TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 6-game road trip with the last of 3 games at the Texas Rangers (2-0)...following today's series finale, Seattle will travel to face the Athletics (3 G, 5/5-5/7) to finish off the trip...the Mariners are coming off a 5-game homestand (4-1) against the Miami Marlins (2-1) and Los Angeles Angels (2-0)...today's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith**, **Angie Mentink** and Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** on the call, with **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and Mariners.com with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners beat the Rangers by a 2-1 final in last night's game, winning their season-high 6th-consecutive game...Seattle is 7-2 over its last 9 games, 10-2 over its last 12 games, 12-3 over its last 15 games, and 16-4 over its last 20 games...the Mariners have the best record in the American League and sit 3.0 games ahead of the Astros and Athletics for the AL West lead.

- **Yard Card** - The Mariners are 19-8 (.704) in games when hitting a home run, and 1-4 (.200) when they do not homer...their lone win without homering came on April 24 at Boston (W 4-3).
- **Sweep Me Off My Feet** - Seattle goes for its 3rd sweep of the season in today's finale...they swept the Rangers in 3 games at home from April 11-13 and the Angels in 2 games from April 29-30.
- **Raving About Rivas** - infielder **Leo Rivas** is batting .382 (13x34) with 9 runs, 1 double, 3 RBI and 9 walks with a .512 OBP and a .924 OPS in 15 games this season...his .512 OBP ranks 3rd in MLB, trailing only Aaron Judge-NYY (.520) and Carson Kelly-CHC (.513).

SEVEN, EIGHT, NINE?...the Mariners have won 8 consecutive series for the first time since June 21-July 17, 2022...on their current run, they have series wins at home against the Astros (2-1), Rangers (3-0), Marlins (2-1) and Angels (2-0), and road series wins at the Reds (2-1), Blue Jays (2-1), Red Sox (2-1) and Rangers (2-0)...in their next series against the Athletics, the Mariners will go for their first 9+ series winning streak since they won a franchise record 15-straight from July 27-Sept. 18, 2001.

ANDRÉS MUÑOZ: AL RELIEVER OF THE MONTH...**Andrés Muñoz** was named American League Reliever of the Month for March/April on Friday...it is the 2nd AL Reliever of the Month award of his career (also: August 2023)...Muñoz leads the AL with 12 saves and is 12-for-12 in save opportunities...in 15 appearances, the right-hander is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 15.0 IP) with 7 walks (2 intentional) and 20 strikeouts...he has not allowed a run this season, tying the Mariners record for most consecutive scoreless appearances to begin a season (also: Marc Rzepczynski in 2017)...Muñoz has a 0.75 WHIP, 11.3 strikeouts-per-9 innings rate and has limited opposing hitters to a .100 batting average (5x50).

A TOP RANKED OFFENSE...the Mariners offense has a .770 OPS and 131 OPS+ this season, ranking 4th and 2nd in MLB in those categories, respectively...Mariners hitters also rank 4th in runs-per-game (5.2), 4th in home runs (49), T-6th in stolen bases (37), 2nd in on-base percentage (.339), 5th in slugging percentage (.426), 1st in walks (139) and 2nd in hit-by-pitches (20)...Seattle also ranks T-6th in the Majors in hard-hit percentage (42.5%) and 2nd in barrel rate (7.6%).

JORGE POLANCO: HOTTER THAN THE SUN...**Jorge Polanco** is the reigning American League Player of the Week (April 21-27) and is batting .395 (30x76) with 14 runs, 5 doubles, 9 home runs and 25 RBI, getting on base at a .434 clip and slugging .816 (1.250 OPS) in 24 games...he is tied for 6th in MLB in home runs, while his 1.250 OPS trails only Aaron Judge-NYY (1.312) among players with at least 80 PA this season.

J.P. HITS-A-LOT...shortstop **J.P. Crawford** hit his 13th career leadoff home run in yesterday's game, extending his current hitting streak to 11 games (4/19-c), 1 shy of tying his career-best (12 G, June 13-26, 2021)...during the streak, the Mariners shortstop is hitting .386 (17x44) with 9 runs, 1 double, 3 home runs, 13 RBI and 6 walks, getting on base at a .460 clip, slugging .614 with a 1.074 OPS and 6 multi-hit games...overall this season, J.P. is hitting .287 (29x101) with 17 runs, 3 doubles, 3 homers, 17 RBI and 20 walks with a .410 on-base percentage and .816 OPS...his .410 OBP ranks 6th in MLB and 3rd in the AL.

CAL KEEPS CRUSHING...**Cal Raleigh** went 2-for-3 with a double and a walk in last night's game...Cal leads the Majors with 12 home runs, ahead of Aaron Judge-NYY (11)...Cal has homered 5 times against the Texas Rangers this season, including homering in each of his first 4 games, batting .471 (8x17) with 10 RBI and a 2.042 OPS...Cal's 5 homers against the Rangers this season are tied for the most by any player against any single opponent (also: Eugenio Suárez-ARI against the Cubs)...overall this season, Cal is batting .252 (31x123) with 21 runs, 7 doubles, 12 home runs, 23 RBI, 19 walks and 4 stolen bases, getting on base at a .361 clip and slugging .602 (.963 OPS).

MOON WALK...the Mariners lead the Majors with 139 base on balls as a team this season, outranking the Cubs (135) and Diamondbacks (131) and Red Sox (131)...**Randy Arozarena** paces the club with 22 walks, followed by **J.P. Crawford** (20), **Cal Raleigh** (19) and **Julio Rodríguez** (15)...Randy's 22 walks are 2nd-most in the AL trailing Rafael Devers-BOS (25)...Seattle is currently sporting a MLB leading 11.1% walk rate, trailing only the 2000 Mariners (12.0%) for highest in franchise history.

EVERYBODY IS CONTRIBUTING...Seattle has 10 players with at least 30 plate appearances and an OPS+ of 100 or better (100 is league average), the most in the Majors ahead of 4 teams tied with 8 players...**Jorge Polanco** (266), **Cal Raleigh** (184), **Leo Rivas** (183), **Dylan Moore** (167), **J.P. Crawford** (147), **Randy Arozarena** (136), **Mitch Garver** (116), **Julio Rodríguez** (108), **Rowdy Tellez** (107) and **Luke Raley** (103) make up the 10 players, while **Ben Williamson** (94) is right on the cusp.

RANDY EXTENDS ON-BASE STREAK TO 27 GAMES...**Randy Arozarena** went 2-for-4 in last night's win, and has now reached base in a career-high 27 consecutive contests (3/31-c)...the streak is the 3rd-longest active streak in MLB, trailing only Kyle Schwarber-PHI (39 G) and Aaron Judge-NYY (29 G)...it is the longest streak by a Mariner since Teoscar Hernández reached safely in 30-consecutive games (Aug. 18-Sept. 16, 2023)...during the streak, Randy has 7 doubles, 4 home runs, 17 RBI, 19 walks and 8 stolen bases, getting on base at a .379 clip, slugging .426 with a .805 OPS.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Rowdy Tellez** drove in the eventual game-winning run in the 9th inning of last night's win, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that the Mariners are tied with Cleveland for the MLB lead with 7 go-ahead or game-tying RBI in the 9th inning or later?...Seattle is also tied for the MLB lead with 15 go-ahead or game-tying RBI in the 7th inning or later with the Phillies...9 different Mariners hitters make up the 15 RBI: **Randy Arozarena** (5), **J.P. Crawford** (2), **Jorge Polanco** (2), **Luke Raley** (1), **Cal Raleigh** (1), **Julio Rodríguez** (1), **Victor Robles** (1), **Ben Williamson** (1) and Tellez (1).

ABOUT LOGAN EVANS...

- The 23-year old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 2nd career Major League start in tonight's game against Texas, and his 1st career start against the Rangers.
- Evans was selected by the Mariners in the 12th round of the 2023 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Pittsburgh.
- Spent 2 seasons at Penn State University, 2020-21, before transferring to the University of Pittsburgh, 2022-23.
- Was born in Ann Arbor, Michigan and attended Saline High School (MI).

LAST TIME OUT...W#1 on 4/27 vs. Miami, he threw 5.0 innings pitched, giving up 2 runs on 2 hits (1 HR), with 3 strikeouts against 3 walks.

MAKING A STATEMENT...became the 9th pitcher in Mariners history to allow 2 or fewer hits with 5.0+ innings of work in his Major League debut, also joining fellow teammates **Emerson Hancock** (8/9/23 vs. SD) and **Bryce Miller** (5/2/23 at OAK).

DEBUTANTS...was the 3rd Mariners player to make his Major League debut this season, joining **Ben Williamson** (April 15 at Cincinnati) and **Sauryn Lao** (April 21 at Boston)...he was also the 48th pitcher in franchise history to start his MLB debut and first since **Emerson Hancock** (August 9, 2023 vs. San Diego)...he was also the youngest starting pitcher to make his MLB debut at home for the Mariners (23 years, 325 days), since Andrew Moore (23 years, 10 days) on June 22, 2017 vs. DET.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH...the 6-foot-4 right-hander earned Pacific Coast League Player of the Week honors on April 14 after tossing 6.0 innings allowing just 1 run on 2 hits and no walks with a season-high 7 strikeouts on April 9 against Sacramento.

PROSPECT WATCH...was the Mariners top pitching prospect entering the season, and 8th overall in the Mariners system by *Baseball America*...he is also ranked as the No. 10 Mariners prospect (*MLB Pipeline*).

MAYNIFICENT PERFORMANCE...in 5 starts last season during May for Arkansas last season, Evans threw 5.0+ innings pitched in all of his starts, compiling a 4-1 record, a .063 ERA (2 ER, 28.2 IP), .163 AVG against, 0.70 WHIP, with 33 strikeouts against 4 walks...was named both Mariners Minor League Co-Pitcher of the Month and Texas League Pitcher of the Month for his efforts.

TIME WITH THE TRAVS...was 9-5 with a 3.20 ERA (38 ER, 107.0 IP), 42 walks and 98 strikeouts in 32 games (22 starts) with Double-A Arkansas last season...in 10 starts before his transition to a reliever, he was 5-2 with a 1.23 ERA (7 ER, 51.1 IP), 15 walks and 47 strikeouts...he made 10 appearances as a reliever from June 4-30 before transitioning back to a starter.

CAREER STATS...has appeared in 3 minor league seasons going 11-6 with a 3.05 ERA (50 ER, 147.2 IP), 48 walks, 136 strikeouts and a 1.15 WHIP in 42 games (32 starts)...he has made 5 starts for Triple-A Tacoma this season, going 1-1 with a 3.05 ERA (11 ER, 25.2 IP), 4 walks, 23 strikeouts and a 1.25 WHIP.

SIMILAR FOOTSTEPS...is set to become the 7th pitcher in Mariners history drafted in the 10th round or later to start their MLB debut (does not include non-drafted players), joining: Bob Stoddard (10th round), Joel Piñeiro (12th), Jim Converse (16th), Anthony Vasquez (18th), Brandon Maurer (23rd), and George Glinatsis (32nd).

PANTHERS IN THE MLB...is set to become the only University of Pittsburgh Panther to appear in the Majors this season...he will also be the 19th pitcher in program history to play in MLB, and only the 2nd pitcher to make a start since the 2000 season.

AWARDED... was named Texas League Pitcher of the Week on Aug. 11, 2024 after tossing 6.0 perfect innings with 7 strikeouts on Aug. 9 vs. Tulsa.

HIGHS...during his minor league career, struck out a career-high 9 batters twice (5/4/24 vs. San Antonio and 9/25/24 vs. Midland, both w/ Double-A Arkansas)...has tossed a career-high 6.0 innings 8 times (last: 4/9/25 vs. Sacramento w/ Triple-A Tacoma).
