starts...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings on June 29 vs. Tulsa, while allowing just 1 run and striking out 8.

TACOMA TIME...in 13 games (12 starts) with Triple-A Tacoma in 2019, was 2-6 with a 6.87 ERA (42 ER, 55.0 IP) with 48 strikeouts and 41 walks.

2019 RECAP...went 0-1 with a 5.50 ERA (22 ER, 36.0 IP) with 18 walks and 37 strikeouts in 8 games (7 starts) with the Mariners.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW...made his Major League debut with the Yankees on Sept. 19 vs. Boston, tossing a scoreless 9th inning...made his debut at 22 years, 129 days of age...selected from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on Sept. 18.

MAKING THE ROUNDS...worked at least 5.0 innings and allowed 1 run or fewer in 3 of his 7 starts.

WELCOME TO SEATTLE...acquired in trade from New York-AL along with Erik Swanson (rhp) and Dom Thompson-Williams (cf) in exchange for James Paxton (lhp) on Nov. 19, 2018.

2019 MINOR DETAILS...began the year in 2018 with Double-A Trenton, going 1-2 with a 2.25 ERA (7 ER, 28.0 IP) with 39 strikeouts and 14 walks in 5 starts...promoted to Triple-A Scranton/ Wilkes-Barre on May 4, where he went 6-4 with a 2.56 ERA (25 ER, 88.0 IP) with 84 strikeouts and 36 walks in 20 games (15 starts)...made 3 postseason relief appearances with Scranton/W-B, going 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA (2 ER, 5.0 IP) with 5 strikeouts.

CAREER...in parts of 2 Major League seasons with New York-AL (2018) and Seattle (2019-c), is 0-1 with a 5.82 ERA (25 ER, 38.2 IP) with 37 strikeouts and 21 walks in 11 games (7 starts)...in parts of 6 minor league seasons with Cleveland (2014-16), New York-AL (2016-18) and Seattle (2019-c), is 43-33 with a 3.31 ERA (228 ER, 620.2 IP) with 640 strikeouts and 243 walks in 128 games (118 starts)...originally selected by Cleveland with the 31st overall pick in the 2014 MLB Draft out of Tullahoma (TN) High School.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: RHP JUSTIN DUNN (0-0, --- ERA)

24-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 1st start of the season tomorrow vs. Los Angeles-AL...**2019:** Made 4 abbreviated starts at the Major League level, allowing 2 earned runs over 6.2 innings pitched (2.70 ERA) with 5 strikeouts, 9 walks and 2 hits allowed...**vs. LAA:** Will be making his 1st career appearance vs. the Angels...**Arkansas Report:** Spent the season with AA Arkansas, going 9-5 with a 3.55 ERA (52 ER, 131.2 IP) with 158 strikeouts and 39 walks in 25 starts...was named a mid-season and post-season All-Star in the Texas League after he finished the year leading the Texas League in wins (9), strikeouts (158) and WHIP (1.19)...**Future:** Joined teammate Evan White and prospect Jarred Kelenic in Cleveland as members of the AL Futures Game roster; he struck out 1 batter in 1.0 scoreless inning in the game.
