RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals continue their six-game Inter-league homestand with the opener of a three-game series with the visiting Cleveland Guardians tonight at Busch Stadium ... The Cardinals dropped two of three to Boston over the weekend and enter play today tied with the Brewers for third in the NL Central Division, 1.0 game behind first place Pittsburgh.

FERNANDEZ RECALLED: Prior to tonight's series opener, the Cardinals recalled RHP **Ryan Fernandez** from Memphis (AAA) and designated LHP **Jared Shuster** for assignment ... The 27-year-old Fernandez began the season in Memphis, striking out six in six scoreless relief appearances (5.2 IP) while holding the opposition to a .158 batting average (3-for-19).

LAKE EFFECT SHOW: The Cardinals have won **five** straight over Cleveland since Sept. 21, 2024, their longest all-time win streak against the Guardians since the two clubs began Interleague play in 1997 ...

• It's the Cardinals longest active win streak versus any opponent and matches San Diego for Cleveland's longest current losing skid against any foe.

• St. Louis' two longest Interleague winning streaks are both versus cross-state rival Kansas City:

7: June 28-2003-May 21, 2005 6: June 22, 2012-May 29, 2013

WALKER'S WORLD: **Jordan Walker** leads Major League Baseball in Home Runs (7), Total Bases (41), and Isolated Power (.418), while ranking among MLB leaders in Average Exit Velocity (97.1mph, 2nd), Hard-Hit % (68.4, 3rd), Barrels/PA % (16.4%, 3rd), Slugging (.745, 3rd), OPS (1.039, 4th), and bWAR (1.4, T-3rd).

- J-Walk is slashing .406/.457/.969 (13-32) with six home runs and a 1.426 OPS over his current eight-game hitting streak.
- The 23-year-old Walker and 21-year-old **Albert Pujols** (8 in 2001) are the only two Cardinals to hit 7+ homers in March/April before turning age 24 ... 2006 Pujols (14 HR) holds the March/April record for Cardinals of any age.
- With a homer tonight, Walker would become the 5th Cardinal with 8+ home runs in the first 16 games of a season with **Stan Musial** (8 in 1954), **Mark McGwire** (8 in 1998), **Scott Rolen** (8 in 2004), and **Albert Pujols** (11 in 2006).
- 2009 **Albert Pujols** (47 HR) was the last Cardinal to lead all of Major League Baseball in home runs.

VOTE FOR PEDRO: Two of **Pedro Pagés**'s 13 career shutouts caught have come against Cleveland: June 27 and June 29 last season at Progressive Field, which includes a one-hit shutout by **Sonny Gray** that was nationally-televised on Apple TV.

CARDS PLAYER DEV NEWS: Memphis (AAA) RHP **Richard Fitts** has been placed on the 7-Day Injured List with a right lat strain ... The 26-year-old Fitts began the season 2-0 with a 1.76 ERA (15.1 IP) and 11 strikeouts in three starts with Memphis.

- Palm Beach (A) RHP **Ty Van Dyke** was named the Florida State League Pitcher of the Week for the April 6-12 period ... The 22-year-old Van Dyke hurled a career-high 5.2 shutout IP with a career-high six strikeouts and no walks on April 8 at Bradenton.
- RHP **Cade Winquest** was returned to the Cards organization and assigned to Memphis (AAA) today after being designated for assignment by the Yankees and going unclaimed ... The 25-year-old was selected by New York in the 2025 MLB Rule 5 Draft, but did not appear.

CLEVELAND CONNECTIONS

José Fernín signed with Cleveland as an International Free Agent (July 2, 2015)...played six minor league seasons in the Guardians organization before being purchased by St. Louis (Nov. 9, 2022).

Justin Bruhl was acquired by St. Louis from the Guardians in exchange for cash considerations on Jan. 6, 2026 after Cleveland had acquired him from Toronto for cash (Dec. 17, 2025).

Julio Rangel spent 11 years in the Cleveland system as a Cultural Development Coordinator (2007-08), Mental Skills Coordinator (2009-10), Lower Level Pitching Coordinator (2011-15), and Assistant Field Coordinator (2016-17).

Shawn Armstrong made 11 relief appearances for the Cardinals during the 2024 season.

Cardinals Asst. GM **Rob Cerfolio** and Farm Director **Larry Day** both previously worked in the Guardians Player Development department for 10 seasons (2015-24) before joining St. Louis.

Cardinals broadcaster **Ricky Horton** spent the 1991 season in Cleveland's minor league system as a pitching coach and pitcher between Colorado Springs (AAA) and Canton-Akron (AA).

Dean Kiekhefer was originally selected by Cleveland in the 37th round of the 2007 MLB Draft out of Oldham High School (Ky.), but did not sign.

Dustin May and **Nolan Gorman** were teammates for the NL in the 2019 SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field in Cleveland.

Cleveland Sr. VP of Medical Services **Lonnie Sol-off** attended St. Louis University...began his baseball career with the Cardinals in 1996 as part of the PBATS internship program.

Guardians Sr. VP Hitting **Alex Eckelman** played parts of 5 yrs. in the Cards MiLB system (1997-2001).

Jordan Walker was named Player of the Game at the 2019 MLB High School All-Star Game at Cleveland's Progressive Field.

Andre Pallante, **Michael McGreevy**, and **Kolby Allard** are graduates of San Clemente (Calif.) High School.

Matt Svanson tallied his first career win on June 28, 2025 at Cleveland after pitching a scoreless inning of relief in a 9-6 victory.

Guardians Manager **Stephen Vogt** notched his first MLB hit on a home run vs. St. Louis on June 28, 2013 while with Oakland.

The Cardinals and Cleveland played in MLB's inaugural Civil Rights Game on March 31, 2007 at AutoZone Park in Memphis, Tenn.

Guardians Replay Coord. **Gunnar Wilhelmy** attended the Univ. of Missouri, earning two undergraduate degrees (2016) and a Master's of Statistics (2018)...worked for the Mizzou Baseball team for five and a half years as Student Mgr., Graduate Asst., and Mgr. of Advanced Technologies.

Cleveland AGM **Eric Binder** pitched part of the 2011 season in the Cardinals minor league system.

Guardians Special Assignment Scout **Doug Carpenter** was the international scouting supervisor for the Cardinals from 1998-2000.

Cleveland Amateur Scouting Coordinator **David Compton** served as a fourth coach for the Double-A Springfield Cardinals in 2015.

Bill Veck was a former owner of both Cleveland (1946-49) and the St. Louis Browns (1951-53).

Guardians MiLB Strength/Conditioning Coordinator **Josh Kesel** was born in St. Louis...was the co-founder and performance director of Premier Pitching and Performance in St. Louis.

Guardians Sr. Player Acquisitions Scout **Kevin Cullen** coached at the Univ. of Missouri and Univ. of Central Missouri before joining Cleveland in 2007.

Cleveland Team Physician **Mark Schickendantz** earned his medical degree from Saint Louis University School of Medicine in 1986.

Cardinals Baseball Info. & Media Serv. Mgr. **Chris Tunno** graduated from Canfield (Ohio) High School.

The Cardinals & Indians played an exhibition at Cleveland's League Park during the 1936 All-Star break, when 17-year-old **Bob Feller** made his unofficial debut with 8 strikeouts in 3.0 innings.

The Cleveland Spiders were rivals of the St. Louis Browns in the American Association (1888-89) and National League (1892-99)...before the 1899 season, Spiders owners **Stanley** and **Frank DeHass Robison**, who also owned the St. Louis franchise, transferred Cleveland's best players (future Hall of Famers **Cy Young**, **Bobby Wallace**, & **Jesse Burkett**) to St. Louis and formed the Perfectos...the Spiders endured the worst season in pro baseball history (20-134) and were disbanded as the NL contracted to eight teams.

The Cardinals won their 10,000th regular season game as a member of the National League with a 4-0 victory over Cleveland at Busch Stadium (June 25, 2018), becoming the 6th NL franchise to reach that plateau, following the Braves, Cubs, Dodgers, Giants, and Pirates. The Yankees also boast 10,000 wins.

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Cardinals 26-year-old Opening Day southpaw starting pitcher makes his team-leading 4th start of the season tonight.
The Cardinals are 3-0 in his games started this season with wins over TB, NYM & WSH.
Has pitched 5.0 or more innings in each of his 1st three starts.
Received one run of support in his first two starts and two runs of support last Tue. (4/7) at WSH.
Making his 124th career Major League appearance and his 57th career start.
The Cardinals are 14-13 in his 27 career starts at Busch Stadium, where he has gone 10-9 with a 3.68 ERA (137.0 IP/55 ER) with 10 quality starts.

LAST TIME OUT (Tuesday, April 7 at Washington): ND, W, 7-6; 5.0 IP, 9 H, 4 R, 4 ER, 2 HR, 2 BB, 6 SO, 92 pitches).

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

- CAPITOL RALLY: Had his shortest start of season (5.0 IP) last Tue. (4/7) at WSH but threw a season-high 92 pitches; left the game trailing 4-2 but the Cardinals rallied to win 7-6 in 10 innings.
NO FOOLING: Held the Mets to one run in his second start on April Fools Day, a day after Andre Pallante and company shut out New York. Retired the first 12 Mets batters (first time a Cardinals pitcher vs. NYM since 1968) and carried a no-hitter through 4.2 innings, longest of his career.
LIBBY'S LID-LIFTER: Made his 1st career Opening Day start and received a no decision vs. TB (3/26) despite pitching 5.0 innings and allowing just one run. Cardinals rallied for a 9-7 win (he exited with game tied 1-1).
LEFTY LIFT-OFFS: Made his 1st career Opening Day start on 3/26 vs. TB, becoming the 1st Cardinals lefty to start on Opening Day since Donovan Osborne (4/5/99) vs. MIL - the same year that Libby was born. He became one of just 16 LHP's to make the Opening Day start for the Cardinals since 1901 (MLB).
PORT SIDE POWER: Of his seven hits allowed to left-handed batters this season, three have been home runs.

2025 HIGHLIGHTS:

- CAREER YEAR: Joined the starting rotation in a full-time capacity and established career highs in wins (8), decisions (20), starts (29), quality starts (11), strikeouts (122), and innings pitched (151.2). Libby's 151.2 innings surpassed his 149.2 combined in 2022 between St. Louis (34.2 IP) and AAA-Memphis (115.0 IP), while his eight wins matched his Major League combined total from his first three seasons (2022-24).
ST. LOUIS SOUTHPAWS: Libby's 29 starts in 2025 were the most by a St. Louis southpaw since Jaime Garcia (32 in 2011), and the most by any Cardinals left-hander age 25 or younger since the same 24-year-old Garcia in 2011.

CAREER:

- Chose to switch to uniform No. 32 prior to 2026 season in honor of Hall of Fame left-handed pitcher Sandy Koufax, whom he grew up admiring.
Was acquired by the Cardinals from the Rays in a four-player trade in 2020, with a compensation pick that netted the Cardinals RHP Tink Hence.
Is a career 13-21 with a 4.78 ERA (269.0 IP) in his 56 career starts opposed to 3-3 with a 3.89 ERA (81.0 IP) in 67 career relief appearances.
Has limited left-handed batters to a .246/.306/.372 (86-349) with a .679 OPS average over his Major League career.
2021 Cardinals Minor League Pitcher of the Year, his first season of play in the Cardinals organization.

LIBERATORE vs. CLEVELAND:

- Is making his 4th career appearance and 3rd career start against the Guardians - it's his 1st start vs. CLE at Busch Stadium.
Was solid in his most recent start (6/29/25) vs. CLE with 6.0 scoreless IP at Progressive Field, allowing three hits (he did however walk 5); was the winner in a 7-0 blanking of Guardians that featured a 3-run 1st inning HR by Nolan Gorman.
His 1st career appearance vs. the Guardians was at Progressive Field (5/26/23) in a 4-3 loss; Libby blanked Cleveland over his 1st 4.0 IP that game, before the Guardians plated all four of their runs in his 5th and final inning.
Is 1-1 with a 3.09 ERA in his three career games vs. the Guardians, including a scoreless relief appearance (0.2 IP) on 9/21/24 at Busch Stadium.
Tonight marks his 21st career Interleague start (4-11, 5.69 ERA), including seven vs. AL Central clubs (2-3, 4/95 ERA).
