TOUCHING ALL BASES

TOMORROW'S MEXICAN HERITAGE NIGHT PRESENTED BY SOL: Arizona's rich Mexican culture will be celebrated with this tomorrow's Mexican Heritage Night presented by Sol transforming the ballpark into a lively, vibrant celebration, complete with music, dancers, and delicious Mexican cuisine always popular among fans...the first 15,000 fans will receive a D-backs Mexican Flag Cap...the night will also include a ceremonial first pitch thrown out by Enrique Mazon, owner of the Hermosillo Naranjeros of the Mexican Pacific League, and performances by Banda La Poderosa, Ballet Folklorico Tapatio and Mariachi Aztlán de Pueblo High School...the evening culminates with a Postgame Concert presented by Wendy's featuring La Séptima Banda, an impressive 17-piece group that plays a variety of regional Mexican music...in addition to Chase Field's wide array of Mexican cuisine, the evening will also feature specialty food and drinks including Carne Asada Fries (fries loaded with cheddar cheese, guacamole, carne asada beef, Pico de Gallo and Mexican crema) and the Jack Fire-Rita (a delicious cocktail made of Jack Daniel's Tennessee Fire, orange liqueur and sweet and sour).

SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

LAST GAME: The D-backs won the series with a 2-1 victory vs. Reds in the rubber match.

- ◆ Brandon Pfaadt delivered a quality start (1 ER in 7.0 IP), working a career-high-tying 7.0 innings (fourth time) with 9 strikeouts, 2 shy of his career best.
- ◆ Christian Walker hit a solo homer in the second inning, and Lourdes Gurriel Jr.'s eighth-inning, goahead RBI double proved to the be the difference.
- ◆ Ryan Thompson got the win with a scoreless eighth inning and Paul Sewald locked down his second save with a perfect ninth.

SNAKEBITES: The D-backs are 7-3 in their last 10 games.

♦ The D-backs, in 1-run decisions, have won 6 of their last 7 such games and are an overall 8-5 in 1-run games and 11-10 in 1- or 2-run games.

MARTE STREAKING: Ketel Marte's season-long 15-game hitting streak is the longest active streak in the Majors and tied for the third-longest overall hitting streak this season with Ozzie Albies/ATL, behind Alec Bohm/PHI (18) and Marcell Ozuna/ATL (16.

- His career best is 16 games (May 16-June 4, 2022; .390, 23-for-59, 7 2B, 1 HR. 9 RBI. 5 BB).
- His 10 career hit streaks of 10+games are third in team history (Luis Gonzalez 12; Paul Goldschmidt 11).
- ♦ Has hit safely in 10 straight home games at a .381 clip (16-for-42)/1.100 OPS with 4 doubles, 3 homers, 5 RBI and 2 walks.

VS. TIGERS: The D-backs are 23-17 all-time vs. Tigers, 11-9 at home.

- ♦ Eighth time facing the Tigers at Chase Field (2001, '02, '05, '08, '14, '17, '22).
- ♦ Last faced the Tigers last season in Detroit, sweeping a 3-game set from June 9-11 (outscored them 23-11).

NEWMAN AT THE DISH: Kevin Newman, in his last 10 games, since May 4, is hitting .424 (14-for-33)/1.094 OPS with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 2 RBI and 2 walks.

♦ Had a career-high-tying 4 straight multi-hit games May 11-14 (also: May 23-28, 2023), the team's first such streak this season.

JOC AT HOME: Joc Pederson, among all players at home (min. 50 PA), is sixth with a .660 SLG and 10th with a 1.073 OPS.

♦ In his last 7 home games, is hitting .321 (9-for-28)/.964 OPS with 3 doubles, 2 homers and 3 RBI.

bWAR(e) OF KETEL: Ketel Marte's 2.7 bWAR is fourth among all players [pitcher or position], behind Mookie Betts/LAD (3.4), Shohei Ohtani/LAD (3.0) and Bobby Witt Jr./KC (3.0).

MAY BLOOM: Kevin Newman, in 12 games in May, is hitting .424 (14-for-33)/1.094 OPS with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 2 RBI and 2 walks.

◆ **Joc Pederson**, in 12 games in May, is hitting .308 (12-for-39)/.973 OPS with 3 doubles, 3 homers, 4 RBI and 2 walks.

GRICHUK GAINING STEAM: Randal Grichuk has hit safely in 7 of his last 11 games at a .318 clip (7-for-22) with 1 double and 3 RBI.

- ♦ Against lefties, is hitting .310 (13-for-42) with 4 doubles, 9 RBI, 2 walks and 1 hit-by-pitch.
- ♦ With runners in scoring position, is batting .417 (5-for-12)/1.067 OPS with 3 doubles and 9 RBI.

STARTERS STALLING OPPONENTS: D-backs starting pitchers have allowed 3 or fewer runs in 8 of their last 9 starts, since May 7 (3.57 ERA, .236 opponent average, 18 walks and 36 strikeouts).

♦ When D-backs starting pitchers allow 3 or fewer runs, the team is 19-14.

BULLPEN HANGING ZEROES: Ryan Thompson has held opponents scoreless in his last 8 games (8.1 IP) and 16 of 18 games overall (2 ER in 18.0 IP).

- ◆ Joe Mantiply has held opponents scoreless in 9 of his last 10 games (1 ER in 9.1 IP).
- ◆ Justin Martinez has held opponents scoreless in 5 outings in May (6.2 IP) and 9 of 10 overall this season.

CALL TO THE 'PEN: The D-backs bullpen in its last 8 games has a 3.21 ERA (11 R-10 ER in 28.0 IP), .250 opponent average (26-for-104), .703 opponent OPS, 11 walks and 24 strikeouts.

ABOVE AVERAGE DEFENDERS: The D-backs are the only team to feature multiple players in the Top 13 among outs above average (OAA) leaders: **Christian Walker** (T-2nd, 8) and **Ketel Marte** (T-6th, 6).

DEFENSE RULES: Ketel Marte (9 DRS) and **Christian Walker** (8) rank fourth and tied for fifth, respectively, in defensive runs saved (DRS).

♦ The D-backs 16 DRS are tied for seventh in the Majors, with the Guardians and Mariners, behind the Royals (31), Blue Jays (31), Dodgers (29), Rangers (24), Braves (19) and Yankees (18).
