METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets dropped the second game of their four-game series with the Marlins, 5-2...The have still won four of their last six games and are 7-7 since the All-Star break...Suffered their first loss at Citi Field to Miami this season...Overall, are 4-4 against the Marlins this season...Were held to two or fewer runs for the 41st time this season...Are the most such games in the NL and tied for the second-most games in the majors this season.... The Mets are in the midst of a 10-game homestand (4-4) against the Dodgers (1-2), Braves (2-1) and Marlins (1-1)...The Mets are off on Monday and then start a nine-game road trip against the Guardians (three games).

CELEBRATE LIKE IT'S 1986: This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions..The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title today.

MEET THE 1986 METS: Today, the Mets will hold a press conference at 2:30 PM with members of the 1986 Mets including Jesse Orosco, Roger McDowell, Mookie Wilson and Sid Fernandez.

IF YOU START ME OFF: Mets starters have recorded a quality start in six of their last eight appearances...The rotation's eight quality starts since the All-Star Break are tied with Kansas City and Chicago-NL for the most in the majors...The staff's 3.00 ERA (41 ER/123.0 IP) since the All-Star Break is the second-lowest mark in the NL and the third-lowest mark in the majors.

A.J. STYLES: A.J. Ewing plated one with an RBI single in the fifth inning last night...He has recorded a hit in 10 of his last 14 games and collected an RBI in three of his last four contests...His 25 hits in July are the second-most by an NL rookie, only trailing teammate Carson Benge.

LINSANITY: Yesterday, Francisco Lindor launched a solo home run to right field in the seventh inning to cut the Mets' deficit to 5-2...Also drew a walk and singled in the fifth...Has reached base in 10 of his last 12 games dating back to July 19...Over that span, he is slashing .333/.444/.689 (15-45) with two doubles, one triple, four homers, 13 RBI, nine walks and a 1.133 OPS...Reached base at least three times for the ninth time this season and four of those instances have occurred over his last 12 games.

150: Lindor recorded his 150th home runs as a Met...Moves past Carlos Beltran for sole possession of seventh on the Mets all-time home run list...Reached the milestone in 812 games, which is the fourth-fastest to reach the mark in franchise history...Only Pete Alonso, Mike Piazza and Darryl Strawberry reached 150 home runs faster.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won four of their last five against the Fish at Citi Field...Overall, the Mets are 92-61 against the Marlins since the yard opened in 2009.

WHAT A RELIEF: The pen's 2.11 ERA (11 ER/47.0 IP) ERA in the second half of the season is the lowest mark in the NL and the fourth-lowest in the majors.

BLAME IT ON THE BENGE: Carson Benge doubled in the fourth inning and singled in the sixth and eighth innings yesterday...Marked his eighth three-hit effort of the season...His eight three-hit games are tied for the sixth-most by a Met through their first 106 career games...Has hit safely in eight of his last 10 games, including three multi-hit games...During July, he has slashed .302/.371/.430 (26-86) with 11 runs, five doubles, two home runs and nine RBI...His 26 hits in July are the most by an NL rookie.

DREAM WEAVER: Luke Weaver fired a scoreless eighth inning in game one of the twinbill on Wednesday..He is unscored upon over his last 11 outings at Citi Field (12.1 IP)...Is unscored upon in 27 of his last 29 outings dating back to May 1 (31.0 IP) and has allowed only one earned run during that span...Is the only relief pitcher in the majors to allow one run and pitch at least 25.0 innings since May.

IN THE CITI: The Mets have won four of their last six home games...They have gone 7-14 over their last 21 games at Citi Field after starting the season 18-18 at home...They are now 25-32 at home this year...The team has posted a 4.12 ERA, while batting .234/.311/.384 at Citi Field.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in the midst of seven straight games against the NL East...They are 3-2 in that span...The Mets are 17-17 against the division this year...They have posted a 4.30 ERA, while batting .247/.320/.408.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Right-hander R.J. Gordon recorded seven strikeouts over 7.0 innings in the start, but the Binghamton Rumble Ponies (9-21, 36-63) fell to the Reading Fightin Phils, 6-5, in walk-off fashion on Friday night at FirstEnergy Stadium...In two minor league seasons, Gordon is 12-11 with a 4.48 ERA, 73 walks and 203 strikeouts.

NEW SKIPPER: Andy Green has been named Interim Manager for the remainder of the 2026 season...Green, who joined the Mets organization in 2023 and previously served as Senior Vice President, Baseball Development, managed the San Diego Padres from 2016-19, guiding the club to a 274-366 (.428) record...The 48-year-old played parts of four Major League seasons with the Diamondbacks (2004-06) and appeared in four games with the Mets in 2009...He will wear #70...The Mets are 12-17 since Green took the helm.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his second straight win after tossing 6.1 innings and allowing three runs on July 27 vs. Atlanta (6.1 IP, 6 H, 3 ER, BB, 5 K, HR)...He has completed at least 6.0 innings in each of his last four starts...He joins Nolan McLean as the only other Met who has made at least four consecutive starts of at least 6.0 innings this season.

ZAC ATTACK: Through five career starts, he is 2-1 with a 2.43 ERA (8 ER/29.2 IP) and is holding opposing batters to a .196 (20-102) average...His ERA is the seventh-best in franchise history through a pitcher's first five career starts and is the third-best mark by a left-hander...He is only trailing Nolan McLean (1.42 ERA, 2025), Steven Matz (1.80 ERA, 2015), Mike Bruher (1.82 ERA, 1978), Tom Seaver (1.91 ERA, 1867), Dillon Gee (2.18 ERA, 2010) and Jason Jacome (2.38 ERA, 1994)...Has only allowed 20 hits through his first five starts...His 20 hits allowed are tied for the fewest by a Mets starter through their first five games with Nolan McLean (min. 29.0 IP)...Has completed 6.0 innings and allowed three or fewer runs in each of his last four starts...He is one of eight pitchers in franchise history to do so in at least four of their first five career starts.

GOOSE EGGS: After allowing a run in the first inning on June 26 vs. Philadelphia, each of Thornton's next 18.0 innings were scoreless until the first inning of his start on July 27 vs. Atlanta... His 18.0 consecutive scoreless innings were the longest such streak in franchise history by a rookie starting pitcher since Steven Matz fired 19.0 scoreless innings from May 20-31, 2016...He is one of 11 rookie starters in franchise history with a streak as long...The longest scoreless streak by a Mets rookie starting pitcher in franchise history is 25.0 innings from Jon Maine from July 21-August 12, 2006...He is the first Mets starter with as long a scoreless streak since Kodai Senga tossed 19.2 scoreless innings from April 1-25, 2025...*Per Elias.*

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: His Major League debut came on May 20 at Washington (4.1 IP, 4 H, 4 ER, 2 BB, 3 K, HR) and he tossed 4.1 innings while allowing four runs on four hits, two walks and recorded three strikeouts...The 24-year-old, Winona, Minnesota native, is in his third professional season after being drafted by the Mets out of Grand Canyon University in the fifth round of the 2023 First-Year Player draft...The left-hander is currently ranked as the No. 12 prospect in the Mets system by *MLB Pipeline*...Over three seasons between Low-A St. Lucie, High-A Brooklyn, Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse, he is 12-11 with a 3.32 ERA (75 ER/203.1 IP) and 197 strikeouts...Overall, he has held minor league batters to a .240 (183-761) batting average.

2026: Has made 14 appearances (13 starts) this season between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse...Between the two clubs, he is 1-5 with a 4.02 ERA (28 ER/62.2 IP) and 65 strikeouts...His first five starts came with Binghamton and he pitched to a 3.60 ERA (10 ER/25.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts...His last nine appearances (eight starts) came with Syracuse, and he went 1-3 with a 4.30 ERA (18 ER/37.2 IP) and 38 strikeouts...His last start in the minors came on July 8 at Norfolk and he completed 2.0 scoreless innings and recorded five strikeouts...He threw 30 pitches...His season-high in terms of pitches was 90 on June 2 vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

CUT IT UP: Over his seven appearances with Triple-A Syracuse, his most-used pitch is his cutter...He has thrown it 35.6% of the time in the minors...In his five Major League starts, his cutter has been his second most-used pitch, and he has thrown it 25.7% of the time....Of his 22 Major League strikeouts, four of them have come via the cutter...In the minors, 47.1% of his swing-and-misses came on his cutter...The most by any of his pitches.

LOVE OF THE LOPES: Pitched his first two collegiate seasons at Barton Community College in Great Bend, Kansas, before transferring to Grand Canyon University for his junior season in 2023...That season, he finished 9-2 with a 3.87 ERA (38 ER/88.1 IP) and 91 strikeouts over 15 starts...He earned All-WAC second-team honors as a starting pitcher...Was named WAC Pitcher of the Week two times (Feb. 20 and Mar. 13) and was named a semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy, given to the nation's top player...Completed at least 5.0 innings in 14 of his 15 starts that season...Notably, he was a college teammate of Jacob Wilson of the Athletics.

YOUTH MOVEMENT: Thornton became the first pitcher to make their Major League debut for the Amazins' this season, but the fourth player overall (also: Carson Benge, AJ, Ewing and Nick Morabito)...Matt Seelinger also made his debut but after Thornton...Five Mets have debuted this season.

PERSONAL: His parents are Paul and Julie Thornton...His mom participated in track and field, cross country and soccer at Lewis & Clark College and St. Olaf College from 1988 to 1992...She was an All-American in heptathlon in 1991 and 1992 and was inducted into the St. Olaf's athletics hall of fame in 2004...His dad also ran track at St. Olaf from 1989-1993 and he was a conference champion in the 1,000-meter run in 1993...His favorite team growing up was the St. Louis Cardinals and his favorite athletes were Yadier Molina, Adrian Peterson and Max Fried.

- Earned his fifth win of the season after throwing a scoreless seventh inning on July 29 vs, Atlanta (G1) (1.0 IP)...35 of his 45 appearances this season have been scoreless.
- Got the final two outs of the seventh inning on July 27 vs. Atlanta (0.2 IP, K).
- Recorded four outs and allowed one earned run on July 22 at Milwaukee (1.1 IP, H, ER)...Has recorded at least four outs in 15 appearances this season.
- He throws his changeup 40.1% of the time and opponents are hitting .173 (13-75) in at-bats ending in his changeup....He has recorded 22 of his 47 strikeouts via the changeup...His changeup produces an 18.5% hard-hit rate, which is tied for the third-best mark in the majors among qualified changeups.
- Dating back to September 20, 2025, he hasn't allowed an earned run in 40 of his last 49 appearances...He is 5-2 with a 2.33 ERA (15 ER/58.0 IP) and is holding opposing batters to a .164 batting average (33-201) over that span.
- Since joining the Mets in 2024, he has made 56 appearances (four starts) at Citi Field...In those contests, he is 4-2 with 12 holds, a 2.53 ERA (19 ER/67.2 IP) and 64 strikeouts...Over 23 appearances (two starts) at home this season he has pitched to a 1.24 ERA (4 ER/29.0 IP).
- Threw 2.0 innings in relief and didn't allow a run (2.0 IP, 3 H, 2 K, 2 BB) on July 7 vs. Kansas City (2.0 IP, 3 H, 2 K, 2 BB)...Has completed at least 2.0 innings six times this season and allowed an earned run in only one of those appearances.
- Recorded one out and allowed a career-high-tying five runs on July 5 at Atlanta (0.1 IP, 4 H, 5 ER, K, BB)...The only other time he has allowed at least five runs in an outing was June 26, 2024 at Kansas City while with Miami.
- Entered with no outs and two men on in the fourth inning on June 24 (G2) vs. Chicago-NL (2.0 IP, 4 K) and struck out the side...He also threw a scoreless fifth inning while recording one more strikeout...Is the ninth time in his career he has recorded at least four strikeouts in an outing and has done so twice this season (also: 6/12 vs. ATL).
- Made his sixth start of the season on June 7 at San Diego and he threw a scoreless first inning (1.0 IP, 2 BB)...Over 7.0 innings as a starter this season he has allowed four earned runs and four of his six starts have been scoreless...For his career as an opener, he has pitched to a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP) over nine starts.
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.

- Fired a scoreless ninth inning on July 29 vs. Atlanta (G2) (1.0 IP, 2 H, 2 K)...Over seven appearances with the Mets this season, he has completed 11.1 scoreless innings.
