TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin their first of three series (10 games total) against the Los Angeles Angeles tonight at Angel Stadium of Anaheim...following tonight's game, the Mariners will play two more in Anaheim on Wednesday and Thursday before heading to Seattle for the opening series against the Oakland A's: July 31-Aug. 3...tonight's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners begin their first series against the Angels...are playing their fourth (1-3) of 20 consecutive games to open the 2020 season...are next scheduled to have an off-day on Aug. 13.

- Young \& Old - third baseman Kyle Seager (32 years, 268 days) is the oldest player on the Mariners active roster...left-handed pitcher Nick Margevicius (24 years, 40 days) is the youngest player on the Mariners active roster.
-Rule 5 Looking Good - RHP Yohan Ramirez (5th pick) is one of 5 players selected in the Major League phase of the 2019 Rule 5 Draft to break Summer Camp with the big league team...Ramirez pitched in 2 games at Houston, whom Seattle selected him from, throwing 3.0 scoreless innings and striking out 4 without allowing a hit.
- International Game - the Mariners active roster is represented by four countries: Cuba (Nestor Cortes), Dominican Republic (Yohan Ramirez), Japan (Yusei Kikuchi), United States (27 players).
- 2019 in Review - Completed the 2019 season 68-94 (.420), finishing 5th in the American League West (39.0 games behind division-winner Houston)...went 35-46 (.432) at home and 33-48 (.407) on the road...were 23-26 in one-run games and 9-4 when games went to extra-innings.
J.P. OFF TO HOT START...J.P. Crawford has reached base safely in 9 of 17 plate appearances $(4 \mathrm{H}, 5$ BB)...in 4 games, he is 4 -for-12 (.333) with 3 runs, 1 double, 2 triples and 5 walks...his 5 walks are tied for 3rd-best in baseball, trailing only Atlanta's Freddie Freeman (6) and Philadelphia's Rhys Hoskins (7).
ALL ABOARD!...in yesterday's loss in Houston, the Mariners saw all 9 offensive players reach base safely (without including a player reaching via an error)...in Sunday's win, Seattle also had 9 players reach safely without the benefit of a defensive miscue, giving the Mariners back-to-back games with 9 players reaching base safely...in 2019, the Mariners had back-to-back games with such an offensive spread just twice: July 30-31 at TEX \& June 23-25 vs. BAL/at MIL.
WHITE NOTCHES HOMER No. 1 ...in what was his 4th game above Double-A, Evan White blasted a change-up from Astros starter Josh James an estimated 418 ft., with an estimated exit velocity of 106.5 MPH off the bat, according to Statcast... with the home run, White becomes the first Mariner of 2020 to record his first big league home run...in 2019, two Mariners collected their first career homer within their first 4 career games: Kyle Lewis (debut) and Tim Lopes (3rd game).
KYLE'S CLOSING IN...Kyle Seager is 1 run scored away from 600 in his career....he will become only the 6th player in franchise history to score at least 600 runs as a Mariner...he will join Edgar Martinez $(1,219)$, Ichiro Suzuki $(1,181)$, Ken Griffey Jr. $(1,113)$, Jay Buhner ( 790 ) and Alex Rodriguez (627) as the only Mariners players in club history with at least 600 runs scored.
- He also sits on 199 career home runs...with his next long-ball, he will become 1 of 4 Mariners in history to reach 200 career home runs (Hall of Famer Griffey Jr.-417, Hall of Famer Martinez-309, Buhner-307). - He enters with 1,223 career hits...needs 32 hits to tie Jay Buhner $(1,255)$ for 4 th in Mariners history.

MARINER MILESTONES ... with his RBI double in the first inning on Sunday, Kyle Seager surpassed Alvin Davis for the 4th-most RBI in club history with 668 career RBI...Hall of Famer Edgar Martinez $(1,261)$ holds the all-time club record, followed by Hall of Famer Ken Griffey Jr. $(1,216)$ and Jay Buhner ( 951 )...since his debut season of 2011, Seager ranks 7th among left-handed batters in RBI (668), 8th in doubles (271) and 8th in home runs (199).
ALL HANDS ON DECK...in the first four games of the season, the Mariners have used 28 players, including 16 pitchers...the only active players yet to appear in a game for the Mariners this season are Justin Dunn, Dylan Moore and Justus Sheffield.
YOUTH MOVEMENT ...the Mariners fielded the youngest Opening Day roster in the Majors with an average age of 27 years, 259 days (ages on 7/24)...ranked ahead of San Diego (27.349), Miami (28.017), Detroit (28.029) and Kansas City (28.047)...Seattle's roster includes just 5 players with at least 4 years of MLB service time and features 14 players with less than 1 year of MLB service.
WHO ARE THESE GUYS?...Dee Gordon and Marco Gonzales are the only players remaining on the Mariners active roster from the 2019 Opening Day lineup (Mitch Haniger is currently on the IL, and Kyle Seager was on the IL for Opening Day last season)...the Mariners did not return a position player from their Opening Day starting lineup in 2019 to 2020.
SUMMER CAMP RECAP...the Mariners played 12 intrasquad games at T-Mobile Park during Mariners Summer Camp...Kyle Lewis led the way on offense, batting . 435 (10x23) with 4 home runs, 7 RBI and 5 walks in 9 games...Justin Sheffield was a standout for the pitching staff, tossing 9.0 innings and allowing just 1 run (1.00 ERA) with no walks and 13 strikeouts over 3 outings.
IT'S A SPRINT....as part of its COVID-19 response, Major League Baseball has restructured the 2020 schedule to span only 60 games compared to the normal 162...the Mariners will face off against the AL West in 40 games and the NL West in 20 games... with the shorter season, each game in the 2020 season carries the equivalent weight of 2.7 regular season games in a typical MLB season...the trade deadline will take place on August 31.
AS YOU KNOW...Mariners first baseman Evan White cranked his first career home run in the 3rd inning yesterday off Astros starter Josh James... BUT DID YOU KNOW?...that he became the 125th player in franchise history to record his first career home run with the club...in 2019 alone, Seattle saw 6 players (Lewis, Court, Lopes, Nola, Long Jr. \& Moore) collect their first big league home runs, the most in a single season since 2011...the first Mariner to ever collect his first career home run with the club: Juan Bernhardt on April 10, 1977 vs. California, off left-handed pitcher Frank Tanana...only 2 teams in the American League have had more players record their first MLB homers since Seattle's inception in 1977: Houston-133 and Minnesota-130.

- Justus ("justice") Kane Sheffield...resides in Tullahoma, TN
- Acquired in trade from New York-AL along with Erik Swanson (rhp) and Dom Thompson-Williams (cf) in exchange for James Paxton (lhp) on Nov. 19, 2018.
- Has been a top-10 organizational prospect according to Baseball America since making his professional debut in 2014...entered the 2020 season as the Mariners No. 7 prospect (Baseball America).
- Made his Major League debut with the Yankees on Sept. 19, 2018 vs. Boston
- Has spent 6 minor league seasons in the Indians (2014-16), Yan kees (2016-18) and Mariners (2019-c) organizations...over his minor league career, has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 2.63 ( $640 \mathrm{~K}, 243 \mathrm{BB}$ ) while averaging 9.3 strikeouts-per-9.0-innings ( $640 \mathrm{~K}, 620.2 \mathrm{IP}$ ) and allowing only 0.70 home-runs-per-9.0-innings ( $48 \mathrm{HR}, 620.2 \mathrm{IP}$ ).
