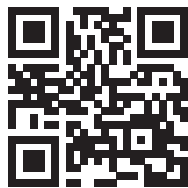

**TODAY'S TILT**...the Mariners continue a 6-game homestand with the third and final game of the 3 game series against the Baltimore Orioles (1-1)...tomorrow, Seattle will host the Red Sox for a 3-game set to wrap up the homestand...the Mariners are coming off a 10-game road trip where they saw the Orioles (2-2), Tigers (1-2) and Nationals (1-2)...today's game against the Orioles will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners.TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call, and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** as sideline analyst...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Shannon Drayer** on the call.

**ODDS & ENDS**...the Mariners fell to the Orioles last night by a 5-3 final score...despite the loss, Seattle is 13-8 (.619) over their last 20 games since May 25, the 2nd-best record in the AL and 5th-best in MLB over that span.

- **Best In The West** - The Mariners (38-37) are in first place in the American League West Division, 1.5 games ahead of the second place Athletics (36-38).
- **Tidal Waves** - The Mariners pitching staff ranks 2nd in MLB in ERA (3.69) and WHIP (1.09) since May 25...Seattle hitters rank 3rd in MLB in home runs (34) during that span.
- **B2B - Dominic Canzone** and **Cole Young** hit back-to-back home runs in the 9th inning last night, the second time the Mariners have hit back-to-back home runs this season, also doing so in the last series against the Orioles (also: **Luke Raley** & Canzone on June 11 at Baltimore).
- **Rack 'Em Up** - The Mariners starting pitching staff leads MLB in strikeouts this season with 415, ranking ahead of the next closest Dodgers (412 SO) and Phillies (411 SO).
- **Cap - J.P. Crawford** is batting .313 (15x48) with 1 double, 4 home runs, 7 RBI and 7 walks over his last 13 games since May 24.
- **Juneteenth Celebration** - The Mariners will host a Juneteenth Celebration and wear their Steelheads jerseys during tomorrow's series opener against the Red Sox.

★**PUNCH THEIR TICKET TO PHILLY**★...Major League Baseball announced a ballot update to Phase One of voting for the 2026 MLB All-Star Game on July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia...the Mariners currently have a player in the Top 8 of voting at every position...OF **Julio Rodríguez** and OF **Randy Arozarena** headline the list, ranking 6th and 7th among AL outfielders, respectively...fans can submit up to 5 ballots per day until the conclusion of Phase One on June 25...Phase Two, which takes the finalists at each position, will run from June 29-July 2 before the All-Star rosters are announced on July 4... for more information and to vote, visit [Mariners.com/Vote](http://Mariners.com/Vote)

**MAMMA MIA, DOM**...**Dominic Canzone** went 2-for-3 with a solo home run last night and has been outstanding over his last 20 games since May 24, batting .393 (24x61) with 12 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 7 home runs and 12 RBI, reaching base at a .448 clip and slugging .836 for a 1.284 OPS...during that span he leads Major League batters in slugging percentage and OPS and also ranks T-3rd in average among players with at least 60 plate appearances...he has hit safely in his last 7-consecutive games since June 10, the longest hitting streak of his career.

**J-ROD BEING J-ROD**...**Julio Rodríguez** last night went 1-for-3 with 1 run and the 125th double of his career...he became just the 3rd player in franchise history to record 125+ doubles, 125+ homers and 125+ stolen bases, joining Hall of Famer Ken Griffey Jr. and Alex Rodríguez...in 75 games this season, Rodríguez is batting .249 (75x301) with 15 doubles, 13 home runs, 35 RBI and 9 stolen bases with a .739 OPS... among AL center fielders (min. 50% G as CF), he ranks T-1st in doubles, 3rd in home runs, 3rd in extra-base hits (28), 3rd in RBI and 4th in stolen bases.

**COLE YOUNG'S HOT STRETCH**...**Cole Young** hit his 6th home run of the season last night and has hit safely in 17 of his last 18 games since May 27...during that span, he is batting .304 (24x79) with 10 runs, 3 home runs, 6 RBI, 2 walks and just 8 strikeouts in 84 plate appearances...his 9.5% strikeout rate during that timeframe ranks 3rd-lowest in the American League, closely behind teammate **Josh Naylor** (8.5%) and trailing only Trent Grisham-NYY (7.0%)...Young recorded a career-high 11-game hitting streak from May 27 to June 8.

**RECENT ROSTER MOVES**...the Mariners yesterday recalled INF/OF **Connor Joe** from Triple-A Tacoma and optioned OF **Curtis Washington Jr.** (post-game June 16) to High-A Everett...on Tuesday, C **Cal Raleigh** (right oblique strain) and INF **J.P. Crawford** (right hand contusion) were reinstated from the 10-day Injured List, and Washington Jr. was recalled...in corresponding moves, OF **Randy Arozarena** was placed on the 10-day IL (left hamstring strain, retroactive to June 13), INF **Will Wilson** was transferred to the 60-day IL (fractured left thumb) and C **Jhonny Pereda** was optioned to Triple-A Tacoma.

**SOLID IN THE 'PEN**...right-handed reliever **Nick Davila** tossed a scoreless 1.0 inning last night and has not allowed an earned run over 11 appearances (11.2 IP) to begin his Major League career, the 5th longest such streak in Mariners history and longest streak since Carson Smith from 2014-25 (20 G)...RHP **Eduard Bazarido** holds a 2.23 ERA (8 ER, 32.1 IP), 11 walks and 28 strikeouts in 34 appearances, ranking 3rd in the AL and T-6th in MLB with 13 holds.

**HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS**...highlights and promotions on the Mariners current homestand include **Mariners Value Game** and **Stars and Stripes Soccer Jersey Day** today, **Juneteenth Celebration** and **Fireworks Night** tomorrow, where Seattle will wear their Steelheads Jerseys, and **Father's Day** on Sunday.

**AS YOU MAY KNOW**...**Julio Rodríguez** hit his 125th career double last night and has also recorded exactly 125 home runs and 125 stolen bases since making his MLB debut in 2022, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**... Rodríguez is the third fastest player in Major League history to record 125+ doubles, 125+ homers and 125+ stolen bases, doing so in 665 career games?...only Ronald Acuña Jr.-ATL (591 G) and Alfonso Soriano-NYY/TEX (643 G) have reached the milestone in fewer games (*h/t Sarah Langs*)...Julio is also the 5th player in MLB history to accomplish the feat at age 25-or-younger, joining Acuña Jr., Mike Trout-LAA, Alex Rodríguez-SEA/TEX and Vada Pinson-CIN.

### ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JUNE 18

- **1992** - The Mariners win their third consecutive game in their final at-bat for the first time in franchise history. Harold Reynolds delivered the walk-off single in the 11th.
- **2000** - Alex Rodriguez goes 4x5 with 4 runs scored, 2 RBI and a HR; John Olerud goes 4x5 with 4 RBI, 1 run scored, 1 HR, & 1 2B; Edgar Martinez goes 1x1 with 4 BB, 3 runs scored, 2 RBI & 1 HR in a 10-2 win at Minnesota.
- **2002** - The Mariners face former teammate and current Cincinnati Reds outfielder Ken Griffey Jr. for the first time since Griffey was traded to Cincy in Feb. of 2000. The Mariners win the game 8-1 in their first-ever meeting against the Reds.
- **2009** - Franklin Gutierrez had his first career multi-homer game at SD.
- **2010** - Ichiro snapped a 20-game hitting streak in interleague games. During the streak, he hit .422 (38x90).

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 15th start of the season... Selected by Seattle in the 6th round... Spent 3 seasons at Cal Poly... Was selected to the 2025 American League All-Star team...

LAST TIME OUT...L#5 on June 11 at Baltimore, tossed 5.0 innings and allowed a career-high tying 7 runs (7 ER) on 7 hits (1 HR) and 1 walk with 4 strikeouts...he threw 82 pitches (53 strikes) in his 14th start of the season.

HOME SWEET HOME...has not allowed a run in each of his last 3 home starts (5/6-c), combining for 26 strikeouts to just 6 hits allowed across 19.0 innings pitched...has thrown 6.0+ innings in all 6 of his starts at T-Mobile Park this season...

AMONG THE BEST...among pitching leaders with 200+ IP at home since 2023, Woo leads MLB in WHIP (0.83), ranks 2nd in K/BB (6.57), 2nd in opponents' batting average (.183), 3rd in BB/9 (1.51), and 4th in ERA (2.57).

SO WE MEET AGAIN...is making his 2nd consecutive start against the Orioles, last facing them in Baltimore on June 11...is making just his second career start against the Orioles at home...in his last start against Baltimore at T-Mobile Park (6/5/25), he threw 6 strikeouts across 6.0 innings with 4 runs (4 ER) allowed on 4 hits (2 HR) and 2 walks.

GOING THE DISTANCE...has thrown 6.0+ innings in 10 of his 14 starts this season and in 54 career starts...his 37 starts of 6.0+ IP since 2025 are most in MLB while his 268.2 IP since 2025 are 8th-most in MLB...has also thrown 8 quality starts this season and 29 total QS since 2025, tied for most in the American League and 3rd-most in MLB across that span.

FEW FREE PASSES...among qualified pitchers since 2025, he ranks 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.43), 2nd in walks-per-nine (1.71), and 2nd in walk percentage (4.8%)...in addition, he has tossed 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer walks in 10 of his 14 starts this season and in 37 total starts since 2025 which leads MLB across that span.

WOO HOLDS THE TRIDENT...his 3.39 career ERA (180 ER, 477.2 IP) is a franchise-best mark among Mariners starters (min. 75 GS), ranking ahead of Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA.

COMMANDING THE ZONE...is 1 of just 4 pitchers with 450+ strikeouts and fewer than 100 walks allowed since 2023 (471 SO, 95 BB), joining teammate George Kirby (567 SO, 92 BB), Tarik Skubal-DET (620 SO, 89 BB), and Paul Skenes-PIT (485 SO, 90 BB).

WITHIN THE SPLITS...has yet to allow a run in the 4th inning across 13 occurrences this season, limiting batters to a .075 batting average (3x40) and .140 on-base percentage with a 12.89 SO/9 and 0.682 WHIP in the inning...is 1 of 4 pitchers with a 0.00 ERA in the 4th inning this season (min. 10+ IP).

WATCH ME WHIP...his 0.99 career WHIP is tied 4th-best in MLB among qualified pitchers since 2023, trailing only Tarik Skubal-DET (0.91), Paul Skenes-PIT (0.94) and Zack Wheeler-PHI (0.98)...his 0.990 career WHIP is also the lowest in franchise history (min. 400 IP).

WOOOO...has tossed 7.0+ innings in 4 starts this season (last: 5/30 vs. ARI)...has made 6 starts of 7.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer hits allowed since 2025, most in MLB across that span...threw 7.0 shutout innings, allowing just 1 hit on April 3 at LAA, his 3rd career start tossing 7.0+ IP with 1-or-fewer hits...his 3 such starts are 2nd-most in MLB since 2025, trailing Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD (4 G).

ONE-HIT WONDERS...has tossed 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits in 2 starts this season (4/3 at LAA and 5/6 vs. ATL) and in 5 starts since 2025, which is tied for the most such games in MLB across that span, (also: Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD)...Woo and Emerson Hancock are 2 of 10 pitchers with multiple games of 6.0+ IP and 1-or-fewer hits allowed this season...the Mariners pitching staff has combined for 6 such games this year (also: Bryce Miller and Luis Castillo), which leads MLB and are tied for the most in a single season in franchise history (also: 2015 and 2023).

DOMINATING THE ZONE...his 71.1% first pitch strike percentage currently leads the league this season, ranking ahead of teammate Logan Gilbert (2nd, 69.3%)...Woo's 68.5% first pitch strike percentage across his career is tied for 2nd-best in MLB among qualified pitchers since 2023, trailing Miles Mikolas-STL (69.1%) and ranking alongside Tarik Skubal-DET (68.5%).

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT...currently averages 14.7 pitches per inning this season, tied for 7th-fewest in MLB, alongside Jacob Misiorowski-MIL and Nathan Eovaldi-TEX...is currently averaging 14.8 pitches per inning across his career, tied for the fewest P/IP among qualified pitchers since 2023 (min. 400 IP), alongside Tarik Skubal-DET and Christopher Sánchez-PHI.

FIRST HALF WARRIOR...is 17-11 with a 3.27 ERA (100 ER, 275.1 IP), 260 strikeouts and 50 walks allowed across 48 starts pre All-Star Break...among pitchers with 200+ IP in the first half since 2023, he ranks 4th in BB/9 (1.63) 5th in WHIP (0.973), 5th in opp. OBP (.254), and 7th in SO/BB (5.20).
