## SPRING SNAKEBITES

- ◆ **Ketel Marte** makes his first Spring start tonight since returning from WBC play with Team Dominican Republic.
- ◆ **Corbin Carroll** makes his fifth start at DH tonight...hit his first homer on Wednesday vs. Cubs.
- ◆ **Gabriel Moreno** made his first start at DH last night since his late scratch the previous Friday with inflammation in his right elbow (0-1, 3 BB).
- ◆ **Nolan Arenado**, **Geraldo Perdomo** and **Carlos Santana** tonight make their second Spring starts since returning from WBC play... WBC champion, **Eduardo Rodriguez**, returned to camp today.
- ◆ **Alek Thomas** is hitting .364 (8-for-22)/1.167 OPS with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 homer and 5 RBI in 8 games.
- ◆ **Nolan Arenado** is batting .444 (4-for-9)/1.682 OPS with 3 doubles, 1 homer and 5 RBI in 6 games.
- ◆ **Geraldo Perdomo** is batting .412 (7-for-17)/.915 OPS with 1 double and 1 walk in 6 games.
- ◆ **Jordan Lawlar** has hit safely in 7 of his last 8 games...has made 12 starts in center field and 1 in left.

## YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ◆ The D-backs lost 4-2 @ White Sox last night.
  - **Michael Soroka** tossed 5.0 scoreless innings with 8 strikeouts in his first Spring start since returning from WBC play with Canada.
  - **Gabriel Moreno** made his first start at DH since his scratch the previous Friday (right elbow inflammation) and drew 3 walks.
  - **Jorge Barrosa** went 2-for-3 with 1 double and 1 walk...is batting .324 (12-for-37)/1.066 OPS with 3 doubles, 2 triples, 2 homers and 8 RBI over 13 games.
  - **Pavin Smith** made his first start at first base since March 11 and had an RBI-single...was held out with left forearm tightness.
  - **Jacob Amaya** went 2-for-3 with 1 walk...is 8-for-13 (.615) with 1 homer and 5 RBI in his last 4 games.

## TWO SPECIAL FANS TO TAKE CENTER STAGE AT HOME OPENER

- ◆ The D-backs home opener on March 30 vs. Tigers features 2 special fans who were personally invited from D-backs President, CEO & General Partner, Derrick Hall:
  - Throwing out the ceremonial first pitch will be **Beauden Baumkirchner**, who, at just 3 years old, developed a rare and aggressive staph infection that led to septic shock and months in intensive care and underwent more than 20 surgeries, including the amputation of both legs...in January, he visited MLB Network with Challenged Athletes Foundation, which included a FaceTime with **Corbin Carroll**...today, he plays baseball at Lake Havasu Little League using prosthetic legs, continuing to inspire those around him.
  - Performing the National Anthem will be **Joe Giacinto**, an Arizona clarinetist born blind and autistic...completely self-taught, he learns and performs music entirely by ear and has memorized hundreds of pieces, and dreams of performing alongside Andrea Bocelli.

## CAMP UPDATES

- ◆ Camp roster currently has 37 players (5 non-roster invitees): 19 pitchers (3), 4 catchers (1), 10 infielders (2) and 4 outfielders.
- ◆ **Gabriel Moreno** played his first game on Thursday since his late scratch the previous Friday (right forearm tightness).
- ◆ **Pavin Smith** played his first game on Thursday since being listed day-to-day with left forearm tightness.
- ◆ **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** has yet to make his Spring debut but continues to get at-bats during back-field work.

## VETERAN SNAKES

- ◆ **Ketel Marte** (since 2017) becomes just the second D-back to play 10 seasons, joining Nick Ahmed (2014-23).
- ◆ Among D-back pitchers all-time, **Zac Gallen**, **Merrill Kelly** and **Kevin Ginkel** enter their franchise-record-tying eighth season with Randy Johnson (1999-2004, '07-08) and Andrew Chafin (2014-20, '23).
- ◆ **Torey Lovullo** enters as the winningest and longest-tenured skipper in franchise history, and his 10th season as Manager as only the second manager/head coach in Phoenix professional sports history to reach double-digits (Cardinals, Coyotes, Mercury, Suns), joining the Suns' John MacLeod (14 seasons, 1974-87).

- ◆ **Torey Lovullo** returns 9 coaches and added 1 new coach...returnees: **Jeff Banister** (bench coach, fifth season), **Dave McKay** (first base coach, 13th season), **Joe Mather** (hitting coach, fifth season), **Damion Easley** (assistant hitting coach, fifth season), **Brian Kaplan** (pitching coach, second season), **Wellington Cepeda** (bullpen coach, second season), **Travis Denker** (assistant hitting coach, second season), **Owen Dew** (assistant pitching coach, second season) and **Shaun Larkin** (infield coach, second season...new coach: **J.R. House** (third base & catching coach) rejoins the organization (previously 2012-18 in player development).

**STARTING PITCHER**

**No. 23 - RHP Zac Gallen**

- Agreed to terms on a 1-year contract on Feb. 15 and returns for his eighth season with Arizona.
- Will become 1 of 12 players (also: Merrill Kelly, Kevin Ginkel this season) to play 8+ seasons with the club and tie the franchise-record 8 seasons for a pitcher (also: Randy Johnson, Andrew Chafin).
- In 2025, went 13-15 with a 4.83 ERA (103 ER in 192.0 IP), opponent .239 AVG, 66 walks and 175 strikeouts in 33 starts (15 quality).
- Is 1 of 2 pitchers in MLB since 2022 to win 12+ games and record 150+ strikeouts in each of the last 4 seasons (also: Framber Valdez).
- With 10+ wins in his previous 4 seasons, is 1 of 4 D-backs to accomplish the feat with Randy Johnson (1999-2002), Brandon Webb (2005-08) and Zack Greinke (2016-19).
- Among NL starters since 2022 [min. 80 GS], ranks in the top 3 in wins (1st, 56), innings (2nd, 734.0), strikeouts (3rd, 743), starts (3rd, 126), win pct. (3rd, .622) and quality starts (3rd, 66).

**ADDITIONAL PITCHERS**

**No. 50 - LHP Philip Abner**

- In 2025, over 5 games in his first season with Arizona, went 0-0 with a 4.91 ERA (2 ER in 3.2 IP), 3 walks and 5 strikeouts...selected from Triple-A Reno on Sept. 18...made his debut on Sept. 19 vs. Phillies, becoming the first call-up from the D-backs' 2023 First-Year Player Draft class.
- Played across 3 levels last season, going a combined 3-2 with 7 saves, a 3.07 ERA (20 ER in 58.2 IP), opponent .216 AVG, 16 walks and 70 strikeouts in 53 games between Triple-A Reno (8 G), Double-A Amarillo (34 G) and High-A Hillsboro (11 G).
- Spent majority of last season with Amarillo, going 3-1 with 1 save, a 4.21 ERA (17 ER in 36.1 IP), 7 walks and 42 strikeouts in 34 games.

**No. 37 - RHP Kevin Ginkel**

- In 2025 was limited to 29 games due to 2 stints on the IL...went 1-4 with 3 saves, a 7.36 ERA (21 ER in 25.2 IP) and 29 strikeouts.
- In his final 23 games from May 13-Aug. 2, held lefties to a .133 AVG (4-for-30) with 0 extra-base hits, 3 walks and 13 strikeouts.
- Did not allow a homer to a right-handed batter in 29 straight games (72 BF) last season...extended his streak to 34 (82 BF) dating back to Sept. 20, 2024.
- Against his slider (42.6% usage), opponents hit .200 (9-for-45) with no homers and a 42.2% whiff.

- Acquired from the Royals for OF Randal Grichuk on July 26 and optioned to Triple-A Reno.
- Made his MLB debut last season on May 30 vs. Tigers with the Royals (2.0 IP)...in 3 games over 2 stints with the Royals, went 0-0 with a 3.86 ERA (2 ER in 4.2 IP), 4 walks and 5 strikeouts.
- In 32 games with Triple-A Omaha (Royals) last season, went 3-3 with 2 saves, a 2.25 ERA (10 ER in 40.0 IP), opponent .230 AVG, 10 walks and 55 strikeouts.

- His 35.1 chase pct. last season ranked fourth among NL relievers [min. 100 BF], behind Graham Ashcraft/CIN (37.9), Tanner Scott/LAD (35.7) and Shelby Miller/AZ-MIL (35.7).
- Did not allow a home run in 30 consecutive games (24.0 IP) last season from May 19-Sept. 26.
- Did not allow a run in a season-high 10 straight games (8.1 IP) from June 17-Sept. 5, going 1-0 with 5 walks and 6 strikeouts.
