**TONIGHT'S TILT**...the Mariners open up their final road trip of the first half with the 1st of 3 games at the Miami Marlins...Seattle will stay in the Sunshine State for 3 games at the Tampa Bay Rays to close out the first half...the Mariners are coming off a 5-1 homestand that saw a series sweep over the Los Angeles Angels (3-0) and a series win over the Toronto Blue Jays (2-1)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call with **Brad Adam** serving as sideline reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Angie Mentink** on the call.

**ODDS & ENDS**...the Mariners beat the Blue Jays on Sunday by a 4-0 final, their 7th shutout win of the season...Seattle is 32-12 when they score 4+ runs and 29-14 when their starter delivers a quality start.

- **Quality and Quantity** - Mariners starting pitchers have 43 quality starts this season, most in the American League and 2nd-most in the big leagues behind the Dodgers (51 QS).
- **High Waters** - With a win today, Seattle would reach their high-water mark of 4.0 games above .500 for the 3rd time this season (also: June 2 and June 9)...Seattle sits in first place in the American League West, 1.5 games ahead of the second place Texas Rangers (45-45).
- **Muñy Being Muñy** - Mariners closer **Andrés Muñoz** has been outstanding over his last 8 appearances, recording 6 saves without allowing a run over 8.0 IP, also recording an 11:3 strikeout-to-walk ratio.
- **Cole is Cruising** - In 22 games since June 11, **Cole Young** is batting .284 (23x81) with 13 runs, 3 doubles, 5 home runs, 10 RBI, 13 strikeouts, a .318 OBP and slugging .506 (.824 OPS).
- **A Good Time to Flip the Script** - Mariners starter **Bryan Woo** has been marvelous at home this season, holding a 2.10 ERA at T-Mobile Park, but struggled on the road, holding a 6.38 ERA in 9 road starts...in his career, he holds a 1.50 ERA (5 ER, 30.0 IP) with 5 walks and 31 strikeouts against NL East opponents and will face the Marlins for the first time in tonight's game.
- **Dynamic Duo Sets Sights on Futures Game** - LHP **Kade Anderson** and RHP **Ryan Sloan** were both named to the All-Star Futures Game roster, set for Sunday, July 12 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia.

**HOW ABOUT THAT PITCHING?**...Mariners pitching was excellent on the homestand, tossing 3 shutouts and not allowing more than 3 runs in any game...the starters recorded a quality start in each of the 6 games, combining to go 5-1 with a 1.30 ERA (6 ER, 41.2 IP), 5 walks, 36 strikeouts, a 0.62 WHIP and holding opponents to a .143 average...during that span (6/29-c), Mariners starters lead MLB in ERA, WHIP, Opp. AVG and fWAR (1.6)...Mariners relievers over the 6 games combined for a 0.73 ERA (1 ER, 12.1 IP), the lowest in MLB during that span...overall this season, the Mariners starters have a 3.55 ERA (5th in MLB and 3rd in the AL), while they rank among the MLB leaders in WHIP (1st, 1.07), BB% (1st, 5.5%), SO/BB (1st, 4.43), K% (4th, 24.5%), Opp. AVG (6th, .226) and fWAR (T-1st, 10.9)...Mariners relievers rank 5th in MLB and 3rd in the AL with a 3.54 ERA this season.

**ARAZARENA NAMED AMERICAN LEAGUE ALL-STAR**...MLB announced Saturday that outfielder **Randy Arozarena** was selected to the American League roster for the 2026 MLB All-Star Game on July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia...Arozarena is batting .286 (87x304) with 55 runs, 21 doubles, 1 triple, 9 home runs, 41 RBI, 32 walks and 19 stolen bases, getting on base at a .375 clip, slugging .451 with an .826 OPS in 83 games this season...he is a three-time All-Star (2023, '25-'26) and has made the Midsummer Classic in each of the last two seasons with Seattle...he is the 15th player in Mariners history to make multiple All-Star teams with the club, joining Ken Griffey Jr. (10x), Ichiro Suzuki (10x), Edgar Martinez (7x), Félix Hernández (6x), Randy Johnson (5x), Alex Rodríguez (4x), Robinson Canó (3x), Nelson Cruz (3x), **Julio Rodríguez** (3x), Bret Boone (2x), Freddy García (2x), **Andrés Muñoz** (2x), Harold Reynolds (2x) and Kazuhiro Sasaki (2x)...Randy is one of two players with 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases in each of the last five seasons (2021-25), along with Cleveland's José Ramírez.

**WALTER IS TAKING OVER**...Mariners starting pitcher **Logan Gilbert** has dominated over his last 8 starts (5/22-c), going 5-1 with a 1.78 ERA (10 ER, 50.2 IP) with 57 strikeouts and 10 walks...during that span he ranks 2nd in MLB in fWAR (1.8), trailing only Jacob deGrom (2.0) while ranking among the leaders in ERA (5th), WHIP (3rd), K% (5th, 30.3%) and Opp. AVG (2nd, .150).

**THE BUCKEYE BRUISER**...over his last 31 games (5/25-c), **Dominic Canzone** is batting .316 (30x95) with 17 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 18 RBI and 10 walks, getting on base at a .387 clip, slugging .695 with a 1.082 OPS...overall this season, Canzone is batting .273 (56x205) with 32 runs, 13 doubles, 1 triple, 14 home runs, 37 RBI, a .349 OBP and slugging .551 for an .900 OPS and 155 OPS+...his 14 home runs are tied with **Luke Raley** and **Julio Rodríguez** for the team lead, while his 155 OPS+ ranks 7th in MLB among players with at least 200 plate appearances.

**TEX'S HOLD 'EM**...in 9 appearances (8 starts) this season, **Bryce Miller** has posted a 1.71 ERA (10 ER, 52.2 IP) with 62 strikeouts and just 5 walks allowed...he leads all Major League pitchers (min. 50.0 IP) in strikeout-to-walk ratio (12.40), 1st in WHIP (0.66) and ranks 1st in walk rate (2.7%)...he also ranks 2nd in ERA, 2nd in opponent batting average (.165), and 3rd in strikeout rate (33.2%).

**AS YOU MAY KNOW**...the Mariners have recorded back-to-back shutout wins and have not allowed a run over their last 24.0 innings, and...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW?**...that the last time the Mariners recorded back-to-back shutouts was Sept. 18-19, 2025, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that the Mariners have tossed 3-consecutive shutouts only once in their history, July 4-6, 2025, with that streak starting exactly a year prior to the current streak?...the Mariners longest scoreless streak of 33.0 IP also occurred last season, from July 3-8.

- **1994** - Randy Johnson becomes Mariners' all-time leader in wins with #75 at Boston passing Mark Langston.
- **2000** - Rickey Henderson moves into 2nd place all-time with 2,020 walks surpassing Ted Williams.
- **2009** - Ken Griffey Jr. hit his 514th career double, tying Edgar Martinez for 39th on the all-time list.
- **2011** - Kyle Seager made his Major League debut at Los Angeles-AL.
- **2014** - Kyle Seager is named to the American League All-Star team.
- **2015** - Robinson Canó records his first walk-off hit since Aug. 28, 2009 with an RBI-single to give the Mariners a 7-6 win over the Tigers in 11 innings.
- **2017** - Nelson Cruz hit his 300th career home run, a 3-run shot in the 8th inning.
- **2023** - Mariners host first-ever HBCU Swingman Classic at T-Mobile Park to kick off All-Star Week.
- **2024** - **Logan Gilbert** named to his first career All-Star game.

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 18th start of the season and his 88th career start...is also making his 1st career start against the Marlins.

LAST TIME OUT...W#7 vs. Angels on June 30...threw 6.1 innings and allowed 2 runs (2 ER) on 4 hits and 1 walk with 5 strikeouts...

he threw a career-high 106 pitches (71 strikes) in his 8th home start of the season...he has thrown 6.0+ innings in all 8 of his home starts this season and in 21 home starts since 2025, most in MLB across that span.

THE STREAK!...set a franchise record of 32.0 consecutive scoreless innings at T-Mobile Park (5/6-6/30), surpassing 30.0 IP by both Félix Hernández (2010) and Jamie Moyer (2002)...Woo's scoreless streak was snapped in the 7th inning.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES...is making his first career start against the Miami Marlins...the Marlins are 1 of 5 teams Woo has yet to face (also: CHC, COL, MIL and SEA)...is also making his first career appearance at loanDepot park which is 1 of 6 ballparks Woo has yet to play at (also: ATL, CHC, COL, MIL, and PHI)...

VS. NL EAST...is 2-1 with a 1.50 ERA (5 ER, 30.0 IP), 0.93 WHIP, and 31 strikeouts to 5 walks allowed across 5 career starts against NL East teams...his 1.50 ERA against NL East teams is tied for the 2nd-lowest in MLB since 2023 (min. 5 GS), alongside Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD, and trailing Shohei Ohtani-LAA/LAD (0.87)...

NEARING 500 x 2...is approaching both 500 career innings (495.0 IP) and 500 career strikeouts (489 SO)...would become the 19th pitcher in Mariners history to record 500+ career innings and 500+ career strikeouts with the club, joining teammates Logan Gilbert, George Kirby, and Luis Castillo.

COMMANDING THE ZONE...is 1 of 4 pitchers with 450+ strikeouts and fewer than 100 walks allowed since 2023 (489 SO, 99 BB), joining teammate George Kirby (579 SO, 95 BB), Tarik Skubal-DET (646 SO, 90 BB), and Paul Skenes-PIT (505 SO, 96 BB).

WATCH ME WHIP...his 0.99 career WHIP is tied for 5th-best in MLB among qualified pitchers since 2023, alongside Zack Wheeler-PHI and Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD and trails Tarik Skubal-DET (0.91), Jacob DeGrom-TEX (0.93), Paul Skenes-PIT (0.96) and Logan Gilbert (0.98)...

FEW FREE PASSES...among qualified pitchers since 2025, he ranks 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.36), 2nd in walks-per-nine (1.73), and 2nd in walk percentage (4.9%)...in addition, he has tossed 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer walks in 12 of his 17 starts this season and in 39 total starts since 2025, which leads MLB across that span.

KEEP OFF MY BASE PATHS...has thrown 7.0+ IP with 4-or-fewer baserunners allowed in 8 career games, including 3 times this season (last: 6/18 vs. BAL)...his 3 such games this season are 2nd-most in MLB trailing only Reid Detmers-LAA (4) while Woo's 7 such games since 2025 are tied for most in MLB (also: Jacob DeGrom-TEX, Kevin Gausman-TOR, and Tarik Skubal-DET)...

ONE-HIT WONDERS...has tossed 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits in 2 starts this season (4/3 at LAA and 5/6 vs. ATL) and in 5 total starts since 2025, tied for the most such games in MLB across that span (also: Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD)...

GOING THE DISTANCE...has thrown 6.0+ innings in 12 of his 17 starts this season and in 56 career starts...his 39 starts of 6.0+ IP since 2025 are most in MLB while his 286.0 IP since 2025 are 8th-most in MLB...has also thrown 10 quality starts this season and 31 total QS since 2025, most in the American League and 3rd-most in MLB across that span...

SHUTTING THINGS DOWN...has thrown 7.0+ IP without an earned run allowed in 3 games this season (last: 6/18 vs. BAL)...has recorded 6.0+ innings without an earned run in 5 starts this season, 3rd-most in MLB...Woo's 10 such starts since last season are tied for 7th-most in MLB while his 16 such starts across his career are T-11th-most in franchise history.

WOO HOLDS THE TRIDENT...his 3.40 career ERA (187 ER, 495.0 IP) is a franchise-best mark among Mariners starters (min. 75 GS), ranking ahead of Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA...also ranks 1st in WHIP (0.990).

IT'S BEEN DECIDED...has factored into the decision in each of his last 10 consecutive starts (5/6-c), going 6-4 across the 10-game stretch...it's his longest streak of decisions across his career and the longest by a Mariners pitcher since George Kirby's 10 consecutive starts from June 25-Aug. 17, 2025 (7-3).

FEAR THE FOUR-SEAMER...his four-seam fastball has been his most used pitch over his career (48.6% usage in 2026, 47.8% across his career)...among right-handed pitchers this season, his 102 swings and misses on his four-seamer rank 5th-most in MLB while his 560 whiffs on his four-seamer across his career also ranks 5th (Luis Castillo leads MLB with 754 whiffs on his four-seamer since 2023).

DOMINATING THE ZONE...ranks 2nd among qualified pitchers in first-pitch strike percentage (69.2%), trailing only Logan Gilbert (69.8%)...owns a 68.2% first-pitch strike percentage across his career which ranks 3rd in MLB among qualified pitchers, trails Miles Mikolas (69.0%) and Tarik Skubal (68.7%).
